ABOUT THE A'S: Are 8-1 over the last nine games after going 1-5 over the previous six contests...are now 14-11 over the last 25 games after starting the year 13-5...are 27-16 for the season, which is the second best record in the American League (Detroit, 26-12) and tied for second best in the majors (Milwaukee)...it is the A's best record

after 43 games since 1990 (30-13)...with a win today, the A's would have their best record after 44 games since 1990 (30-14)...with a loss, would match their best start after 44 contests since 2003...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 20th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 24 consecutive days and 37 of the last 39...have 33 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have swept four series this year, which is tied with Detroit for the most in the majors...have not lost more than three in a row since May 6-10, 2013 when they had a fivegame losing streak.

OFFENSE: Brandon Moss hit a home run last night and the A's have now homered in nine consecutive games, which is an ongoing season-high (18 home runs total)...that includes a season-high tying four home runs on Friday (also: April 18 at Houston)...are now batting .283 (100 for 353) over the last 10 games...lead the majors in walks (183), rank second in runs scored (222) and on-base percentage (.341), tied for third in triples (11) and are fourth in home runs (48)...30 of the A's 48 home runs have come with runners on base, which is the most in the majors (Toronto, 27)...A's catchers are batting .322 (49 for 152), which is the best mark in the majors (Milwaukee, .319)...A's first basemen are batting .222 (35 for 158), which is third lowest in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 1.65 ERA (15 er in 82.0 ip) and allowed a .172 (49 for 285) opponents batting average over the last nine games...have three shutouts over that span and five for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...lead the majors in opponents batting average (.217), on-base percentage (.281) and slugging percentage (.328) and rank second in ERA (2.92)...also lead the majors with a .189 (61 for 323) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...are tied for the second fewest home runs allowed (33) in the AL and have the fourth fewest walks (118).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in seven of the last nine games and have surrendered just eight runs in 53.1 innings over that span (1.35 ERA)...are 6-0 over that stretch...have a 2.92 ERA (84 er in 259.0 ip) for the season, which ranks second in the American League (Detroit, 2.66)...are tied with Detroit for the fewest losses (8), are third in innings pitched (259.0) and fourth in strikeouts (222)...Sonny Gray, Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez have combined for a 13-3 record and a 2.30 ERA (42 er in 164.1 ip) in 26 starts while the A's other starters are 4-5 with a 3.99 ERA (42 er in 94.2 ip) in 17 starts.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on this nine-game road trip to Cleveland (2-0), Tampa Bay (three games) and Toronto (three games) tonight...went 6-4 on the last road trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (3-0) and Boston (1-2) and are 15-6 (.714) on the road for the season, which is the second best road record in the majors (Detroit, 13-4)...it is the A's best start on the road since the 1990 A's also went 15-6 (won game 22)...went 6-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-3), Washington (3-0) and Chicago-AL (2-1) and are 12-10 (.545) at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have five wins when trailing after seven innings, which is the most in the majors...are tied for the ML lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (3), losses when leading after seven innings (5) and are tied for second in losses when leading after eight (3)...are 8-6 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the American League in last at bat wins and games...are 5-2 in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning wins and games and have the second best record...are 7-4 in one-run games, which is the fifth best record in the AL...however, are 2-7 in games decided by two runs, which is third worst in the AL...are 18-5 in games decided by three runs or more.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 24 for 27 (88.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 28 of their 31 (90.3%) attempts, which is the third highest percentage in the majors...the A's are one of two Major League teams without a pickoff (Miami).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 9 for 40 (.225) with 10 walks, two doubles, a home run and five RBI...lead the American League in walks and plate appearances (51), are tied for the lead in home runs and extra base hits (3) and tied for second in RBI.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used just 31 players this year...in the American League, only Boston has employed fewer players (29)...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 43 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an Oakland team since they began the 1984 season with a 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26

THIS AND THAT: The A's had their season-high five-game errorless streak snapped last night...now have 33 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...are 18-7 when committing an error compared to 9-9 when going errorless...are 17-2 when scoring first, which is the best record in the AL...are 9-6 in May after going 18-9 in April...have a streak of 11 consecutive months with a winning record dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 8 minutes...averaged 3:05 last year, which was second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Cook, Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL eight times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times.

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's lead the season series, 3-2...have won the first two games in Cleveland after losing two of three in Oakland to start the season...will complete the season series with the Indians today...have yet to play six American League teams...the A's lost the season series last year 5-2...won two out of three in Oakland in 2013 but were swept in a four-game series in Cleveland...it was their second season series loss to the Indians over the last three years...are 15-14 against Cleveland over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 263-229 against the Indians...that breaks down to 139-101 in Oakland and 124-128 in Cleveland...including 39-59 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 898-1022 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Donaldson leads the American League and ranks third in the majors in go-ahead RBI (11)...Sean Doolittle has not walked a batter in 21.0 innings and has a streak of 33.0 consecutive innings without a walk dating back to last year, which is the second longest streak in Oakland history...Brandon Moss has 21 home runs and 69 RBI in 76 games dating back to Aug. 19 of last year...the RBI are the most in the majors over that span (Stanton, 68) and the home runs are second most (Stanton, 22)...**Derek Norris** is batting .410 (25 for 61) with 12 walks (.507 on-base percentage) over his last 21 games...is hitting .354 overall, which ranks second in the majors among players with 100 or more plate appearances (Tulowitzki, COL .400)...**Dan Otero** tossed a career-high 3.2 innings last night and now leads AL relievers in innings pitched (25.1)...recorded his fourth win, which is the most among AL relievers...Josh Reddick recorded a career-high six RBI on Friday (previous: 5, two times) and his fifth career multi-homer game...including his second career grand slam.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1952 Bobby Shantz tosses a three-hit shutout to defeat Bob Feller 2-0 in the first game of a doubleheader at Cleveland...in 1998 Mike Blowers becomes the second player in Oakland history to hit for the cycle in the A's 14-0 win at Chicago...in 2003 the A's score three runs in the eighth inning and five in the ninth to come from behind and defeat Cleveland, 8-5

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (3-1, 2.44 ERA)

ONE EARNED RUN OR FEWER: Has allowed one earned run or fewer in five of his eight starts and has a 2.44 ERA, which ranks ninth in the American League...had a season-opening streak of four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Ranks second in the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.257), third in batting average (.208) and fifth in slugging percentage (.323)...has walked just one batter to lead off an inning and his .226 (12 for 53) opponents on-base percentage in that situation ranks sixth in the AL...has allowed a .118 (12 for 102) batting average with two strikes...has allowed five home runs, all solo shots...has a .342 (13 for 38) opponents batting average in the first inning, .175 (27 for 154) after that...the opponents number three hitter is batting .435 (10 for 23) but the number four hitter is 2 for 23 (.087).

CAREER APPEARANCE NUMBER 200: Is scheduled to make the 200th appearance of his career today...it is just his 11th start...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 3-2 with a 3.58 ERA (24 er in 60.1 ip) in 10 career starts compared to 9-14 with a 5.30 ERA in 189 relief appearances...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .171 (14 for 82) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .236 (26 for 110) against left-handers...has issued just two of his 12 walks to righties for a .188 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage against right-handers is the lowest in the American League and the batting average is fourth lowest...over the last two years, he has held right-handed hitters to a .193 (35 for 181) batting average...has issued 24 of his 32 walks over that stretch to lefties.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (6 er in 26.0 ip) and .198 (19 for 96) opponents batting average in four starts on the road compared to21-1 with a 2.81 ERA (8 er in 25.2 ip) and .219 (21 for 96) opponents average in four starts at home...over the last two years, he is 1-1 with a 2.43 ERA (15 er in 55.2 ip) and .189 (38 for 201) opponents batting average in 24 games on the road compared to 4-4 with a 4.05 ERA (24 er in 53.1 ip) and .250 (52 for 208) opponents average in 19 games in Oakland.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-1 (.875) in his starting assignments...has 51 strikeouts, which is four short of his career high of 55 from last year...has tossed at least six innings in six of his eight starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer seven times...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 1-1 with a 3.95 ERA (6 er in 13.2 ip) in two starts in May after going 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).

2014 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win over Seattle *April 3* in Oakland...was charged with an unearned run in the first inning when Almonte reached on a Callaspo error, went to second on a Punto error, third on a Miller fly out and scored on a Cano ground out...also allowed a RBI single to Almonte in the fifth to make the score 2-0...the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game...had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota *April 9...*struck out a career-high nine in 7.0 innings...the A's scored four times in the first inning and he allowed a solo home run to Kubel to lead off the second...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings and he was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth...had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) *April 14...*matched his career high with nine strikeouts for the second consecutive start...allowed an

unearned run in the first inning when Calhoun singled, went to second on a passed ball and scored on a Pujols single...allowed a solo home run to Pujols in the third and left after seven innings trailing 2-1...picked up his first career win as a starter in the A's 4-1 win over Houston April 20 in Oakland...blanked the Astros on three hits and two walks over the first three innings before Gonzalez homered with two outs in the fourth...then retired seven of the final eight batters he faced...tossed a career-high 103 pitches...had a no decision in the A's 12-5 win at Houston April 25...allowed a career-high eight hits...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a run in the third inning on an Altuve RBI double...the A's scored a run in the fourth to take a 5-1 lead but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the fourth on a Dominguez RBI single, a two-run error by Donaldson and a Castro RBI ground out...the A's scored seven times in the ninth for the win...extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 12-1 victory at Texas *April* 30...did not allow a run in 7.0 innings...yielded just one hit (Fielder two-out single in first) and one walk (Fielder, one out in fourth)...did not allow a base runner past first base...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Seattle May 6...allowed three runs in the first inning on a wild pitch, a Smoak RBI double and an Ackley RBI single...the A's scored twice in the second to narrow the gap to 3-2 and he blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over innings two through five before allowing a Zunino sacrifice fly in the sixth...left after that trailing 4-2.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Chicago last Monday in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings...allowed two runs on a pair of solo home runs by Viciedo in the second and Abreu to lead off the ninth...the two home runs matched his career high...the A's bullpen was charged with two more runs in the ninth before Doolittle retired the final three batters for the save.

CHAVEZ vs. CLEVELAND: Is 0-1 with an 8.49 ERA (11.2 ip, 11 h, 11 r, 11 er, 7 bb, 5 so, 5 hr) in 10 career appearances, all in relief...is 0-0 with a 9.64 ERA (10 er in 9.1 ip) in seven appearances in his home ballparks and 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA (1 er in 2.1 ip) in three games at Progressive Field...has allowed 10 runs in his last three games against Cleveland (5.1 ip, 16.88 ERA) after allowing one in his first seven contests (6.1 ip, 1.42 ERA)...faced the Indians once last year in relief on Aug. 17 in Oakland (1.2 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 so).

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season with the A's and was 2-4 with a save and a career-low 3.92 ERA in 35 games over two stints...the save was the first of his career and he also struck out a career-high 55 batters...also had career lows in opponents batting average (.230), onbase percentage (.302) and slugging percentage (.318)...matched his career highs in wild pitches (5) and hit batters (3)...surrendered just three home runs in 57.1 innings, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...entered the season with 34 home runs in 177.1 career innings (1.73 per nine innings).

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Drew Pomeranz (3-1, 1.14 ERA): Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-1 with a 1.98 ERA in nine relief appearances before making his first start in the second game of the doubleheader May 7 against Seattle...has two wins and has not allowed a run in his two starting assignments (10.0 ip)...his 1.14 ERA is second lowest in the American League among pitchers with 20 or more innings (Britton, BAL 0.81)...is 2-0 with a 0.59 ERA over his last five games and has 19 strikeouts in 15.1 innings (11.15 per nine innings)...has tossed 5.0 innings or fewer in each of his last 18 starts dating back to Aug. 1, 2012, which is the longest such streak by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 11-0 A's win over Chicago (AL) last Tuesday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 8 so)...it marks the first time in his career he has put together back-to-back wins and he now has a career-high 10.0 inning scoreless streak...has never faced the Rays in his career.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

10-8, 2.92 ERA (44 er in 135.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 7-for-15 (46.7%)

- The A's bullpen leads the American League in wins (10), ERA (2.92), opponents batting average (.215), opponents percentage (.273) and opponents slugging percentage (.293)...has the lowest save percentage (.46.7%), is tied for the most blown saves (8), has the second fewest saves (7) and the fourth highest of percentage of inherited runners scored (17 of 48, 35.4%).
- Leads AL bullpens in decisions (17) and has the second fewest
- walks (39) and home runs (7). Has a 3.50 ERA (14 er in 36.0 ip) over the last 11 games after posting a 2.71 ERA over its first 31 games.
- Has just five save opportunities and two saves since April 21 (25 games)...team is 14-11 during that stretch.
- Are the only AL team that does not have a player with three or more saves.

Last Outing: 5/17 at Cleveland (ND, 1.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 0 so) Saves/Opportunities: 0-0 Inherited Runners/Scored: 5/0 First Hitters: 3-17, 2 bb

- Was charged with his first loss of the season on Wednesday against Chicago (AL) and now has a 14-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011...that is the longest active losing streak in the majors and it matches the longest losing streak in the majors over the last 21 years...the last longer streak was a 27-game losing streak by Anthony Young from May 6, 1992-July 24, 1993. Has allowed five runs over his last five outings (3.2 ip, 12.27 ERA) after not allowing a run over his first 14 appearances (13.1 ip).
- Has allowed just seven hits (all singles) and leads Major League relievers in opponents slugging percentage (.123)...is tied for third in opponents batting average (.123) and is fifth in on-base percentage (.203).
- Has faced the Indians twice this year (1.2 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so)...has a 4.91 ERA (2 er in 3.2 ip) in five career appearances against Cleveland.

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.

Last Outing: 5/7 (Gm. 1) vs. Seattle (L, 0.2 ip, 1 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 1 so) **Saves/Opportunities:** 0-0 Inherited Runners/Scored: 4/3 First Hitters: 3-10, 2 bb

- Was placed on the DL for the second time this season on May 9 (retroactive to May 8) with a strained right forearm.
- Was originally placed on the DL March 29 (retroactive to March 21) with right shoulder tendinitis...came off the DL on April 7 and pitched in 12 games with the A's (0-1, 2.92 ERA in 12.1 ip).

Last Year: Was 6-4 with two saves and a 2.54 ERA in a team-leading 71 relief appearances...allowed just two home runs in 67.1 innings, an average of 0.27 per nine innings, which was fourth lowest among AL relievers.

62 LHP SEAN DOOLITTLE
