### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (26-16) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (19-23)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 7-1 over the last eight games after going 1-5 over the previous six contests...are now 13-11 over the last 24 games after starting the year 13-5...are 26-16 for the season, which is the second best record in the American League and fourth best in the majors...it is the A's best record after 42 games since 1990 (30-12)...with a win

tonight, the A's would have their best record after 43 games since 1990 (30-13)...with a loss, would match their best start after 43 contests since 2004...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 19<sup>th</sup> consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 23 consecutive days and 36 of the last 38...have 32 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have swept four series this year, which is tied with Detroit for the most in the majors...have not lost more than three in a row since May 6-10, 2013 when they had a five-game losing streak.

**OFFENSE:** The A's scored 11 runs last night, which was one short of tying their season-high of 12 (two times)...that included eight runs in the second inning, which is the most runs the A's have scored in a single inning this season (previous: 7, three times)...hit a season-high tying four home runs (also: April 18 at Houston) and have now homered in a season-high eight consecutive games (17 home runs total)...are batting .290 (92 for 317) over the last nine games...**lead the majors** in walks (181) and on-base percentage (.343), rank second in runs scored (216) and tied for fourth in triples (10) and home runs (47)...29 of the A's 47 home runs have come with runners on base, which is the **most in the majors** (Toronto, 27)...A's catchers are batting .324 (48 for 148), which is the best mark in the majors (Milwaukee, .315)...A's first basemen are batting .213 (33 for 155), which is second lowest in the American League.

**PITCHING:** The A's allowed a season-low tying three hits last night (sixth time) and recorded a season-high tying 12 strikeouts (third time)...have compiled a 1.60 ERA (13 er in 73.0 ip) and allowed a .165 (42 for 255) opponents batting average over the last eight games...have three shutouts over that span and five for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...**lead the majors** in opponents batting average (.216), on-base percentage (.281) and slugging percentage (.329) and rank second in ERA (2.94)...also lead the majors with a .192 (61 for 318) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...have allowed the third fewest home runs (33) and fourth fewest walks (115) in the AL.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in six of the last eight games and have surrendered just seven runs in 52.0 innings over that span (1.21 ERA)...are 6-0 over that stretch...have a 2.90 ERA (83 er in 257.2 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Detroit, 2.72)...**lead the AL** in innings pitched (257.2), are tied with Detroit for the fewest losses (8) and are third in strikeouts (221)...Sonny Gray, Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez have combined for a 13-3 record and a 2.26 ERA (41 er in 163.0 ip) in 25 starts while the A's other starters are 4-5 with a 3.99 ERA (42 er in 94.2 ip) in 17 starts.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this nine-game road trip to Cleveland (1-0), Tampa Bay (three games) and Toronto (three games) tonight...went 6-4 on the last road trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (3-0) and Boston (1-2) and are 14-6 (.700) on the road for the season, which is the second best road record in the American League (Detroit, 12-4) and third best in the majors (Milwaukee, 13-5)...it is the A's best start on the road since the 1990 A's also went 14-6 (won game 21)...went 6-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-3), Washington (3-0) and Chicago-AL (2-1) and are 12-10 (.545) at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is the most in the majors...are tied for the ML lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (3), losses when leading after seven innings (5) and are tied for second in losses when leading after eight (3)...are 8-6 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the American League in last at bat wins and games...are 5-2 in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning wins and games and have the second best record...are 7-4 in one-run games, which is tied for the fourth best record in the AL...however, are 2-7 in games decided

by two runs, which is second worst in the AL...are 17-5 in games decided by three runs or more.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's are 24 for 27 (88.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 28 of their 31 (90.3%) attempts, which the third highest percentage in the majors...the A's are one of two Major League teams without a pickoff (Miami).

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 9 for 40 (.225) with nine walks, two doubles, a home run and five RBI...lead the American League in walks and plate appearances (50), are tied for the lead in home runs and extra base hits (3) and tied for second in RBI.

**ROSTER NOTES:** The A's have used just 31 players this year...in the American League, only Boston has employed fewer players (29)...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 42 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an Oakland team since they began the 1984 season with a 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's have gone a season-high five consecutive games without an error but have 32 for the season, which is third most in the American League...are 17-7 when committing an error compared to 9-9 when going errorless...are 17-2 when scoring first, which is the best record in the AL...are 8-6 in May after going 18-9 in April...have a streak of 11 consecutive months with a winning record dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have five players on the disabled list (Cook, Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL eight times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times.

A's vs. INDIANS: The season series is tied at two games each...the A's won last night in Cleveland after losing two of three in Oakland to start the season...will complete the season series with the Indians Sunday...have yet to play six American League teams...the A's lost the season series last year 5-2...won two out of three in Oakland in 2013 but were swept in a four-game series in Cleveland...it was their second season series loss to the Indians over the last three years...are 14-14 against Cleveland over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 262-229 against the Indians...that breaks down to 139-101 in Oakland and 123-128 in Cleveland...including 38-59 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 897-1022 against the Indians

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Donaldson has homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his career (also: Aug. 29-31, 2012)...leads the American League and ranks third in the majors in go-ahead RBI (11)... Sean Doolittle has not walked a batter in 20.0 innings and has a streak of 32.0 consecutive innings without a walk dating back to last year, which is tied for the second longest streak in Oakland history...Brandon Moss has 20 home runs and 66 RBI in 75 games dating back to Aug. 19 of last year, which are second most in the majors to Giancarlo Stanton (21 HR and 67 RBI in 81 games)...Derek Norris is batting .421 (24 for 57) with 12 walks (.522 on-base percentage) over his last 20 games...is hitting .359 overall, which ranks second in the majors among players with 100 or more plate appearances (Tulowitzki, COL .389)...Josh Reddick recorded a career-high six RBI last night (previous: 5, two times) and his fifth career multi-homer game...including his second career grand slam.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1959 Bob Grim pitches a two-hit shutout and Dick Williams drives in three runs as the A's defeat the Yankees in the second game of a doubleheader, 10-0...in 1963 Ted Bowsfield tosses a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Boston...in 1996 Jason Giambi homers off Boston's Tim Wakefield for the 4000th home run in Oakland A's history.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (5-1, 2.28 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fifth in the American League in ERA (2.28), is tied for fifth in wins (5) and tied for sixth in winning percentage (.833)...is second in opponents slugging percentage (.289), third in on-base percentage (.266) and 10th in batting average (.216)...has the highest run support (7.89), ranks third in fewest pitches per inning (14.8), fifth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.35) and fewest walks per nine innings (1.58), tied for fifth in wild pitches (4), tied for sixth in hit batters (4) and tied for 10th in grounded into double plays (6) and strikeout to walk ratio (4.67).

LAST 25 STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in four of his eight starts this year and 12 of his last 26 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 12-6 with a 2.80 ERA (48 er in 154.1 ip) and .231 (135 for 584) opponents batting average over that stretch...has walked 33 (1.92 per nine innings) and struck

out 149 in 154.1 innings (8.69 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.52...has yielded just nine home runs (0.52 per nine innings).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-0 with a 1.31 ERA (5 er in 34.1 ip) and .172 (21 for 122) opponents batting average in five starts during the day compared to 2-1 with a 4.24 ERA (8 er in 17.0 ip) and .294 (20 for 68) opponents average in three starts at night...last year, he went 5-2 with a 3.27 ERA in 10 starts during the day compared to 5-7 with a 4.46 ERA in 19 starts at night...is now 8-2 with a 2.52 ERA (25 er in 89.1 ip) in 15 starts during the day over the last two years and 7-8 with a 4.43 ERA (59 er in 120.0 ip) in 22 starts at night.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 9 for 50 (.180) with a double (.200 slugging percentage), no walks and two hit by pitches (.212 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is second lowest in the American League, the on-base percentage ranks fifth and the batting average is sixth...has allowed a .133 (6 for 45) batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranks third in the AL...opponents are 1 for 18 (.056) with RISP and two outs...has yielded a .190 (28 for 147) average against right-handers compared to .302 (13 for 43) against left-handers...has issued seven of his nine walks to righties...over the last two years, 48 of his 56 walks have been issued to right-handed hitters...has surrendered both of his home runs this year and 18 of his 21 over the last two years to righties...both of the home runs this year have been solo shots as have 15 of his 21 over the last two years.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA (6 er in 34.1 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more compared to 3-0 with a 3.71 ERA (7 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Was charged with his first loss of the season May 5 after beginning the season 4-0 for the first time in his career...the loss snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2013 (also May 10-June 6, 2008)...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in innings...struck out 56 and walked just 10.

IN APRIL: Went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of April...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Gray, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...of those six, only Cahill was undefeated (Cahill started the season 6-0)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...his last four-win month was June of 2010 with Los Angeles (AL)...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-1 (.875) in his starting assignments...has walked one batter or fewer in five of his eight starts...has not allowed a run three times.

2014 START-BY-START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game April 2...tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut...won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Minnesota April 7...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Hicks in the second...the A's scored three times in the third but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a Kubel RBI double and a Suzuki RBI ground out...then retired 11 of the final 13

batters he faced...combined with Abad, Otero, Gregerson and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle April 13...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed two of the hits but had a no decision as the A's scored twice in the eighth and once in the ninth...retired each of the first 10 batters, allowed back to back singles to Miller and Cano with one out in the fourth, and then retired each of the final eight batters...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Houston *April* 19 in Oakland...allowed his first home run of the season, a solo shot by Villar in the third inning...also allowed a RBI single to Dominguez in the fourth and an unearned run in the fifth when Villar scored on a Norris throwing error following a steal of third...left trailing 3-1 but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the ninth for the win...was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-1 win at Houston April 24...the A's scored twice in the first and he allowed a run in the bottom of the first on a bases loaded walk to Chris Carter...blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over his final five innings...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 win at Texas *April* 29...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his first run in the bottom of the fourth on a RBI double by Rios...the A's then scored five times in the fifth to make the score 9-1...he allowed two runs in the bottom of the fifth on an Andrus RBI groundout and a Fielder RBI single...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-2 loss to Seattle **May 5...**allowed two runs in the first inning on a Hart RBI single and a Seager RBI ground out...the A's came back to tie the game with two runs in the fourth inning but he allowed a solo home run to Romero in the fifth and a RBI single to Miller in the sixth.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-1 win over Washington last Sunday in Oakland...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and yielded just four hits while not walking a batter...retired 15 in a row at one point...allowed just two base runners as far as second base.

KAZMIR vs. CLEVELAND: Is 2-3 with a 5.17 ERA (47.0 ip, 57 h, 31 r, 27 er, 24 bb, 44 so, 8 hr) in nine career starts...is 1-1 with a 6.56 ERA (17 er in 23.1 ip) in five starts in his home ballparks and 1-2 with a 3.80 ERA (10 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts at Progressive Field as a visitor...pitched for Cleveland last year and is 8-4 with a 3.84 ERA (42 er in 98.1 ip) in 18 career starts at Progressive Field...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 6-1 A's win in the day game on April 2...tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.

2013 RECAP: Went from the independent Atlantic League in 2012 to a key member of the Cleveland Indians rotation, going 10-9 with a 4.04 ERA in 29 starts...it was his sixth 10-win season but his first since 2009...his 29 starts were his most since 2007, as were his 158.0 innings pitched...walked 47 batters for an average of 2.68 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...struck out 162, and his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.45 was also a career best...averaged 9.23 strikeouts per nine innings...did not qualify for the league leaders but had the seventh best strikeout per nine inning ratio among American League pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he had the fifth highest run support average (6.27)...was 3-4 with a 5.89 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his first 11 starts through June 15...then went 7-5 with a 3.06 ERA and .239 opponents average over his final 18 starts.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Chavez (3-1, 2.44 ERA): Has allowed one earned run or fewer in five of his eight starts and has a 2.44 ERA, which ranks ninth in the American League...ranks second in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.257), third in batting average (.208) and fifth in slugging percentage (.323)...is scheduled to make the 200<sup>th</sup> appearance of his career...has allowed a .171 batting average against right-handed hitters with two walks (.188 on-base percentage)...the on-base percentage against right-handers is the lowest in the AL and the batting average is second lowest...the A's are 7-1 (.875) in his starting assignments...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-4 A's win over Chicago last Monday in Oakland (8.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...is 0-1 with an 8.49 ERA in 10 career appearances against Cleveland, all in relief...faced the Indians once last year in relief on Aug. 17 in Oakland (1.2 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 so). RHP Jesse Chavez (3-1, 2.44 ERA): Has allowed one earned run or fewer

- The A's bullpen leads the American League in ERA (3.02), opponents batting average (.214), opponents on-base percentage (.275) and opponents slugging percentage (.296) but is tied with Houston for the lead in blown saves (8)...are also tied with the Astros for lowest save percentage (46.7%), are tied for the second fewest saves (7) and have the fourth highest of percentage of inherited runners scored (17 of 46, 37.0%).
- Lead AL bullpens in decisions (17), are tied for the lead in wins (9) and have the second fewest walks (39) and home runs (7).
- Has a 4.13 ERA (13 er in 28.1 ip) over the last 10 games after posting a 2.71 ERA over its first 31 games.
- Has just five save opportunities and two saves since April 21 (24 games)...team is 13-11 during stretch.
- Are one of two teams in the AL that does not have a player with more than three saves (Houston).

- Was charged with his first loss of the season on Wednesday against Chicago (AL) and now has a 14-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011...that is the longest active losing streak in the majors and it matches the longest losing streak in the majors over the last 21 years...the last longer streak was a 27-game losing streak by Anthony Young from May 6, 1992-July 24, 1993.
- Has allowed four runs over his last four outings (2.2 ip) after not allowing a run over his first 14 appearances (13.1 ip).
- Has allowed just five hits (all singles) and leads Major League relievers in opponents batting average (.094) and slugging percentage (.094)...is fourth in opponents on-base percentage
- Has not allowed a run (6.0 ip) or hit (19 at bats) in eight games on the road.
- Faced the Indians once this year on March 31 (0.2 ip, 1 so)...has a 3.38 ERA (1 er in 2.2 ip) in four career appearances against Cleveland.

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.
