OAKLAND ATHLETICS (30-19) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (28-22)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost a seasonhigh tying three consecutive games (third time, also: April 21-23 and May 5-7)...have not lost more than three in a row since May 6-10, 2003 when they had a five-game losing streak...are now 30-19 for the season, which is the second best record in the American League (Detroit 28-17) and third best in

League (Detroit, 28-17) and third best in the majors (San Francisco, 31-18)...held sole possession of the best record in the majors Thursday and Friday, which marked the first time the A's have had the best record since Sept. 23, 2002...the 30-19 mark is the A's best record after 49 games since the 1990 club started the year 33-16 (won game 50)...lead the AL West by $2\frac{1}{2}$ games...led the West by a season-high four games Monday through Wednesday...it was the first time the A's led the West by at least four games before the All-Star Break since 1992 when they led by as many as four games as early as June 15...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 27th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 31 consecutive days and 44 of the last 46...have 40 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for third and three days in fourth...swept a three-game series from Cleveland to start the road-trip, their fifth series sweep of the season...that is tied with Detroit for the Major League lead.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-3 on this nine-game road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Toronto (0-2)...are on a seasonhigh three-game road losing streak after winning a season-high six straight on the road...are now 18-9 (.667) on the road for the season, which is **tied for the best road record in the majors** (Detroit, 14-7)...it is the third best start on the road in Oakland history...the 1990 club started 19-8 (won game 28) and the 1988 club went 20-7 (won game 28)...return home following the game today for a seven-game homestand against Detroit (four games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 6-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-3), Washington (3-0) and Chicago-AL (2-1) and are 12-10 (.545) at home, which is the third best home record in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.06 ERA (31 er in 135.2 ip) and .196 (95 for 484) opponents batting average over the past 15 games...now have a 2.89 ERA (144 er in 448.1 ip) for the season, which is the **best in the American League** and second best in the majors (Atlanta, 2.84)...**lead the majors** in opponents batting average (.218), on-base percentage (.284) and slugging percentage (.328)...also lead the majors with a .188 (68 for 362) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...are tied for third in the AL in shutouts (6) and have the fourth fewest walks (138).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer in nine of the past 15 games and are 9-2 with a 1.81 ERA (18 er in 89.1 ip) over that span...are now 20-10 with a 2.87 ERA (94 er in 295.0 ip) for the season...the ERA is the **best in the majors** and have the fewest losses...rank third in the American League in innings pitched (295.0).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .175 (29 for 166) over the past five games and have scored 12 runs over that span (2.40 runs per game)...had a .286 average and 75 runs scored over the previous 11 contests (6.82 per game)...**lead the majors** in walks (214), rank second in runs (247) and on-base percentage (.337), third in triples (13), fifth in extra base hits (153), seventh in fewest strikeouts (346), ninth in slugging percentage (.407) and tied for ninth in doubles (89).

THE LONG BALL: The A's offense is fifth in the American League and ninth in the majors with 51 home runs...30 of those have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors (Toronto, 31)...the pitching staff has allowed 38 home runs, which is second fewest in the AL (Detroit, 34) and tied for sixth fewest in the majors...only 12 of those have come with runners on base, which is tied for second fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed two errors yesterday after being charged with just two errors over the previous 11 games...now have 36 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...the errors have led to just 11 unearned runs, which is tied for

the fewest in the AL...are 18-9 when committing at least one error compared to 12-10 when going errorless.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 28 for 31 (90.3%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 31 of their 35 (88.6%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the American League and fourth highest in the majors...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 10 for 42 (.238) with 11 walks, two doubles, a home run and seven RBI...lead the American League in walks and plate appearances (55), are tied for the lead in home runs, second in RBI and tied for second in extra base hits (3).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 8-7 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the American League in last at bat wins and are tied for the lead in games...are 5-3 in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning wins and games and have the fourth best record...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (5) and are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (3) and losses when leading after seven innings (5)...are 10-12 in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 20-7 in games decided by three runs or more.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have used just 31 players this year...in the AL, only Boston has employed fewer players (29)...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 49 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an Oakland team since they began the 1984 season with a 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 19-3 when scoring first, which is the best record in the majors...are 19-1 when outhomering the opposition, which is also the best...are 12-9 in May after going 18-9 in April...have a streak of 11 consecutive months with a winning record dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972... the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 9 minutes...averaged 3:05 last year, which was second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Cook, Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL eight times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's have lost the first two meetings of 2014...won the season series last year, 4-3...lost two of three at home but were 3-1 in four games in Toronto...Josh Reddick hit five home runs at Rogers Centre last year Aug. 9-10, which tied the Major League record for most home runs in a two-game span...all-time, the A's are 207-181 (.534) against the Blue Jays...are 100-93 in Oakland, 107-86 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Alberto Callaspo a .333 (48 for 144) hitter in his career against Toronto, his best batting average against any team (min. 50 AB)...Josh Donaldson has a 29-game reaching base streak on the road dating back to Sept. 28 of last year, which is the longest road reaching base streak by an Athletic since Mark McGwire had a 55game streak from Sept. 3, 1995-July 26, 1996...Sean Doolittle has not allowed a run in his past 10 games and 11.1 innings pitched...Derek Norris is batting .356 (26 for 73) with 17 walks (.478 on-base percentage) over his last 26 games...John Jaso is batting .351 (20 for 57) with 11 runs, three home runs, eight RBI and seven walks (1 hbp, .431 on-base percentage) over his last 17 games.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1931** the A's win their 17th consecutive game in a 4-2 win over the Yankees at Philadelphia...the winning streak remained a franchise record until 2002 when the A's won an American League record 20 consecutive games...in **1975** Gene Tenace connects for the 6000th home run in the history of the Athletics franchise in the A's 6-3 win in the first game of a doubleheader at Cleveland.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Drew Pomeranz (4-1, 0.94 ERA)

THREE STRAIGHT SCORELESS STARTS: Moved into the starting rotation in the second game of the doubleheader May 7 against Seattle and has tossed 5.0 scoreless innings in each of his three starts (15.0 ip, 8 h, 4 bb, 16 so)...the bullpen has completed the shutout in all three starts...the 15.0-inning scoreless streak is a career high and the second longest active streak in the American League...the last A's pitcher with three consecutive scoreless outings of five or more innings is Ted Lilly (Sept. 10-21, 2003)...the only pitchers in Oakland history with four consecutive scoreless outings of five or more innings are Steve Ontiveros (June 14-July 4, 1994) and Cory Lidle (Aug. 4-21, 2002)...has allowed three hits or fewer in each start and joins Ontiveros (June 14-24, 1994) as the only A's pitchers since 1914 with three consecutive scoreless outings of five innings or more and three hits or fewer.

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Has won each of his last three starts, which is the longest winning streak of his career...had not put together consecutive wins prior to this year...now has four wins in 2014 after tallying four wins in 34 games over his first three seasons.

BRIEFLY: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-1 with a 1.98 ERA in nine relief appearances before moving into the starting rotation...has allowed one earned run or fewer in each of his 12 appearances and has a 0.94 ERA in 28.2 innings...his ERA is second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 25 or more innings (Britton, BAL 0.70).

LAST SIX GAMES: Is 3-0 with a 0.44 ERA (1 er in 20.1 ip) over his last six games and has 22 strikeouts in 20.1 innings (9.74 per nine innings)...went 0-1 with a 2.16 ERA over his first six games while fanning five in 8.1 innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .188 opponents batting average, including .179 (5 for 28) against left-handed hitters compared to .192 (14 for 73) against right-handers...his career splits are .168 (24 for 143) against left-handers, .282 (136 for 483) against right-handers...has surrendered 18 of his 20 career home runs to right-handers and has a .460 career slugging percentage against rightes compared to .224 by lefties...has allowed a .091 (5 for 55) batting average with two strikes...opponents are 3 for 27 (.111) with one walk (.143 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...has a .136 (8 for 59) opponents average over his first 30 pitches in a game, .262 (11 for 42) after that...has surrendered two home runs, both solo shots on the first pitch.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is 3-0 with a 0.00 ERA (15.0 ip) and .157 (8 for 51) opponents batting average in three starts and 1-1 with a 1.98 ERA and .220 opponents average in nine relief appearances...first batters faced were 0 for 8 with a walk in his relief appearances and he stranded all three of his inherited runners...began his career with 30 consecutive starts before making his final four appearances of 2013 in relief...is 7-14 with a 4.85 ERA (3 er in 18.2 ip) in 13 relief appearances.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 0.00 ERA (14.0 ip) and .106 (5 for 47) opponents batting average in six games at home compared to 1-1 with a 1.84 ERA (3 er in 14.2 ip) and .259 (14 for 54) opponents batting average in six games on the road.

FIVE INNINGS OR FEWER: Has tossed 5.0 innings in each of his first three starts and has now tossed five innings or fewer in each of his last 19 starts dating back to Aug. 1, 2012...that is the longest streak of consecutive starts of five innings or fewer by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914 (previous: Len Barker, 14 from May 21, 1985-June 10, 1987)...is 4-7 with a 4.63 ERA (41 er in 79.2 ip) over that stretch...has tossed more than five innings in just six of his 33 career starts.

FIRST START: He combined with Dan Otero and Jim Johnson on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win in the second game of the doubleheader May 7 against Seattle...it was his first win as a starter since Sept. 26, 2012 against Chicago (NL)...tossed 5.0 innings and allowed two of the hits: a two-out single by Cano in the first and a one out single by Smoak in the fourth...allowed just one base runner as far as second base.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 11-0 win over Chicago (AL) May 13 in Oakland...it marks the first time in his career he has put together back-to-back wins...combined with Dan Otero, Fernando Abad and Joe Savery on a four-hit shutout...tossed five innings and allowed three of the hits while striking out a career-high eight.

LAST START: He combined with Dan Otero, Luke Gregerson and Sean Doolittle on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Tampa Bay

THIS SPRING: Was 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA (12.2 ip, 13 h, 7 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 20 so, 2 hr) in eight games this spring, all in relief...opponents hit .250...averaged 14.21 strikeouts per nine innings...had more strikeouts than innings pitched in six of his eight appearances...had an 8.10 ERA over his first three games...allowed just one earned run over his final five contests (9.1 ip, 0.96 ERA)

2013 RECAP: Was 0-4 with a 6.23 ERA in eight games, including four starts, over two stints with Colorado...walked 19 and struck out 19 in 21.2 innings...allowed a .301 opponents batting average, including .130 (3-for-23) against left-handed hitters compared to .367 (22-for-60) against right-handers...issued 16 of his 19 walks and yielded nine of his 10 extra base hits to righties...had a .405 OPS against lefties compared to 1.150 against righties...held opponents to a .190 average with runners in scoring position, including .091 with RISP and two outs...has a .174 (12-for-69) career average with RISP and two outs...was 0-2 with a 4.61 ERA and .255 opponents average in six games at Coors Field, 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA and .375 opponents average in two starts on the road...in three seasons with the Rockies, he went 2-7 with a 4.40 ERA in 19 games at home compared to 2-7 with a 6.20 ERA (42 er in 61.0 ip) in 15 games on the road...opponents batted .158 when leading off an inning...tossed 4.1 innings or fewer, allowed three runs or more and walked four batters or more in each of his four starts

2013 WITH COLORADO: Was recalled for the first time June 30 and went 0-4 with an 8.10 ERA and .358 opponents batting average in four starts...walked 18 in 16.2 innings while striking out just 13...was optioned to Colorado Springs July 11 but was recalled July 22 and placed on the disabled list the next day with left biceps tendinitis...was reinstated Sept. 6 and pitched in relief for the first time in his career...did not allow a run while holding opponents to a .063 batting average in four relief outings (5.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 6 so)...did not inherit a runner and retired all four of his first batters faced

2013 WITH COLORADO SPRINGS: Began the season at Triple-A Colorado Springs and went 8-1 with a 4.20 ERA in 15 starts before the Rockies called June 30...struck out 96 batters in 85.2 innings, an average of 10.1 per nine innings...despite spending just three months with the Sky Sox, he led the club in wins and strikeouts...allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .180 (18-for-100) against left-handed hitters compared to .290 (65-for-224) against right-handers...opponents hit .217 with the bases empty compared to .306 with runners on base...including .329 with runners in scoring position...logged a 1.20 ERA in the first inning and had a 3.00 ERA over the first four innings of a game compared to 7.01 from the fifth inning on...the Sky Sox were 13-2 (.867) in his starting assignments...went 4-0 with a 2.54 ERA in five starts in the month of April...extended his season-opening winning streak to six games May 16 at Round Rock...struck out a season-high 11 batters in 6.2 shutout innings June 16 at Las Vegas...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in wins (8) and strikeouts (96) at the time of his promotion to Colorado June 30.

LHP Tommy Milone (2-3, 3.99 ERA): Is 2-0 with a 1.37 ERA and .171 opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 0-3 with a 5.86 ERA and .274 opponents average over his first five starts...is 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA and .174 opponents batting average in three starts in Oakland compared to 1-3 with a 5.60 ERA and .272 opponents batting average in six starts on the road...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-2 A's win at Tampa Bay last Wednesday (5.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...is 1-2 with a 7.13 ERA in three career starts against the Rays, including a loss in his only start last year on April 21 at Tampa Bay (6.2 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 2-0 with a 3.24 ERA in three career regular season starts against betroit...including a win his only start last year, a five-inning complete game three-hitter in the A's 6-3 win on Aug. 27 at Detroit (3 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...also started Game 2 of the 2012 ALDS at Detroit and had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss (6.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 9-2 with a 1.94 ERA in 18 career against the AL Central compared to 19-20 with a 4.60 ERA in 54 games against all others teams.
