OAKLAND ATHLETICS (31-20) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (28-19)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their season-high four-game losing streak yesterday and are now 12-5 over the last 17 games...are 31-20 for the season, which is the second best record in the majors to San Francisco (32-19)...the last time the A's and Giants had sole possession of the first and second best record in the majors was Sept. 29, 1989...it is the A's best record

after 51 games since the 1991 club also started the year 31-20 (won game 52)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 29th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 33 consecutive days and 46 of the last 48...have a 2½-game lead over second place Los Angeles...have 42 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...were swept at Toronto over the weekend to extend their losing streak to four games...it marked the first time the A's had lost more than three straight in over a year and was the A's longest losing streak since dropping five in a row from May 6-10, 2013...the sweep marked the second time this year the A's have been swept (April 21-23 vs. Texas)...have swept five series, which is tied with Detroit for the Major League lead...had the best record in the majors last Wednesday and Thursday, which marked the first time the A's held sole possession of the best record in the majors record since Sept. 23, 2002.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff recorded its fifth shutout in the month of May yesterday, which are the A's most shutouts in May since 1931...it was the A's seventh shutout of the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...have a 2.00 ERA (34 er in 152.2 ip) and .201 (110 for 548) opponents batting average over the last 17 games...lead the majors in ERA (2.84), opponents batting average (.219), on-base percentage (.284) and slugging percentage (.328)...also lead the majors with a .183 (69 for 377) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 14 of the last 17 games and are 10-3 with a 1.80 ERA (20 er in 100.0 ip) and .195 (71 for 364) opponents batting average over that span...are now 21-11 with a 2.83 ERA (96 er in 305.2 ip) for the season...the ERA is the lowest in the majors (St. Louis, 2.91) and the losses are the fewest (Los Angeles-NL, 12)...rank fourth in the American League in innings pitched (305.2).

OFFENSE: The A's scored 10 runs yesterday after tallying 13 runs over the previous six contests...are batting .192 (45 for 234) over the last seven games after hitting .290 over the previous nine contests...lead the majors in walks (220), rank second in runs (258) and on-base percentage (.335), tied for third in triples (13), fourth in home runs (57), tied for fifth in extra base hits (160), tied for sixth in fewest strikeouts (359) and seventh in slugging percentage (.411).

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit a season-high five home runs yesterday and now have 57 for the season, which ranks second in the American League and fourth in the majors...31 of those have come with runners on base, which is tied with Toronto for the most in the majors...the pitching staff has allowed 39 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and fifth fewest in the majors...only 12 of those have come with runners on base, which is tied with the Cubs for the fewest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this seven-game homestand today against Detroit (1-0) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...these are the A's only seven home games over a 25-game stretch from May 16 to June 11...have won seven of the last eight home games after losing six straight...went 6-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-3), Washington (3-0) and Chicago-AL (2-1) and are 13-10 (.565) at home, which is the second best home record in the American League...went 5-4 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Toronto (0-3)...have a season-high four-game road losing streak after winning a season-high six straight on the road...are 18-10 (.643) on the road for the season, which is the best road record in the majors ahead of Detroit (14-8).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 30 for 33 (90.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 34 of their 38 (89.5%) attempts, which is also the

highest percentage in the majors...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors in the last four games after making just one error over the previous 10 contests...have 37 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...the errors have led to just 11 unearned runs, which is tied with Baltimore and Minnesota for the fewest in the AL...are 19-9 when committing at least one error compared to 12-11 when going errorless.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 10 for 43 (.233) with 11 walks, two doubles, a home run and seven RBI...lead the American League in walks, are tied for the lead in home runs, rank second in plate appearances (56), tied for second in extra base hits (3) and third in RBI.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 5-3 in extra inning games...lead the American League in extra inning games, are tied for the lead in wins and have the fourth best record...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (5) and are tied for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (3) and losses when leading after seven innings (5)...are 8-7 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Tampa Bay for the AL lead in last at bat wins and tied with Chicago and Boston for the lead in last at bat games...are 10-13 in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 21-7 in games decided by three runs or more.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 10-3 against American League Central teams, which is the best mark in the AL against the Central...are 20-3 when scoring first, which is the best record in the majors...are 20-1 when outhomering the opposition, which is also the best...are 13-10 in May after going 18-9 in April...have a streak of 11 consecutive months with a winning record dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 51 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an Oakland team since they began the 1984 season with a 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 9 minutes...averaged 3:05 last year, which was second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Cook, Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL eight times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's won the first meeting of 2014 yesterday after winning the season series last year, 4-3...lost two of three in Oakland but won three of four in Detroit...then lost to the Tigers in the ALDS in five games for the second consecutive season...the season series win last year was the A's first since 2008...are 20-20 against the Tigers since 2009...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 244-235 against the Tigers...that includes 136-105 in Oakland, 106-128 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 912-988 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Alberto Callaspo has a 15-game hitting streak against the Tigers dating back to July 17, 2012 (19 for 53, .358)...is a .314 (65 for 207) career hitter against Detroit...Josh Donaldson has reached base safely in each of his last 41 games as a third baseman, which is the longest such streak by an Athletics third baseman since at least 1914...Sean Doolittle has not allowed a run in his past 11 games and 12.1 innings pitched...Brandon Moss has 18 extra base hits in May, which ties the Oakland record for extra base hits in May set by Jason Giambi in 2001 (18).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1956** Art Ditmar scatters 10-hits and shuts out the Tigers 5-0 in the second game of a doubleheader...in **1984** Rickey Henderson is 3 for 3 with three stolen bases in the A's 7-1 win over New York...in **1985** Dwayne Murphy leads off the bottom of the 10th inning with a home run to lift the A's to a 2-1 win over the New York Yankees.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (5-1, 1.99 ERA)

EARNED RUN AVERGE: Has allowed one earned run or fewer in six of his 10 starts and has a 1.99 ERA for the season...that is the lowest mark in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors...since 1991, the only A's pitcher to have an ERA under 2.00 at the end of May (min. 50 ip) is Dan Haren (1.64 in 2007).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second in the American League in opponents batting average (.206) and slugging percentage (.291), tied for second in shutouts (1) and wild pitches (6), tied for fourth in complete games (1), tied for fifth in winning percentage (.833), sixth in opponents on-base percentage (.278), tied for ninth in wins (5) and tied for 10th in grounded into double plays (7).

SIX INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Has tossed six innings or more and allowed three runs or fewer in each of his first 10 starts, which is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.

LAST 16 STARTS: Is 9-2 with a 2.08 ERA (24 er in 103.2 ip) and .215 (82 for 382) opponents batting average over his last 16 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...the ERA is the lowest in the American League over that span (min. 75 ip) and the wins are tied for third.



OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held right-handed

hitters to a .180 (18 for 100) batting average, (min. 75.0 ip) which is fourth lowest in the American League...has allowed a .190 (11 for 58) batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranks ninth in the AL...has yielded a .198 (21 for 106) average with RISP in his career...opponents are 3 for 26 (.115) with RISP and two outs...opponents are batting .164 (10 for 61) when leading off an inning, which is third lowest in the AL...has surrendered four home runs all solo shots...three have been hit by lefthanded hitters...has surrendered just eight home runs in 132.0 career innings (0.55 per nine innings)...has a .167 (13 for 78) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .225 (38 for 169) after that...has yielded a .093 (10 for 107) batting average with two strikes

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-0 with a 1.76 ERA (8 er in 41.0 ip) in six starts at night compared to 1-1 with a 2.33 ERA (7 er in 27.0 ip) in four starts during the day...has the lowest night ERA in the American League...his career numbers are 6-1 with a 1.74 ERA (15 er in 77.2 ip) in 13 night games, 4-3 with a 3.15 ERA (19 er in 54.1 ip) in nine day dames

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 2.81 ERA (10 er in 32.0 ip) and .254 (31 for 122) opponents average in five starts at home compared to 3-0 with a 1.25 ERA (5 er in 36.0 ip) and .160 (20 for 125) opponents batting average in five starts on the road...leads the American League in road FRA.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 4-0 with a 2.08 ERA (12 er in 52.0 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-1 with a 1.69 ERA (3 er in 16.0 ip) in two starts on four days rest...his career numbers are 7-1 with a 1.90 ERA (17 er in 80.2 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more, 3-3 with a 3.23 ERA (17 er in 47.1 ip) in seven starts on four days rest.

10th CAREER WIN: Recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20).

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the month of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in five starts...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Was charged with his first loss of the season April 23, snapping his season-opening winning streak at three games...it snapped a six-game winning streak dating back to September 11 of last year, which was a career high...went 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak.

THAT'S ODD: Has a 3.66 ERA (14 er in 36.0 ip) in odd numbered innings compared to a 0.28 ERA (1 er in 32.0 ip) in even numbered innings

THIS AND THAT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in five of his 10 starts...the A's have been shut out twice this year, both times in his starts...the A's are 7-3 (.700) in his starting assignments this year and are 13-7 (.650) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 16 of his 20 career starts and allowed two runs or fewer 12 times

2014 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night March 31 ... tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahil, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle April 6 in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle April 12 ... struck out a career-high tying nine batters ... blanked the Mariners on three hits and two walks over his final six innings...won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-3 win over Houston *April 18* in Oakland...allowed a career-high nine hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oakland ... walked a career-high four batters...Perez shut out the A's on three hits and two walks...tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas *April 28*...became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)...allowed a Martin single in the third and a Rios single in the seventh...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win at Boston May 4...blanked the Red Sox on one hit over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high tying 14.0 innings...had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10inning win over Washington May 10 in Oakland ... allowed three runs in 7.0 innings of work, all in the third inning...was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-1 win at Cleveland May 16 ... matched his career-high with nine strikeouts.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-2, 11-inning loss at Tampa Bay last Thursday...it was the third time in his last four starts the game went extra innings...blanked the Rays on three hits and a walk over the first six innings before allowing a RBI single to Escobar in the seventh...Cobb blanked the A's on three hits over 6.2 innings, but the A's scored a run in the ninth to tie the game.

GRAY vs. DETROIT: Is making his first career regular season appearance and start...made two starts in the 2013 ALDS and was 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA (3 er in 13.0 ip)...combined with Grant Balfour on a four-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win in Oakland in Game 2 on Oct. 5 (8.0 ip, 4 h, 2 bb, 9 so) but had a no decision ... according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the third rookie to strikeout at least nine without allowing a run in a postseason game (Dave Righetti, Game 2 of 1981 ALDS; Mike Boddicker, Game 2 of 1983 ALCS)...is the fourth pitcher with 10 or fewer career regular seasons starts that has not allowed a run in a postseason start (Duster Mails, Game 6 of 1920 World Series; Brandon Backe, Game 5 of 2004 NLCS; Matt Moore, Game 1 of 2011 ALDS)...allowed just three runners into scoring position and one as far as third base...then took the loss in the A's 3-0 loss in Game 5 in Oakland on Oct. 10 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 3 so)...allowed a tworun home run to Cabrera in the fourth...was relieved by Otero with no outs and runners on first and second in the sixth and Otero allowed one of the runners to score...Verlander and Benoit shutout the A's on three hits and a walk.

LHP Scott Kazmir (5-2, 2.56 ERA): Ranks sixth in the American League in ERA and tied for ninth in wins (5)...is third in opponents slugging percentage (.300), fourth in on-base percentage (.270) and fifth in batting average (.214)...is 1-2 with a 3.38 ERA in four starts in May after going 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA in six starts in April...is 12-7 with a 2.88 ERA over his last 28 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...the ERA is fifth lowest in the AL over that span (min. 130.0 ip)...ranks second in the AL in run support average (7.09)...has allowed a .130 batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranks second in the AL...the A's are 8-2 (.800) in his starting assignments...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-2 loss at Toronto last Friday (7.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...is 4-5 with a 3.99 ERA in 13 career starts against Detroit...went 0-1 with a 5.06 ERA in two starts last year with Cleveland.

- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 consecutive games from April 6 through the first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, 16 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .387 on-base percentage) during the streak.

- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.

JIM JOHNSON

· Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

JOSH LINDBLOM

• Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- •Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...it was his fifth career two-homer game (last: Aug. 28, 2013 at Detroit) and his fourth game with five or more RBI... became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

• Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
