CHICAGO WHITE SOX (19-22) at OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-15) RHP Andre Rienzo (3-0, 4.56) vs. LHP Tommy Milone (1-3, 4.54) Game #42/Road #21 • Wednesday, May 14, 2014

WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost four straight games and five of their last six as they conclude a three-game series this afternoon at Oakland.
- RHP Andre Rienzo, who has earned the win in three of his four starts, takes the mound for the White Sox.
- Chicago is tied for fourth place in the American League Central, 7.0 games behind the division-leading Detroit Tigers.
- Following today's finale at O.co Coliseum, the White Sox will continue their nine-game, 10-day trip at Houston (5/16-18) and Kansas City (5/19-21) ... the team is off on 5/15.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox have lost a season-high tying four straight games (third time, also 4/29-5/3 and 5/16-19) and are a season-high tying three games under .500 (also 5/3).
- The Sox have lost seven straight games at O.co Coliseum, their longest skid since 5/18/01-5/6/03 (10 in a row).
- Jose Abreu is hitting .344 (11-32) with three doubles, two homers and three RBI in his last eight games (hit safely in seven).
- Ronald Belisario has not allowed an earned run in his last 13.0 IP (nine games) ... surrendered five hits during that span.

ROSTER MOVE

- Prior to today's game, Chicago returned INF Jeff Keppinger from his rehab assignment at Class AA Birmingham, reinstated him from the disabled list and designated him for assignment.
- Keppinger has not appeared in a game after being placed on the disabled list on 3/30 (retro to 3/21) to continue his recovery from right shoulder surgery performed on 9/26/13.
- Keppinger hit .253 (107-423) with four home runs and 40 RBI over 117 games last season, his first with the White Sox.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- The White Sox were limited to four singles, with just one runner reaching second base, in their 11-0 loss at Oakland.
- The shutout loss was the largest in Oakland since 5/28/76 (also 11-0) ... the Sox scored four runs or less for the 16th consecutive game at O.co Coliseum (4-12 record).
- Chicago's offense went 0-2 with RISP, struck out 11 times, walked just twice and were retired in order four times.
- Starter Scott Carroll suffered his third straight loss, allowing six runs on 11 hits with one homer (Josh Reddick) over 5.0 IP.

RISP-Y BUSINESS

- Chicago ranks second in the American League and third in the majors with a .277 average with RISP (102-368) in 2014.
- Alexei Ramirez (4th, .413), Conor Gillaspie (20th, .348) and Tyler Flowers (21st, .346) each rank in the AL Top 25 this year.
- The White Sox are just 2-12 (.167) with RISP over the last four games after going 15-36 (.417) in the previous three.
- Sox pitchers are limiting opponents to a .220 mark with RISP (20-91) over the last 11 games (three hits or less nine times).

HAWK AND WIMPY REUNITED

- Tom Paciorek will work alongside Ken "Hawk" Harrelson in the White Sox television booth this weekend at Houston.
- Analyst Steve Stone has the series off.

ROUGH ROAD

- The White Sox are concluding a stretch where they play 23 of 33 games against 2013 American League playoff teams.
- The Sox are 10-12 vs. the postseason clubs, going 1-2 vs. Boston, 4-3 vs. Cleveland, 2-4 vs. Detroit, 0-2 vs. Oakland and 4-3 vs. Tampa Bay.
- Following today's game, Chicago will play 10 consecutive games and 13 of 16 vs. non-playoff teams from 2013.

ABREU IS AWESOME

- Jose Abreu leads the major leagues with 14 home runs, 26 extra-base hits and 99 total bases and ranks second with 38 RBI, a .611 slugging percentage and 11.57 AB/HR ratio.
- Abreu was named AL April Player and Rookie of the Month, the second player (Yasiel Puig) to win both honors in his first month in the majors.

ALEXEI'S STRONG START

- Alexei Ramirez ranks among the American League leaders in singles (T1st, 38), hits (2nd, 52), average at home (2nd, .378), multi-hit games (T2nd, 16) and overall average (5th, .327).
- He has hit safely in 34 of the first 41 games and has played in an AL leading 365.0 innings (out of possible 367.0).
- Ramirez has recorded a four-hit game, four-RBI game, game-ending home run and grand slam this season.

COUNTDOWN TO COOPERSTOWN

- **Frank Thomas** will be inducted into Baseball's Hall of Fame on July 27 in Cooperstown, N.Y. ... joining Thomas in the Class of 2014 are pitchers Tom Glavine and Greg Maddux and managers Bobby Cox, Tony La Russa and Joe Torre.
- "The Big Hurt", the White Sox all-time leader in most offensive categories, is one of four players in major-league history with a career .300 average, 500 home runs, 1,500 RBI and 1,000 runs scored and 1,500 walks, joining Mel Ott, Babe Ruth and Ted Williams.

WHITE SOX VS. OAKLAND

- Oakland has won the first two games of this series by a combined 16-4 margin.
- The Sox have lost seven straight games at Oakland, are 11-21 since 2006 and 15-41 since 2001.
- Chicago went 2-5 in 2013, going 2-2 at home and 0-3 on the road ... all seven games were decided by three runs or less.
- The White Sox are hitting .177 (11-62) with two homers, a 9.00 ERA (16 ER/16.0 IP) and have been outscored, 16-4, in 2014.
- Chicago trails all-time series, 272-297, going 142-139 at home (54-57 at U.S. Cellular Field) and 130-158 at O.co Coliseum.

BULLPEN BREAKDOWN

- Sox relievers have allowed 15 earned runs over the last six games (19.1 IP) since recording a 23.1 consecutive scoreless IP from 5/2-7 (longest streak since 7/31-8/12/91, 32.0 IP).
- The bullpen owns a 2.68 ERA (17 ER/57.0 IP) with 49 strikeouts and a .176 average (36-205) since 4/26 (17 games), lowering its season ERA from 5.20 to 4.16 during that span.
- The 2.68 mark is the fourth-lowest in MLB since 4/26.

UP AND DOWN ON OFFENSE

- Chicago ranks among the American League leaders in runs scored (2nd, 201), runs/game (4th, 4.90), extra-base hits (3rd, 126), homers (3rd, 44) and slugging percentage (4th, .415).
- The White Sox are 22-124 (.177) with seven extra-base hits and eight runs over the last four games and hitting .266 (72-271) with nine homers and 35 runs scored in the last eight.
- The Sox lead the American League with 18 10-plus hit games and are tied for second with eight eight-plus run efforts.

NINTH-INNING LEADERS

- Chicago scored three runs in the ninth on Monday and lead baseball with 38 runs in the frame (Oakland is second with 23).
- The Sox rank among the MLB ninth-inning leaders in slugging percentage (2nd, .485), on-base percentage (2nd, .384), hits (3rd, 39), home runs (T3rd, 5) and average (5th, .287).
- By contrast, the White Sox hit .228 (113-495) with 13 homers and 45 runs scored in the ninth inning last season.

THE KIDS JUST WON'T QUIT

- The White Sox have two wins when trailing after eight innings in 2014, matching their total from the entire 2013 season.
- Alexei Ramirez ranks among the American League leaders in batting average with two outs (1st, .404), two strikes (7th, .302) and RISP/two outs (9th, .444).
- Jose Abreu is tied for the AL lead with five homers in the seventh inning or later ... Marcus Semien (3) is tied for eighth.

WEATHERING THE STORM

- There have been 144 games missed by Sox players who made the Opening Day roster due to being on the disabled list.
- A breakdown of the OD roster players and games missed:
 - Adam Eaton (11), Avisail Garcia (32), Nate Jones (38), Felipe Paulino (24), Chris Sale (25) and Conor Gillaspie (14) ... four of the players were in the White Sox Opening Day lineup vs. Minnesota.
- INF Gordon Beckham (22 games) and INF Jeff Keppinger (40) both started the season on the disabled list.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH

- **Ronald Belisario:** 10 games for 300 career.
- **Scott Downs:** 17 games for 600 career.
- **Adam Dunn:** Four home runs to tie Jeff Bagwell and Vladimir Guerrero (449) for 36th place all-time ... seven walks to tie John Olerud for 47th place all-time.
- **Paul Konerko:** Two RBI for 1,400 career.
- **Alexei Ramirez:** Three games at shortstop to pass Chico Carrasquel (835) for fourth-most in franchise history.

ON DECK: AT HOUSTON ASTROS

- Chicago opens a three-game series at Houston on Friday.
- The Sox went 3-4 last season, losing three of four at Minute Maid Park and winning two of three at U.S. Cellular Field.
- The all-time series is even, 14-14 ... the White Sox are 10-8 at home and 4-6 in Houston.

RIENZO AT A GLANCE

- The 25-year-old native of Sao Paulo, Brazil makes his 15th major-league start, fifth of the season and first career vs. Oakland.
- Was recalled from Class AAA Charlotte on 4/19.
- Has gone 3-1 with a 4.05 ERA (21 ER/46.2 IP) in eight career road starts, compared to 2-2 with an 5.73 ERA (21 ER/33.0 IP) in six starts at U.S. Cellular Field.
- Rienzo and Cleveland's Yan Gomes are the only two Brazilian natives to play in the major leagues, and Rienzo is the only pitcher from that country to earn a major-league victory ... joins teammate Jose Quintana and Atlanta's Julio Teheran, who both are from Colombia, as the only pitchers from South America (not including Venezuela) to start a major-league game.
- Was ranked by *Baseball America* as the White Sox No. 7 prospect entering the 2013 season.
- Has gone 37-28 with a 3.49 ERA (216 ER/556.2 IP) and 593 strikeouts in 114 games (100 starts) over seven seasons in the White Sox minor-league system.

LAST START

- Improved to 3-0 on the season with a victory on 5/9 vs. Arizona ... allowed three runs on four hits over 5.2 IP ... walked two and struck out three ... gave up a two-run homer to Gerardo Parra in the third inning and a RBI single to A.J. Pollock in the fifth ... left with a 7-3 lead after throwing 104 pitches (67 strikes) ... Sox won, 9-3.

2014 QUICK HITS

- Was recalled from Class AAA Charlotte on 4/19 ... Sox are 4-0 in his starts, one of which has been quality ... opponents are hitting .239 (22-92), with right-handers at .209 (9-43) ... is receiving 7.94 runs of support per 9.0 IP in his starts (20 RS/22.2 IP) ... has induced one GIDP ... opponents are 1-1 in stolen-base attempts ... was 0-2 with a 4.85 ERA (7 ER/13.0 IP) in three starts with Charlotte.

2014 OUTINGS OF NOTE

- Improved to 2-0 with a victory on 4/28 vs. Tampa Bay ... allowed three runs (two earned) on five hits over 6.0 IP ... earned the victory in his first start of the season on 4/23 at Detroit (4 ER/6.1 IP) ... made his season debut on 4/20 at Texas, pitching a scoreless eighth inning.

2013 WHITE SOX RECAP

- Split the season between the White Sox and Class AAA Charlotte ... six of his 10 starts with the Sox were quality ... Chicago went 3-7 in his starts ... went 2-1 with a 3.63 ERA (14 ER/34.2 IP) on the road and 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA (16 ER/21.1 IP) at home ... allowed fewer hits (55) than IP (56.0) but averaged 4.5 walks per 9.0 IP (28 BB) and recorded a 1.36 strikeout-to-walk ratio (38 SO) ... limited opponents to a .227 average (10-44) with RISP and .211 (4-19) with RISP/two outs ... averaged 94.1 pitches per start ... threw four wild pitches, induced three double plays and recorded one pickoff.
- Made his major-league debut on 7/30 at Cleveland, allowing three runs on five hits over 7.0 IP in a no decision ... held the Indians scoreless on two hits through 4.0 IP before giving up the three runs on two hits and an error in the fifth (see note below).
- Earned his first major-league victory on 8/21 at Kansas City (2 ER/6.0 IP) ... became the first native of Brazil (Sao Paulo) to record a win in the major leagues ... carried a three-hit shutout into the seventh inning on 8/4 at Detroit before giving up two runs.

BACK-TO-BACK FIRSTS

- Rienzo recorded his first major-league victory on 8/21/13 at Kansas City, and RHP Jake Petricka earned his first win in his major-league debut the following night against the Royals.
- It marked the first time that Sox pitchers have earned their first major-league wins in consecutive games since Fritz Ackley and Frank Kreuzer on 9/27-28/63 vs. Washington (Elias).
- Rienzo's victory was the first ever for a Brazilian-born pitcher.

UPON FURTHER REVIEW

- Major League Baseball overturned an official scoring decision from the White Sox game on 7/30/13 at Cleveland ... a Carlos Santana ground ball off pitcher Andre Rienzo in the fifth inning of that game that originally was ruled an error on shortstop Alexei Ramirez was changed to a single on 8/13.
- As a result, all three runs charged to Rienzo are earned ... prior to the overturn, Rienzo had become the first Sox pitcher to work 7.0-plus IP and not allow an earned run in his major-league debut since Jack McDowell on 9/15/87 vs. Minnesota (7.0 scoreless IP).

WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC

- Went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA (2 ER/4.2 IP), four walks and two strikeouts in one start for Team Brazil in the 2013 World Baseball Classic.
- Brazil went 0-3 in pool play against Japan (5-3), Cuba (5-2) and China (5-2) in Fukuoka, Japan ... Reinzo was charged with the loss on 3/3 vs. Cuba ... allowed two runs on one hit over 4.2 IP ... held Cuba hitless through 4.0 IP.

VS. OAKLAND A'S

- Makes his first career start against the A's

FRIDAY'S STARTER

- LHP Jose Quintana (1-3, 3.67) is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season and fourth on the road as the Sox open a three-game series in Houston ... signed a five-year contract on 3/24/14.
- Is 0-3 with a 4.50 ERA (15 ER/30.0 IP) over his last five starts after going 1-0 with a 2.37 ERA (5 ER/19.0 IP) in his first three.
- Lost his last start on 5/10 vs. Arizona, allowing three runs on seven hits over 6.0 IP.
- Went 9-7 with a 3.51 (78 ER/200.0 IP) with 164 strikeouts over 33 starts in 2013, setting a White Sox and American League record with 17 no decisions ... led the Sox in starts (33) and winning percentage (.563).
- Became the youngest pitcher (age 24) to lead the White Sox in starts since Mark Buehrle in 2002 (34 starts at age 23).
- Is 0-0 with a 3.65 ERA (5 ER/12.1 IP) in two career starts against the Astros.
