CHICAGO WHITE SOX (19-21) at OAKLAND ATHLETICS (24-15) RHP Scott Carroll (1-2, 3.63) vs. LHP Drew Pomeranz (2-1, 1.45) Game #41/Road #20 • Tuesday, May 13, 2014

WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost three straight games and four of their last five as they continue their trip tonight at Oakland.
- RHP Scott Carroll, who is making his fourth major-league start (second on the road), takes the mound for the White Sox.
- Chicago is tied for third place in the American League Central, 6.0 games behind the division-leading Detroit Tigers.
- Following this three-game set at O.co Coliseum, the White Sox will continue their nine-game, 10-day trip at Houston (5/16-18) and Kansas City (5/19-21) ... the team is off on 5/15.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- Twelve of the last 14 games between Chicago and Oakland have been decided by three runs or less (the Sox are 3-9).
- The White Sox are tied for second in the American League, and third in baseball, with a .279 average with RISP (102-366), but are just 2-10 (.200) over the last three games.
- White Sox starters own a 2.51 ERA (8 ER/28.2 IP) and .221 opponents average (23-104) over the last five road starts.
- Jose Abreu is hitting .357 (10-28) with three doubles, two homers and three RBI in his last seven games (hit safely in six).
- Ronald Belisario has not allowed an earned run in his last 12.0 IP (eight games) ... surrendered four hits during that span.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- Leury Garcia struck out with the tying run on second as Chicago's ninth-inning rally fell just short in its 5-4 loss at Oakland.
- The White Sox scored three runs on three hits in the ninth after tallying one on four in the first eight frames ... Jose Abreu (homers), Alexei Ramirez (single) and Paul Konerko (sacrifice fly) each collected a RBI in the final inning.
- John Danks (3 ER/6.0 IP) suffered his third loss despite making his sixth quality start ... Daniel Webb allowed two runs on two hits with four walks and three wild pitches in 1.0 IP of relief.
- Abreu's homer was his MLB-leading 14th of the season ... Dayan Viciedo connected on his third homer in the second.

MINOR PROMOTION

- INF Micah Johnson has been promoted from Class AA Birmingham to Class AAA Charlotte.
- Johnson hit .329 (48-146) with nine doubles, a triple, three home runs, 16 RBI, 18 runs scored and 10 stolen bases over 37 games with the Barons (30 games at second base).
- He ranks among the Southern League leaders in average (1st), hits (1st), total bases (3rd, 68) and OBP (5th, .414).

NINTH-INNING NUMBERS

- Chicago scored three runs in the ninth last night and leads baseball with 38 runs in the frame (Oakland is second with 23).
- The Sox rank among the MLB ninth-inning leaders in slugging percentage (1st, .496), on-base percentage (2nd, .391), average (2nd, .293), hits (3rd, 39) and home runs (3rd, 5).
- By contrast, the White Sox hit .228 (113-495) with 13 homers and 45 runs scored in the ninth inning last season.

ROUGH ROAD

- The White Sox are concluding a stretch where they play 23 of 33 games against 2013 American League playoff teams.
- The Sox are 10-11 vs. the postseason clubs, going 1-2 vs. Boston, 4-3 vs. Cleveland, 2-4 vs. Detroit, 0-1 vs. Oakland and 4-3 vs. Tampa Bay.
- Following this series at Oakland, Chicago will play 10 consecutive games and 13 of 16 vs. non-playoff teams from 2013.

ABREU IS AWESOME

- Jose Abreu leads the major leagues with 14 home runs, 26 extra-base hits and 98 total bases and ranks second with 38 RBI, a .620 slugging percentage and 11.29 AB/HR ratio.
- Abreu is the seventh player in major-league history to hit 14-plus homers in his first 40 career games.
- He was named AL April Player and Rookie of the Month, the second player (Yasiel Puig) to win both honors in his first month in the majors.

UP AND DOWN ON OFFENSE

- Chicago ranks among the American League leaders in runs scored (1st, 201), runs/game (2nd, 5.03), extra-base hits (3rd, 126), homers (3rd, 44) and slugging percentage (4th, .420).
- The White Sox have gone 18-95 (.189) with seven extra-base hits and eight runs scored over the last three games but are hitting .281 (68-242) with nine home runs and 35 runs scored over the last seven games (5.0 runs per game).
- The Sox lead the American League with 18 10-plus hit games and are tied for second with eight eight-plus run efforts.

COUNTDOWN TO COOPERSTOWN

- **Frank Thomas** will be inducted into Baseball's Hall of Fame on July 27 in Cooperstown, N.Y. ... joining Thomas in the Class of 2014 are pitchers Tom Glavine and Greg Maddux and managers Bobby Cox, Tony La Russa and Joe Torre.
- "The Big Hurt", the White Sox all-time leader in most offensive categories, is one of four players in major-league history with a career .300 average, 500 home runs, 1,500 RBI and 1,000 runs scored and 1,500 walks, joining Mel Ott, Babe Ruth and Ted Williams.

WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND

- Oakland leads the season series, 1-0, after last night's win.
- The Sox are 4-9 over the last 13 games and have gone 15-18 since 2010, including a 5-11 mark at O.co Coliseum.
- Chicago went 2-5 in 2013, going 2-2 at home and 0-3 on the road ... all seven games were decided by three runs or less.
- The White Sox are hitting .212 (7-33) with two homers, a 5.63 ERA (5 ER/8.0 IP) and have been outscored, 5-4, in 2014.
- Chicago trails all-time series, 272-296, going 142-139 at home (54-57 at U.S. Cellular Field) and 130-157 at O.co Coliseum.

WESTERN WINNING WAYS

- Chicago is 79-62 (.560) vs. the American League West since 2010, the fourth-best mark in the majors ... the White Sox have gone 44-24 at home and 35-38 on the road during that span.
- By contrast, the Sox went 79-88 (.467) vs. the division from 2005-09, including a 35-48 record away from Chicago.

BULLISH BULLPEN

- Sox relievers have allowed 10 earned runs over the last five games (16.1 IP) since recording a 23.1 consecutive scoreless IP from 5/2-7 (longest streak since 7/31-8/12/91, 32.0 IP).
- The bullpen owns a 2.00 ERA (12 ER/54.0 IP) with 48 strikeouts and a .158 average (30-190) since 4/26 (16 games), lowering its season ERA from 5.20 to 3.92 during that span.
- The 2.00 mark is the second-lowest in MLB since 4/26.

ALEXEI'S STRONG START

- Alexei Ramirez ranks among the American League leaders in average (2nd, .331), average at home (2nd, .378), hits (2nd, 52), multihit games (T2nd, 16) and average with RISP (4th, .422).
- His 52 hits are the most by a White Sox through the first 40 games in a season since Paul Konerko in 2002 (54).
- Ramirez has recorded a four-hit game, four-RBI game, game-ending home run and grand slam this season.

THE KIDS JUST WON'T QUIT

- The White Sox have two wins when trailing after eight innings in 2014, matching their total from the entire 2013 season.
- Alexei Ramirez ranks among the American League leaders in batting average with two outs (1st, .413), two strikes (5th, .302) and RISP/two outs (8th, .471).
- Jose Abreu is tied for the AL lead with five homers in the seventh inning or later ... Marcus Semien (3) is tied for eighth.

SALE SET FOR REHAB

- LHP Chris Sale, who has been on the disabled list since 4/22 (retro to 4/18) with a left flexor muscle strain, will make his first rehab start on Thursday with Class AAA Charlotte at Durham.
- Sale's next scheduled throw day and location will be determined following Thursday's start with the Knights.

WEATHERING THE STORM

- There have been 139 games missed by Sox players who made the Opening Day roster due to being on the disabled list.
- A breakdown of the OD roster players and games missed:
 - Adam Eaton (10), Avisail Garcia (31), Nate Jones (37), Felipe Paulino (23), Chris Sale (24) and Conor Gillaspie (14) ... four of the players were in the White Sox Opening Day lineup vs. Minnesota.
- INF Gordon Beckham (22 games) and INF Jeff Keppinger (39) both started the season on the disabled list.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH

- **Ronald Belisario:** 11 games for 300 career.
- **Scott Downs:** 17 games for 600 career.
- **Adam Dunn:** Four home runs to tie Jeff Bagwell and Vladimir Guerrero (449) for 36th place all-time ... seven walks to tie John Olerud for 47th place all-time.
- **Paul Konerko:** Two RBI for 1,400 career.
- **Alexei Ramirez:** Four games at shortstop to pass Chico Carrasquel (835) for fourth-most in franchise history.

CARROLL AT A GLANCE

- The 29-year-old right-hander makes his fourth major league start and second on the road... had his contract purchased from Class AAA Charlotte on 4/27.
- Became just the third pitcher in White Sox history to allow one earned run or less in each of his first two career appearances (Kip Wells in 1999 and Fred Klages in 1966).
- Was named International League Pitcher of the Week for the period of 4/7-13 ... went 3-0 in his first three starts of the season at Charlotte, allowing two unearned runs over 19.0 IP.
- Went 3-1 with a 1.57 ERA (4 ER/23.0 IP) and a .228 (18-79) opponents average over four starts with the Knights this season ... held righties to a .185 average (5-27).
- Combined to go 0-2 with a 3.29 ERA (15 ER/41.0 IP) and 29 strikeouts over 11 starts between Advanced Rookie Bristol and Class AA Birmingham in 2013.
- Was signed by the White Sox as a free agent on 7/12/12 ... was drafted by Cincinnati in the third round of the June 2007 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST START

- Suffered his first career loss on 5/8 vs.the Cubs, allowing six runs on 11 hits over 4.0 IP ... walked and struck out two.
- Surrendered two-run home runs to Anthony Rizzo in the third inning and Starlin Castro in the fourth.
- Departed the game with the White Sox trailing, 6-4 ... threw 90 pitches (55 strikes).

AGE IS JUST A NUMBER

- Made his major-league debut at the age of 29, becoming the oldest White Sox to make his debut as a starting pitcher since Ernesto Escarrega (32 years) on 4/26/82-2 vs. Boston.
- The last Chicago player to make his major-league debut at the age of 29 or older was Tadahito Iguchi (30) on 4/5/05 vs. Cleveland.

A STARTING DEBUT

- Is the 17th White Sox pitcher to make his major-league debut in a starting role since 2000.
- Became the first Sox starter to earn the win in their major-league debut (4/27) as a starter since Lucas Harrell on 7/30/10 vs. Oakland.
- The previous 16 Chicago pitchers making their debuts as a starter were a combined 1-7 with a 7.70 ERA (67 ER/78.1 IP).

2013 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

- Began the season on the disabled list with a right elbow injury ... made five rehab starts with Advanced Rookie Bristol, going 0-0 with a 1.69 ERA (3 ER/16.0 IP).
- Was reinstated from the disabled list on 8/2 and assigned to Class AA Birmingham ... went 0-2 with a 4.32 ERA (12 ER/25.0 IP) over six starts with the Barons.
- Lefties batted .233 (10-43) during his time with Birmingham (righties hit .263, 15-57).
- Tossed 8.0 scoreless IP over his last two starts of season ... was removed from his last start after 3.0 IP with a strained right elbow on 8/30 vs. Montgomery.
- Missed the rest of the season after being placed on the disabled list on 8/31.

CAREER MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS

- Has gone 27-38 with a 3.95 ERA (281 ER/639.2 IP) and 385 strikeouts in 138 appearances (107 starts) over eight seasons between the Cincinnati and White Sox organizations ... is 24-33 with a 3.77 ERA (242 ER/578.1 IP) as a starter.
- Struck out a career-high 85 batters with Class AAA Louisville in 2011 and tied a career high with seven wins (also in 2008).
- Was a non-roster invitee to his first spring training with the Reds in 2010.
- Tossed 18.0 consecutive scoreless IP over three starts from 7/14-25/08, allowing just one run during that span (22.0 IP) ... was named Florida State League Pitcher of the Week for the period of 7/14-20/08.

VS. OAKLAND ATHLETICS

- Will make his first career appearance against Oakland.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER

- RHP Andre Rienzo (3-0, 4.56 ERA) is scheduled to make his sixth appearance (fifth start) of the season ... is 3-0 with a 4.76 ERA (12 ER/22.2 IP) over his four starts in 2014.
- Earned the win in his last start on 5/9 vs. Arizona, allowing three runs (all earned) on four hits over 5.2 IP ... walked two and struck out three.
- Went 2-3 with a 4.82 ERA (30 ER/56.0 IP), 38 strikeouts and .253 opponents average (55-217) over 10 starts with the White Sox in 2013.
- Will make his first career appearance vs. Oakland.
