OAKLAND ATHLETICS (30-16) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (19-28)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won five straight and 11 of the last 12 games to move to a season-high 14 games over .500 at 30-16...that is the **best record** in the majors...it is the first time the A's have had sole possession of the best record in the majors since Sept. 23, 2002...it is the A's best record after 46 games since the 1990 club started the

year 32-14 (won game 47)...have a season-high tying four game lead in the American League West for the third consecutive day...prior to this year, the last time the A's led the West by at least four games before the All-Star Break was 1992 when they led by as many as four games as early as June 15...the last time the A's led the by West by more than four games before the All-Star Break was in 1990 when they led by as many as 5½ games as early as May 9...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 24th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 28 consecutive days and 41 of the last 43...have 37 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...swept a three-game series from Cleveland to start the road-trip, their fifth series sweep of the season...that is tied with Detroit for the Major League lead...have not lost more than three in a row since May 6-10, 2013 when they had a five-game losing streak.

ONE HIT: The A's won last night despite recording only one hit (Moss home run)...since 1914, it is the first time the A's have won a regular season game with one hit or fewer...were previously 0-71 in such games...won Game 4 of the 1974 ALCS with one hit (Jackson double).

LAST 12 GAMES: The A's are 11-1 over the last 12 games and have outscored the opposition 77-20 over that span...the run differential of 57 is the A's best over a 12-game stretch since Aug. 19-31, 2002 (58)...the pitching staff has a 1.65 ERA (20 er in 109.0 ip) and .183 (70 for 382) opponents batting average...A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer eight times and are 9-0 with a 1.57 ERA (12 er in 69.0 ip)...the offense is batting .263 (109 for 415) with 26 doubles, three triples and 19 home runs.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-0 on this nine-game road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Tampa Bay (2-0) and Toronto (three games) and have a season-high six-game road winning streak...are 18-6 (.750) on the road for the season, which is the **best road record in the majors** (Detroit, 14-7)...it matches the second best start on the road in Oakland history...the 1988 club also started 18-6 (lost game 25) and the 1990 club went 19-5 (lost game 25)...went 6-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-3), Washington (3-0) and Chicago-AL (2-1) and are 12-10 (.545) at home, which is the third best home record in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's **lead the majors** in opponents batting average (.217), on-base percentage (.283) and slugging percentage (.326) and rank second in ERA (2.84)...also lead the majors with a .187 (64 for 343) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...rank third in the AL in shutouts (6) and have issued the fourth fewest walks (132).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 20-8 with a 2.88 ERA (88 er in 274.2 ip)...the losses are the fewest in the majors and the ERA ranks second (Atlanta, 2.78)...rank fourth in the American League in innings pitched (274.2).

OFFENSE: The A's **lead the majors** in walks (205), rank second in runs (241) and on-base percentage (.342), tied for third in triples (12), fifth in extra base hits (146), seventh in fewest strikeouts (325), eighth in slugging (.413) and tied for ninth in doubles (85).

THE LONG BALL: The A's offense is tied for seventh in the majors with 48 home runs...30 of those have come with runners on base, which is **tied for the most in the majors**...the pitching staff has allowed 35 home runs, which is second fewest in the American League and sixth fewest in the majors...only 10 of those have come with runners on base, which is second fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in the last nine games but have 33 for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...the errors have led to just nine unearned

runs, which is the fewest in the AL...are 18-7 when committing at least one error compared to 12-9 when going errorless.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 26 for 29 (89.7%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 30 of their 33 (90.9%) attempts, which is the third highest percentage in the majors...the A's are one of two Major League teams without a pickoff (Miami).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 9 for 41 (.220) with 11 walks, two doubles, a home run and five RBI...lead the American League in walks and plate appearances (53) and are tied for the lead in home runs and extra base hits (3).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 8-6 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the American League in last at bat wins and games...are 5-2 in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning wins and games and have the second best record...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (5) and are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (3) and losses when leading after seven innings (5)...are 10-11 in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 20-5 in games decided by three runs or more.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used just 31 players this year...in the AL, only Boston has employed fewer players (29)...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 46 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an Oakland team since they began the 1984 season with a 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 19-2 when scoring first, which is the best record in the majors...are 19-1 when outhomering the opposition, which is also the best...are 12-6 in May after going 18-9 in April...have a streak of 11 consecutive months with a winning record dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Cook, Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL eight times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's have won the first two games of 2014 after splitting the season series last year, 3-3...each club swept a three-game series in its home ballpark...Oakland is batting .194 (111 for 572) with 50 runs scored in 17 games (2.9 runs per game) against Tampa Bay over the last three years...since 2007, the

A's have won three season series, lost three and split one...are 32-30 against the Rays over that span...all-time, the A's are 91-55 (.623) against Tampa Bay, which is the best record against the Rays by any American League team (Cleveland, 77-51, .602)...are 50-21 in Oakland and 41-34 at Tropicana Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Donaldson has a 26-game reaching base streak on the road dating back to Sept. 28 of last year, which is the longest road reaching base streak by an Athletic since Eric Chavez had a 27-game streak from July 22-Sept. 16, 2005...Brandon Moss has 11 extra base hits over his last seven games...in Oakland history, only Reggie Jackson has more extra base hits over a seven-game stretch (12 from June 10-16, 1969)...Derek Norris is batting .391 (25 for 64) with 17 walks (.519 on-base percentage) over his last 23 games...Dan Otero has a career-high 14.1 inning scoreless streak.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1996 Geronimo Berroa hits three solo home runs and is 4 for 4 in the A's 5-1 win at New York...he would add another three-homer game later in the season to tie a major league record with two three-homer games...in 2004 Reggie Jackson becomes the third player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor him by retiring number 9.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (5-1, 2.10 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League in ERA (2.10) and is tied for sixth in wins (5)...is also tied for second in shutouts (1), tied for third in complete games (1), ranks fifth in opponents batting average (.211), tied for fifth in winning percentage (.833), sixth in slugging percentage (.307) and tied for eighth in grounded into double plays (7)...also ranks second in wild pitches (6).

10th CAREER WIN: Has five wins in nine games this year after tallying five in 12 games last year...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20).

SIX INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Has tossed six innings or more and allowed three runs or fewer in each of his first nine starts, which is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914.

LAST 15 STARTS: Is 9-2 with a 2.16 ERA (23 er in 95.2 ip) and .218 (77 for 353) opponents batting average over his last 15 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...the wins are tied for third most in the majors over that span and the ERA is fifth lowest (min. 75.0 ip).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .173 (9 for 52) batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranks 10th in the American League...has yielded a .190 (19 for 100) average with RISP in his career...opponents are 2 for 23 (.087) with RISP and two outs...opponents are batting .182 (10 for 55) when leading off an inning, which is seventh lowest in the AL...has surrendered four home runs all solo shots...three have been hit by left-handed hitters...has surrendered just eight home runs in 124.0 career innings (0.58 per nine innings)...has a .171 (12 for 70) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .230 (34 for 148) after that...has yielded a .100 (10 for 100) batting average with two strikes.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 1.29 ERA (4 er in 28.0 ip) and .156 (15 for 96) opponents batting average in four starts on the road compared to 2-1 with a 2.81 ERA (10 er in 32.0 ip) and .254 (31 for 122) opponents average in five starts at home...ranks second in the American League in road ERA.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-0 with a 2.25 ERA (11 er in 44.0 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-1 with a 1.69 ERA (3 er in 16.0 ip) in two starts on four days rest...his career numbers are 7-1 with a 1.98 ERA (16 er in 72.2 ip) in 12 starts on five days rest or more, 3-3 with a 3.23 ERA (17 er in 47.1 ip) in seven starts on four days rest.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-0 with a 1.76 ERA (8 er in 41.0 ip) in six starts at night compared to 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA (6 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts during the day...his career numbers are 6-1 with a 1.74 ERA (15 er in 77.2 ip) in 13 night games, 4-3 with a 3.50 ERA (18 er in 46.1 ip) in eight day games.

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the month of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in five starts...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Was charged with his first loss of the season April 23, snapping his season-opening winning streak at three games...it snapped a six-game winning streak dating back to September 11 of last year, which was a career high...went 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak.

THAT'S ODD: Has a 3.66 ERA (13 er in 32.0 ip) in odd numbered innings compared to a 0.32 ERA (1 er in 28.0 ip)

THIS AND THAT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in four of his nine starts...the A's have been shut out twice this year, both times in his starts...the A's are 7-2 (.778) in his starting assignments this year and are 13-6 (.684) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 15 of his 19 career starts and allowed two runs or fewer 11 times.

2014 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night *March 31...*tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill,

Odom)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle April 6 in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle **April 12**...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...blanked the Mariners on three hits and two walks over his final six innings...won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-3 win over Houston April 18 in Oakland...allowed a career-high nine hits...the A's scored seven times in the first inning and he blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...allowed three runs in the fifth on RBI singles by Fowler and Springer and a sacrifice fly by Carter...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas *April 23* in Oakland...walked a career-high four batters...allowed a RBI triple to Rios in the first, a RBI single to Choice in the fifth and a solo home run to Murphy in the sixth...Perez shut out the A's on three hits and two walks...tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28...became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)...allowed a Martin single in the third and a Rios single in the seventh...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win at Boston May 4...blanked the Red Sox on one hit over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high tying 14.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a Sizemore RBI double in the fifth...the A's scored once in the sixth but he allowed a Pierzynski home run to start the seventh...walked the next batter and was relieved by Abad with the scored tied 2-2...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win over Washington *May 10* in Oakland...allowed three runs in 7.0 innings of work, all in the third inning...yielded a solo home run to Espinosa and a two-run double to Frandsen...blanked the Nationals on two hits and a walk over his final four innings

GRAY vs. TAMPA BAY: Was the winning pitcher in his only career start, a 2-1 A's win in Oakland last year on August 31...tossed 6.2 shutout innings and allowed five hits and a walk...allowed just one base runner past second base...Lobaton double with one out in the fifth and went to third on a balk...the A's scored a run in the bottom of the sixth to take a 1-0 lead and he was relieved by Doolittle with a runner on first base and two outs in the seventh.

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season at Triple-A Sacramento where he was 10-7 with a 3.42 ERA in 20 starts...also had two stints with the A's...after making two relief appearances in his Major League debut in July, he returned to Oakland Aug. 10 and finished the season in the starting rotation...was 5-3 with a 2.67 ERA in 12 games, 10 starts, with the A's...also went 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA in two ALDS starts against Detroit...based upon a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he had the lowest opponents on-base percentage among American League rookies (.272), ranked second in opponents batting average (.214) and slugging percentage (.298) and third in ERA...struck out 67 batters in 64.0 innings and his average of 9.42 strikeouts per nine innings was second best (Allen, CLE 11.26).

LHP Scott Kazmir (5-1, 2.39 ERA): Ranks fifth in the American League in ERA (2.39), tied for fifth in winning percentage (.833) and tied for sixth in wins (5)...is second in opponents slugging percentage (.292) and fifth in batting average (.215) and on-base percentage (.275)...is 12-6 with a 2.80 ERA over his last 27 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...the ERA is third lowest in the AL over that span (min. 130.0 ip)...leads the majors in run support average (7.69)...has allowed a .133 batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranks third in the AL...the A's are 8-1 (.889) in his starting assignments...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-2 A's win at Cleveland last Saturday (1.1 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 1 so)...it was the shortest outing of his career as he was ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne in the second inning...is 4-5 with a 3.80 ERA in 15 career starts against Toronto...has not faced the Blue Jays since August 13, 2010 when he was the losing pitcher in a 3-0 Angels loss at Los Angeles (6.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 3 so).

- Is tied for the AL lead in decisions (18) and has allowed the second fewest walks (47) and home runs (7).
- Has a 1.80 ERA (8 er in 40.0 ip) over the last 12 games after posting a 3.11 ERA over its first 33 games.
- Has just six save opportunities and four saves since April 23 (25 games)...team is 16-9 during that stretch.

- Has a 14-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011...that is the longest active losing streak in the majors and it matches the longest losing streak in the majors over the last 21 years...the last longer streak was a 27-game losing streak by Anthony Young from May 6, 1992-July 24, 1993.
- Has faced the Rays twice in his career (2.2 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 3 so).

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.
