RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers snapped a three-game losing streak last night with a 6-5 win over Oakland at O.co Coliseum. Trailing 5-4 in the seventh inning, Detroit scored single runs in both the seventh and eighth innings to post the comeback win. Miguel Cabrera and Torii Hunter each homered and added two hits in the win. Cabrera drove in two runs, while Hunter had one RBI. J.D. Martinez went 2x3 with a double and one RBI. The Tigers bullpen combined to throw three scoreless innings with Al Alburquerque earning the win and Joe Nathan picking up his 12th save of the season. Max Scherzer started for Detroit and did not factor into the decision after giving up five runs on eight hits, striking out four and walking two in 6.0 innings. The Tigers and Athletics continue their four-game series tonight. After the series vs. Oakland, the Tigers travel to Seattle for a three-game series vs. the Mariners, starting on Friday.

FIRST ALL-STAR BALLOT UPDATE: The first balloting update for the 85th All-Star Game, to be played on Tuesday, July 15th at Target Field in Minneapolis, was announced yesterday afternoon. Miguel Cabrera, who is an eight-time All-Star and is looking to start the All-Star Game for the second straight year, leads all American League first basemen with 440,407 votes. Ian Kinsler, who is seeking his fourth career All-Star selection and first starting assignment, leads all AL second basemen with 356,244 votes. Tigers are also among the leaders at designated hitter (Victor Martinez, third place), third base (Nick Castellanos, fifth place) and outfield (Torii Hunter, sixth place; Rajai Davis, 13th place; Austin Jackson, 14th place).

CHAMBERLAIN CONTINUES TO PUT UP ZEROS: Joba Chamberlain worked a scoreless eighth inning in last night's game. The appearance continued a series of solid outings for Chamberlain, who has not allowed a run in 13 of his last 14 appearances. Over his last 14 outings, Chamberlain has a 1.32 ERA (13.2IP/2ER) with 10 hits allowed, 13 strikeouts and four walks.

DAVIS, MARTINEZ WITH IMPR

DAVIS, MARTINEZ WITH IMPRESSIVE NUMBERS VS. KAZMIR: Rajai Davis and Victor Martinez have each posted excellent numbers in their career against tonight's Oakland starter, Scott Kazmir. Davis is hitting .467 (7x15) with two doubles, one triple, one home run and six RBI off of Kazmir, whiel Martinez has a .500 (10x20) batting average with three doubles, one home run and four RBI vs. Kazmir. Among active players, Martinez's .500 batting average vs. Kazmir ranks third, while Davis' .467 average ranks fifth.

MARTINEZ, CABRERA ON THE MARK VS. OAKLAND: Victor Martinez and Miguel Cabrera have put together impressive numbers in their career vs. the Athletics. Martinez is hitting .345 (87x252) with 23 runs scored, 20 doubles, four home runs and 24 RBI in 68 career games against Oakland. Cabrera is batting .341 (62x182) with 36 runs scored, 12 doubles, 16 home runs and 49 RBI in 50 career games vs. the Athletics. Martinez's .345 batting average vs. Oakland ranks first among active American League players, while Cabrera's .341 batting average is second. Cabrera leads all active AL players with a .440 on-base percentage and a .670 slugging percentage vs. Oakland. Cabrera has hit safely in 11 of his last 13 games vs. Oakland, while Martinez is on an eight-game hitting streak against the Athletics.

THREE TIGERS MASHING IN MAY: Victor Martinez, Miguel Cabrera and Ian Kinsler have

Martinez is hitting .378 (37x98) with nine doubles, eight home runs and 16 RBI this month. Cabrera is batting .372 (35x94) with 11 doubles, six home runs and 29 RBI, while Kinsler is hitting .359 (37x103) with 11 doubles, two home runs and eight RBI in May. Martinez's .378 batting average in May ranks third in the American League, Cabrera ranks fifth with a .372 batting average and Kinsler is eighth with a .359 average. Cabrera leads the American League with 29 RBI in May, while Martinez's eight home runs in May are tied for third most in the AL.

TIGERS AT THE TOP IN HITTING: The Tigers currently lead the American League with a .275 team batting average. Detroit has three of the top six hitters in the American League by batting average. Victor Martinez leads the AL with a .341 (62x182) batting average, Miguel Cabrera is tied for fourth with a .324 (61x188) average and Ian Kinsler is sixth with a .322 (65x202) batting average.

BURGOS, CRAWFORD EARN PITCHER OF THE WEEK HONORS: Alex Burgos, a relief pitcher for the Lakeland Flying Tigers, was named the Florida State League Pitcher of the Week, while Jonathon Crawford, a starting pitcher for the West Michigan Whitecaps was named the Midwest League Pitcher of the Week for the week ending May 25. Burgos appeared in two games during the week, throwing 7.2 scoreless innings, allowing one hit and one walk, while striking out 10 batters. Crawford made one start, working seven shutout innings and striking out nine, while allowing three hits and walking one.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Brad Ausmus is in his first season at the helm for the Tigers after being named the 37th manager in Tigers history on November 3, 2013.

- According to Stats, LLC, became the first manager since Clint Hurdle of Colorado and Jerry Royster of Milwaukee in 2002 to begin his career with four straight wins.

- Becomes just the 14th manager in Tigers history to have also played at the major league level for Detroit, joining Alan Trammell, Dick Tracewski, Billy Martin, Bob Swift, Billy Hitchcock, Fred Hutchinson, Mickey Cochrane, Del Baker, Bucky Harris, George Moriarty, Ty Cobb, Hughie Jennings and Bobby Lowe.

- Spent 18 seasons as a catcher at the major league level with the Padres (1993-96), Tigers (1996, 1999-2000), Astros (1997-1998, 2001-07) and Dodgers (2009-10)...made eight postseason appearances as a player, including two trips to the American League Championship Series and one to the World Series.

ALL ABOUT ANIBAL: In his third season with the Tigers, Sanchez will make his eighth start of the season tonight against the Athletics.

LAST TIME OUT: Sanchez won his second straight start on Friday vs. Texas, allowing two runs on five hits and striking out five in 7.0 innings pitched.

ON THE ROAD: Sanchez is making his fourth road start of the season tonight against the Athletics. In three road starts this season, he has a 1-0 record with a 1.42 ERA (12.2IP/2ER) and 11 strikeouts.

Sanchez has made 93 road starts in his career and has a 31-35 record with a 3.63 ERA (555.2IP/224ER) and 448 strikeouts. RECORD AT O.co COLISEUM: Tonight's start marks Sanchez's second career regular season start at O.co Coliseum tonight. In his only other regular season start at the venue he allowed one run on three hits, struck out eight and walked four in 7.0 innings on April 14, 2013.

RECORD IN MAY: Sanchez has made 29 starts in his career in the month of May and has a 14-10 record with a 2.96 ERA (182.1IP/60ER). Since 2007, Sanchez ranks seventh among all active pitchers with a 2.96 ERA in the month of May.

AGAINST THE AL WEST: Tonight's game marks the 14th start of Sanchez's career against a team from the American League Western Division. In 13 previous starts vs. an AL West opponent, Sanchez has a 3-6 record with a 4.21 ERA (77.0IP/36ER) and 80 strikeouts.

RETURNING TO ACTION: Sanchez was reinstated from the disabled list on May 18 at Boston after being sidelined since April 27 with a right middle finger laceration.

QUALITY WORK WITH DETROIT: Sanchez has made 48 starts with the Tigers since being acquired by the club during the 2012 season. He has posted a quality start in 30 of 48 starts during his career with Detroit. Sanchez has compiled a 20-16 record and 2.90 ERA (291.2IP/94ER) in 48 starts during his Tigers career.

SANCHEZ CAPTURES AL ERA CROWN: Sanchez ended the 2013 season as leader of the American League with a 2.57 ERA (182.0IP/52ER) to capture the ERA Crown. He became the seventh pitcher in Tigers history to capture the ERA crown and the first since Justin Verlander did so with a 2.40 ERA in 2011.

SURPASSING 200: Sanchez ended the 2013 season with 202 strikeouts, to surpass the 200-or-more strikeout mark for the second time in his career. His only other season with more than 200 strikeouts was 2011 when he also fanned 202 batters with the Marlins.

CAREER HIGH IN WINS: Sanchez established a career high with 14 wins last season. His previous career high of 13 wins was established during the 2010 season with the Marlins.

JOINS FELLER WITH FIVE LOW-HIT GAMES IN FIRST 155: Sanchez fired a one-hitter in his outing on May 24th, 2013 against the Minnesota Twins, marking the fourth one-hitter of his major league career to go along with his no-hitter on September 6, 2006 versus Arizona. The outing was the 155th of his career and he joined Bob Feller as one of just two pitchers since at least 1916 to record five complete games allowing one hit-or-fewer in the first 155 games of their major league career. Feller also posted one no-hitter and four one-hitters during that span, recording his fifth with a one-hitter in the 139th game of his career on July 12, 1940 at Shibe Park against the Philadelphia Athletics.

HISTORIC STRIKEOUT PERFORMANCE VERSUS ATLANTA: Sanchez recorded 17 strikeouts over eight shutout innings in his outing on April 26, 2013 against the Atlanta Braves, establishing the franchise record for strikeouts in a single game. The 17 strikeouts surpassed the previous high of 16 strikeouts accomplished by Mickey Lolich in a complete game effort on May 23, 1969 against the California Angels at Tiger Stadium. Lolich also recorded 16 strikeouts over nine innings on June 9, 1969 against the Seattle Pilots at Tiger Stadium in a game that went 10 innings. The 17 strikeouts also established a new record for most strikeouts by any one pitchers in an Interleague game, and matched the most strikeouts ever recorded by a pitcher in 8.0 innings-or-less.

SIGNING LONG TERM: Sanchez agreed to terms on a five-year contract, plus a club option for 2018, with the Tigers on December 18, 2012.

TOSSING A NO-HITTER: Sanchez fired a no-hitter during his rookie season with the Marlins on September 6, 2006 versus Arizona. He became the 19th rookie in major league history to toss a no-hitter, and the first since Bud Smith did so with St. Louis against San Diego on September 3, 2001.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Sanchez was acquired by the Tigers in a five-player deal with the Miami Marlins on July 23, 2012. He was originally signed by the Boston Red Sox as a non-drafted free agent on January 3, 2001. Sanchez was acquired by the Marlins in a seven-player deal with the Red Sox on November 24, 2005.
