OAKLAND ATHLETICS (29-16) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (19-27)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four straight and 10 of the last 11 games to move to a season-high 13 games over .500 at 29-16...that is the second best record in the majors to Detroit (27-14) and the A's best record after 45 games since the 1990 club started the year 31-14 (won game 46)...have a season-high tying four game lead in the American

League West for the second consecutive day...prior to this year, the last time the A's led the West by at least four games before the All-Star Break was 1992 when they led by as many as four games as early as June 15...the last time the A's led the by West by more than four games before the All-Star Break was in 1990 when they led by as many as 5½ games as early as May 9...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 23rd consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 27 consecutive days and 40 of the last 42...have 36 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days ted for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...swept a three-game series from Cleveland to start the road-trip, their fifth series sweep of the season...that is tied with Detroit for the Major League lead...have not lost more than three in a row since May 6-10, 2013 when they had a five-game losing streak.

LAST 11 GAMES: The A's are 10-1 over the last 11 games and have outscored the opposition 74-18 over that span...the run differential of 56 is the A's best over an 11-game stretch since Aug. 18-28, 2002 (also 56)...the pitching staff has a 1.62 ERA (18 er in 100.0 ip) and .176 (61 for 347) opponents batting average...A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer eight times and are 8-0 with a 1.42 ERA (10 er in 63.1 ip)...the offense is batting .280 (108 for 386) with 26 doubles, three triples and 18 home runs (.503 slugging percentage).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-0 on this nine-game road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Tampa Bay (1-0) and Toronto (three games) and have a season-high five-game road winning streak...are 17-6 (.739) on the road for the season, which is the **best road record in the majors** (Detroit, 14-6)...it matches the second best start on the road in Oakland history...the 1988 club started 18-5 (won game 24) and the 1990 club also went 17-6 (won game 24)...went 6-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-3), Washington (3-0) and Chicago-AL (2-1) and are 12-10 (.545) at home, which is the third best home record in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's tossed their fourth shutout in the last 11 games last night and their sixth of the season, which ranks third in the American League...**lead the majors** in opponents batting average (.216), on-base percentage (.283) and slugging percentage (.327) and rank second in ERA (2.86)...also lead the majors with a .185 (62 for 335) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...have issued the fourth fewest walks in the AL (130).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 19-8 with a 2.88 ERA (86 er in 269.0 ip)...the losses are the fewest in the majors and the ERA ranks second in the American League (Detroit, 2.82) and third in the majors (Atlanta, 2.66)...are tied for third in the AL in innings pitched (269.0).

OFFENSE: The A's **lead the majors** in walks (198), rank second in runs (238) and on-base percentage (.344), third in triples (12), fifth in extra base hits (145), sixth in slugging (.418) and fewest strikeouts (314), tied for sixth in doubles (85) and eighth in batting (.258).

THE LONG BALL: The A's offense is tied for sixth in the majors with 48 home runs...30 of those have come with runners on base, which is the **most in the majors**...the pitching staff has allowed 35 home runs, which is second fewest in the American League and tied for sixth fewest in the majors...only 10 of those have come with runners on base, which is tied for second fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in the last eight games but have 33 for the season, which is third most in the American League...the errors have led to just nine unearned runs, which is tied with Baltimore for the fewest in the AL...are 18-7 when committing at least one error compared to 11-9 when going errorless.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 26 for 29 (89.7%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 30 of their 33 (90.9%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Minnesota, 91.7%)...the A's are one of two Major League teams without a pickoff (Miami).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 9 for 41 (.220) with 10 walks, two doubles, a home run and five RBI...lead the American League in walks and plate appearances (52) and are tied for the lead in home runs and extra base hits (3).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 8-6 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the American League in last at bat wins and games...are 5-2 in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning wins and games and have the second best record...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (5) and are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (3) and losses when leading after seven innings (5)...are 9-11 in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 20-5 in games decided by three runs or more.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used just 31 players this year...in the AL, only Boston has employed fewer players (29)...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 45 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an Oakland team since they began the 1984 season with a 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 18-2 when scoring first, which is the best record in the majors...are 18-1 when outhomering the opposition, which is also the best...are 11-6 in May after going 18-9 in April...have a streak of 11 consecutive months with a winning record dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Cook, Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL eight times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's won the first meeting of 2014 last night after splitting the season series last year, 3-3...each club swept a three-game series in its home ballpark...Oakland is batting .203 (110 for 543) with 47 runs scored in 16 games (2.9 runs per game) against Tampa Bay over the last three years...since 2007, the

A's have won three season series, lost three and split one...are 31-30 against the Rays over that span...all-time, the A's are 90-55 (.621) against Tampa Bay, which is the best record against the Rays by any American League team (Cleveland, 77-51, .602)...are 50-21 in Oakland and 40-34 at Tropicana Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Donaldson has a 25-game reaching base streak on the road dating back to Sept. 28 of last year, which is the longest road reaching base streak by an Athletic since Eric Chavez had a 27-game streak from July 22-Sept. 16, 2005...Brandon Moss has 10 extra base hits over his last six games...in Oakland history, only Reggie Jackson has more extra base hits over a six-game stretch (11 from June 10-15, 1969 and June 11-16, 1969)...Derek Norris is batting .403 (25 for 62) with 15 walks (.519 on-base percentage) over his last 22 games...Dan Otero has a career-high 14.1 inning scoreless streak.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1930** Max Bishop walks five times in the first game of a doubleheader against New York and adds three more in the second game...in **1974** Reggie Jackson becomes the first Oakland Athletic to reach 200 homers when he hits a two-run homer in the seventh inning of the A's 8-1 win at Minnesota...in **1995** the A's tie a club record by turning six double plays, but still lose at Chicago, 6-4...in **1997** Jose Canseco doubles in the seventh inning of the A's 7-3 win at Texas for his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Tommy Milone (1-3, 4.10 ERA)

LAST TWO STARTS: Is 1-0 with a 0.64 ERA (1 er in 14.0 ip), .146 (7 for 48) opponents batting average and one home run allowed over his last two starts after going 0-3 with a 5.86 ERA, .274 opponents average and four home runs over his first five starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .200 (6 for 30) batting average with runners in scoring position...last year, opponents hit .216 with RISP, which ranked eighth in the American League...has issued 12 of his 15 walks and allowed four of his five home runs this year to right-handed hitters...has yielded 25 of his 30 home runs over the last two years to righties...has held the opponents number three, four and five hitters to a .132 (7 for 53) batting average.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-1 with a 2.88 ERA (8 er in 25.0 ip) in four starts at night compared to 0-2 with a 5.94 ERA (11 er in 16.2 ip) in three starts during the day...has yielded one home run in 25.0 innings at night, four home runs in 16.2 innings during the day.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA (4 er in 20.0 ip) in three starts in Oakland compared to 0-3 with a 6.23 ERA (15 er in 21.2 ip) in four starts on the road...has allowed four of his five home runs on the road...last year, he went 5-4 with a 3.44 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 7-5 with a 4.69 ERA in 16 games on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 13-8 with a 2.89 ERA (60 er in 186.2 ip) in 30 games in Oakland compared to 13-14 with a 4.92 ERA (110 er in 201.1 ip) in 36 games on the road.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on six days rest today...is 1-2 with a 4.70 ERA (12 er in 23.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more compared to 0-1 with a 3.38 ERA (7 er in 18.2 ip) in three starts on four days rest.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in three of his seven starts this year, all losses...last year, he received just 10 runs of support in his nine losses (1.78 RSA)...has received just 22 runs of support in his 22 losses in three seasons with the A's (124.2 ip, 1.59 RSA)...has received no support 12 times over the last three years as a starter and one run of support eight times...went 11-1 with three runs of support or more in 2013 and is 21-3 in his career.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Opponents have reached base on an error twice with him pitching, which has led to three unearned runs...last year, opponents reached base on an error 11 times with him pitching, which was the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...that led to 11 unearned runs, which tied for second most in the AL...opponents have now reached base via error 24 times over the last three years, which is tied for the most in the majors (Jordan Lyles)...has 25 unearned runs over that span, which is tied for fifth in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: Has left with the lead in three of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (Gregerson each time)...the A's are 1-6 (.143) in his starting assignments...went 16-10 (.615) in his 26 starting assignments last year and are 37-27 (.578) in his career...his teams are 42-27 (.609) in his 68 career starts...has a 10.29 ERA (8 er in 7.0 ip) in the first inning, a 4.10 ERA (11 er in 34.2 ip) after that.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss at Seattle April 11...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and two unearned runs in the second on errors by Donaldson and Lowrie...surrendered a two-run home run to Zunino in the sixth and left trailing 5-0...Hernandez shutout the A's three hits over the seven innings.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 16...allowed a run in the third inning on a Trout RBI double, but the A's scored four times in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead...put the first two batters on base in the seventh inning and was relieved by Otero, who allowed both runners to score...Gregerson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Texas April 22 in Oakland...walked a career-high tying four batters...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Murphy RBI single and a Chirinos bases loaded walk...the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first but he allowed a run in the third when Rios scored on a Kouzmanoff grounded into double play...the A's then scored twice in the fourth to take the lead...left after six innings with a 4-3 lead but Gregerson allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss at Houston April 27...allowed just one run over the first six innings and

that was in the third inning when Villar doubled and later scored on a Fowler ground out...then allowed a two-out two-run triple to Villar in the seventh inning...was relieved by Otero, who allowed Villar to score on an Altuve home run...McHugh shutout the A's on one hit over the first eight innings before Callaspo had a RBI single in the ninth.

FIFTH START: He fell to 0-3 in the A's 6-3 loss at Boston May 3...matched his career-highs by walking four batters (sixth time) and allowing three home runs (fourth time)...allowed a grand slam to Gomes in the first inning and solo home runs to Ortiz in the third and Ross in the fourth...left after walking Napoli to start the fifth with the A's trailing 6-0.

SIXTH START: He combined with Fernando Rodriguez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Washington May 9 in Oakland...tossed eight innings and allowed two of the hits, both to Hairston...also walked three batters but allowed just two base runners as far as second base.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss to Chicago (AL) a week ago today in Oakland...allowed a home run to Beckham on the first pitch of the game but blanked the White Sox on four hits and a hit batter after that...left after six innings with the A's lead 2-1 but Gregerson allowed a three-run home run in the eighth inning for the blown save.

MILONE vs. TAMPA BAY: Is 1-2 with a 7.13 ERA (17.2 ip, 20 h, 16 r, 14 er, 6 bb, 11 so) in three career starts...including a loss in his only start last year, an 8-1 A's loss at Tampa Bay April 21...allowed three runs in the first inning but only one was earned following a Reddick error...allowed a leadoff home run to Escobar in the second but then retired 15 of the next 18 batters he faced...allowed a RBI double to Roberts in the seventh and left with a runner on third and two outs...Neshek allowed the inherited runner to score on a wild pitch...his other two starts came in 2012...the win came in the A's 9-5 victory at Tampa Bay May 6...allowed five runs in five innings and walked a career-high four batters...allowed four runs in the first inning...the A's then scored five times in the third and three more times in the fifth to take an 8-4 lead...took the loss in a 8-0 decision in Oakland July 31...allowed two runs in the second inning and three more in the sixth...Shields tossed a three-hit shutout and did not walk a batter while striking out 11 for the Rays.

THIS SPRING: Went 2-1 with a 4.26 ERA (19.0 ip, 18 h, 12 r, 9 er, 5 bb, 8 so, 4 hr) in five games, four starts, this spring...allowed a .240 opponents batting average...logged a 1.93 ERA over his final three games after posting a 10.80 ERA in his first two starts...also pitched in a minor league game March 20 (6.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...was scheduled to pitch in relief in the spring finale March 29 against San Francisco but that game was rained out.

2013 RECAP: Spent the first four months of the season in the starting rotation but split the final two months of the year between the bullpen, rotation and minor leagues...was 12-9 with a 4.14 ERA in 28 games, 26 starts...had a .258 opponents batting average and .301 on-base percentage, which were the lowest marks of his career...had career highs in ERA (4.14), walks (39) and home runs (25) and matched his high in extra base hits (59).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER RHP Sonny Gray (5-1, 2.10 ERA): Ranks second in the American League in ERA (2.10) and tied for sixth in wins (5)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 11-1 A's win at Cleveland last Friday (6.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 9 so)...it was his 10th career win and it came in his 21st game...is one of five pitchers in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer (Hudson, Zito, Griffin, Krueger)...has tossed six innings or more and allowed three runs or fewer in each of his first nine starts, which is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...is 9-2 with a 2.16 ERA and .218 opponents batting average over his last 15 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...the wins are tied for third most in the majors over that span and the ERA is fourth lowest (min. 75.0 ip)...is 3-0 with a 1.29 ERA and .156 opponents batting average in four starts on the road and 4-0 with a 2.25 ERA in seven starts on five days rest or more...was the winning pitcher in his only career start against Tampa Bay, a 2-1 A's win in Oakland last year on August 31 (6.2 ip, 5 h, 1 bb, 7 so).

- Was charged with his first loss of the season on Wednesday against Chicago (AL) and now has a 14-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011...that is the longest active losing streak in the majors and it matches the longest losing streak in the majors over the last 21 years...the last longer streak was a 27-game losing streak by Anthony Young from May 6, 1992-July 24, 1993.
- Has allowed five runs over his last six outings (5.0 ip, 9.00 ERA) after not allowing a run over his first 14 appearances (13.1 ip).
- Has allowed just seven hits (all singles) and leads Major League relievers in opponents batting average (.115) and slugging percentage (.115)...is sixth in on-base percentage (.191).
- Has faced the Rays one time in his career (2.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 3 so)

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.

THURSDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (5-1, 2.10 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second in the American League in ERA (2.10) and tied for sixth in wins (5)...is also tied for second in shutouts (1), tied for third in complete games (1), ranks fourth in opponents batting average (.211) and slugging percentage (.307), tied for sixth in winning percentage (.833) and tied for eighth in grounded into double plays (7)...also ranks second in wild pitches (6).

10th **CAREER WIN:** Has five wins in nine games this year after tallying five in 12 games last year...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20).

SIX INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Has tossed six innings or more and allowed three runs or fewer in each of his first nine starts, which is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914.

LAST 15 STARTS: Is 9-2 with a 2.16 ERA (23 er in 95.2 ip) and .218 (77 for 353) opponents batting average over his last 15 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...the wins are tied for third most in the majors over that span and the ERA is fourth lowest (min. 75.0 ip).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .173 (9 for 52) batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranks 10th in the American League...has yielded a .190 (19 for 100) average with RISP in his career...opponents are 2 for 23 (.087) with RISP and two outs...opponents are batting .182 (10 for 55) when leading off an inning, which is sixth lowest in the AL...has surrendered four home runs all solo shots...three have been hit by left-handed hitters...has surrendered just eight home runs in 124.0 career innings (0.58 per nine innings)...has a .171 (12 for 70) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .230 (34 for 148) after that...has yielded a .100 (10 for 100) batting average with two strikes.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 1.29 ERA (4 er in 28.0 ip) and .156 (15 for 96) opponents batting average in four starts on the road compared to 2-1 with a 2.81 ERA (10 er in 32.0 ip) and .254 (31 for 122) opponents average in five starts at home...ranks second in the American League in road ERA.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-0 with a 2.25 ERA (11 er in 44.0 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-1 with a 1.69 ERA (3 er in 16.0 ip) in two starts on four days rest...his career numbers are 7-1 with a 1.98 ERA (16 er in 72.2 ip) in 12 starts on five days rest or more, 3-3 with a 3.23 ERA (17 er in 47.1 ip) in seven starts on four days rest.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-0 with a 1.76 ERA (8 er in 41.0 ip) in six starts at night compared to 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA (6 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts during the day...his career numbers are 6-1 with a 1.74 ERA (15 er in 77.2 ip) in 13 night games, 4-3 with a 3.50 ERA (18 er in 46.1 ip) in eight day games.

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the month of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in five starts...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Was charged with his first loss of the season April 23, snapping his season-opening winning streak at three games...it snapped a six-game winning streak dating back to September 11 of last year, which was a career high...went 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak.

THAT'S ODD: Has a 3.66 ERA (13 er in 32.0 ip) in odd numbered innings compared to a 0.32 ERA (1 er in 28.0 ip)

THIS AND THAT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in four of his nine starts...the A's have been shut out twice this year, both times in his starts...the A's are 7-2 (.778) in his starting assignments this year and are 13-6 (.684) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 15 of his 19 career starts and allowed two runs or fewer 11 times.

2014 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night March 31 ... tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003) ... it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahilí, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle April 6 in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle April 12...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...blanked the Mariners on three hits and two walks over his final six innings...won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-3 win over Houston April 18 in Oakland...allowed a career-high nine hits...the A's scored seven times in the first inning and he blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...allowed three runs in the fifth on RBI singles by Fowler and Springer and a sacrifice fly by Carter...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas *April 23* in Oakland...walked a career-high four batters...allowed a RBI triple to Rios in the first, a RBI single to Choice in the fifth and a solo home run to Murphy in the sixth...Perez shut out the A's on three hits and two walks...tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas *April 28*...became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)...allowed a Martin single in the third and a Rios single in the seventh...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win at Boston *May 4*...blanked the Red Sox on one hit over the first four innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a Sizemore RBI double in the fifth...the A's scored once in the sixth but he allowed a Pierzynski home run to start the seventh...walked the next batter and was relieved by Abad with the scored tied 2-2...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win over Washington *May 10* in Oakland...allowed three runs in 7.0 innings of work, all in the third inning...yielded a solo home run to bits and a two-run double to Frandsen...blanked the Nationals on two hits and a walk over his final four innings.

2013 RECAP: Went from the independent Atlantic League in 2012 to a key member of the Cleveland Indians rotation, going 10-9 with a 4.04 ERA in 29 starts...it was his sixth 10-win season but his first since 2009...his 29 starts were his most since 2007, as were his 158.0 innings pitched...walked 47 batters for an average of 2.68 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...struck out 162, and his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.45 was also a career best...averaged 9.23 strikeouts per nine innings...did not qualify for the league leaders but had the seventh best strikeout per nine inning pitched...using the same minimum, he had the fifth highest run support average (6.27)...was 3-4 with a 5.89 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his first 11 starts through June 15...then went 7-5 with a 3.06 ERA and .239 opponents average over his final 18 starts.

SATURDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (4-1, 2.54 ERA)

BACK-TO-BACK WINS: Has won each of his last two starts, marking the fifth time in his career he has put together consecutive wins...has never won three straight...has four wins for the season, which is one short of his career high of five in 2010.

ONE EARNED RUN OR FEWER: Has allowed one earned run or fewer in five of his nine starts and has a 2.54 ERA, which ranks eighth in the American League...had a season-opening streak of four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Ranks fourth in the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.270) and 10th in batting average (.216)...has walked just one batter to lead off an inning and his .241 (14 for 58) opponents on-base percentage in that situation ranks eighth in the AL...opponents are hitting .167 (7 for 42) with runners in scoring position, which ranks ninth in the AL...they are 2 for 19 (.105) with RISP and two outs...has allowed seven home runs, all solo shots...has a .349 (15 for 43) opponents batting average in the first inning, .182 (31 for 170) after that...has a .252 (38 for 151) opponents batting average the first two times through the order, .129 (8 for 62) after that...the opponents number three hitter is batting .480 (12 for 25), which is fifth highest in the AL, but the number four hitter is 2 for 25 (.080), which is second lowest in the AL.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .161 (14 for 87) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .254 (32 for 126) against left-handers...has issued just three of his 15 walks to righties for a .187 on-base percentage...the batting average and on-base percentage against right-handers are the lowest in the American League...over the last two years, he has held right-handed hitters to a .188 (35 for 186) batting average...has issued 26 of his 35 walks over that stretch to lefties.

CAREER APPEARANCE NUMBER 200: Made the 200th appearance of his career in his last outing but it was just his 11th start...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 4-2 with a 3.58 ERA (26 er in 65.1 ip) in 11 career starts compared to 9-14 with a 5.30 ERA in 189 relief appearances...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 2.32 ERA (8 er in 31.0 ip) and .214 (25 for 117) opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 2-1 with a 2.81 ERA (8 er in 25.2 ip) and .219 (21 for 96) opponents average in four starts at home...over the last two years, he is 2-1 with a 2.52 ERA (17 er in 60.2 ip) and .198 (44 for 222) opponents batting average in 25 games on the road compared to 4-4 with a 4.05 ERA (24 er in 53.1 ip) and .250 (52 for 208) opponents average in 19 games in Oakland.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 2-1 with a 3.86 ERA (8 er in 18.2 ip) in three starts in May after going 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).

THIS AND THAT: Struck out six batters in his last start to bring his season total to 57...that is a new career high, surpassing his 55 from last year...the A's are 8-1 (.889) in his starting assignments...is 4-1 with four no decisions...is tied for third among American League starters in no decisions...has tossed at least six innings in six of his nine starts, allowed two runs or fewer seven times and walked two batters or fewer seven times...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk.

2014 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 12inning win over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...left trailing 2-0 but the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game ... had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota **April 9...**struck out a career-high nine in 7.0 innings...the A's scored four times in the first inning and he allowed a solo home run to Kubel to lead off the second...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings and he was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth...had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) April 14 ... matched his career high with nine strikeouts for the second consecutive start...allowed an unearned run in the first inning when Calhoun singled, went to second on a passed ball and scored on a Pujols single ... allowed a solo home run to Pujols in the third and left after seven innings trailing 2-1...picked up his first career win as a starter in the A's 4-1 win over Houston April 20 in Oakland...blanked the Astros on three hits and two walks over the first three innings before Gonzalez homered with two outs in the fourth...then retired seven of the final eight batters he faced...had a no decision in the A's 12-5 win at Houston April 25 ... allowed a careerhigh eight hits...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a run in the third inning on an Altuve RBI double...the A's scored a run in the fourth to take a 5-1 lead but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the fourth on a Dominguez RBI single, a two-run error by Donaldson and a Castro RBI ground out...the A's scored seven times in the ninth for the win...extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 12-1 victory at Texas *April 30*...did not allow a run in 7.0 innings...yielded just one hit (Fielder two-out single in first) and one walk (Fielder, one out in fourth)...did not allow a base runner past first base...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Seattle *May 6*...allowed three runs in the first inning on a wild pitch, a Smoak RBI double and an Ackley RBI single...the A's scored twice in the second to narrow the gap to 3-2 and he blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over innings two through five before allowing a Zunino sacrifice fly in the sixth...left after that trailing 4-2...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Chicago *May 12* in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings...allowed two runs on a pair of solo home runs by Viciedo in the second and Abreu to lead off the ninth...the two home runs matched his career high...the A's bullpen was charged with two more runs in the ninth before Doolittle retired the final three batters for the save.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 13-3 win at Cleveland last Sunday...tossed a career-high 109 pitches and allowed a career-high tying two home runs for the second consecutive start...allowed a leadoff home run to Bourn in the first inning but the A's scored seven unanswered runs before he allowed a one out solo home run to Brantley in the fifth.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- •Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.

- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's

catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

• Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
