ABOUT THE A'S: Have won a season-high five consecutive games to move to a season-high nine games over .500 at 24-15...that is the second best record in the American League and fourth best in the majors...it matches the A's best record after 39 games over the last 24 years...the 2003 A's also started the year 24-15 (won game 40)...have a season-high 3½ game lead in the AL

West...this marks the first time the A's have led the West by more than three games before the All-Star Break since 1992 when they led by as many as four games as early as June 15...are in sole possession of first place in the West for the 15th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 19 consecutive days and 32 of the last 34...the A's current five-game winning streak comes after losing five of the previous six games...are 11-10 over the last 21 games after starting the year 13-5...swept a three-game series from Washington over the weekend, their fourth sweep of the season...that is the most in the majors...have not lost more than three in a row since May 6-10, 2013 when they had a five-game losing streak...have 28 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for third and three days in fourth.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed eight runs over the last five games (46.0 ip, 1.57 ERA) and now have a 2.94 ERA for the season...that is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 2.66)...opponents are 26 for 161 (.161) over the last five games and are batting .219 for the season, which is the **lowest mark in the majors** by 11 points (Atlanta, .230)...also lead the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.284) and rank second in slugging percentage (.332).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed seven or more innings in each of the last four games...the A's are 12-1 when the starter pitches seven or more innings...starters are 4-0 with a 1.29 ERA (5 er in 35.0 ip) over the last five games after going 0-4 with a 5.91 ERA (21 er in 32.0 ip) over the previous six contests...have a 3.03 ERA (81 er in 240.2 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Detroit, 2.69)...lead the AL in innings pitched (240.2), are tied with Detroit for the fewest losses (8) and rank third in strikeouts (200)...Sonny Gray, Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez have combined for a 12-3 record and a 2.29 ERA (40 er in 157.0 ip) in 24 starts while the A's other starters are 3-5 with a 4.41 ERA (41 er in 83.2 ip) in 15 starts.

OFFENSE: The A's lead the majors in walks (170), rank second in onbase percentage (.341), tied for third in triples (10) and fourth in runs scored (192)...A's catchers are batting .328 (45 for 137), which is the best mark in the majors (Cincinnati, .323)...23 of the A's 38 home runs have come with runners on base, which is tied for third in the majors...that includes seven three-run homers, which ranks second (Toronto, 8)....are batting .235 (87 for 371) with 44 runs scored in 11 games in May (4.0 runs per game) after hitting .265 with 148 runs scored in 27 games in April (5.5 runs per game).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have a season-high five-game home winning streak, which comes on the heels of a six-game home losing streak...the losing streak matched the A's longest home losing streak over the last 13 years...are now 11-9 (.550) at home compared to 13-6 (.684) on the road...have the third best home record in the American League and the second best road record...are 5-3 on this 10-game homestand against Seattle (1-3), Washington (3-0) and Chicago-AL (1-0)...this homestand is the first of three 10-game homestands his year...the last time the A's had at least three 10-game homestands in one season was in 2002 when they had four...went 6-4 on the last road trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (3-0) and Boston (1-2)...leave Thursday for a nine-game road trip to Cleveland (three games), Tampa Bay (three games) and Toronto (three games).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's improved to 7-4 in one-run games with the win last night, which is tied for the third best record in the American League...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (5) and are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eighth innings (3)...are 8-6 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for the Major League lead in last at bat wins (Miami, Milwaukee, San Francisco) and

are second to the Marlins in last at bat games (15)...are 5-2 in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning wins and games and have the second best record...are 9-10 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 15-5 in games decided by three runs or more.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 24 for 27 (88.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 28 of their 31 (90.3%) attempts, which the third highest percentage in the majors...the A's are one of three Major League teams without a pickoff (Boston, Miami).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters have nine walks, which is more than twice as many as any American League team and second most in the majors to Washington (12)...also lead the AL with 45 pinch plate appearances...are 6 for 35 (.171) with a home run and five RBI...are tied for the AL lead in home runs and extra base hits (3) and tied for second in RBI.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used just 30 players this year...in the American League, only Boston has employed fewer players (29)...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 39 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an Oakland team since they began the 1984 season with a 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have committed 32 errors, which is tied for second most in the American League...however, are 17-7 when committing an error compared to 7-8 when going errorless...are 16-2 when scoring first, which is the best record in the AL...are 11-5 in day games, which is tied with Detroit for the best record in the AL...went 18-9 in April, which was the A's 11th consecutive winning month dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Cook, Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL eight times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's won the first meeting of 2014 last night after winning the season series last year, 5-2...swept a three-game series in Oakland and split a four-game set in Chicago...now have a six-game winning streak against the White Sox at home...since 2006, the A's have won four season series, lost two and split two...are 35-31 (.531) against Chicago over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 296-272 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 157-130 in Oakland and 139-142 in Chicago...all-time, the A's are 973-1027 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Donaldson leads the American League in go-ahead RBI (10) and is tied for the lead in go-ahead home runs (5)...leads the AI and ranks second in the majors in home runs with runners on base (7)...Sean Doolittle has not walked a batter in 20.0 innings and has a streak of 32.0 consecutive innings without a walk dating back to last year, which is tied for the second longest streak in Oakland history...Brandon Moss has 18 home runs and 61 RBI in 71 games dating back to Aug. 19 of last year...both figures are second most in the majors to Giancarlo Stanton (21 HR and 67 RBI in 77 games)...Derek Norris is batting .457 (21 for 46) with 10 walks (.554 on-base percentage) over his last 17 games...is hitting .370 overall, which is second best in the majors among players with 70 or more plate appearances (Tulowitzki, COL .395).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1981** Matt Keough improves to 6-0 as the A's defeat the Yankees at New York, 5-4...in **1986** Dave Kingman hits a three-run homer in the bottom of the 10th inning after the A's score single runs in the seventh, eighth and ninth innings in a 6-3 win over Toronto...in **2007** the A's score five times in the bottom of the ninth inning to defeat Cleveland, 10-7...Milton Bradley hits a two-run home run to tie the game and Jack Cust hits a three-run homer for the win as he homers in his fourth consecutive game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Drew Pomeranz (2-1, 1.45 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-1 with a 1.98 ERA in nine relief appearances before making his first start last Wednesday in the second game of the doubleheader against Seattle...tossed 5.0 shutout innings that day for the win and takes over Dan Straily's spot in the rotation after he was optioned to Sacramento last Friday...has allowed one earned run or fewer in each of his 10 appearances and has a 1.45 ERA in 18.2 innings...his ERA is tied for fifth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 15 or more innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .191 opponents batting average, including .154 (4 for 26) against left-handed hitters compared to .214 (9 for 42) against right-handers...his career splits are .163 (23 for 141) against left-handers, .290 (131 for 452) against right-handers...has surrendered 18 of his 20 career home runs to right-handers and has a .480 career slugging percentage against righties compared to .220 by lefties...has allowed a .088 (3 for 34) batting average with two strikes...opponents are 2 for 18 (.111) with no walks when leading off an inning...has yielded two home runs, both solo shots.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (9.0 ip) and .067 (2 for 30) opponents batting average in five games at home compared to 0-1 with a 2.79 ERA (3 er in 9.2 ip) and .289 (11 for 38) opponents batting average in five games on the road.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (5.0 ip) in his one start and 1-1 with a 1.98 ERA in nine relief appearances...first batters faced were 0 for 8 with a walk in his relief appearances and he stranded all three of his inherited runners...began his career with 30 consecutive starts before making his final four appearances of 2013 in relief...is 5-14 with a 5.20 ERA (79 er in 136.2 ip) in 31 career starts compared to 1-1 with a 1.45 ERA (3 er in 18.2 ip) in 13 relief appearances.

FIVE INNINGS OR FEWER: Tossed 5.0 innings in his first start and has now tossed five innings or fewer in each of his last 17 starts dating back to Aug. 1, 2012...that is the longest streak of consecutive starts of five innings or fewer by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914 (previous: Len Barker, 14 from May 21, 1985-June 10, 1987)...is 2-7 with a 5.30 ERA (41 er in 69.2 ip) over that stretch...has tossed more than five innings in just six of his 31 career starts.

LAST 20 STARTS: Is 2-10 with a 6.07 ERA (56 er in 83.0 ip) and .290 (95 for 328) opponents batting average over his last 20 starting assignments dating back to July 15, 2012...that includes 0-4 with an 8.10 ERA and .358 opponents batting average in his four starts last year.

LAST START: He combined with Dan Otero and Jim Johnson on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win in the second game of the doubleheader last Wednesday against Seattle...it was his first win as a starter since Sept. 26, 2012 against Chicago (NL)...tossed 5.0 innings and allowed two of the hits: a two-out single by Cano in the first and a one out single by Smoak in the fourth...allowed just one base runner as far as second base.

POMERANZ vs. CHICAGO: Is making his first career appearance and start.

THIS SPRING: Was 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA (12.2 ip, 13 h, 7 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 20 so, 2 hr) in eight games this spring, all in relief...opponents hit .250...averaged 14.21 strikeouts per nine innings...had more strikeouts than innings pitched in six of his eight appearances...had an 8.10 ERA over his first three games...allowed just one earned run over his final five contests (9.1 ip, 0.96 ERA)

2013 RECAP: Was 0-4 with a 6.23 ERA in eight games, including four starts, over two stints with Colorado...walked 19 and struck out 19 in 21.2 innings...allowed a .301 opponents batting average, including .130 (3-for-23) against left-handed hitters compared to .367 (22-for-60) against right-handers...issued 16 of his 19 walks and yielded nine of his 10 extra base hits to righties...had a .405 OPS against lefties compared to 1.150 against righties...held opponents to a .190 average with runners in scoring position, including .091 with RISP and two outs...has a .182 (12-for-66) career average with RISP and two outs...was 0-2 with a 4.61 ERA and .255 opponents average in six games at Coors Field, 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA and .375 opponents average in two starts on the road...in three seasons with the Rockies, he went 2-7 with a 4.40 ERA in 19 games at home compared to 2-7 with a 6.20 ERA (42 er in 61.0 ip) in 15 games on the road...opponents batted .158 when leading off an inning...tossed 4.1 innings or fewer, allowed three runs or more and walked four batters or more in each of his four starts

2013 WITH COLORADO: Was recalled for the first time June 30 and went 0-4 with an 8.10 ERA and .358 opponents batting average in four starts...walked 18 in 16.2 innings while striking out just 13...was optioned to Colorado Springs July 11 but was recalled July 22 and placed on the disabled list the next day with left biceps tendinitis...was reinstated Sept. 6 and pitched in relief for the first time in his career...did not allow a run while holding opponents to a .063 batting average in four relief outings (5.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 6 so)...did not inherit a runner and retired all four of his first batters faced

2013 WITH COLORADO SPRINGS: Began the season at Triple-A Colorado Springs and went 8-1 with a 4.20 ERA in 15 starts before the Rockies called June 30...struck out 96 batters in 85.2 innings, an average of 10.1 per nine innings...yielded just six home runs, average of 0.63 per nine innings...despite spending just three months with the Sky Sox, he led the club in wins and strikeouts...allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .180 (18-for-100) against left-handed hitters compared to .290 (65-for-224) against righthanders...however, surrendered four of his six home runs to lefties...opponents hit .217 with the bases empty compared to .306 with runners on base...including .329 with runners in scoring position...logged a 1.20 ERA in the first inning and had a 3.00 ERA over the first four innings of a game compared to 7.01 from the fifth inning on...the Sky Sox were 13-2 (.867) in his starting inning on...the Sky Sox were 13-2 (.867) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in six of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 10 times...did not allow a run in two of his first three starts...including April 13 at Las Vegas when he allowed a season high six runs on a season-high nine hits in 5.0 innings...picked up his first win of the season in that game, an 11-6 Sky Sox victory...went 4-0 with a 2.54 ERA in five starts in the month of April...extended his season-opening winning streak to six games May 16 at Round Rock...had a 3.22 ERA over that eight-start stretch...was charged with his only loss of the season May 21 at Albuquerque and went 2-1 with a 5.27 ERA over his final seven Triple-A starts...struck out a season-high 11 batters in 6.2 shutout innings June 16 at Las Vegas...left with a 6-0 lead but had a no decision in a 9-7 win...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings for the win in his final Triple-A start June 21 against Tacoma...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in wins (8) and strikeouts (96) at the time of his promotion to Colorado June 30...was optioned to Colorado Springs 11 but did not appear in a game before he was sent to Double-A Tulsa July 16...started and lost that day against Northwest Arkansas (5.1 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 7 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...recalled by Colorado July 22 and was placed on the DL the next day.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Tommy Milone (1-3, 4.54 ERA): Picked up his first win of the season last Friday against Washington when he combined with Fernando Rodriguez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win (8.0 ip, 2 h, 3 bb, 7 so)...is now 1-0 with a 1.93 ERA in two starts in Oakland compared to 0-3 with a 6.23 ERA in four starts on the road....in three seasons with the A's, he is 13-8 with a 2.94 ERA in 29 games in Oakland compared to 13-14 with a 4.92 ERA in 36 games on the road....has allowed a .207 batting average with runners in scoring position...has held the opponents number three and four hitters to a .125 batting average...has walked at least two batters in each of his last five starts...prior to that, had never walked two or more batters in more than two consecutive starts...is 1-0 with a 0.60 ERA (15.0 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in two career starts against Chicago...is 9-2 with a 1.97 ERA in 17 career appearances against the American League Central compared to 18-20 with a 4.63 ERA in 63 games against all others teams.

- The A's bullpen has allowed six earned runs over its last 10 outings (29.1 ip, 19 h, 10 r, 6 er, 7 bb, 24 so, 1.84 ERA)...allowed 11 earned runs over its previous five games (12.2 ip, 7.82 ERA)...its 2.75 ERA is first in the American League...is the only team in the AL with a sub-3.00 ERA.
- Have just four save opportunities and two saves since April 20 (21 games)...team is 11-10 during stretch...tied for the third fewest saves in the AL...one of two teams in the AL that does not have a player with more than three saves (Houston).
- Seven blown saves are the second most in the AL (Houston, 8).
- Its 16 decisions this season are the most among AL bullpens.
- Nine wins are the most among AL bullpens.
- First in the AL in opponents batting average (.215), on-base percentage (.280) and slugging percentage (.297)...has allowed the fewest runs (40) and the third fewest walks (38) in the AL.

WEDNESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Tommy Milone (1-3, 4.54 ERA)

HOME AND AWAY: Picked up his first win of the season last Friday against Washington and is now 1-0 with a 1.93 ERA (3 er in 14.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland compared to 0-3 with a 6.23 ERA (15 er in 21.2 ip) in four starts on the road...last year, he went 5-4 with a 3.44 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 7-5 with a 4.69 ERA in 16 games on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 13-8 with a 2.94 ERA (59 er in 180.2 ip) in 29 games in Oakland compared to 13-14 with a 4.92 ERA (110 er in 201.1 ip) in 36 games on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .207 (6 for 29) batting average with runners in scoring position...last year, opponents hit .216 with RISP, which ranked eighth in the American League...has issued 12 of his 15 walks and allowed three of his four home runs this year to right-handed hitters...has yielded 24 of his 29 home runs over the last two years to righties...has held the opponents number three and four hitters to a .125 (4 for 32) batting average.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is scheduled to make his first start against an American League Central team...went 3-1 with a 1.98 ERA in eight games against AL Central teams last year...is now 9-2 with a 1.97 ERA (22 er in 100.2 ip) in 17 career appearances against the AL Central compared to 18-20 with a 4.63 ERA (158 er in 307.1 ip) in 63 games against all others teams.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in three of his six starts this year, all losses...last year, he received just 10 runs of support in his nine losses (1.78 RSA)...has received just 22 runs of support in his 22 losses in three seasons with the A's (124.2 ip, 1.59 RSA)...has received no support 12 times over the last three years as a starter and one run of support eight times...went 11-1 with three runs of support or more in 2013 and is 21-3 in his career.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Opponents have reached base on an error twice with him pitching, which has led to three unearned runs...last year, opponents reached base on an error 11 times with him pitching, which was the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...that led to 11 unearned runs, which tied for second most in the AL...opponents have now reached base via error 24 times over that st three years, which is tied for the most in the majors (Jordan Lyles)...has 25 unearned runs over that span, which is tied for fourth in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: Has walked at least two batters in each of his last five starts (15 bb in 30.2 ip, 4.40 walks per nine innings)...prior to that, had never walked two or more batters in more than two consecutive starts...the A's are 1-5 (.167) in his starting assignments...went 16-10 (.615) in his 26 starting assignments last year and are 37-26 (.587) in his career...his teams are 42-26 (.618) in his 67 career starts...is tied for eighth in the American League in losses (3).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss at Seattle April 11...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and two unearned runs in the second on errors by Donaldson and Lowrie...surrendered a two-run home run to Zunino in the sixth and left trailing 5-0...Hernandez shutout the A's three hits over the seven innings.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 16...allowed a run in the third inning on a Trout RBI double, but the A's scored four times in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead...put the first two batters on base in the seventh inning and was relieved by Otero, who allowed both runners to score...Gregerson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Texas April 22 in Oakland...walked a career-high tying four batters...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Murphy RBI single and a Chirinos bases loaded walk...the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first but he allowed a run in the third when Rios scored on a Kouzmanoff grounded into double play...the A's then scored twice in the fourth to take the lead...left after six innings with a 4-3 lead but Gregerson allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss at Houston April 27...allowed just one run over the first six innings and that was in the third inning when Villar doubled and later scored on a Fowler ground out...then allowed a two-out two-run triple to Villar in the seventh inning...was relieved by Otero, who allowed Villar to score on an Altuve home run...McHugh shutout the A's on one hit over the first eight innings before Callaspo had a RBI single in the ninth.

RHP Sonny Gray (4-1, 1.91 ERA): Ranks second in the American League in ERA and tied for third in wins...is 8-2 with a 2.07 ERA over his last 13 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...the wins are tied for second most in the majors over that span and the ERA is fourth lowest (min. 60.0 ip)...has nine wins in 19 career appearances...the only pitchers in Oakland history to win their 10th game in 20 appearances or fewer are Tim Hudson (18 games) and Barry Zito (19)...was named AL Pitcher of the Month for the month of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in five starts...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-2 A's win in 10 innings at Boston last Sunday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...has never faced Washington in his career...has one career interleague appearance and it came in his Major League debut on July 10, 2013 at Pittsburgh (2.0 ip, 1 h, 3 so).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks third in the American League in ERA (2.17) and tied for fifth in wins (4)...is also tied for second in complete games (1) and shutouts (1), tied for third in grounded into double plays (7) and ranks fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.318)...also ranks second in wild pitches (6).

SIX INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Has tossed six innings or more and allowed three runs or fewer in each of his first eight starts, which is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-0 with a 1.80 ERA (7 er in 35.0 ip) in five starts at night compared to 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA (6 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts during the day...his career numbers are 5-1 with a 1.76 ERA (14 er in 71.2 ip) in 12 night games, 4-3 with a 3.50 ERA (18 er in 46.1 ip) in eight day games.

WINS: Has four wins this year and nine in 20 career appearances...the only pitchers in Oakland history to win their 10th game in 21 appearances or fewer are Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20 games) and Bill Krueger (20 games).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 3-0 with a 2.37 ERA (10 er in 38.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-1 with a 1.69 ERA (3 er in 16.0 ip) in two starts on four days rest...his career numbers are 6-1 with a 2.03 ERA (15 er in 66.2 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more, 3-3 with a 3.23 ERA (17 er in 47.1 ip) in seven starts on four days rest.

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the month of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in five starts...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-0 with a 1.31 ERA (5 er in 34.1 ip) and .172 (21 for 122) opponents batting average in five starts during the day compared to 2-1 with a 4.24 ERA (8 er in 17.0 ip) and .294 (20 for 68) opponents average in three starts at night...ranks fifth in the American League in day ERA...last year, he went 5-2 with a 3.27 ERA in 10 starts during the day compared to 5-7 with a 4.46 ERA in 19 starts at night...is now 8-2 with a 2.52 ERA (25 er in 89.1 ip) in 15 starts during the day over the last two years and 7-8 with a 4.43 ERA (59 er in 120.0 ip) in 22 starts at night.
