OAKLAND ATHLETICS (22-15) VS. WASHINGTON NATIONALS (19-17)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight after losing five of the previous six games...with a win today, the A's would record their fourth series sweep of the season, which would be the most in the majors (Baltimore is also going for its fourth sweep today)...are 9-10 over the last 19 games after starting the year 13-5...are 22-15 for the season, which is the second best record in the American League and fourth best in the majors...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 13th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 17 consecutive days and 30 of the last 32...have a 2½ game lead, which is ½ game short of the season high of three (April 30, May 1)...have 26 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...snapped their season-high tying three-game losing streak with a win in the second game of the doubleheader on Wednesday...have not lost more than three in a row since May 6-10, 2013 when they had a five-game losing streak...lost back-to-back series May 2-7 (at Boston, vs. Seattle) for the first time since Aug. 19-25 of last year.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their third walk-off win of the season last night...it was their fifth win when trailing after seven innings, which is the most in the majors and one more than their season total from last year...it was their third win when trailing after eight innings, which is tied with Texas for the most in the majors...improved to 8-6 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Miami for the Major League lead in last at bat wins and are second to the Marlins in last at bat games (15)...improved to 5-2 in extra inning games...are tied with San Francisco for the ML lead in extra inning wins and are second to Los Angeles (NL) in extra inning games (9)...have the second best extra inning record in the American League...are 8-10 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 14-5 in games decided by three runs or more.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed three runs over the last three games (28.0 ip, 0.96 ERA) and now have a 2.96 ERA for the season...that is the lowest mark in the American League by nearly half a run (Detroit, 3.45) and second lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 2.66)...opponents are 12 for 95 (.126) over the last three games and are batting .220 for the season, which is the **lowest mark in the majors**...ranks second in the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.286) and slugging percentage (.332).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-6 with a 3.86 ERA (62 er in 144.2 ip) over the last 24 games after going 5-2 with a 1.89 ERA over the first 13 contests...have a 3.15 ERA (79 er in 225.2 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Detroit, 2.81)...lead the AL in innings pitched (225.2), are tied for the fewest losses (8) and rank third in strikeouts (189)...Sonny Gray, Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez have combined for a 10-3 record and a 2.41 ERA (38 er in 142.0 ip) in 22 starts while the A's other starters are 3-5 with a 4.41 ERA (41 er in 83.2 ip) in 15 starts.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .217 (66 for 304) with 30 runs scored over the last nine games (3.3 runs per game) after hitting .283 with 94 runs scored over the previous 15 contests (6.3 runs per game)...lead the majors in walks (159), rank fourth in on-base percentage (.337) and runs scored (178) and tied for fourth in triples (9)...20 of the A's 35 home runs have come with runners on base, which ranks fourth in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 23 for 26 (88.5%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 27 of their 30 (90.0%) attempts, which the third highest percentage in the majors...the A's are one of three Major League teams without a pickoff (Boston, Miami).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters have nine walks, which is more than twice as many as any American League team and second most in the majors to Washington (12)...also lead the AL with 45 pinch plate appearances, which is more than two National League teams (Atlanta, 44; Milwaukee, 43)...are 6 for 35 (.171) with a home run and five RBI...are tied for the AL lead in home runs and extra base hits (3).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on this 10-game homestand against Seattle (1-3), Washington (2-0) and Chicago-AL (three games)...are 9-9 (.500) at home compared to 13-6 (.684) on the

road...have the second best road record in the majors (Milwaukee, 12-5)...snapped their six-game home losing streak with a win in the second game of the doubleheader Wednesday...that matched the A's longest home losing streak over the last 13 years...this homestand is the first of three 10-game homestands this year...the last time the A's had at least three 10-game homestands in one season was in 2002 when they had four...went 6-4 on the last road trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (3-0) and Boston (1-2).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's have won their first two interleague games of the season and are 24-10 (.706) over their last 34 games against the National League...also host San Francisco (July 7-8), New York (Aug. 19-20) and Philadelphia (Sept. 19-21) and play at New York (June 24-25), Miami (June 27-29), San Francisco (July 9-10) and Atlanta (Aug. 15-17)...went 13-7 against the NL last year, which tied for third best in the majors...it marked the second consecutive season and 10th time in 17 seasons that the A's finished with a winning record against the National League...are now 169-137 (.553) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have committed 31 errors, which is tied for second most in the American League...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 37 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an Oakland team since they began the 1984 season with a 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader...are 15-2 when scoring first, which is the best record in the AL...are 10-1 when the starter pitches seven or more innings...went 18-9 in April, which was the A's 11th consecutive winning month dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 10 minutes...averaged 3:05 last year, which was second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Ryan Cook on the disabled list Friday and have five players on the DL (Cook, Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL eight times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. NATIONALS: The A's trail in the all-time series, 2-3...have won the first two games of this series...prior to that, had not met since June 7-9, 2005 when Washington swept a three-game series at RFK Stadium...that was the only meeting between Oakland and Washington...the A's are 5-3 all-time against the Nationals/Expos franchise...swept a three-game series from Montreal in Oakland, June 13-15, 2003.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's have a 25-22 record on Mother's Day since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 16-9 in Oakland and 9-13 on the road...today marks the A's first interleague Mother's Day game...**Sean Doolittle** has not walked a batter in 19.0 innings and has a streak of 31.0 consecutive innings without a walk dating back to last year, which is tied for the third longest streak in Oakland history...**Brandon Moss** has 18 home runs and 61 RBI in 70 games dating back to Aug. 19 of last year...both figures are the most in the AL and second most in the majors to Giancarlo Stanton (21 HR and 65 RBI in 75 games)...**Derek Norris** is batting .378, which is second best in the majors among players with 60 or more plate appearances (Tulowitzki, COL .405).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1931 Al Simmons drives in a run for the 11th consecutive game as Lefty Grove defeats Chicago, 5-2 en route to a 31-win season...the win moves the A's into first place for good as the Athletics win their third straight American League pennant...in 2012 Brandon Inge drives in four runs for the fourth time in his last five games to become the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over a five-game stretch...the first was Lou Gehrig in 1931.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (4-1, 2.64 ERA)

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Was charged with his first loss of the season in his last start after beginning the season 4-0 for the first time in his career...the loss snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2013 (also May 10-June 6, 2008)...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings...struck out 56 and walked just 10.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for fifth in the American League in wins (4) and ranks ninth in ERA (2.64)...is third in opponents slugging percentage (.307), ninth in batting average (.223) and 10th in on-base percentage (.279)...has the second highest run support (7.31), is tied for fifth in wild pitches (4) and hit batters (4), ranks sixth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.41) and seventh in fewest walks per nine innings (1.83).

LAST 24 STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in three of his seven starts this year and 11 of his last 25 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 11-6 with a 2.93 ERA (48 er in 147.1 ip) over that stretch...the ERA is third lowest among American League pitchers over that span (min. 125.0 ip)...has held the opposition to a .234 (131 for 560) batting average...has walked 33 (2.02 per nine innings) and struck out 145 in 147.1 innings (8.86 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.39...has yielded just nine home runs (0.55 per nine innings).

INTERLEAGUE: Went 3-1 with a 3.38 ERA in five interleague starts with Cleveland last year...is now 11-5 with a 4.54 ERA (61 er in 121.0 ip) in 22 career interleague starts.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-0 with a 1.65 ERA (5 er in 27.1 ip) and .173 (17 for 98) opponents batting average in four starts during the day compared to 2-1 with a 4.24 ERA (8 er in 17.0 ip) and .294 (20 for 68) opponents average in three starts at night...ranks seventh in the American League in day ERA...last year, he went 5-2 with a 3.27 ERA in 10 starts during the day compared to 5-7 with a 4.46 ERA in 19 starts at night...is now 7-2 with a 2.73 ERA (25 er in 82.1 ip) in 14 starts during the day over the last two years and 7-8 with a 4.43 ERA (59 er in 120.0 ip) in 22 starts at night.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .143 (6 for 42) batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranks fourth in the American League...opponents are 1 for 17 (.059) with RISP and two outs...opponents are 8 for 43 (.186) with no walks and two hit by pitches when leading off an inning (.222 on-base percentage)...the on-base percentage is sixth lowest in the AL and the batting average is tied for ninth...has yielded a .190 (24 for 126) average against right-handers compared to .325 (13 for 40) against left-handers...has issued seven of his nine walks to righties...over the last two years, 48 of his 56 walks have been issued to right-handed hitters...has surrendered both of his home runs this year and 18 of his 21 over the last two years to righties...both of the home runs this year have been solo shots as have 15 of his 21 over the last two years.

IN APRIL: Went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of April...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Gray, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...of those six, only Cahill was undefeated (Cahill started the season 6-0)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...his last four-win month was June of 2010 with Los Angeles (AL)...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 6-1 (.857) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in six of his seven starts...has hit a batter in four consecutive starts, which is tied for the second longest streak in Oakland history...the longest streak is five by Justin Duchscherer from May 13 to June 4, 2008.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game April 2 against Cleveland...tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Minnesota April 7...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Hicks in the second...the A's scored three times in the third but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a Kubel RBI double and a Suzuki RBI ground out...then retired 11 of the final 13 batters he faced.

THIRD START: He combined with Abad, Otero, Gregerson and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle April 13...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed two of the hits but had a no decision as the A's scored twice in the eighth and once in the ninth...retired each of the first 10 batters, allowed back to back singles to Miller and Cano with one out in the fourth, and then retired each of the final eight batters.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Houston April 19 in Oakland...allowed his first home run of the season, a solo shot by Villar in the third inning...also allowed a RBI single to Dominguez in the fourth and an unearned run in the fifth when Villar scored on a Norris throwing error following a steal of third...left trailing 3-1 but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

FIFTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-1 win at Houston April 24...the A's scored twice in the first and he allowed a run in the bottom of the first on a bases loaded walk to Chris Carter...blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over his final five innings.

SIXTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 win at Texas April 29...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his first run in the bottom of the fourth on a RBI double by Rios...the A's then scored five times in the fifth to make the score 9-1...he allowed two runs in the bottom of the fifth on an Andrus RBI groundout and a Fielder RBI single.

LAST START: He was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-2 loss to Seattle last Monday...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Hart RBI single and a Seager RBI ground out...the A's came back to tie the game with two runs in the fourth inning but he allowed a solo home run to Romero in the fifth and a RBI single to Miller in the sixth.

KAZMIR vs. WASHINGTON: Had a no decision in his only career start, a 7-6 Cleveland loss last year on June 15...allowed five runs in just 2.2 innings...allowed back-to-back home runs to Zimmerman and Werth in the first inning and a leadoff home run to Desmond in the second...loaded the bases with no outs in the third and allowed one run to score on a grounded into double play...a second scored on a wild pitch and he was relieved by Albers trailing 5-0...the Indians came back to take a 6-5 lead before losing 7-6

THIS SPRING: Went 1-0 with a 1.62 ERA (16.2 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 7 bb, 14 so) in four starts during the spring...held the opposition to a .155 (9 for 58) batting average...did not allow a home run in 16.2 innings...did not allow a run in three of his four starts...was scratched from his start March 17 against Chicago (NL) with left triceps stiffness.

2013 RECAP: Went from the independent Atlantic League in 2012 to a key member of the Cleveland Indians rotation, going 10-9 with a 4.04 ERA in 29 starts...it was his sixth 10-win season but his first since 2009...his 29 starts were his most since 2007, as were his 158.0 innings pitched...walked 47 batters for an average of 2.68 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...struck out 162, and his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.45 was also a career best...averaged 9.23 strikeouts per nine innings...did not qualify for the league leaders but had the seventh best strikeout per nine inning ratio among American League pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he had the fifth highest run support average (6.27)...was 3-4 with a 5.89 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his first 11 starts through June 15...then went 7-5 with a 3.06 ERA and .239 opponents average over his final 18 starts.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Chavez (2-1, 2.47 ERA): Has allowed one earned run or fewer in five of his seven starts and has a 2.47 ERA, which ranks sixth in the American League...also ranks second in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.263) and slugging percentage (.307) and is seventh in opponents batting average (.215)...has allowed a .159 batting average against right-handed hitters with one walk (.169 on-base percentage)...the on-base percentage against right-handers is the lowest in the AL and the batting average is second lowest...has not allowed a hit to a right-handed hitter over his last two starts (0 for 18)...the A's are 6-1 in his starting assignments...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-3 A's loss to Seattle last Tuesday (5.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...is 1-0 with a 2.92 ERA in seven career appearances, all in relief, against Chicago...has not faced the White Sox since July 8, 2012 at Chicago while pitching for Toronto (0.2 ip, 1 h, 2 so).

- Allowed his first run of the season Wednesday after not allowing a run over his first 14 outings (13.1 ip)...second in the AL in ERA among qualifying relievers (0.61).
- Leads Major League relievers in opponents batting average (.043), on-base percentage (.135) and slugging percentage (.043).
- Leads all Major League relievers in WHIP (0.41)...has allowed the fewest hits in the majors by a reliever (min. 10.0 ip).
- Has two career appearances against the Nationals (1.1 ip, 0 bb, 2 so).
- Has a 13-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011, which is the longest active losing streak in the majors.

MONDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (2-1, 2.47 ERA)

ONE EARNED RUN OR FEWER: Has allowed one earned run or fewer in five of his seven starts and has a 2.47 ERA, which ranks **sixth** in the American League...had a season-opening streak of four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Ranks **fourth** in the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.263) and slugging percentage (.307) and is **sixth** in opponents batting average (.215)...has walked just one batter to lead off an inning and his .250 (11 for 44) opponents on-base percentage in that situation is **10th** lowest in the AL...has allowed a .109 (10 for 92) batting average with two strike...opponents are hitting .200 (7 for 35) with runners in scoring position...has allowed three home runs, all solo shots...has a .353 (12 for 34) opponents batting average in the first inning, .178 (23 for 129) after that...the opponents number three hitter is batting .474 (9 for 19) but he has held all other hitters in the order to a .181 (26 for 144) average.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .159 (11 for 69) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .255 (24 for 94) against left-handers...has issued just one of his 10 walks to righties for a .169 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage against right-handers is the **lowest** in the American League, the batting average is **second** lowest and his .246 slugging percentage is **third** lowest...has not allowed a hit to a right-handed hitter over his last two starts (0 for 18)...over the last two years, he has held right-handed hitters to a .190 (32 for 168) batting average...has issued 23 of his 30 walks to lefties over that stretch.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (6 er in 26.0 ip) and .198 (19 for 96) opponents batting average in four starts at home compared to 1-1 with a 3.06 ERA (6 er in 17.2 ip) and .239 (16 for 67) opponents average in three starts on the road...over the last two years, he is 1-1 with a 2.43 ERA (15 er in 55.2 ip) and .189 (38 for 201) opponents batting average in 24 games on the road compared to 3-4 with a 4.37 ERA (22 er in 45.1 ip) and .263 (47 for 179) opponents average in 18 games in Oakland.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 6-1 (.857) in his starting assignments...is 2-1 with four no decisions...is **tied for third** among American League starters in no decisions (Masterson, CLE and Peavy, BOS 5)...has tossed at least six innings in five of his seven starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer six times...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk.

IN APRIL: Went 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).

AS A STARTER: Prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 2-2 with a 3.78 ERA (22 er in 52.1 ip) in nine career starts...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...was charged with an unearned run in the first inning when Almonte reached on a Callaspo error, went to second on a Punto error, third on a Miller fly out and scored on a Cano ground out...also allowed a RBI single to Almonte in the fifth to make the score 2-0...the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota April 9...struck out a career-high nine in a career-high 7.0 innings...the A's scored four times in the first inning and he allowed a solo home run to Kubel to lead off the second...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings and he was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth.

THIRD START: He had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) April 14...matched his career high with nine strikeouts and 7.0 innings pitched for the second consecutive start...allowed an unearned run in the first inning when Calhoun singled, went to second on a passed ball and scored on a Pujols single...allowed a solo home run to Pujols in the third and left after seven innings trailing 2-1.

FOURTH START: He picked up his first career win as a starter in the A's 4-1 win over Houston April 20 in Oakland...blanked the Astros on three hits and two walks over the first three innings before Gonzalez homered with two outs in the fourth...then retired seven of the final eight batters he faced...tossed a career-high 103 pitches.

FIFTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 12-5 win at Houston April 25...allowed a career-high eight hits...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a run in the third inning on an Altuve RBI double...the A's scored a run in the fourth to take a 5-1 lead but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the fourth on a Dominguez RBI single, a two-run error by Donaldson and a Castro RBI ground out...the A's scored seven times in the ninth for the win.

SIXTH START: He extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 12-1 victory at Texas April 30...did not allow a run and matched his career high by tossing 7.0 innings...yielded just one hit (Fielder two-out single in first) and one walk (Fielder, one out in fourth)...did not allow a base runner past first base.

LAST START: Was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Seattle last Tuesday...allowed three runs in the first inning on a wild pitch, a Smoak RBI double and an Ackley RBI single...the A's scored twice in the second to narrow the gap to 3-2 and he blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over innings two through five before allowing a Zunino sacrifice fly in the sixth...left after that trailing 4-2.

THIS SPRING: Went 5-1 with a save and a 2.22 ERA (28.1 ip, 22 h, 7 r, 7 er, 6 bb, 25 so, 4 hr) in seven games, five starts...the five wins were the most in the majors this spring and the most by an A's pitcher since spring win totals are available beginning in 1990...ranked second in the Cactus League in innings pitched (28.1), fourth in strikeouts (25) and eighth in ERA...allowed a .216 opponents batting average...did not allow a run in five of his seven games, including a spring-opening 13.2-inning scoreless streak.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .191 opponents batting average, including .154 (4 for 26) against left-handed hitters compared to .214 (9 for 42) against right-handers...his career splits are .163 (23 for 141) against left-handers, .290 (131 for 452) against right-handers...has surrendered 18 of his 20 career home runs to right-handers and has a .480 career slugging percentage against righties compared to .220 by lefties...has allowed a .088 (3 for 34) batting average with two strikes...opponents are 2 for 18 (.111) with no walks when leading off an inning...has yielded two home runs, both solo shots.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (9.0 ip) and .067 (2 for 30) opponents batting average in five games at home compared to 0-1 with a 2.79 ERA (3 er in 9.2 ip) and .289 (11 for 38) opponents batting average in five games on the road.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (5.0 ip) in his one start and 1-1 with a 1.98 ERA in nine relief appearances...first batters faced were 0 for 8 with a walk in his relief appearances and he stranded all three of his inherited runners...began his career with 30 consecutive starts before making his final four appearances of 2013 in relief...is 5-14 with a 5.20 ERA (79 er in 136.2 ip) in 31 career starts compared to 1-1 with a 1.45 ERA (3 er in 18.2 ip) in 13 relief appearances.

FIVE INNINGS OR FEWER: Tossed 5.0 innings in his first start and has now tossed five innings or fewer in each of his last 17 starts dating back to Aug. 1, 2012...that is the longest streak of consecutive starts of five innings or fewer by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914 (previous: Len Barker, 14 from May 21, 1985-June 10, 1987)...is 2-7 with a 5.30 ERA (41 er in 69.2 ip) over that stretch...has tossed more than five innings in just six of his 31 career starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Picked up his first win of the season last Friday against Washington and is now 1-0 with a 1.93 ERA (3 er in 14.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland compared to 0-3 with a 6.23 ERA (15 er in 21.2 ip) in four starts on the road...last year, he went 5-4 with a 3.44 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 7-5 with a 4.69 ERA in 16 games on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 13-8 with a 2.94 ERA (59 er in 180.2 ip) in 29 games in Oakland compared to 13-14 with a 4.92 ERA (110 er in 201.1 ip) in 36 games on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .207 (6 for 29) batting average with runners in scoring position...last year, opponents hit .216 with RISP, which ranked eighth in the American League...has issued 12 of his 15 walks and allowed three of his four home runs this year to right-handed hitters...has yielded 24 of his 29 home runs over the last two years to righties...has held the opponents number three and four hitters to a .125 (4 for 32) batting average.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is scheduled to make his first start against an American League Central team...went 3-1 with a 1.98 ERA in eight games against AL Central teams last year...is now 9-2 with a 1.97 ERA (22 er in 100.2 ip) in 17 career appearances against the AL Central compared to 18-20 with a 4.63 ERA (158 er in 307.1 ip) in 63 games against all others teams.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in three of his six starts this year, all losses...last year, he received just 10 runs of support in his nine losses (1.78 RSA)...has received just 22 runs of support in his 22 losses in three seasons with the A's (124.2 ip, 1.59 RSA)...has received no support 12 times over the last three years as a starter and one run of support eight times...went 11-1 with three runs of support or more in 2013 and is 21-3 in his career.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Opponents have reached base on an error twice with him pitching, which has led to three unearned runs...last year, opponents reached base on an error 11 times with him pitching, which was the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...that led to 11 unearned runs, which tied for second most in the AL...opponents have now reached base via error 24 times over the last three years, which is **red** tied for the most in the majors (Jordan Lyles)...has 25 unearned runs over that span, which is **red** tied for fourth in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: Has walked at least two batters in each of his last five starts (15 bb in 30.2 ip, 4.40 walks per nine innings)...prior to that, had never walked two or more batters in more than two consecutive starts...the A's are 1-5 (.167) in his starting assignments...went 16-10 (.615) in his 26 starting assignments last year and are 37-26 (.587) in his career...his teams are 42-26 (.618) in his 67 career starts...is **red** tied for eighth in the American League in losses (3).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss at Seattle April 11...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and two unearned runs in the second on errors by Donaldson and Lowrie...surrendered a two-run home run to Zunino in the sixth and left trailing 5-0...Hernandez shutout the A's three hits over the seven innings.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 16...allowed a run in the third inning on a Trout RBI double, but the A's scored four times in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead...put the first two batters on base in the seventh inning and was relieved by Otero, who allowed both runners to score...Gregerson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save.

RHP Sonny Gray (4-1, 1.91 ERA): Ranks second in the American League in ERA and tied for third in wins...is 8-2 with a 2.07 ERA over his last 13 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...the wins are tied for second most in the majors over that span and the ERA is fourth lowest (min. 60.0 ip)...has nine wins in 19 career appearances...the only pitchers in Oakland history to win their 10 th game in 20 appearances or fewer are Tim Hudson (18 games) and Barry Zito (19)...was named AL Pitcher of the Month for the month of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in five starts...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-2 A's win in 10 innings at Boston last Sunday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...has never faced Washington in his career...has one career interleague appearance and it came in his Major League debut on July 10, 2013 at Pittsburgh (2.0 ip, 1 h, 3 so).

2014 PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

DARIC BARTON

- Made his fourth career Opening Day start at first base March 31 against Cleveland, which matches Jason Giambi for second most in Oakland history...only Mark McGwire, with nine, has more.

ALBERTO CALLASPO

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.
- Struck out a career-high tying three times May 3 at Boston (third time, first since Sept. 23, 2012 vs. Chicago-AL).

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...it was his sixth regular season "walk-off" RBI.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a career-high 0 for 20 streak from April 2 to 6.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.

- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was also at Los Angeles on April 9, 2013.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.
