CHICAGO WHITE SOX (19-20) at OAKLAND ATHLETICS (23-15) LHP John Danks (3-2, 4.93) vs. RHP Jesse Chavez (2-1, 2.47) Game #40/Road #19 • Monday, May 12, 2014

WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have won five of their last eight games as they begin a nine-game trip tonight at Oakland.
- LHP John Danks, who has won six of his nine career starts vs. the Athletics, takes the mound for the Sox.
- Chicago is tied for second place in the American League Central, 5.0 games behind the division-leading Detroit Tigers.
- Following this three-game set at O.co Coliseum, the White Sox will continue their nine-game, 10-day trip at Houston (5/16-18) and Kansas City (5/19-21) ... the team is off on 5/15.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- Eleven of the last 13 games between Chicago and Oakland have been decided by three runs or less (the Sox are 3-8).
- The White Sox are 11-62 (.177) in the last two games but are hitting .292 (61-209) with seven home runs and 31 runs scored over the last six (5.17 runs per game).
- John Danks is 6-1 with a 2.12 ERA (15 ER/63.2 IP) and .222 opponents average (49-221) in nine career starts vs. Oakland.
- The Sox bullpen owns a 1.73 ERA (10 ER/52.0 IP) since 4/26 (15 games) ... nine games have been scoreless.
- Alexei Ramirez is tied for the American League lead with a .333 average (51-153).

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- The White Sox were limited to just four hits (one extra-base hit) and five total baserunners in a 5-1 loss to Arizona.
- Starter Hector Noesi (3 ER/6.0 IP) suffered his second loss with the White Sox despite making his first quality start ... Frank Francisco (1 ER/1.2 IP) made his White Sox debut.
- Moises Sierra tallied the White Sox only run with a solo home run in the sixth inning, his first with the club.

SALE SET FOR REHAB

- LHP Chris Sale, who has been on the disabled list since 4/22 (retro to 4/18) with a left flexor muscle strain, will make his first rehab start on Thursday with Class AAA Charlotte at Durham.
- Sale's next scheduled throw day and location will be determined following Thursday's start with the Knights.

CLETO OUTRIGHTED TO CHARLOTTE

- RHP Maikel Cleto, who was designated for assignment on 5/10, cleared waivers and has been outrighted to Class AAA Charlotte.

DANKS DELIVERS

- John Danks is 6-1 with a 2.12 ERA (15 ER/63.2 IP) and .222 opponents average (49-221) in nine career starts vs. Oakland ... five of his six wins have come at U.S. Cellular Field.
- His .857 winning percentage and 2.12 ERA both rank first among American League pitchers vs. the A's since 2007 (minimum nine starts).
- Danks has allowed two earned runs or less eight times and worked 7.0-plus IP five times.

ALEXEI'S STRONG START

- Alexei Ramirez ranks among the American League leaders in average (T1st, .333), average at home (2nd, .378), hits (2nd, 51), multihit games (2nd, 16) and average with RISP (6th, .409).
- His 51 hits are the most by a White Sox through the first 39 games in a season since Paul Konerko in 2002 (53).
- Ramirez has recorded a four-hit game, four-RBI game, game-ending home run and grand slam this season.

UP AND DOWN ON OFFENSE

- Chicago ranks among the American League leaders in runs scored (1st, 197), runs/game (2nd, 5.05), extra-base hits (3rd, 122), homers (3rd, 42) and slugging percentage (4th, .420).
- The White Sox have gone 11-62 (.177) with three extra-base hits and four runs scored over the last two games but are hitting .292 (61-209) with seven home runs and 31 runs scored over the last six games (5.17 runs per game).
- The Sox lead the American League with 18 double-digit hit efforts and rank second with eight, eight-plus run games.

BULLISH BULLPEN

- White Sox relievers own a 1.73 ERA (10 ER/52.0 IP) with 45 strikeouts since 4/26 (15 games), the lowest mark in the major leagues ... the Sox bullpen has lowered its overall ERA from 5.20 to 3.85 during that span.
- The bullpen threw 23.1 consecutive scoreless IP from 5/2-7, its longest streak since 7/31-8/12/91 (32.0 IP).

COUNTDOWN TO COOPERSTOWN

- **Frank Thomas** will be inducted into Baseball's Hall of Fame on July 27 in Cooperstown, N.Y. ... joining Thomas in the Class of 2014 are pitchers Tom Glavine and Greg Maddux and managers Bobby Cox, Tony La Russa and Joe Torre.
- "The Big Hurt", the White Sox all-time leader in most offensive categories, is one of four players in major-league history with a career .300 average, 500 home runs, 1,500 RBI and 1,000 runs scored and 1,500 walks, joining Mel Ott, Babe Ruth and Ted Williams.

WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND

- The White Sox and Oakland play seven times in 2014.
- The Sox are 4-8 over the last 12 games and have gone 15-17 since 2010, including a 5-10 mark at O.co Coliseum.
- Chicago went 2-5 in 2013, going 2-2 at home and 0-3 on the road ... all seven games were decided by three runs or less.
- The White Sox hit .204 (46-225) with five homers, owned a 2.87 ERA (20 ER/62.2 IP) and were outscored, 21-18.
- Chicago trails all-time series, 272-295, going 142-139 at home (54-57 at U.S. Cellular Field) and 130-156 at O.co Coliseum.

WESTERN WINNING WAYS

- Chicago is 79-61 (.564) vs. the American League West since 2010, the fourth-best mark in the majors ... the White Sox have gone 44-24 at home and 35-37 on the road during that span.
- By contrast, the Sox went 79-88 (.467) vs. the division from 2005-09, including a 35-48 record away from Chicago.

LEESMAN WINS WEEKLY HONOR

- Class AAA Charlotte LHP Charlie Leesman has been named International League Pitcher of the Week for 5/5-11.
- Leesman (1-2, 1.70 ERA) earned the win on 5/9 vs. Buffalo, allowing just four hits with nine strikeouts over 8.0 scoreless IP.

ROAD TRIPPIN'

- The White Sox are beginning a nine-game, 10-day trip to Oakland (5/12-14), Houston (5/16-18) and Kansas City (5/19-21) ... the team has an off day on 5/15.
- The current trip is the first of three, three-city ventures for the Sox this season (also 6/19-29 and 9/15-24).
- Chicago has won four of their last seven road games after starting the season 4-7 away from U.S. Cellular Field.

ABREU'S HISTORIC START

- Jose Abreu leads the major leagues with 13 home runs and 25 extra-base hits, ranks second with 37 RBI and 93 total bases and third with a .610 slugging percentage.
- Abreu was named AL April Player & Rookie of the Month.
- He is the first AL player, and second player ever, to be named Player and Rookie of the Month in his first month in the majors ... Yasiel Puig won the National League honors in 6/13.
- Abreu has 13 multihit efforts, three multihomer games, four four-plus RBI efforts and a game-ending grand slam this year.

THE KIDS JUST WON'T QUIT

- Chicago leads MLB with 35 ninth-inning runs this season.
- The White Sox have two wins when trailing after eight innings in 2014, matching their total from the entire 2013 season.
- Alexei Ramirez ranks among the American League leaders in batting average with two outs (1st, .422), two strikes (8th, .288) and RISP/two outs (7th, .471).

WEATHERING THE STORM

- There have been 134 games missed by Sox players who made the Opening Day roster due to being on the disabled list.
- A breakdown of the OD roster players and games missed:
 - Adam Eaton (9), Avisail Garcia (30), Nate Jones (36), Felipe Paulino (22), Chris Sale (23) and Conor Gillaspie (14) ... four of the players were in the White Sox Opening Day lineup vs. Minnesota.
- INF Gordon Beckham (22 games) and INF Jeff Keppinger (38) both started the season on the disabled list.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH

- **Ronald Belisario:** 11 games for 300 career.
- **Scott Downs:** 18 games for 600 career.
- **Adam Dunn:** Four home runs to tie Jeff Bagwell and Vladimir Guerrero (449) for 36th place all-time ... seven walks to tie John Olerud for 47th place all-time.
- **Paul Konerko:** Three RBI for 1,400 career.
- **Alexei Ramirez:** Five games at shortstop to pass Chico Carrasquel (835) for fourth-most in franchise history.

DANKS AT A GLANCE

- The 29-year-old lefty is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season and fourth on the road ... is 1-1 with a 5.89 ERA (12 ER/18.1 IP) in three road starts this season.
- Needs 12 starts for 200 in his career and 11 strikeouts to tie Richard Dotson (873) for 15th place on the White Sox all-time list.
- Recorded four consecutive quality starts to begin the season (4/5-21) ... Jake Peavy made seven straight to begin 2012 (STATS LLC).
- Went 4-14 with 4.75 ERA (73 ER/138.1 IP) and 89 strikeouts over 22 starts with the White Sox last season ... 14 losses were a career high.
- Made four injury rehabilitation starts between Class AAA Charlotte and Class AA Birmingham to begin 2013, going a combined 2-0 with a 3.18 ERA (8 ER/22.2 IP) and 15 strikeouts.
- Underwent season-ending surgery on 8/6/12 at Rush University Medical Center to repair a capsular tear and minor debridement of the rotator cuff and biceps in the left shoulder.
- Signed a five-year, \$65-million contract with the White Sox on 12/29/11.

LAST START

- Earned his third win of season on 5/7 vs. the Cubs, tossing his fifth quality start ... allowed three runs on four hits over 6.0 IP ... walked one and struck out eight ... it was his first win during Interleague play since 5/19/12 at the Cubs.
- Surrendered an RBI doubles to Emilio Bonifacio and Luis Valbuena and a solo home run to Mike Olt.
- Departed with the White Sox leading, 8-3, in the seventh ... threw 98 pitches (64 strikes) ... the eight runs of support were his most since 9/24/11 vs. Kansas City (also eight).

2014 QUICK HITS

- Sox are 3-4 in his starts ... opponents are hitting .252 (41-163) ... owns a 1.38 strikeout-to-walk ratio (29 SO/21 BB) ... has made five quality starts ... is averaging 106.7 pitches per start ... is receiving 6.00 runs of support per 9.0 IP (28 RS/42.0 IP) ... has induced three GDP ... opponents are 4-5 in stolen base attempts ... has one pickoff and three wild pitches.

A CHANGE IN SUPPORT

- Is receiving a 6.00 run support average (28 RS/42.0 IP) this season, the ninth-highest in the American League ... the White Sox have scored 13 runs over his last two starts.
- Received a career-low 3.25 RSA (50 RS/83.2 IP) last season, the fourth-lowest in the majors.
- Has received a career 4.57 run support average (585 RS/1151.2 IP) over his eight seasons with the White Sox (2007-), the eighth-lowest mark in the American League during that span.

SOUTHPAW STRUGGLES

- Left-handers are hitting .255 (12-47) with one home run over his first seven starts of the season ... lefties batted .298 (71-238) with 11 home runs and 37 RBI from 2012-13.
- Left-handers posted a .293 average (44-150) last season, the second-highest mark in his career, and a career-high .307 mark (27-88) in 2012.
- Allowed a career-high eight home runs to lefties in 2013 and 2009.

JUST A BIT OUTSIDE

- Has issued 21 walks this season (42.0 IP), tied for the fourth-most in the American League ... issued 27 walks over 138.1 IP in 2013.
- Has walked at least three in five of his seven starts and at least four in three.

MAY MAY GO AWAY

- Is 1-6 with a 6.54 ERA (55 ER/75.2 IP) over his last 13 starts in May ... opponents are hitting .302 (90-298) with 14 home runs and 52 RBI during that span.
- Has gone 10-17 with a 5.23 ERA (119 ER/204.2 IP) and .291 opponents average (238-817) in 36 career May starts ... the 5.23 ERA and .291 average against are both career monthly highs.

2013 SEASON REVIEW

- The Sox went 6-16 in his starts ... made 12 quality starts and left with the lead six times ... induced nine double plays and hit four batters ... averaged 100.1 pitches per start ... the Sox defense committed 11 errors in his starts, leading to eight unearned runs.
- Tied a career high with 28 home runs allowed (also 2009 and 2007) ... the 28 homers were tied for the sixth-most in the American League and the most by a Sox pitcher since his 2009 season.
- Made his season debut on 5/24 vs. Miami (3 ER/6.0 IP) after starting the season on the disabled list.
- Owned the best walks-per-9.0 IP (1.79) and strikeout-to-walk (3.30) ratios of his career ... walked one or fewer in 18 starts.
- Surpassed Gavin Floyd for 16th all-time on the White Sox strikeout list (833) on 9/6 at Baltimore.
- Made a career-high 12 straight starts of throwing 6.0 IP or more from 6/26-8/25, the longest such streak by a White Sox starter in 2013.
- Retired a career-high 26 consecutive batters from 6/8-6/15 (second inning) at Houston ... tied for the fifth-longest by a White Sox pitcher since 1991 (source: STATS) ... retired 30 straight at home from 6/8-26.

BASEBALL BLOODLINES

- Younger brother, Jordan, is an outfielder with Class AAA Charlotte ... became the first set of brothers to be on the Sox active roster at the same time since Roberto and Sandy Alomar in 2004.
- Jordan hit a go-ahead, solo home run in support of his brother, John, on 8/25/13 vs. Texas ... John beamed the first pitcher to start and win a game in which his brother homered as a teammate since 6/28/47 when Walker Cooper hit a home run while brother, Mort, threw a complete game for the New York Giants (Elias).

SUCCESS AGAINST THE WEST

- Is 12-8 with a 2.51 ERA (52 ER/186.2 IP) over 26 starts against the American League West since 8/11/09 ... 21 of the 26 outings have been quality, including three complete games and two shutouts ... owns a 3.04 strikeout-to-walk ratio (140 SO/46 BB) during that span.
- Has gone 18-16 with a 3.11 ERA (99 ER/286.1 IP) over 43 career starts vs. the AL West ... his 3.11 ERA is the fourth-lowest among active pitchers in baseball (min. 200.0 IP).

- Is scheduled to make his 10th career appearance vs. Oakland and third at O.co Coliseum ... is 6-1 with a 2.12 ERA (15 ER/63.2 IP) lifetime and 1-0 with a 2.03 ERA (2 ER/13.1 IP) on the road.
- His six wins are tied for the most against an opponent (also, Kansas City and Minnesota) ... has seven career wins against Seattle.
