OAKLAND ATHLETICS (32-22) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (30-23)

ABOUT THE A'S: Split the four game series with Detroit to open the homestand and have now lost six of the last eight games...however, are 13-7 over the last 20 contests...are 32-22 for the season, which is the second best record in the American League (Detroit, 30-20) and tied for third best in the majors...it is the A's best record after 54 games since the 1992 club also started

The year 32-22...with a win tonight, the A's would have their best record after 55 games since 1991 (33-22)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 32nd consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 36 consecutive days and 49 of the last 51...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days with at least a share of first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...have 45 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third, and three days in fourth...have a 1½ game lead over second place Los Angeles for the third time in the last five days...have not led by fewer than one game since April 27 when they were tied for first with Texas...had a four-game losing streak from May 22-25, which marked the first time the A's lost more than three straight in over a year...it was the A's longest losing streak since dropping five in a row from May 6-10, 2013.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 11-15 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 21-7 in games decided by three runs or more...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (6) and are tied with Milwaukee for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (4)...are 9-7 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the American League in last at bat wins and are tied with Chicago and Boston for the lead in last at bat games...are 5-3 in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning games, are tied for the lead in wins and have the fourth best record...have four walk-off wins, which is tied with Baltimore and Texas for second most in the AL (Chicago, 6)

ONE-THIRD OF THE SEASON: The A's played their 54th game of the season yesterday, which is one-third of the season...Josh Donaldson is on pace to score 132 runs, which would break the Oakland record of 123 set by Reggie Jackson in 1969...Luke Gregerson is on pace to pitch in 78 games, which would tied for the second highest total in Oakland history (Koch, 84 in 2002)...Brandon Moss is on pace for 126 RBI, which would be the third best total in Oakland history (Giambi, 137 in 2000; Tejada, 131 in 2002)...the offense is on pace for 39 triples, which would be the most since the 1968 club set the Oakland record with 40...the pitching staff has a 2.89 ERA, which is currently second lowest in Oakland history (2.58 in 1972)...pitchers are also on pace for 124 strikeouts, which would break the franchise record of 1183 set last year.

IN MAY: The A's are 14-12 in May after going 18-9 in April...need to win one of the next two games to clinch a winning record for the 12th consecutive month dating back to June of 2012...that would be the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972...the pitching staff has a 3.00 ERA (78 er in 233.2 ip)...should they finish below 3.17, it would be the A's lowest May ERA since 1990 (2.43).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.25 ERA (45 er in 179.2 ip) and .210 (136 for 649) opponents batting average over the last 20 games...**lead the majors** in ERA (2.89), opponents batting average (.221), on-base percentage (.284) and slugging percentage (.333)...also lead the majors with a .187 (74 for 395) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...are tied for second in the American League in shutouts (7) and have issued the third fewest walks (149)...have five shutouts this month, which are the A's most in the month of May since 1931.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 15 of the last 20 games and are 11-4 with a 2.08 ERA (28 er in 121.0 ip) and .210 (93 for 443) opponents batting average over that span...are now 22-12 with a 2.87 ERA (104 er in 326.2 ip) for the season...the ERA is the lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 2.90) and the losses are the fewest in the majors...are tied for the American League lead in complete games (2) and tied for third in innings pitched (326.2).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .202 (67 for 332) over the last 10 games after hitting .290 over the previous nine contests...**lead the**

majors in walks (233), rank second in on-base percentage (.333), third in runs (270), tied for third in triples (13), fourth in home runs (60), tied for fifth in extra base hits (170) and eighth in slugging percentage (.410) and fewest strikeouts (381).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 60 home runs, which ranks second in the American League and fourth in the majors...34 of those have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors (Toronto, 35)...the pitching staff has allowed 42 home runs, which is second fewest in the AL and sixth fewest in the majors...only 12 of those have come with runners on base, which is tied with the Cubs for the fewest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this seven-game homestand against Detroit (2-2) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...these are the A's only seven home games over a 25-game stretch from May 16 to June 11...have won eight of the last 11 home games after losing six straight...went 6-4 on the last homestand and are 14-12 (.538) at home...begin a nine-game road trip to New York-AL (three games), Baltimore (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games) on Tuesday...went 5-4 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Toronto (0-3)...have a season-high four-game road losing streak after winning a season-high six straight on the road...are 18-10 (.643) on the road for the season, which is the best road record in the majors (Detroit, 16-9).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 30 for 34 (88.2%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 35 of their 39 (89.7%) attempts, which is also the highest percentage in the majors...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 37 errors, which is third most in the American League...the errors have led to just 12 unearned runs, which is third fewest in the AL...are 19-9 when committing at least one error compared to 13-13 when going errorless...rank second in the AL with 12 outfield assists (Toronto, 14).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters have 12 walks, which is five more than any other American League team and second most in the majors (Washington, 15)...are tied for the AL lead in home runs (1) and plate appearances (60), tied for second in extra base hits (3), rank third in on-base percentage (.383) and tied for third in RBI (7).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 20-3 when scoring first, which is the best record in the majors...are 6-2 on Sunday, which is the best record in the American League...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 54 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an A's team since they began the 1984 season with an Oakland record 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 2-1 after taking two of three at Los Angeles in April...won the season series last year 11-8...went 6-4 in Oakland and 5-4 in Los Angeles...it was the A's third consecutive season series win...are 34-26 (.567) against the Angels over the last four seasons...including 27-3 when scoring four or more runs...have been shutout in seven of their last 18 losses to the Angels and have scored just one run in six of those games...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 399-322 against the Angels...that includes 205-153 in Oakland and 194-169 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 448-399 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Donaldson has reached base safely in each of his last 44 games as a third baseman, which is the longest such streak by an Athletics third baseman since at least 1914... **Brandon Moss** has 18 extra base hits in May, which ties the Oakland record for extra base hits in May set by Jason Giambi in 2001.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1932** Al Simmons and Jimmy Dykes hit two home runs each and Lefty Grove tosses a six-hitter in a 13-2 win over Washington...in **1982** Rickey Henderson has three hits, three RBI and four stolen bases in the second game of a doubleheader as the A's defeat Detroit, 10-3...in **1988** Dave Henderson homers to lead off the bottom of the 14th inning as the A's defeat the New York Yankees, 3-2.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Drew Pomeranz (4-2, 1.38 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-1 with a 1.98 ERA in nine relief appearances before moving into the starting rotation May 7...is 3-1 with a 0.95 ERA (2 er in 19.0 ip) in four starting assignments...has a 1.38 ERA overall, which is the lowest in the majors among pitchers with 30 or more innings.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 0.00 ERA (14.0 ip) and .106 (5 for 47) opponents batting average in six games at home compared to 1-2 with a 2.41 ERA (5 er in 18.2 ip) and .271 (19 for 70) opponents batting average in seven games on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .205 opponents batting average, including .179 (5 for 28) against left-handed hitters compared to .213 (19 for 89) against right-handers...his career splits are .168 (24 for 143) against left-handers, .283 (141 for 499) against right-handers...has surrendered two of his three home runs this year and 19 of 21 in his career to right-handers...has a .461 career slugging percentage against righties compared to .224 by lefties...all three of his home runs have been solo shots and two came on the first pitch...opponents are batting .158 (3 for 19) with runners in scoring position...has allowed a .119 (8 for 67) batting average with two strikes...opponents are 4 for 31 (.129) with two walks (.182 on-base percentage) and no extra base hits when leading off an inning...has a .127 (8 for 63) opponents average over his first 30 pitches in a game, .286 (16 for 56) after that.

FIVE INNINGS OR FEWER: Has tossed 5.0 innings or fewer in each of his four starts and has now tossed five innings or fewer in each of his last 20 starts dating back to Aug. 1, 2012...that is the longest streak of consecutive starts of five innings or fewer by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914 (previous: Len Barker, 14 from May 21, 1985-June 10, 1987)...is 4-8 with a 4.63 ERA (43 er in 83.2 ip) over that stretch...has not tossed more than 5.0 innings since July 27, 2012 when he logged 5.1 innings against Cincinnati...has tossed more than five innings in just six of his 34 career starts.

SCORELESS STREAK SNAPPED: Had his scoreless streak snapped at a career-high and A's season-high 18.0 innings in the fourth inning of his last start last Sunday at Toronto...began the streak with three consecutive scoreless starts of exactly 5.0 innings from May 7 to 20...is the first A's pitcher with three consecutive scoreless outings of five or more innings since Ted Lilly (Sept. 10-21, 2003)...allowed three hits or fewer in each of those three starts, joining Steve Ontiveros (June 14-24, 1994) as the only A's pitchers since 1914 with three consecutive scoreless outings of five innings or more and three hits or fewer.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Had his three-game winning streak snapped in his last start...went 3-0 and did not allow a run over a three start stretch from May 7 to 20 (15.0 ip, 8 h, 4 bb, 16 so)...it marked the first time in his career he put together consecutive wins...now has four wins in 2014 after tallying four wins in 34 games over his first three seasons.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: First batters faced were 0 for 8 with a walk in his relief appearances this year and he stranded all three of his inherited runners...began his career with 30 consecutive starts before making his final four appearances of 2013 in relief...is 7-15 with a 4.84 ERA (81 er in 150.2 ip) in 34 career starts compared to 1-1 with a 1.45 ERA (3 er in 18.2 ip) in 13 relief appearances.

FIRST START: He combined with Dan Otero and Jim Johnson on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win in the second game of the doubleheader May 7 against Seattle...it was his first win as a starter since Sept. 26, 2012 against Chicago (NL)...tossed 5.0 innings and allowed two of the hits: a two-out single by Cano in the first and a one out single by Smoak in the fourth...allowed just one base runner as far as second base.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 11-0 win over Chicago (AL) May 13 in Oakland...it marks the first time in his career he has put together back-to-back wins...combined with Dan Otero, Fernando Abad and Joe Savery on a four-hit shutout...tossed five innings and allowed three of the hits while striking out a career-high eight.

THIRD START: He combined with Dan Otero, Luke Gregerson and Sean Doolittle on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Tampa Bay May 20...tossed 5.0 innings and allowed three of the hits...retired the side in order in the first and second inning but was aided by double plays in the third and fifth.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Toronto last Sunday...blanked the Blue Jays on two walks over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings...the streak was snapped on a one-out solo home run by Encarnacion in the fourth...loaded the bases with no outs in the fifth and was relieved by Johnson, who allowed one of the inherited runners to score...Happ shut out the A's on four hits over the first seven innings.

POMERANZ vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA (4.1 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 3 so, 1 hr) in two career relief appearances, both this year at Anaheim...tossed 2.2 scoreless innings April 15 in the A's 10-9, 11-inning win win (1 bb, 2 so)...then took the loss in a 5-4 decision the next day (1.2 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so)...pitched a scoreless 11th inning and retired the first two batters in the 12th before allowing a walk-off home run to lannetta.

2013 RECAP: Was 0-4 with a 6.23 ERA in eight games, including four starts, over two stints with Colorado...walked 19 and struck out 19 in 21.2 innings...allowed a .301 opponents batting average, including .130 (3-for-23) against left-handed hitters compared to .367 (22-for-60) against right-handers...issued 16 of his 19 walks and yielded nine of his 10 extra base hits to righties...held opponents to a .190 average with runners in scoring position, including .091 with RISP and two outs...has a .174 (12-for-69) career average with RISP and two outs...was 0-2 with a 4.61 ERA and .255 opponents average in six games at Coors Field, 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA and .375 opponents average in two starts on the road...in three seasons with the Rockies, he went 2-7 with a 4.40 ERA in 19 games at home compared to 2-7 with a 6.20 ERA (42 er in 61.0 ip) in 15 games on the road...opponents batted .158 when leading off an inning...tossed 4.1 innings or fewer, allowed three runs or more and walked four batters or more in each of his four starts...was on the disabled list from July 22 to Sept. 5 with left biceps tendinitis.

2013 WITH COLORADO SPRINGS: Began the season at Triple-A Colorado Springs and went 8-1 with a 4.20 ERA in 15 starts before the Rockies called June 30...struck out 96 batters in 85.2 innings, an average of 10.1 per nine innings...yielded just six home runs, an average of 0.63 per nine innings...despite spending just three months with the Sky Sox, he led the club in wins and strikeouts...allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .180 (18-for-100) against left-handed hitters compared to .290 (65-for-224) against right-handers...opponents hit .217 with the bases empty compared to .306 with runners on base...including .329 with runners in scoring position...logged a 1.20 ERA in the first inning and had a 3.00 ERA over the first four innings of a game compared to 7.01 from the fifth inning on...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in wins (8) and strikeouts (96) at the time of his promotion to Colorado June 30.

LHP Tommy Milone (3-3, 3.50 ERA): Is 3-0 with a 1.03 ERA and .168 opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 0-3 with a 5.86 ERA and .274 opponents average over his first five starts...is 2-0 with a 1.35 ERA and .170 opponents batting average in four starts in Oakland compared to 1-3 with a 5.60 ERA and .272 opponents batting average in six starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 14-8 with a 2.79 ERA in 31 games in Oakland compared to 14-14 with a 4.87 ERA in 37 games on the road...has allowed a .175 batting average with a 4.24 ERA in four starts during the day...combined with Otero and Doolittle on a five-hit shutout in his last start, a 10-0 A's win over Detroit on Monday (6.2 ip, 4 h, 2 bb, 6 so)...is 5-2 with a 4.17 ERA in eight career starts against Los Angeles (AL)...the five wins are his most against any team...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 5-4 A's loss in 11 innings on April 16 at Anaheim (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 1 so).

- Has the most blown saves (9), has the lowest save percentage (50.0%) and is tied for the fewest saves (9)...tied for the third highest percentage of inherited runners scored (22 of 66, 33.3%).
- Has allowed the second fewest walks (51) and is tied for the fewest home runs allowed (9).
- Is 0-2 with a 4.34 ERA (9 er in 18.2 ip) over its last seven games after going 10-8 with a 2.76 ERA over its first 45 games.
- Has just four saves since April 23 (33 games)...team is 18-15 during that stretch.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second in the American League in ERA (2.31), fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.316), tied for fifth in winning percentage (.833), sixth in opponents batting (.217), ninth in opponents on-base percentage (.284) and 10th in wins (5)...is also tied for second in shutouts (1), tied for third in wild pitches (6) and tied for fourth in complete games (1).

LAST 17 STARTS: Is 9-2 with a 2.30 ERA (28 er in 109.2 ip) and .221 (90 for 407) opponents batting average over his last 17 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...the ERA is the lowest in the American League over that span (min. 80 ip) and the wins are tied for fourth.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 1.25 ERA (5 er in 36.0 ip) and .160 (20 for 125) opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA (14 er in 38.0 ip) and .265 (39 for 147) opponents average in six starts at home...leads the American League in road ERA.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 4-0 with a 2.08 ERA (12 er in 52.0 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-1 with a 2.86 ERA (7 er in 22.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest...his career numbers are 7-1 with a 1.90 ERA (17 er in 80.2 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more, 3-3 with a 3.54 ERA (21 er in 53.1 ip) in eight starts on four days rest.

THAT'S ODD: Has a 3.92 ERA (17 er in 39.0 ip) in odd numbered innings compared to a 0.51 ERA (2 er in 35.0 ip) in even numbered innings.

10th CAREER WIN: Recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20).

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the month of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in five starts...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).
