LEADING OFF: Tonight the Angels play the fifth game (2-2) an all-AL West, 10-game road trip to Seattle (May 26-29; 2-2), Oakland (May 30-June 1) and Houston (June 3-5)...Halos are 3-3 in last six games after winning 11 of previous 14...LAA is 5-0-1 in last six series...Angels have won 14 of last 20 games to take sole possession of second place in West - and move with 1.5 games of Oakland... Halos are 16-10 in May and have spent last two-plus weeks in second place...LAA is 19-10 in last 29G (opened season 11-13)...Seven of last 14 victories are come-frombehind efforts...Halos' 30 wins are third most in AL.

KNOW THIS: Garrett Richards is 3-0 with a 1.38 ERA (39 IP - 6 ER) in six road starts this season...He has also limited opponents to a .133 (18/135) average against, tops in MLB...In his last two starts at Oakland, he has surrendered just one earned run (12 IP, 10 K).

TROUT'S CLOUT: 2-time All-Star Mike Trout leads all A.L. players in the first balloting figures for the $85^{\rm th}$ All-Star Game...Trout, who last year at 21 years old, became the youngest A.L. position player to start the Midsummer Classic since Ivan Rodriguez in 1993, leads A.L. balloting with 764,007 total votes.

HAMILTON UPDATE: Josh Hamilton (left thumb surgery) hit in the cage and took batting practice on the field yesterday. He is expected to resume his rehab stint with Salt Lake today.

BACK ON THE ROAD: Club has posted a 3.01 ERA (2nd in MLB) & .197 BAA (1st in MLB) on the road...Howie Kendrick leads LAA batting .327 (32/98) in away games... Erick Aybar is at a .326 clip in road affairs this season... Joe Smith has surrendered one earned run across 11 road outings (11 IP).

LOOKING UP FOR HALOS: At 30-23, Angels have a six-win improvement after 53 games from a season ago (24-29), largest increase in AL...Club was 25-29 after 54 G in 2013.

RECENT RUN: During the Angels' current 14-6 run, the starters have fashioned a 2.95 ERA (134.1 IP - 44 ER) while holding opponents to a .209 batting average against (102/489) with 35 walks and 109 Ks...Club has 15 quality starts in the 20-game span.

BULLPEN BONUS: Since May 14, Angels relievers have limited opponents to nine earned runs over 34.2 innings (2.34 ERA), while walking 13 and striking out 31...Bullpen logged a 4.37 ERA in April.

HOT HALOS: After an 0-2 record and 5.79 ERA in his first three starts, Jered Weaver is 6-1 with a 2.01 ERA (53.2 IP -12 ER) in his last eight starts - with 8 consecutive quality starts...Since his recall May 2, Grant Green is batting .377 (20/53)...Pujols' 111 total bases are T5th-most in AL... Ernesto Frieri has allowed two earned runs in his last 14 appearances (14.1 IP) with six saves, two holds with 16 strikeouts...Prior to that, he allowed 7 ER in his previous 3.2 IP (3 HR)... Eric Aybar has a .343 average (12/35) with nine RBI his past nine games... Mike Trout is riding a 10-game hitstreak (.364: 15/36) with nine RBI in span...Since May 17. Chris lannetta is batting .391 (9/23) with 5 runs, 2 doubles, 2 home runs & 3 RBI.

MORE COWGILL: Collin Cowgill has reached base safely in 29 of 33 starts...Only Angels player to appear in every victory this season (Halos are 30-16 when he plays, 0-7 when he does not play)...Has reached safely in 25 of his last 62 PA...Club is 21-12 in his 33 starts.

- Celebrated 26th birthday on Tuesday...Making 11th start of 2014 and seventh on the road...Second start vs. Oakland this season...Is in fourth big league season...Began the regular season in the Halos starting rotation for the first time in
- Leads the Majors with an average of 0.136 home runs allowed per 9 innings (1 HR 66 IP)...Ranks third in the American League with a .209 batting average against (50/239) this season
- Owns a 3-0 road record this season and his 1.38 road ERA (39 IP 6 ER) ranks second in the American League.
- According to FanGraphs, ranks second in the Majors with an average fastball velocity of 95.9 MPH.
- LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in the decision in last start Sunday at Kansas City after tossing seven innings, allowing three runs on five hits with two walks and seven strikeouts...Seventh quality start of 2014.
- Opened the season with a career best four-game win streak in decisions from April 4 May 14 (previously three wins from September 2-12, 2013).
- Has allowed no more than two runs and five hits in each of his six road starts this season (First pitcher in Angels history to do so)...Joins Barry Moore (1969 Senators) & Juan Guzman (1992 Blue Jays) as the only pitchers in AL history to start a season with six straight road starts allowing a maximum of two runs and five hits
- Became second pitcher in last 100 years to allow no more than two runs and three hits in each of first four road starts of a season (Jake Peavy, 2007).
- According to ELIAS, is one of three pitchers in last 100 years to have an ERA under 1.40 and opponent batting average under .140 after first six road starts, joining Pedro Martinez (1997 Expos) and Reb Russell (1916 White Sox).
- VS. OAKLAND: In nine career games (five starts) against the A's, is 0-2 with a 5.29 ERA (34 IP 20 ER)...Did not factor in the decision in first start this season against Oakland on April 15 after pitching seven innings and allowing five runs on eight hits with two walks and five strikeouts...As a starter, is 0-2 with a 6.14 ERA (29.1 IP - 20 ER) in his five starts
