RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers lost the series finale to the Rangers 12-4 on Sunday afternoon at Comerica Park. Victor Martinez and Andrew Romine each had two hits and drove in a run, while Rajai Davis also added two hits and scored one run. Torii Hunter and Austin Jackson added one hit and one RBI. Justin Verlander started on the mound and took the loss after allowing nine runs, six earned, on 11 hits, walking three and striking out one. The Tigers open a seven-game road trip this afternoon with the first of a four-game series against Oakland. After the series vs. the Athletics, the Tigers travel to Seattle for a three-game series vs. the Mariners, starting on Friday.

KINSLER EXTENDS HITTING STREAK TO 11 GAMES: Ian Kinsler extended his hitting streak to 11 games in yesterday's contest, going 1x5 with one run scored. Over his last 11 games, Kinsler is hitting .400 (20x50) with 10 runs scored, eight doubles and three RBI. Kinsler's hitting streak is tied with Cleveland's Michael Brantley for the longest active hitting streak in the American League.

ON THE ROAD: The Tigers enter this afternoon's game with a 14-7 road record and a .667 road winning percentage, which ranks as the best road winning percentage in the American League. Detroit's 14-7 road record is the team's best through 21 games since the 2007 team also had a 14-7 record through 21 road contests.

THE NEED FOR SPEED: The Tigers enter today's game ranked second in the American League with 39 stolen bases. The 39 steals in 46 games this season already eclipses the 35 steals the Tigers had in all of 2013. Individually, Rajai Davis ranks second in the AL with 15 stolen bases.

MARTINEZ, CABRERA ON THE MARK VS. OAKLAND: Victor Martinez and Miguel Cabrera have put together impressive numbers in their career vs. the Athletics. Martinez is hitting .343 (84x245) with 23 runs scored, 20 doubles, four home runs and 24 RBI in 66 career games against Oakland. Cabrera is batting .339 (59x174) with 34 runs scored, 11 doubles, 15 home runs and 47 RBI vs. the Athletics. Martinez's .343 batting average vs. Oakland ranks first among active American League players, while Cabrera's .339 batting average is second. Cabrera leads all active AL players with a .443 on-base percentage and a .661 slugging percentage vs. Oakland.

VERLANDER MOVING UP THE TIGERS ALL-TIME INNINGS PITCHED LIST: With 5.1 innings pitched in yesterday's game vs. Texas, Justin Verlander moved into 12th place on the Tigers all-time innings pitched list with 1843.1 innings. He's 24.0 innings pitched away from tying Jim Bunning for 11th in franchise history with 1867.1 innings pitched.

THREE TIGERS MASHING IN MAY: Ian Kinsler, Victor Martinez and Miguel Cabrera have each put up excellent numbers at the plate in the month of May. Kinsler is hitting .378 (37x98) with 11 doubles, two home runs and eight RBI this month. Martinez is batting .374 (34x91) with nine doubles, eight home runs and 16 RBI, while Cabrera is hitting .372 (32x86) with 10 doubles, five home runs and 27 RBI in May. Kinsler's .378 batting average in May ranks third in the American League, Martinez ranks fourth with a .374 batting average and Cabrera is fifth with a .372 average. Cabrera leads the American League with 27 RBI in May, while Martinez's eight home runs in May are third most in the AL.

TIGERS AT THE TOP IN HITTING: The Tigers currently lead the American League with a .278 team batting average. Detroit has three of the top five hitters in the American League by batting average. Victor Martinez leads the American League with a .337 (59x175) batting average, Ian Kinsler is second with a .330 (65x197) average and Miguel Cabrera is tied for fifth with a .322 (58x180) batting average.

REPLAY RUNDOWN: The Tigers have been involved in 30 instant replay challenges so far this season. Detroit has challenged 14 plays with eight plays being overturned, three plays confirmed and three plays standing as called. Opponents have made 14 challenges with nine plays being overturned, one play confirmed and four plays standing. The umpires have initiated a pair of reviews with one play being overturned and one play confirmed.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Brad Ausmus is in his first season at the helm for the Tigers after being named the 37th manager in Tigers history on November 3, 2013.
- According to Stats, LLC, became the first manager since Clint Hurdle of Colorado and Jerry Royster of Milwaukee in 2002 to begin his career with four straight wins.
- Becomes just the 14th manager in Tigers history to have also played at the major league level for Detroit, joining Alan Trammell, Dick Tracowski, Billy Martin, Bob Swift, Billy Hitchcock, Fred Hutchinson, Mickey Cochrane, Del Baker, Bucky Harris, George Moriarty, Ty Cobb, Hughie Jennings and Bobby Lowe.
- Spent 18 seasons as a catcher at the major league level with the Padres (1993-96), Tigers (1996, 1999-2000), Astros (1997-1998, 2001-07) and Dodgers (2009-10)... made eight postseason appearances as a player, including two trips to the American League Championship Series and one to the World Series.

THE SCOOP ON SMYLY: In his second full season with the Tigers, Smyly will make his seventh start, 10th appearance overall, of the season this afternoon vs. the Athletics.

LAST TIME OUT: Smyly pitched a scoreless inning out of the bullpen on Thursday vs. Texas, striking out one. In his most recent start last Monday at Cleveland, Smyly allowed three runs on seven hits, struck out six and walked five in 5.0 innings.

ON THE ROAD: Smyly has put up impressive numbers in four road appearances, including three starts, this season. He has a 1-0 record with a 1.71 ERA (21.0IP/4ER) and 22 strikeouts on the road in 2014. His 1.71 road ERA ranks seventh among AL pitchers. Smyly has made 50 appearances, including 13 starts, in his career on the road. Smyly has a 7-1 record and a 3.02 ERA (116.1IP/39ER) in his career away from Comerica Park.

AGAINST THE AL WEST: Today's start vs. the Athletics marks Smyly's 21st appearance overall and seventh start against a team from the American League Western Division. In his previous 20 appearances, Smyly has a 2-3 record with a 4.36 ERA (53.2IP/26ER).

RECORD IN MAY: Smyly has pitched in 20 games, including 10 starts, during the month of May in his career. He has a career record of 3-2 with a 3.77 ERA (71.2IP/30ER) in the month of May.

DOMINANT IN THE DAYTIME: Smyly has pitched in 32 games, including six starts, during the day in his career and has a record of 4-2 with one save and a 2.70 ERA (70.0IP/21ER). Dating back to 2012, Smyly's 2.70 ERA in day games ranks ninth among active American League pitchers.

STARTER VS. RELIEVER: Smyly has made 24 starts in his career and has compiled a 5-5 record with a 3.75 ERA (127.1IP/53ER). In 71 career appearances out of the bullpen, Smyly has a 7-0 record with two saves and a 2.47 ERA (87.1IP/24ER).

LIMITING LEFTHANDERS: Smyly has limited lefthanded hitters to a .105 (4x38) batting average this season. Righties are hitting .274 (29x106) against Smyly this season. For his career, Smyly has held lefties to a .192 (53x276) batting average, while righthanded hitters have hit .256 (135x527) against him.

BEARING DOWN WITH RISP: Smyly has been tough on opponents once they get runners in scoring position. This season, Smyly is limiting opponents to a .200 (6x30) batting average with runners in scoring position. For his career, Smyly has held opponents to a .210 (34x162) batting average with runners in scoring position.

SMYLY TURNS IN CAREER LONG OUTING VS. ROYALS: Smyly turned in the longest outing of his major league career in his start on Saturday vs. Kansas City, working seven scoreless innings and holding the Royals to just two hits. He became the first Tigers lefthanded pitcher to work seven or more shutout innings and allow two or fewer hits since Kenny Rogers on April 30, 2006.

FOUR INNING SAVE VS. THE YANKEES: Smyly recorded his first career save on April 5, 2013 vs. the Yankees, tossing four perfect innings. He became the first Tiger pitcher to have a save of four-or-more innings since Esteban Yan on May 14, 2005 against Texas.

13 STRAIGHT OUTINGS WITH NO RUNS: Smyly did not allow a run in 13 consecutive outings from June 28-July 28, 2013. Over the stretch, Smyly worked 13.1 scoreless innings, allowed seven hits and struck out 18.

HIS FIRST MAJOR LEAGUE WIN: Smyly earned the first win of his major league career on April 28, 2013 at the Yankees, allowing one run and striking out seven in six innings. He became the first Tigers starting pitcher to earn his first major league win in New York since Larry Pashnick did so at Yankee Stadium on April 24, 1982. (Source: STATS LLC)

LIMITING THE RUNS ALLOWED: Smyly allowed just one run in each of his first four starts from April 12-28, 2013. Since at least 1918, he is the only Tigers starting pitcher to begin his career by allowing one run-or-fewer in each of his first four starts.
