### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (32-22) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (30-23)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Split the four game series with Detroit to open the homestand and have now lost six of the last eight games...however, are 13-7 over the last 20 contests...are 32-22 for the season, which is the second best record in the American League (Detroit, 30-20) and tied for third best in the majors...it is the A's best record after 54 games since the 1992 club also started the year 32-22...with a win tonight, the A's would have their best record after 55 games since 1991 (33-22)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 32<sup>nd</sup> consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 36 consecutive days and 49 of the last 51...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days with at least a share of first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...have 45 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have a 1½ game lead over second place Los Angeles for the third time in the last five days...have not led by fewer than one game since April 27 when they were tied for first with Texas...had a four-game losing streak from May 22-25, which marked the first time the A's lost more than three straight in over a year...it was the A's longest losing streak since dropping five in a row from May 6-10, 2013.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 11-15 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 21-7 in games decided by three runs or more...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (6) and are tied with Milwaukee for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (4)...are 9-7 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the American League in last at bat wins and are tied with Chicago and Boston for the lead in last at bat games...are 5-3 in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning games, are tied for the lead in wins and have the fourth best record...have four walk-off wins, which is tied with Baltimore and Texas for second most in the AL (Chicago, 6)

**ONE-THIRD OF THE SEASON:** The A's played their 54<sup>th</sup> game of the season yesterday, which is one-third of the season...Josh Donaldson is on pace to score 132 runs, which would break the Oakland record of 123 set by Reggie Jackson in 1969...Luke Gregerson is on pace to pitch in 78 games, which would tie for the second highest total in Oakland history (Koch, 84 in 2002)...Brandon Moss is on pace for 126 RBI, which would be the third best total in Oakland history (Giambi, 137 in 2000; Tejada, 131 in 2002)...the offense is on pace for 39 triples, which would be the most since the 1968 club set the Oakland record with 40...the pitching staff has a 2.89 ERA, which is currently second lowest in Oakland history (2.58 in 1972)...pitchers are also on pace for 1224 strikeouts, which would break the franchise record of 1183 set last year.

**IN MAY:** The A's are 14-12 in May after going 18-9 in April...need to win one of the next two games to clinch a winning record for the 12<sup>th</sup> consecutive month dating back to June of 2012...that would be the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972...the pitching staff has a 3.00 ERA (78 er in 233.2 ip)...should they finish below 3.17, it would be the A's lowest May ERA since 1990 (2.43).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 2.25 ERA (45 er in 179.2 ip) and .210 (136 for 649) opponents batting average over the last 20 games...lead the majors in ERA (2.89), opponents batting average (.221), on-base percentage (.284) and slugging percentage (.333)...also lead the majors with a .187 (74 for 395) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...are tied for second in the American League in shutouts (7) and have issued the third fewest walks (149)...have five shutouts this month, which are the A's most in the month of May since 1931.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 15 of the last 20 games and are 11-4 with a 2.08 ERA (28 er in 121.0 ip) and .210 (93 for 443) opponents batting average over that span...are now 22-12 with a 2.87 ERA (104 er in 326.2 ip) for the season...the ERA is the lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 2.90) and the losses are the fewest in the majors...are tied for the American League lead in complete games (2) and tied for third in innings pitched (326.2).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .202 (67 for 332) over the last 10 games after hitting .290 over the previous nine contests...lead the

majors in walks (233), rank second in on-base percentage (.333), third in runs (270), tied for third in triples (13), fourth in home runs (60), tied for fifth in extra base hits (170) and eighth in slugging percentage (.410) and fewest strikeouts (381).

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have hit 60 home runs, which ranks second in the American League and fourth in the majors...34 of those have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors (Toronto, 35)...the pitching staff has allowed 42 home runs, which is second fewest in the AL and sixth fewest in the majors...only 12 of those have come with runners on base, which is tied with the Cubs for the fewest in the majors.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-2 on this seven-game homestand against Detroit (2-2) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...these are the A's only seven home games over a 25-game stretch from May 16 to June 11...have won eight of the last 11 home games after losing six straight...went 6-4 on the last homestand and are 14-12 (.538) at home...begin a nine-game road trip to New York-AL (three games), Baltimore (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games) on Tuesday...went 5-4 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Toronto (0-3)...have a season-high four-game road losing streak after winning a season-high six straight on the road...are 18-10 (.643) on the road for the season, which is the best road record in the majors (Detroit, 16-9).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's are 30 for 34 (88.2%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 35 of their 39 (89.7%) attempts, which is also the highest percentage in the majors...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 37 errors, which is third most in the American League...the errors have led to just 12 unearned runs, which is third fewest in the AL...are 19-9 when committing at least one error compared to 13-13 when going errorless...rank second in the AL with 12 outfield assists (Toronto, 14).

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters have 12 walks, which is five more than any other American League team and second most in the majors (Washington, 15)...are tied for the AL lead in home runs (1) and plate appearances (60), tied for second in extra base hits (3), rank third in on-base percentage (.383) and tied for third in RBI (7).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 20-3 when scoring first, which is the best record in the majors...are 6-2 on Sunday, which is the best record in the American League...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 54 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an A's team since they began the 1984 season with an Oakland record 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader

**A's vs. ANGELS:** The A's lead the season series 2-1 after taking two of three at Los Angeles in April...won the season series last year 11-8...went 6-4 in Oakland and 5-4 in Los Angeles...it was the A's third consecutive season series win...are 34-26 (.567) against the Angels over the last four seasons...including 27-3 when scoring four or more runs...have been shutout in seven of their last 18 losses to the Angels and have scored just one run in six of those games...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 399-322 against the Angels...that includes 205-153 in Oakland and 194-169 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 448-399 against the Angels.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Josh Donaldson** has reached base safely in each of his last 44 games as a third baseman, which is the longest such streak by an Athletics third baseman since at least 1914... **Brandon Moss** has 18 extra base hits in May, which ties the Oakland record for extra base hits in May set by Jason Giambi in 2001.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1932** Al Simmons and Jimmy Dykes hit two home runs each and Lefty Grove tosses a six-hitter in a 13-2 win over Washington...in **1982** Rickey Henderson has three hits, three RBI and four stolen bases in the second game of a doubleheader as the A's defeat Detroit, 10-3...in **1988** Dave Henderson homers to lead off the bottom of the 14th inning as the A's defeat the New York Yankees, 3-2.

# ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

## TEAM

10-10, 2.93 ERA (54 er in 165.2 ip)  
Saves/Opportunities: 9-for-18 (50.0%)

- The A's bullpen is second in the American League in ERA (2.93) and is tied for the third most wins (10) and second most losses (10)...ranks first in opponents batting average (.216), opponents on-base percentage (.279) and opponents slugging percentage (.293).
- Has the most blown saves (9), has the lowest save percentage (50.0%) and is tied for the fewest saves (9)...tied for the third highest percentage of inherited runners scored (22 of 66, 33.3%).
- Has allowed the second fewest walks (51) and is tied for the fewest home runs allowed (9).
- Is 0-2 with a 4.34 ERA (9 er in 18.2 ip) over its last seven games after going 10-8 with a 2.76 ERA over its first 45 games.
- Has just four saves since April 23 (33 games)...team is 18-15 during that stretch.

## 56 LHP FERNANDO ABAD

First Hitters: 3-21, 3 bb

- Has two losses and a 5.40 ERA (5 er in 8.1 ip) in his last 11 games after not allowing a run over his first 14 appearances (13.1 ip) this season...walked two hitters in a game Tuesday for the first time this season.
- Is second among AL relievers in opponents slugging percentage (.137), tied for second in opponents batting average (.137) and seventh in on-base percentage (.229)...all 10 of his hits allowed this season have been singles.
- Is eighth among AL relievers in WHIP (0.83).
- Has a 15-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011...that is the longest active losing streak in the majors and is the longest losing streak in the majors over the last 21 years...the last longer streak was a 27-game losing streak by Anthony Young from May 6, 1992-July 24, 1993.
- Has one appearance against the Angels this season (0.1 ip)...is his lone career outing against Los Angeles.

**Last Year:** Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.

## 48 RHP RYAN COOK

Inherited Runners/Scored: 4/3  
First Hitters: 3-10, 2 bb

- Was placed on the DL for the second time this season on May 9 (retroactive to May 8) with a strained right forearm.
- Was originally placed on the DL March 29 (retroactive to March 21) with right shoulder tendinitis...came off the DL on April 7 and pitched in 12 games with the A's (0-1, 2.92 ERA in 12.1 ip).

**Last Year:** Was 6-4 with two saves and a 2.54 ERA in a team-leading 71 relief appearances...allowed just two home runs in 67.1 innings, an average of 0.27 per nine innings, which was fourth lowest among AL relievers.

## 62 LHP SEAN DOOLITTLE

- Has not allowed a run over his last 11 outings (12.1 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 20 so) after giving up seven earned runs over his previous five games (4.0 ip, 9 h, 7 er, 5 so, 15.75 ERA).
- Has issued just one walk in 24.0 ip this season...is the fewest walks allowed in the Majors (min. 10.0 ip)...has just one walk since Sept. 1, 2013...is third among AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.209) and sixth in WHIP (0.79).
- Recorded two straight saves on May 20-21 at Tampa Bay...is now 7 for 14 (50.0%) in save opportunities in his career, but has converted 6 of his last 7 (85.7%)...has recorded each of the A's last three saves (since Johnson save on May 7).
- Is fourth among AL relievers in strikeouts (33).
- Has a blown save in his only appearance against the Angels this season (1.0, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 so)...has no decisions in 13 career games (12.1 ip, 12 h, 5 r, 5 er, 0 bb, 10 so, 3.65 ERA).
- Allowed his first inherited runner to score on May 12 since June 20, 2013, breaking streak of stranding 25 straight inherited runners (55 games)...for his career, has allowed just 6 of 62 (9.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the lowest among active relievers (min. 50 inherited runners).

**Last Year:** Went 5-5 with two saves and a 3.13 ERA in 70 games...allowed just 2-of-32 (6.3%) inherited runners to score, which was the lowest mark in the majors...issued 13 walks in 69.0 innings (1.70 per nine innings).

- Allowed a walk-off three-run home run last Thursday at Tampa Bay...was his second home run allowed this season after allowing three home runs all last season.
- Has five blown saves, which is tied for the most in the majors.
- Has allowed 8 of 13 (61.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the majors.
- Is tied for fifth in the AL in games pitched (26)...now has 389 games pitched since 2009, which is the most in the majors over that span.
- Has a save and a blown save against the Angels in two outings this season (3.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 1 so, 3.00 ERA)...in his career, is 1-0 with a save in five games (5.1 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 3 so, 1.69 ERA).

**Last Year:** Went 6-8 with four saves and a 2.71 ERA in a team-leading 73 games in his fifth and final season with San Diego...topped 70 games for the fourth time in the last five years.

- Is tied for seventh in the American League in extra base hits (25) and tied for 10<sup>th</sup> in doubles (14).
- Is batting .306 (11 for 36) as the designated hitter and .230 (35 for 152) as an outfielder.
- The A's are 30-18 with him in the starting lineup, 2-4 when he doesn't start...in his three seasons with the club, the A's are 195-114 (.631) with him in the starting lineup and 27-42 (.391) when he doesn't start.

**Last Year:** Batted .240 with 26 home runs and 80 RBI in 135 games in his second season in the majors...the home runs were a career high but his batting average dropped 52 points from his .292 in 2012.

- Had a career-high 0 for 20 streak from April 2 to 6.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston.
- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 consecutive games from April 6 through the first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, 16 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .387 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his career May 13-16 (also: Aug. 29-31, 2012)
- Scored a career-high four runs May 18 at Cleveland.

## SEAN DOOLITTLE

- Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

## SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

### **CRAIG GENTRY**

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

### **LUKE GREGERSON**

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

### **A.J. GRIFFIN**

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

### **JOHN JASO**

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was also at Los Angeles on April 9, 2013.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.

### **JIM JOHNSON**

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

### **JOSH LINDBLOM**

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

### **JED LOWRIE**

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.

### **BRANDON MOSS**

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).

- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...it was his fifth career two-homer game (last: Aug. 28, 2013 at Detroit) and his fourth game with five or more RBI... became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.

### DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco... both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).

### ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

### JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

### DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

### NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).

### JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).

### FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.

- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.

#### **EVAN SCRIBNER**

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and did not allow a run in two outings (1.1 ip) before he was optioned to Sacramento April 7 when Ryan Cook was reinstated from the DL.

#### **ERIC SOGARD**

- Snapped a career-high 0 for 18 streak with his fifth inning single May 18 at Cleveland.
