

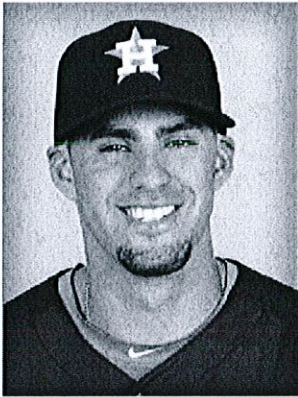

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Has played in 252 Major League games over parts of the last three seasons with the Astros and has compiled a .251 average with 44 doubles, 24 home runs and 126 RBI.
- Hit .250 (74x296) with seven homers and 52 RBI in 86 games with Houston in 2013...hit .298 in 42 road games.
- Played in the Venezuelan Winter League during the 2013 offseason and hit .312 (29x93) with six doubles, six homers, 18 RBI and a .957 OPS (.387 OBP/.570 SLG) in 24 games for the Leones del Caracas.
- Led the Astros with 55 RBI in 2012 after beginning the season as the club's Opening Day left fielder... opened the season with a nine-game hitting streak from April 6-15, becoming the first Astro to do so since Craig Biggio also had a nine-gamer to open the 2005 season (April 5-15, 2005).
- Named the 2011 Astros Rookie of the Year by the Houston Chapter of the BBWAA...made his MLB debut on July 30, 2011 at MIL (1x1, 2B, RBI)...in his first full month in the Majors, posted 28 RBI in August, which ranked second in the NL...ranks as the most RBI for any Astros rookie in any calendar month, besting Chris Truby's previous record of 27 in Sept. 2000.
- Labeled as the Astros No. 6 overall prospect by *Baseball America* entering the 2011 season.
- Named the Astros 2010 Minor League Player of the Year after splitting his 2010 campaign between Double A Corpus Christi and Class A Lexington...his time with Lexington earned him the South Atlantic League's MVP and Player of the Year Awards.
- Led the New York-Penn League in batting average and OPS (.920) and was named a NYPL All-Star in 2009.

NOTES

Graduated from Flanagan High School in Pembroke Pines, FL, where his team won consecutive state titles...achieved Second-Team All-Broward County honors his sophomore, junior and senior seasons...drafted out of high school in the 36th round of the June 2006 draft by Minnesota but did not sign.

Later drafted after his junior season at Nova Southeastern University in Davie, FL...hit .428 as a junior with 15 home runs and 57 RBI, while setting Nova's all time record in runs scored (73) in a single season...owns the program's career home run record...selected by the National College Baseball Writers Association as a First-Team All-American in 2009...selected by Houston in the 20th round of the June 2009 draft...signed by Astros scout Greg Brown.

A native of Miami, hit the first regular season home run at Marlins Park in Miami on April 13, 2012, off RHP Edward Mujica.

Was added to the Astros 40-man roster in July of 2011...was taken off the 40-man roster on Nov. 20, 2013...is currently signed to a minor league contract that runs through the 2014 season.

2013: 26-year-old outfielder played in 86 games in what was his third Major League season...missed over a month of the season due to a left wrist injury...hit well in 42 road games (.298 AVG)...did not make the club out of Spring Training and was optioned to minor league camp...was recalled to Houston prior to Opening Day on March 30 to replace the injured Fernando Martinez...was placed on the 15-day DL on April 20 with a right knee sprain...missed 16 games and was activated from the DL on May 6...placed on the 15-day DL on July 27 with a left wrist sprain and was not activated until Sept. 13 (missed 44 games)...sustained the injury while sliding into second base...had a career-high four hits on May 30 at COL...was one of four Astros to record an RBI in four straight games...did so from July 5-10...played in five games with Double A Corpus Christi from April 30-May 5 as part of a rehab stint...hit .300 (6x20) with two doubles, one homer and five RBI.

2012: Led the club with 55 RBI in the second extended MLB action of his career...ranked tied for third on the club with 40 walks and third with 11 home runs (all of which came in the first half)...ranked tied for third in the NL among left fielders with nine outfield assists in just 97 starts at the position...began the season as the everyday LF before getting optioned to Triple A on Aug. 7...recalled on Sept. 4...had surgery on Sept. 26 to

remove the hook of the hamate bone in his left hand...started the season with a nine-game hitting streak from April 6-15 where he hit .371 (13x35) with three homers and 10 RBI...was the longest hitting streak by an Astro to begin a season since Craig Biggio also had a nine-gamer to open the 2005 season (April 5-15, 2005)...ranked third in the NL in walks (18), tied for fourth in RBI (20) and tied for fifth in on-base percentage (.414.) from April 6-May 2...the Miami native hit the first regular season home run at Marlins Park in Miami on April 13...belted his first career grand slam against LHP Barry Zito on June 14 at SF...in 15 games from June 16-July 2, hit .308 (16x52) with four doubles, three homers, 10 RBI and a .915 OPS (.357 OBP/.558 SLG)...hit the three homers over a four-game span from June 23-26...did not make an error in his first 74 games in the outfield in 2012...had a 101-game errorless streak, spanning two seasons from Sept. 3, 2011-July 18, 2012...recorded a hit in seven of his 12 games (.303, 10x33) after his final recall from Triple A on Sept. 4...hit .233 (21x90) with six doubles and four RBI in 23 games with Triple A OKC.

J. MARTINEZ

2011: Started 52 of the final 55 games of the season after having his contract purchased from Double A on July 29...started 51 games in LF and one in RF...had 107 RBI combined at the Major League and minor league levels (141 games)...his 35 RBI after his MLB debut on July 30 were tops on the club, tied for 13th in the NL and led all NL rookies in that span...his 28 RBI in August ranked second in the NL and fourth in MLB...the 28 RBI were the most for any Astros rookie in any calendar month, besting Chris Truby's previous record of 27 in September of 2000, and were tied for the third-most in the month of August among all Astros in franchise history...hit his first career MLB home run on Aug. 3 vs. CIN, a two-run HR that was part of a 3x4, four-RBI game...also had a four-RBI game on Aug. 20 vs. SF...is one of nine Astros in franchise history to post multiple games of at least four RBI during their rookie season...made his Major League debut on July 30 as a PH and hit an RBI-double...at the time his contract was purchased by HOU, ranked second in the Texas League in batting (.338), tied for fifth in RBI (72), fifth in OBP (.414) and seventh in slugging pct. (.546)...was a Texas League All-Star selection in 2011...named TL Player of the Month for July after hitting .380 with seven HR and 16 RBI.

MINOR LEAGUES:

2010: Named the Astros Minor League Player of the Year after hitting a combined .341 (183x537) with 40 doubles, 18 homers and 89 RBI with Class A Lexington (88g) and Double A Corpus Christi (50g)...before being promoted to Corpus Christi on July 16, posted a .362 (126x348) average with 15 homers and 64 RBI in 88 games for Lexington...his performance, in a little over half the season with Lexington, earned him the South Atlantic League's Most Valuable Player Award and the SAL's Player of the Year Award...also named a Midseason and Postseason All-Star in the SAL...named the SAL's 'Best Hitting Prospect' by *Baseball America*...named Lexington's Offensive Player of the Month in April and June, the Legends' Defensive Player of the Month in May, and the SAL's Player of the Week from July 5-11...after his promotion to Corpus Christi, hit at a .302 clip (57x189) with three home runs and 25 RBI in 50 games...earned the Hooks' Offensive Player of the Month in August...**2009:** Hit a combined .348 (92x264) with 12 home runs and 56 RBI in 72 games with Rookie Level Greeneville (19g) and Class A Short Season Tri-City (53g)...after signing with Houston, assigned to Greeneville, where he hit .403 (31x77) with five home runs and 23 RBI in 19 games...promoted to Tri-City on July 12 and finished his campaign with a .326 (61x187) average, seven home runs and 33 RBI in 53 games for the ValleyCats...led the New York-Penn League in batting average and OPS (.920)...named a NYPL All-Star, and also earned NYPL Player of the Week honors from July 27-Aug. 2.

2013 SEASON

- ◆ Finished fourth big league season with the Angels batting .259 (28/108) with nine runs scored, three doubles and 10 RBI...Established new career highs in games (47), hits (28), runs, doubles and RBI.
- ◆ Made first career Opening Day roster with Angels before being optioned back to Triple-A Salt Lake on May 3...Recalled on August 14 and spent the remainder of the season with the Halos.
- ◆ Defensively played in 17 games at SS, 24 games at 3B and four games at 2B...Posted a combined .967 fielding percentage in those contests.
- ◆ Nine of his 11 career RBI came in the final 20 games of the season.
- ◆ On Sept. 2, logged first career extra-base hit, a double, in 80th big league at-bat.
- ◆ Hit .287 (104/363) in Triple-A Salt Lake with 16 doubles, five triples and four home runs...At the time of final recall, his 104 hits were third on the club while his 15 stolen bases and 43 walks ranked second.

- ◆ Made four different stints with the Angels...Played in 12 games, going 7-for-17 (.412) with an RBI and two runs scored...Prior to 2012, combined for three hits in two big league seasons (27 at-bats)...Reached base in six of seven games with an at-bat in 2012.
- ◆ Drove in first big league RBI on June 30.
- ◆ Spent majority of the 2012 season with Triple-A Salt Lake, batting .285 (100/351) with 11 doubles, seven triples, four home runs and 39 RBI...Led the Bees with 23 steals (tied for 11th in PCL) and tied for second on the club in triples.

- ◆ In 2011, began season at Triple-A Salt Lake...Hit .281 (88/321) with four HR and 35 RBI for the Bees... First recalled by Angels, June 12...Appeared in 10 games (four starts) for Angels and hit .125 (2/16) for season...Scored first career Major League run, Sept. 16 at Baltimore...Stole first career Major League base, Sept. 27 vs. Texas...In 2010, had contract selected Sept. 24 from Double-A Arkansas and made Major League debut with the Angels that evening with a start at shortstop (0/3)...Single in second inning on Sept. 26 vs. Chicago White Sox marked first hit of Major League career...In 2009 played career-high 131 games and set career-bests in hits (133), triples (9) and RBI (36) with Single-A Rancho Cucamonga...In 2008, led entire Angels organization and Midwest League with 62 stolen bases...Ranked second in league with 79 runs scored...Spent entire season with Class-A Cedar Rapids...Spent first professional season with Rookie-level Orem Owlz of the Pioneer League...Collected first hit (single) on July 1 against Casper... Hit for the cycle on Sept. 9 against Ogden, going 4-for-5 with five RBI.

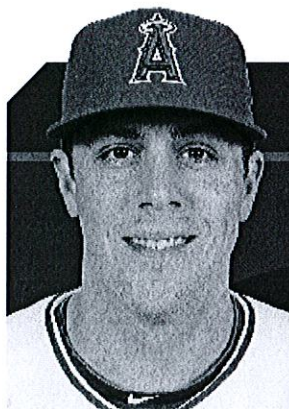

2013 SEASON

- ◆ Completed rookie season with 1-1 record and 7.20 ERA (20 IP – 16 ER) in 15 games (one start) across three separate stints with the Angels.
- ◆ Earned the win in Major League debut on April 13th vs. Houston, becoming first Halos reliever to win ML debut since Curt Brown in 1983...Became first Angel reliever to throw two innings and strike out four batters in Major League debut.
- ◆ Made first big league start on April 24 vs. Texas...In a losing effort, gave up five runs on six hits with two strikeouts in 3.1 innings of work.
- ◆ Did not allow a run in final five relief appearances for Angels (5 IP) while allowing just one hit and two walks.

MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS

- ◆ In 2013, appeared in 17 games (15 starts) for Double-A Arkansas and pitched to a 6-3 record and 4.20 ERA (79.1 IP – 37 ER) with 36 walks and 51 strikeouts...Made two postseason starts for the Travelers and was the winning pitcher in both games while allowing just one earned run in 14 innings pitched (0.64 ERA) with two walks and seven strikeouts...Made professional debut in 2012 and pitched in 11 games (nine starts) from Rookie-level Orem...Went 0-2 with a 4.91 ERA (22 IP - 12 ER) with 11 walks and 21 strikeouts.

- ◆ Named *Baseball America* first team All-American in 2011 after leading all Division I starters in ERA at 1.06.
