ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a three-game series from Cleveland to start the road-trip, their fifth series sweep of the season...that is tied with Detroit for the Major League lead...have won three straight and nine of the last 10 games after losing five of the previous six contests...are a season-high 12 games over .500 at 28-16...that is the second

best record in the majors to Detroit (27-13) and the A's best record after 44 games since the 1990 club started the year 30-14 (lost game 45)...have a season-high tying four game lead in the American League West (also May 13)...prior to this year, the last time the A's led the West by at least four games before the All-Star Break was 1992 when they led by as many as four games as early as June 15...the last time the A's led the by West by more than four games before the All-Star Break was in 1990 when they led by as many as 5½ games as early as May 9...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 22nd consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 26 consecutive days and 39 of the last 41...have 35 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...had their season-high winning streak snapped at six games last Wednesday...have not lost more than three in a row since May 6-10, 2013 when they had a five-game losing streak.

LAST 10 GAMES: The A's are 9-1 over the last 10 games and have outscored the opposition 71-18 over that span...the run differential of 53 matches the second highest mark over a 10-game stretch in Oakland history and is the best since the 20-game winning streak in 2002, which had 10-game marks of 53 twice and an Oakland record 55 from Aug. 17-26...the pitching staff has a 1.78 ERA (18 er in 91.0 ip) and .179 (57 for 319) opponents batting average...A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer seven times and are 7-0 with a 1.54 ERA (10 er in 58.1 ip)...the offense is batting .285 (100 for 351) with 23 doubles, three triples and 18 home runs (.530 slugging percentage).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-0 on this nine-game road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Tampa Bay (three games) and Toronto (three games) tonight...went 6-4 on the last road trip and are 16-6 (.714) on the road for the season, which is the second best road record in the majors (Detroit, 14-5)...it is the A's best start on the road since the 1990 A's also went 16-6 (won game 23)...went 6-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-3), Washington (3-0) and Chicago-AL (2-1) and are 12-10 (.545) at home, which is tied for the second best home record in the American League.

OFFENSE: The A's **lead the majors** in walks (192), rank second in runs (235) and on-base percentage (.344), third in triples (12) and fewest strikeouts (300), fourth in slugging (.421), fifth in extra base hits (142), tied for sixth in home runs (48), tied for seventh in doubles (82) and ninth in batting (.259)...30 of the A's 48 home runs have come with runners on base, which is the **most in the majors** (Colorado and Toronto, 27)...the A's did not homer Sunday, snapping their season-best streak of nine consecutive games with a home run (18 home runs total)

PITCHING: The A's **lead the majors** in opponents batting average (.217), on-base percentage (.283) and slugging percentage (.330) and rank second to Atlanta (2.82) in ERA (2.92)...also lead the majors with a .185 (61 for 330) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...are tied for second in the AL in fewest home runs (35), tied for the third in shutouts (5) and have the fourth fewest walks (125).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 18-8 with a 2.93 ERA (86 er in 264.0 ip)...are tied with Detroit for the fewest losses in the American League and rank second to the Tigers in ERA (2.70)...are also fourth in innings pitched (264.0) and strikeouts (228)...Sonny Gray, Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez have combined for a 14-3 record and a 2.34 ERA (44 er in 169.1 ip) in 27 starts while the A's other starters are 4-5 with a 3.99 ERA (42 er in 94.2 ip) in 17 starts.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in the last seven games but have 33 for the season, which is third most in the American League...the errors have led to just nine unearned runs, which is tied with Baltimore for the fewest in the AL...are 18-7 when committing at least one error compared to 10-9 when going errorless.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 24 for 27 (88.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have

been successful in 29 of their 32 (90.6%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Minnesota, 91.3%)...the A's are one of two Major League teams without a pickoff (Miami).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 9 for 41 (.220) with 10 walks, two doubles, a home run and five RBI...lead the American League in walks and plate appearances (52), are tied for the lead in home runs and extra base hits (3) and tied for second in hits and RBI.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 8-6 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the American League in last at bat wins and games...are 5-2 in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning wins and games and have the second best record...are 7-4 in one-run games, which is the fifth best record in the AL...however, are 2-7 in games decided by two runs, which is third worst in the AL...are 19-5 in games decided by three runs or more...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (5) and are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (3) and losses when leading after seven innings (5).

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used just 31 players this year...in the AL, only Boston has employed fewer players (29)...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 44 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an Oakland team since they began the 1984 season with a 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 17-2 when scoring first, which is the best record in the majors...are 18-1 when outhomering the opposition, which is second best (Texas, 10-0)...are 10-6 in May after going 18-9 in April...have a streak of 11 consecutive months with a winning record dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Cook, Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL eight times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's and Rays split the season series last year, 3-3...each club swept a three-game series in its home ballpark...Oakland is batting .201 (102 for 508) with 44 runs scored in 15 games against Tampa Bay over the previous two seasons...since 2007, the A's have won three season series. and split one...are 30-30 against the Rays over that span...all-time, the A's are 89-55 (.618) against Tampa Bay, which is the best record against the Rays by any American League team (Cleveland, 77-51, .602)...are 50-21 in Oakland and 39-34 at Tropicana Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes had five RBI on Sunday, which was the fourth game of five or more RBI by an Athletic in the last seven games...no other team has more than three for the entire season...Josh Donaldson has reached base safely in each of his 22 road games...Sean Doolittle has not walked a batter in 21.0 innings and has a streak of 33.0 consecutive innings without a walk dating back to last year, which is the second longest streak in Oakland history...Brandon Moss was named American League Player of the Week yesterday after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...Derek Norris is batting .410 (25 for 61) with 12 walks (.507 on-base percentage) over his last 21 games.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1977** Wayne Gross has five RBI and Earl Williams drives in four as the A's defeat Seattle 14-5...in **2005** Keith Ginter has one hit in one official at bat but drives in five runs on a three-run home run and two sacrifice flies in the A's 8-4 win at San Francisco...in **2011** Mark Ellis singles in the second inning off San Francisco's Ryan Vogelsong for his 1000th career hit to become the 12th player in Oakland history to collect 1000 hits.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Drew Pomeranz (3-1, 1.14 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-1 with a 1.98 ERA in nine relief appearances before making his first start in the second game of the doubleheader May 7 against Seattle...has two wins and has not allowed a run in his two starting assignments (10.0 ip)...has allowed one earned run or fewer in each of his 11 appearances and has a 1.14 ERA in 23.2 innings...his ERA is second lowest in the American League among pitchers with 20 or more innings (Britton, BAL 0.81).

LAST FIVE GAMES: Is 2-0 with a 0.59 ERA (1 er in 15.1 ip) over his last five games and has 19 strikeouts in 15.1 innings (11.15 per nine innings)...went 0-1 with a 2.16 ERA over his first six games while fanning five in 8.1 innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .188 opponents batting average, including .154 (4 for 26) against left-handed hitters compared to .203 (12 for 59) against right-handers...his career splits are .163 (23 for 141) against left-handers, .286 (134 for 469) against right-handers...has surrendered 18 of his 20 career home runs to right-handers and has a .469 career slugging percentage against righties compared to .220 by lefties...has allowed a .089 (4 for 45) batting average with two strikes...opponents are 2 for 22 (.091) with one walk (.130 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has yielded a .182 (2 for 11) average with runners in scoring position...has a .151 (8 for 53) opponents average over his first 30 pitches in a game, .250 (8 for 32) after that...has surrendered two home runs, both solo shots.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0 ip) in two starts and 1-1 with a 1.98 ERA in nine relief appearances...first batters faced were 0 for 8 with a walk in his relief appearances and he stranded all three of his inherited runners...began his career with 30 consecutive starts before making his final four appearances of 2013 in relief...is 6-14 with a 5.02 ERA (79 er in 141.2 ip) in 32 career starts compared to 1-1 with a 1.45 ERA (3 er in 18.2 ip) in 13 relief appearances.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 0.00 ERA (14.0 ip) and .106 (5 for 47) opponents batting average in six games at home compared to 0-1 with a 2.79 ERA (3 er in 9.2 ip) and .289 (11 for 38) opponents batting average in five games on the road.

FIVE INNINGS OR FEWER: Has tossed 5.0 innings in each of his first two starts and has now tossed five innings or fewer in each of his last 18 starts dating back to Aug. 1, 2012...that is the longest streak of consecutive starts of five innings or fewer by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914 (previous: Len Barker, 14 from May 21, 1985-June 10, 1987)...is 3-7 with a 4.94 ERA (41 er in 74.2 ip) over that stretch...has tossed more than five innings in just six of his 32 career starts.

FIRST START: He combined with Dan Otero and Jim Johnson on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win in the second game of the doubleheader May 7 against Seattle...it was his first win as a starter since Sept. 26, 2012 against Chicago (NL)...tossed 5.0 innings and allowed two of the hits: a two-out single by Cano in the first and a one out single by Smoak in the fourth...allowed just one base runner as far as second base.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 11-0 win over Chicago (AL) a week ago today in Oakland...it marks the first time in his career he has put together back-to-back wins...combined with Otero, Abad and Savery on a four-hit shutout...tossed five innings and allowed three of the hits while striking out a career-high eight...now has a career-high 10.0-innng scoreless streak.

THIS SPRING: Was 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA (12.2 ip, 13 h, 7 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 20 so, 2 hr) in eight games this spring, all in relief...opponents hit .250...averaged 14.21 strikeouts per nine innings...had more strikeouts than innings pitched in six of his eight appearances...had an 8.10 ERA over his first three games...allowed just one earned run over his final five contests (9.1 ip, 0.96 ERA)

2013 RECAP: Was 0-4 with a 6.23 ERA in eight games, including four starts, over two stints with Colorado...walked 19 and struck out 19 in 21.2 innings...allowed a .301 opponents batting average, including .130 (3-for-23) against left-handed hitters compared to .367 (22-for-60) against right-handers...issued 16 of his 19 walks and yielded nine of his 10 extra base hits to righties...had a .405 OPS against lefties compared to 1.150 against righties...had a .405 OPS against lefties compared to 1.150 against righties...held opponents to a .190 average with runners in scoring position, including .091 with RISP and two outs...has a .176 (12-for-68) career average with RISP and two outs...was 0-2 with a 4.61 ERA and .255 opponents average in six games at Coors Field, 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA and .375 opponents average in two starts on the road...in three seasons with the Rockies, he went 2-7 with a 4.40 ERA in 19 games at home compared to 2-7 with a 6.20 ERA (42 er in 61.0 ip) in 15 games on the road...opponents batted .158 when leading off an inning...tossed 4.1 innings or fewer, allowed three runs or more and walked four batters or more in each of his four starts

2013 WITH COLORADO: Was recalled for the first time June 30 and went 0-4 with an 8.10 ERA and .358 opponents batting average in four starts...walked 18 in 16.2 innings while striking out just 13...was optioned to Colorado Springs July 11 but was recalled July 22 and placed on the disabled list the next day with left biceps tendinitis...was reinstated Sept. 6 and pitched in relief for the first time in his career...did not allow a run while holding opponents to a .063 batting average in four relief outings (5.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 6 so)...did not inherit a runner and retired all four of his first batters faced

2013 WITH COLORADO SPRINGS: Began the season at Triple-A Colorado Springs and went 8-1 with a 4.20 ERA in 15 starts before the Rockies called June 30...struck out 96 batters in 85.2 innings, an average of 10.1 per nine innings...yielded just six home runs, an average of 0.63 per nine innings...despite spending just three months with the Sky Sox, he led the club in wins and strikeouts...allowed a 256 opponents batting average, including .180 (18-for-100) against left-handed hitters compared to .290 (65-for-224) against right-handers...however, surrendered four of his six home runs to lefties...opponents hit .217 with the bases empty compared to .306 with runners on base...including .329 with runners in scoring position...logged a 1.20 ERA in the first inning and had a 3.00 ERA over the first four innings of a game compared to 7.01 from the fifth inning on...the Sky Sox were 13-2 (.867) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in six of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 10 times...did not allow a run in two of his first three starts...including April 13 at Las Vegas when he allowed a season high six runs on a season-high nine hits in 5.0 innings...picked up his first win of the season in that game, an 11-6 Sky Sox victory...went 4-0 with a 2.54 ERA in five starts in the month of April...extended his season-opening winning streak to six games May 16 at Round Rock...had a 3.22 ERA over that eight-start stretch...was charged with his only loss of the season May 21 at Albuquerque and went 2-1 with a 5.27 ERA over his final seven Triple-A starts...struck out a season-high 11 batters in 6.2 shutout innings June 16 at Las Vegas...left with a 6-0 lead but had a no decision in a 9-7 win...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings for the win in his final Triple-A start June 21 against Tacoma...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in wins (8) and strikeouts (96) at the time of his promotion to Colorado June 30...was optioned to Colorado Springs July 11 but did not appear in a game before he was sent to Double-A Tulsa July 16...started and lost that day against Northwest Arkansas (5.1 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 7 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...recalled by Colorado July 22 and was placed on the DL the next day.

LHP Tommy Milone (1-3, 4.10 ERA): Is 1-0 with a 0.64 ERA, .146 opponents batting average and one home run allowed over his last two starts after going 0-3 with a 5.86 ERA, .274 opponents average and four home runs over his first five starts...has allowed a .200 batting average with runners in scoring position...is 1-1 with a 2.88 ERA in four starts at night compared to 0-2 with a 5.94 ERA in three starts during the day...is 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA in three starts in Oakland compared to 0-3 with a 6.23 ERA in four starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 13-8 with a 2.89 ERA in 30 games in Oakland compared to 13-14 with a 4.92 ERA in 36 games on the road...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-2 A's loss to Chicago (AL) last Wednesday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 so)...left with a 2-1 lead but Gregerson allowed a three-run home run for the blown save, the third time this year Gregerson has blown a save in a Milone start...is 1-2 with a 7.13 ERA in three career starts against the Rays, including a loss in his only start last year on April 21 at Tampa Bay (6.2 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 6 so).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

- The A's bullpen leads the American League in wins (10), ERA (2.90), opponents batting average (.214), opponents percentage (.277) and opponents slugging percentage (.289)...has the lowest save percentage (46.7%), is tied for the most blown saves (8) and fewest saves (7), and has the fourth highest percentage of inherited runners scored (17 of 51, 33.3%).
- Tied for the AL lead in decisions (18) and has the second fewest walks (43) and home runs (7).
- Has a 3.38 ERA (15 er in 40.0 ip) over the last 12 games after posting a 2.71 ERA over its first 31 games.
- Has just four save opportunities and two saves since April 23 (23 games)...team is 14-9 during that stretch.

- Was charged with his first loss of the season on Wednesday against Chicago (AL) and now has a 14-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011...that is the longest active losing streak in the majors and it matches the longest losing streak in the majors over the last 21 years...the last longer streak was a 27-game losing streak by Anthony Young from May 6, 1992-July 24, 1993.
- Has allowed five runs over his last six outings (5.0 ip, 9.00 ERA)
- after not allowing a run over his first 14 appearances (13.1 ip). Has allowed just seven hits (all singles) and leads Major League relievers in opponents slugging percentage (.115)...is second in opponents batting average (.115) and is sixth in on-base percentage (.191).
- Has faced the Rays one time in his career (2.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 3 so)

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.

- Was placed on the DL for the second time this season on May 9 (retroactive to May 8) with a strained right forearm.
- Was originally placed on the DL March 29 (retroactive to March 21) with right shoulder tendinitis...came off the DL on April 7 and pitched in 12 games with the A's (0-1, 2.92 ERA in 12.1 ip).

Last Year: Was 6-4 with two saves and a 2.54 ERA in a team-leading 71 relief appearances...allowed just two home runs in 67.1 innings, an average of 0.27 per nine innings, which was fourth lowest among AL relievers.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one
 in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment
 before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

LUKE GREGERSON

Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was also at Los Angeles on April 9, 2013.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at
 Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four
 times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least
 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.

JIM JOHNSON

Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

JOSH LINDBLOM

 Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most
 by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has
 been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was
 performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy
 John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

DREW POMERANZ

 Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

 Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.

EVAN SCRIBNER

Was on the A's Opening Day roster and did not allow a run in two outings (1.1 ip) before he was
optioned to Sacramento April 7 when Ryan Cook was reinstated from the DL.
