OAKLAND ATHLETICS (30-20) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (28-18)

MONDAY, MAY 26, 2014 – O.CO COLISEUM – 1:05 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's were swept at Toronto over the weekend and have now lost a season-high four consecutive games...it marks the first time the A's have lost more than three straight in over a year...it is the A's longest losing streak since dropping five straight from May 6-10, 2013...now have a 1½-game lead in the American League West, which is the A's smallest lead since May

8 (also 1½)...have not led by fewer than one game since April 27 when they were tied for first...are 30-20 for the season, which is the second best record in the AL (Detroit, 28-18) and third best in the majors (San Francisco, 32-18)...it is the A's best record after 50 games since the 1991 club also started the year 30-20 (won game 51)...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 28th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 32 consecutive days and 45 of the last 47...have 41 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...the sweep at Toronto marks the second time this year the A's have been swept (April 21-23 vs. Texas)...have swept five series, which is tied with Detroit for the Major League lead...had the best record in the majors last Wednesday and Thursday, which marked the first time the A's held sole possession of the best record in the majors record since Sept. 23, 2002.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 13 of the last 16 games and are 9-3 with a 1.93 ERA (20 er in 93.1 ip) and .198 (67 for 339) opponents batting average over that span...are now 20-11 with a 2.89 ERA (96 er in 299.0 ip) for the season...the ERA is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 2.82)...the losses are the fewest in the majors...are fourth in the AL in innings pitched (299.0 ip).

PITCHING: The A's have won 11 of their last 16 games and have a 2.13 ERA (34 er in 143.2 ip) and .204 (105 for 515) opponents batting average over that span...lead the majors in opponents batting average (.220), on-base percentage (.286) and slugging percentage (.330) and rank second to Atlanta in ERA (2.90)...also lead the majors with a .185 (69 for 372) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...are tied for third in the AL in shutouts (6).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored three runs or fewer in each of the last six games (13 runs total, 2.17 per game) and are batting .172 (34 for 198) over that span...hit .290 with 69 runs scored over the previous nine games (7.67 per game)...lead the majors in walks (217), rank second in runs (248), third in on-base percentage (.335) and triples (13), fifth in extra base hits (155), seventh in fewest strikeouts (353) and ninth in slugging percentage (.405).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a seven-game homestand today against Detroit (four games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...these are the A's only seven home games over a 25-game stretch from May 16 to June 11...have won six of the last seven home games after losing six straight...went 6-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-3), Washington (3-0) and Chicago-AL (2-1) and are 12-10 (.545) at home, which is the third best home record in the American League...went 5-4 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Toronto (0-3)...have a season-high four-game road losing streak after winning a season-high six straight on the road...are 18-10 (.643) on the road for the season, which is the second best road record in the majors (Detroit, 14-7).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 30 for 33 (90.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 34 of their 38 (89.5%) attempts, which is also the highest percentage in the majors...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed three errors in the last three games after making just one error over the previous 10 contests...have 36 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...the errors have led to just 11 unearned runs, which is tied for the fewest in the AL...are 18-9 when committing at least one error compared to 12-11 when going errorless.

THE LONG BALL: The A's offense ranks fifth in the American League and ninth in the majors with 52 home runs...30 of those have come

with runners on base, which is second most in the majors (Toronto, 31)...the pitching staff has allowed 39 home runs, which is second fewest in the AL (Detroit, 35) and sixth fewest in the majors...only 12 of those have come with runners on base, which is tied for second fewest in the majors.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 10 for 43 (.233) with 11 walks, two doubles, a home run and seven RBI...lead the American League in walks, are tied for the lead in plate appearances (56) and home runs, tied for second in extra base hits (3) and rank third in RBI.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-3 in extra inning games...lead the American League in extra inning wins and games and have the fourth best record...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (5) and are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (3) and losses when leading after seven innings (5)...are 8-7 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Tampa Bay for the AL lead in last at bat wins and tied with Chicago and Boston for the lead in last at bat games...are 10-13 in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 20-7 in games decided by three runs or more.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 19-3 when scoring first, which is the best record in the majors...are 19-1 when outscoring the opposition, which is also the best...are 12-10 in May after going 18-9 in April...have a streak of 11 consecutive months with a winning record dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 50 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an Oakland team since they began the 1984 season with a 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 9 minutes...averaged 3:05 last year, which was second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Cook, Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL eight times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's won the season series last year, 4-3...lost two of three in Oakland but won three of four in Detroit...then lost to the Tigers in the ALDS in five games for the second consecutive season...the season series win last year was the A's first since 2008...are 15-15 against the Tigers since 2010...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 243-235 against the Tigers...that includes 135-105 in Oakland, 106-128 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 911-988 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's are 24-19 on Memorial Day since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 16-11 in Oakland and 8-8 on the road...this marks the seventh time the A's have faced the Tigers on Memorial Day since 1968 and the two clubs have split the six games...last met in 2010 at Detroit (W, 4-1) and last met in Oakland in 1984 (L, 2-6)...**Alberto Callaspo** has a 14-game hitting streak against the Tigers dating back to July 17, 2012 (18 for 49, .367)...is a .315 (64 for 203) career hitter against Detroit...**Josh Donaldson** has reached base safely in each of his last 40 games as a third baseman, which is the longest such streak by an Athletics third baseman since at least 1914...**Sean Doolittle** has not allowed a run in his past 10 games and 11.1 innings pitched...**Brandon Moss** has 17 extra base hits in May, which is one short of the Oakland record for extra base hits in May set by Jason Giambi in 2001 (18).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1954 Gus Zernial hits the last grand slam in Philadelphia A's history in a 6-5 win over Boston...in 1975 Gene Tenace has five RBI including the game winning RBI single in the bottom of the 11th inning of the A's 6-5 win over Baltimore...in 1989 Todd Burns, Rick Honeycutt and Eric Plunk combine to shutout the Yankees on one hit in a 4-0 victory at New York.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Tommy Milone (2-3, 3.99 ERA)

LAST THREE STARTS: Is 2-0 with a 1.37 ERA (3 er in 19.2 ip) and .171 (12 for 70) opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 0-3 with a 5.86 ERA and .274 opponents average over his first five starts...has 14 strikeouts, four walks and one home run over his last three starts after tallying 16 strikeouts, 12 walks and four home runs over his first five starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA (4 er in 20.0 ip) and .174 (12 for 69) opponents batting average in three starts in Oakland compared to 1-3 with a 5.60 ERA (17 er in 27.1 ip) and .272 (31 for 114) opponents batting average in six starts on the road...has allowed four of his five home runs on the road...last year, he went 5-4 with a 3.44 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 7-5 with a 4.69 ERA in 16 games on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 13-8 with a 2.89 ERA (60 er in 186.2 ip) in 30 games in Oakland compared to 14-14 with a 4.87 ERA (112 er in 207.0 ip) in 37 games on the road.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Has made one start against an American League Central team (Chicago on May 14) and had a no decision, allowing one run in 6.0 innings...went 3-1 with a 1.98 ERA in eight games against AL Central teams last year...is now 9-2 with a 1.94 ERA (23 er in 106.2 ip) in 18 career appearances against the AL Central compared to 19-20 with a 4.60 ERA (160 er in 313.0 ip) in 54 games against all others teams.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .200 (7 for 35) batting average with runners in scoring position...last year, opponents hit .216 with RISP, which ranked eighth in the American League...has issued 13 of his 16 walks and allowed four of his five home runs this year to right-handed hitters...has yielded 25 of his 30 home runs over the last two years to righties...has held the opponents number three, four and five hitters to a .129 (8 for 62) batting average.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA (10 er in 30.2 ip) in five starts at night compared to 0-2 with a 5.94 ERA (11 er in 16.2 ip) in three starts during the day...has yielded one home run in 30.2 innings at night, four home runs in 16.2 innings during the day.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 0-1 with a 3.38 ERA (7 er in 18.2 ip) in three starts on four days rest compared to 2-2 with a 4.39 ERA (14 er in 28.2 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in three of his eight starts this year, all losses...last year, he received just 10 runs of support in his nine losses (1.78 RSA)...has received just 22 runs of support in his 22 losses in three seasons with the A's (124.2 ip, 1.59 RSA)...has received no support 12 times over the last three years as a starter and one run of support eight times...went 11-1 with three runs of support or more in 2013 and is 22-3 in his career.

THIS AND THAT: Has left with the lead in three of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (Gregerson each time)...the A's are 2-6 (.250) in his starting assignments...went 16-10 (.615) in his 26 starting assignments last year and are 38-27 (.585) in his career...his teams are 43-27 (.614) in his 69 career starts...has a 9.00 ERA (8 er in 8.0 ip) in the first inning, a 2.97 ERA (13 er in 39.1 ip) after that.

2014 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss at Seattle **April 11**...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and two unearned runs in the second on errors by Donaldson and Lowrie...surrendered a two-run home run to Zunino in the sixth and left trailing 5-0...Hernandez shutout the A's three hits over the seven innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) **April 16**...allowed a run in the third inning on a Trout RBI double, but the A's scored four times in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead...put the first two batters on base in the seventh inning and was relieved by Otero, who allowed both runners to score...Gregerson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Texas **April 22** in Oakland...walked a career-high tying four batters...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Murphy RBI single and a Chirinos bases loaded walk...the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first but he allowed a run in the third when Rios scored on a Kouzmanoff grounded into double play...the A's then scored twice in the fourth to take the lead...left after six innings with a 4-3 lead but Gregerson allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss at Houston **April 27**...allowed just one run over the first six innings and that was in the third inning when Villar doubled and later scored on a Fowler ground

out...then allowed a two-out two-run triple to Villar in the seventh inning...was relieved by Otero, who allowed Villar to score on an Altuve home run...McHugh shutout the A's on one hit over the first eight innings before Callaspo had a RBI single in the ninth...fell to 0-3 in the A's 6-3 loss at Boston **May 3**...matched his career-highs by walking four batters (sixth time) and allowing three home runs (fourth time)...allowed a grand slam to Gomes in the first inning and solo home runs to Ortiz in the third and Ross in the fourth...left after walking Napoli to start the fifth with the A's trailing 6-0...combined with Fernando Rodriguez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Washington **May 9** in Oakland...tossed eight innings and allowed two of the hits, both to Hairston...also walked three batters but allowed just two base runners as far as second base...had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss to Chicago (AL) **May 14** in Oakland...allowed a home run to Beckham on the first pitch of the game but blanked the White Sox on four hits and a hit batter after that...left after six innings with the A's lead 2-1 but Gregerson allowed a three-run home run in the eighth inning for the blown save.

LAST START: He extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 3-2 win at Tampa Bay last Wednesday...the A's scored twice in the second and once in the fourth and he blanked the Rays on three hits over the first five innings...allowed a RBI single to Loney and was relieved by Rodriguez with runners on first and second and two outs...Rodriguez allowed one of the inherited runners to score.

MILONE vs. DETROIT: Is 2-0 with a 3.24 ERA (16.2 ip, 17 h, 8 r, 6 er, 7 bb, 10 so) in three career regular season starts...including a win in his only start last year, a five-inning complete game three-hitter in the A's 6-3 win at Detroit Aug. 27...the A's scored twice in the first but he allowed three runs in the bottom of the first on two-run single by Fielder and a Callaspo error...the A's tied the game in the third and took the lead in the fifth before the game was called because of rain with the A's batting in the sixth...his other starts came in 2012, including a win in an 11-4 decision in Oakland May 11...retired each of the final 10 batters he faced...then had a no decision in the A's 12-4 win at Detroit September 20...left trailing 3-2 with two outs in the fifth but the A's scored four times in the sixth for the win...had a no decision in his only ALDS appearance, a start in the A's 5-4 loss in Game 2 at Detroit on October 7, 2012...the A's scored a run in the third inning, but he allowed a run in the bottom of the third when Cabrera doubled and later scored on a Young ground out...the A's scored a run in the seventh to take a 2-1 lead and he was relieved by Doolittle to start the bottom of the seventh...Doolittle was charged with two unearned runs for the blown save.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Sonny Gray (5-1, 1.99 ERA): Leads the American League and ranks fifth in the majors in ERA (2.10)...is also tied for fifth in the AL in winning percentage (.833) and tied for ninth in wins...has tossed six innings or more and allowed three runs or fewer in each of his first 10 starts, which is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...is 9-2 with a 2.08 ERA over his last 16 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...the wins are tied for fourth most in the majors over that span and the ERA is sixth lowest (min. 75.0 ip)...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-2 A's loss at Tampa Bay last Thursday (8.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...will be making his first career regular season appearance against Detroit...made two starts in the 2013 ALDS and was 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA...combined with Grant Balfour on a four-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win in Oakland in Game 2 but had a no decision...took the loss in Game 5.

- The A's bullpen is tied for the American League lead in wins (10) and is first in ERA (2.92)...ranks first in opponents batting average (.219), opponents on-base percentage (.282) and opponents slugging percentage (.293)...is tied for the most blown saves (8), has the second lowest save percentage (52.9%) and is tied for the second fewest saves (9) and the fourth most losses (9)...has the fourth highest percentage of inherited runners scored (21 of 63, 33.3%).
- Has allowed the second fewest walks (49) and home runs (8).
- Has a 2.50 ERA (14 er in 50.1 ip) over the last 16 games after posting a 3.11 ERA over its first 33 games.
- Has just six save opportunities and four saves since April 23 (29 games)...team is 16-13 during that stretch.

- Has thrown four straight scoreless outings (3.1 ip) after allowing five runs over his previous five outings (3.2 ip)...did not allow a run over his first 14 appearances (13.1 ip) this season.
- Is second among AL relievers in opponents slugging percentage (.145) and fifth in opponents batting average (.145) and on-base percentage (.221)...all 10 of his hits allowed this season have been singles.
- Is third among AL relievers in WHIP (0.79).
- Has a 14-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011...that is the longest active losing streak in the majors and it matches the longest losing streak in the majors over the last 21 years...the last longer streak was a 27-game losing streak by Anthony Young from May 6, 1992-July 24, 1993.

ALBERTO CALLASPO

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.
- Struck out a career-high tying three times May 3 at Boston (third time, first since Sept. 23, 2012 vs. Chicago-AL).

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.

- Homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his career May 13-16 (also: Aug. 29-31, 2012)
- Scored a career-high four runs May 18 at Cleveland.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was also at Los Angeles on April 9, 2013.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...it was his fifth career two-homer game (last: Aug. 28, 2013 at Detroit) and his fourth game with five or more RBI... became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

DREW POMERANZ
