ABOUT THE A'S: Have a season-high six-game winning streak and are a season-high 10 games over .500 at 25-15...that is the second best record in the American League and tied for third best in the majors...it matches the A's best record after 40 games over the last 24 years (2003)...with a win today, the A's would have their best record after 41 games since 1990 (29-12)...have a

season-high four game lead in the AL West...this marks the first time the A's have led the West by at least four games before the All-Star Break since 1992 when they led by as many as four games as early as June 15...the last time the A's led the by West by more than four games before the All-Star Break was in 1990 when they led by as many as 5½ games as early as May 9...swept a three-game series from Washington over the weekend, their fourth sweep of the season...that is the most in the majors...are in sole possession of first place in the West for the 16th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 20 consecutive days and 33 of the last 35...have 29 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...the A's current six-game winning streak comes after losing five of the previous six games...are 12-10 over the last 22 games after starting the year 13-5...have not lost more than three in a row since May 6-10, 2013 when they had a five-game losing streak.

SIX-GAME WINNING STREAK: The A's have outscored the opposition 39-8 during the current six-game winning streak...the pitching staff has compiled a 1.31 ERA (8 er in 55.0 ip) and allowed a .158 (30 for 190) opponents batting average...starters have a 1.13 ERA (5 er in 40.0 ip) and five of the wins...the offense is batting .305 (64 for 210) with 11 home runs.

PITCHING: The A's recorded their third shutout in the last six games last night...it was their fifth of the season, which ranks third in the American League...now have a 2.86 ERA, which ranks second in the majors (Atlanta, 2.66)...lead the majors in opponents batting average (.217), on-base percentage (.282) and slugging percentage (.327)...also lead the majors with a .192 (60 for 312) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run in four of the last six games...have a 2.97 ERA (81 er in 245.2 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Detroit, 2.66)...lead the AL in innings pitched (245.2), are tied with Detroit for the fewest losses (8) and rank third in strikeouts (208)...Sonny Gray, Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez have combined for a 12-3 record and a 2.29 ERA (40 er in 157.0 ip) in 24 starts while the A's other starters are 4-5 with a 4.16 ERA (41 er in 88.2 ip) in 16 starts.

OFFENSE: The A's lead the majors in walks (173), rank second in runs scored (203) and on-base percentage (.344), tied for fourth in triples (10) and seventh in home runs (41), batting average (.259) and slugging percentage (.411)...A's catchers are batting .326 (46 for 141), which is the best mark in the majors (Milwaukee, .317)...26 of the A's 41 home runs have come with runners on base, which is tied with Toronto for the most in the majors...that includes seven three-run homers, which is tied for second (Toronto, 8).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have a season-high six-game home winning streak, which comes on the heels of a season-high six-game home losing streak...the losing streak matched the A's longest home losing streak over the last 13 years...are now 12-9 (.550) at home compared to 13-6 (.684) on the road...have the third best home record in the American League and the second best road record...are 6-3 on this 10-game homestand against Seattle (1-3), Washington (3-0) and Chicago-AL (2-0)...this homestand is the first of three 10-game homestands this year...the last time the A's had at least three 10-game homestands in one season was in 2002 when they had four...went 6-4 on the last road trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (3-0) and Boston (1-2)...leave tomorrow for a nine-game road trip to Cleveland (three games), Tampa Bay (three games) and Toronto (three games).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (5) and are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eighth innings (3)...are 8-6 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied for the Major League lead in last at bat wins (Miami, Milwaukee, San Francisco) and are second to the Marlins in last at bat games

(15)...are 5-2 in extra inning games...lead the American League in extra inning wins and games and have the second best record...are 7-4 in one-run games, which is tied for the third best record in the AL...are 9-10 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 16-5 in games decided by three runs or more.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 24 for 27 (88.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 28 of their 31 (90.3%) attempts, which the third highest percentage in the majors...the A's are one of two Major League teams without a pickoff (Miami).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 6 for 36 (.167) with nine walks, two doubles, a home run and five RBI...lead the American League in walks and plate appearances (46), are tied for the lead in home runs and extra base hits (3) and tied for second in RBI.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used just 30 players this year...in the American League, only Boston has employed fewer players (29)...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 40 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an Oakland team since they began the 1984 season with a 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 11-5 in day games, which is tied with Detroit for the best record in the AL...have committed 32 errors, which is tied for second most in the AL...however, are 17-7 when committing an error compared to 8-8 when going errorless...are 17-2 when scoring first, which is the best record in the AL...are 7-5 in May after going 18-9 in April...have a streak of 11 consecutive months with a winning record dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Cook, Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL eight times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's have won the first two meetings of 2014 and have now won each of their last seven games against Chicago in Oakland...the seven-game home winning streak is the A's second longest against the White Sox in the Coliseum (10, May 18, 2001-May 6, 2003)...have four shutouts during the streak...won the season series last year, 5-2...swept a three-game series in Oakland and split a four-game set in Chicago...since 2006, the A's have won four season series, lost two and split two...are 36-31 (.537) against Chicago over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 297-272 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 158-130 in Oakland and 139-142 in Chicago...all-time, the A's are 974-1027 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Donaldson leads the AL in go-ahead RBI (10) and is tied for the lead in go-ahead home runs (5)...is tied with Brandon Moss for the AL lead in home runs with runners on base (7)...Sean Doolittle has not walked a batter in 20.0 innings and has a streak of 32.0 consecutive innings without a walk dating back to last year, which is tied for the second longest streak in Oakland history...John Jaso has back-to-back three-hit games for the first time in his career (6 for 10) and is batting .455 (15 for 33) with four walks and a hit by pitch (.526 on-base percentage) over his last 10 games...Brandon Moss has 36 home runs and 104 RBI over his last 162 games...has 20 home runs and 66 RBI in 72 games dating back to Aug. 19 of last year, which are second most in the majors to Giancarlo Stanton (21 HR and 67 RBI in 78 games)...Derek Norris is batting .440 (22 for 50) with 11 walks (.541 on-base percentage) over his last 18 games...is hitting .365 overall, which ranks second in the majors among players with 70 or more plate appearances (Tulowitzki, COL .394).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1941** the A's walk 19 times against St. Louis but lose 10-5...in **1988** Bob Welch tosses a five hit shutout as the A's win at Baltimore, 8-0...in **1995** Geronimo Berroa and Terry Steinbach have four RBI each in the A's 12-3 win at Minnesota...the A's hit five home runs, including two by Berroa.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Tommy Milone (1-3, 4.54 ERA)

HOME AND AWAY: Picked up his first win of the season last Friday against Washington and is now 1-0 with a 1.93 ERA (3 er in 14.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland compared to 0-3 with a 6.23 ERA (15 er in 21.2 ip) in four starts on the road...last year, he went 5-4 with a 3.44 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 7-5 with a 4.69 ERA in 16 games on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 13-8 with a 2.94 ERA (59 er in 180.2 ip) in 29 games in Oakland compared to 13-14 with a 4.92 ERA (110 er in 201.1 ip) in 36 games on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .207 (6 for 29) batting average with runners in scoring position...last year, opponents hit .216 with RISP, which ranked eighth in the American League...has issued 12 of his 15 walks and allowed three of his four home runs this year to right-handed hitters...has yielded 24 of his 29 home runs over the last two years to righties...has held the opponents number three and four hitters to a .125 (4 for 32) batting average.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is scheduled to make his first start against an American League Central team...went 3-1 with a 1.98 ERA in eight games against AL Central teams last year...is now 9-2 with a 1.97 ERA (22 er in 100.2 ip) in 17 career appearances against the AL Central compared to 18-20 with a 4.63 ERA (158 er in 307.1 ip) in 63 games against all others teams.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in three of his six starts this year, all losses...last year, he received just 10 runs of support in his nine losses (1.78 RSA)...has received just 22 runs of support in his 22 losses in three seasons with the A's (124.2 ip, 1.59 RSA)...has received no support 12 times over the last three years as a starter and one run of support eight times...went 11-1 with three runs of support or more in 2013 and is 21-3 in his career.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Opponents have reached base on an error twice with him pitching, which has led to three unearned runs...last year, opponents reached base on an error 11 times with him pitching, which was the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...that led to 11 unearned runs, which tied for second most in the AL...opponents have now reached base via error 24 times over the last three years, which is tied for the most in the majors (Jordan Lyles)...has 25 unearned runs over that span, which is tied for fifth in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: Has walked at least two batters in each of his last five starts (15 bb in 30.2 ip, 4.40 walks per nine innings)...prior to that, had never walked two or more batters in more than two consecutive starts...the A's are 1-5 (.167) in his starting assignments...went 16-10 (.615) in his 26 starting assignments last year and are 37-26 (.587) in his career...his teams are 42-26 (.618) in his 67 career starts...is tied for 10th in the American League in losses (3).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss at Seattle April 11...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and two unearned runs in the second on errors by Donaldson and Lowrie...surrendered a two-run home run to Zunino in the sixth and left trailing 5-0...Hernandez shutout the A's three hits over the seven innings.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 16...allowed a run in the third inning on a Trout RBI double, but the A's scored four times in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead...put the first two batters on base in the seventh inning and was relieved by Otero, who allowed both runners to score...Gregerson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Texas April 22 in Oakland...walked a career-high tying four batters...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Murphy RBI single and a Chirinos bases loaded walk...the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first but he allowed a run in the third when Rios scored on a Kouzmanoff grounded into double play...the A's then scored twice in the fourth to take the lead...left after six innings with a 4-3 lead but Gregerson allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss at Houston April 27...allowed just one run over the first six innings and that was in the third inning when Villar doubled and later scored on a Fowler ground out...then allowed a two-out two-run triple to Villar in the seventh inning...was relieved by Otero, who allowed Villar to score on an Altuve home run...McHugh shutout the A's on one hit over the first eight innings before Callaspo had a RBI single in the ninth.

FIFTH START: He fell to 0-3 in the A's 6-3 loss at Boston May 3...matched his career-highs by walking four batters (sixth time) and

LAST START: He combined with Fernando Rodriguez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Washington last Friday...tossed eight innings and allowed two of the hits, both to Hairston...also walked three batters but allowed just two base runners as far as second base.

MILONE vs. CHICAGO: Is 1-0 with a 0.60 ERA (15.0 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in two career starts...had a no decision in his only start last year, a 4-1 A's loss at Chicago June 8...tossed a career-high 118 pitches...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a lead-off home run to Dunn in the bottom of the second inning...that was the only run he would allow in seven innings but Danks held the A's to a run on three hits and a walk in eight innings...Doolittle allowed three runs in the bottom of the loss...combined with Grant Balfour on a four-hit, 2-0 shutout in his others start on April 24, 2012 in Oakland...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed three of the hits...did not allow a hit until Ramirez singled to lead off the fifth...did not allow a runner past first base and faced just two batters over the minimum as he was aided by two double plays and a caught stealing.

THIS SPRING: Went 2-1 with a 4.26 ERA (19.0 ip, 18 h, 12 r, 9 er, 5 bb, 8 so, 4 hr) in five games, four starts, this spring...allowed a .240 opponents batting average...logged a 1.93 ERA over his final three games after posting a 10.80 ERA in his first two starts...also pitched in a minor league game March 20 (6.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...was scheduled to pitch in relief in the spring finale March 29 against San Francisco but that game was rained out.

2013 RECAP: Spent the first four months of the season in the starting rotation but split the final two months of the year between the bullpen, rotation and minor leagues...was 12-9 with a 4.14 ERA in 28 games, 26 starts...had a .258 opponents batting average and .301 on-base percentage, which were the lowest marks of his career...had career highs in ERA (4.14), walks (39) and home runs (25) and matched his high in extra base hits (59).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .247 (121-for-489) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .298 (39-for-131) against left-handers...surrendered 21 of his 25 home runs to righties, which tied for fourth most in the American League...18 of the home runs were solo shots and 14 came in the first two innings of a game...opponents batted .299 with a .541 slugging percentage when leading off an inning...has allowed a .308 (123 for 399) batting average and .546 (32 doubles, 21 home runs) slugging percentage in that situation in his career.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 12-9 with a 4.17 ERA and .261 opponents batting average in his 26 starts, 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA and .100 opponents average in his two relief appearances...did not inherit a runner in his two relief appearances and retired both of his first batters faced.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Went 8-8 with a 4.24 ERA before the All-Star Break, 4-1 with a 3.86 ERA after the break...is now 17-17 before the break compared to 10-5 after the break.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (4-1, 2.17 ERA): Ranks third in the American League in ERA (2.17) and opponents slugging percentage (.313) and tied for eighth in wins (4)...has tossed six innings or more and allowed three runs or fewer in each of his first eight starts, which is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914... Is 8-2 with a 2.21 ERA and .228 opponents batting average over his last 14 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...the wins are tied for third most in the majors over that span and the ERA is sixth lowest (min. 60.0 ip)...was named AL Pitcher of the Month for the month of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in five starts...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's win in 10 innings over Washington last Saturday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...had a no decision in his only career start against Cleveland, a 2-0 A's loss on Opening Night earlier this year (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 bb, 7 so).

- First in the AL in opponents batting average (.212), on-base percentage (.275) and slugging percentage (.291)...has allowed the fewest runs (40) and the second fewest walks (38) in the AL.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks third in the American League in ERA (2.17) and tied for fifth in wins (4)...is also tied for second in complete games (1) and shutouts (1), tied for third in grounded into double plays (7) and ranks fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.318)...also ranks second in wild pitches (6).

SIX INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Has tossed six innings or more and allowed three runs or fewer in each of his first eight starts, which is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914.

LAST 14 STARTS: Is 8-2 with a 2.21 ERA (22 er in 89.2 ip) and .228 (76 for 333) opponents batting average over his last 14 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...the wins are tied for second most in the majors over that span (Wainwright, STL 10) and the ERA is fifth lowest (min. 60.0 ip).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed three home runs in 54.0 innings and his average of 0.50 home runs per nine innings is ninth lowest in the American League...all three home runs have been solo shots...has surrendered just seven home runs in 118.0 career innings (0.53 per nine innings)...has yielded a .176 (9 for 51) average with runners in scoring position, which ranks eighth in the American League...has allowed a .192 (19 for 99) average with RISP in his career...opponents are 2 for 22 (.091) with RISP and two outs...has a .175 (11 for 63) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .252 (34 for 135) after that.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 1.23 ERA (3 er in 22.0 ip) in three starts on the road compared to 2-1 with a 2.81 ERA (10 er in 32.0 ip) in five starts at home...ranks second in the American League in road ERA.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-0 with a 1.80 ERA (7 er in 35.0 ip) in five starts at night compared to 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA (6 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts during the day...his career numbers are 5-1 with a 1.76 ERA (14 er in 71.2 ip) in 12 night games, 4-3 with a 3.50 ERA (18 er in 46.1 ip) in eight day games.

WINS: Has four wins this year and nine in 20 career appearances...the only pitchers in Oakland history to win their 10th game in 21 appearances or fewer are Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20 games) and Bill Krueger (20 games).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 3-0 with a 2.37 ERA (10 er in 38.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-1 with a 1.69 ERA (3 er in 16.0 ip) in two starts on four days rest...his career numbers are 6-1 with a 2.03 ERA (15 er in 66.2 ip) in 11 starts on five days rest or more, 3-3 with a 3.23 ERA (17 er in 47.1 ip) in seven starts on four days rest.

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the month of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in five starts...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Was charged with his first loss of the season April 23, snapping his season-opening winning streak at three games...has never lost consecutive decisions in his career...the loss snapped a six-game winning streak dating back to September 11 of last year, which was a career high...went 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak.

2014 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night *March 31*...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle *April 6* in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was charged with two unearned runs in the second inning (Barton error) when he allowed RBI singles to Almonte and Miller...also allowed a RBI single to Smoak in the third to give the Mariners a 3-0 lead but the A's tied the game on a Moss three-run homer in the bottom of the third...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced, including each of the last seven, and the A's scored twice in the fifth to take the lead for good...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle *April 12*...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...allowed back-to-back singles to Almonte and Miller to start the game before retiring 11 straight...Almonte scored on a Cano ground out, but that would be the only run he would allow in seven innings...blanked the Mariners on three hits and two walks over his

final six innings...won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-3 win over Houston *April 18* in Oakland...allowed a career-high nine hits...the A's scored seven times in the first inning and he blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...allowed three runs in the fifth on RBI singles by Fowler and Springer and a sacrifice fly by Carter...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas **April 23** in Oakland...walked a career-high four April batters...allowed a RBI triple to Rios in the first, a RBI single to Choice in the fifth and a solo home run to Murphy in the sixth...Perez shut out the A's on three hits and two walks...tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a three-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28...became just the fifth visiting pitcher to allow three hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)...allowed a Martin single in the third, a Chirinos single in the sixth and a Rios single in the seventh...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win at Boston *May 4*...blanked the Red Sox on one hit over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a careerhigh tying 14.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a Sizemore RBI double in the fifth...the A's scored once in the sixth but he allowed a Pierzynski home run to start the seventh...walked the next batter and was relieved by Abad with the scored tied 2-2.

2013 RECAP: Went from the independent Atlantic League in 2012 to a key member of the Cleveland Indians rotation, going 10-9 with a 4.04 ERA in 29 starts...it was his sixth 10-win season but his first since 2009...his 29 starts were his most since 2007, as were his 158.0 innings pitched...walked 47 batters for an average of 2.68 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...struck out 162, and his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.45 was also a career best...averaged 9.23 strikeouts per nine innings...did not qualify for the league leaders but had the seventh best strikeout per nine inning ratio among American League pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he had the fifth highest run support average (6.27)...was 3-4 with a 5.89 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his first 11 starts through June 15...then went 7-5 with a 3.06 ERA and .239 opponents average over his final 18 starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Leads the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.257), ranks fourth in batting average (.208) and fifth in slugging percentage (.323)...has walked just one batter to lead off an inning and his .226 (12 for 53) opponents on-base percentage in that situation ranks seventh in the AL...opponents are hitting .189 (7 for 37) with runners in scoring position, which ranks 10th in the AL...has allowed a .118 (12 for 102) batting average with two strikes...has allowed five home runs, all solo shots...has a .342 (13 for 38) opponents batting average in the first inning, .175 (27 for 154) after that...the opponents number three hitter is batting .435 (10 for 23) but the number four hitter is 2 for 23 (.087).

CAREER APPEARANCE NUMBER 200: Is scheduled to make the " appearance of his career today...it is just his 11th start ... prior to 200 this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 3-2 with a 3.58 ERA (24 er in 60.1 ip) in 10 career starts compared to 9-14 with a 5.30 ERA in 189 relief appearances...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .171 (14 for 82) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .236 (26 for 110) against lefthanders...has issued just two of his 12 walks to righties for a .188 onbase percentage...the on-base percentage against right-handers is second lowest in the American League and the batting average is tied lowest...over the last two years, he has held right-handed hitters to a .193 (35 for 181) batting average...has issued 24 of his 32 walks over that stretch to lefties.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (6 er in 26.0 ip) and .198 (19 for 96) opponents batting average in four starts on the road compared to21-1 with a 2.81 ERA (8 er in 25.2 ip) and .219 (21 for 96) opponents average in four starts at home...over the last two years, he is 1-1 with a 2.43 ERA (15 er in 55.2 ip) and .189 (38 for 201) opponents batting average in 24 games on the road compared to 4-4 with a 4.05 ERA (24 er in 53.1 ip) and .250 (52 for 208) opponents average in 19 games in Oakland.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-1 (.875) in his starting assignments...is 3-1 with four no decisions...is tied for third among American League starters in no decisions (N 5)...has 51 strikeouts, which is four short of his career high of 55 from last year...has tossed at least six innings in six of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer seven times...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 1-1 with a 3.95 ERA (6 er in 13.2 ip) in two starts in May after going 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).
