ABOUT THE A'S: Are 3-2 over the last five games, 3-6 over the last nine games and 14-7 over the last 21 contests...are 33-22 for the season, which is the second best record in the American League (Detroit, 31-20) and tied for third best in the majors...it is the A's best record after 55 games since the 1991 club also started the year 33-22 (woon game 56) are in sole

22 (won game 56)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 33rd consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 37 consecutive days and 50 of the last 52...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...have 46 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have a 2½ game lead over second place Los Angeles ...had a four-game losing streak from May 22-25, which marked the first time the A's lost more than three straight in over a year...it was the A's longest losing streak since dropping five in a row from May 6-10, 2013.

IN MAY: The A's are 15-12 in the month of May entering the final game of the month...went 18-9 in April and have now posted a winning record in 12 consecutive months dating back to June of 2012...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972...the pitching staff has a 3.08 ERA (83 er in 242.2 ip)...should they finish below 3.17, it would be the A's lowest May ERA since 1990 (2.43).

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit three home runs last night and have now homered in eight consecutive games (14 home runs total)...one of the home runs last night was a grand slam, which was the A's third of the season...that is tied with Boston and Chicago (AL) for the Major League lead...36 of the A's 63 home runs have come with runners on base, which is the most in the majors...the 63 home runs rank second in the American League and tied for third in the majors...the pitching staff has allowed 44 home runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL and tied for sixth fewest in the majors...only 13 of those have come with runners on base, which is tied with the Cubs for the fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.39 ERA (50 er in 188.2 ip) and .209 (143 for 683) opponents batting average over the last 21 games...**lead the majors** in ERA (2.93), opponents batting average (.221), on-base percentage (.285) and slugging percentage (.335)...also lead the majors with a .186 (75 for 403) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...are tied for second in the American League in shutouts (7) and have issued the third fewest walks (153)...have five shutouts this month, which are the A's most in the month of May since 1931.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 12-4 with a 2.35 ERA (33 er in 126.1 ip) and .210 (97 for 463) opponents batting average over the last 21 games...are now 23-12 with a 2.95 ERA (109 er in 332.0 ip) for the season...the losses are the fewest in the majors and the ERA is second lowest (Atlanta, 2.95)...are tied for the American League lead in complete games (2) and rank fourth in innings pitched (332.0)

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .260 (44 for 169) with 31 runs scored and 11 home runs in five games on the homestand after hitting .216 with 43 runs scored and nine home runs in nine games on the last road trip...for the season, the A's are hitting .257 (234 for 911) with 38 home runs in 27 games at home compared to .243 with 25 home runs in 28 games on the road...overall, the A's **lead the majors** in runs (279), walks (239) and on-base percentage (.337), are tied for third in triples (13) and home runs (63), rank sixth in extra base hits (173), seventh in slugging percentage (.413) and eighth in fewest strikeouts (388).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 11-15 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 22-7 in games decided by three runs or more...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (6) and are tied with Milwaukee for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (4)...are 9-7 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the American League in last at bat wins and are tied for second in last at bat games...are 5-3 in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning games, are tied for the

Thu., June 5 at New York (AL)

lead in wins and have the fourth best record...have four walk-off wins, which is tied for second in the AL (Chicago, 6).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this seven-game homestand against Detroit (2-2) and Los Angeles-AL (1-0)...these are the A's only seven home games over a 25-game stretch from May 16 to June 11...have won nine of the last 12 home games after losing six straight and are 15-12 (.556) at home for the season, which is the third best home record in the American League...begin a nine-game road trip to New York-AL (three games), Baltimore (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games) on Tuesday...went 5-4 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Toronto (0-3)...have a season-high four-game road losing streak after winning a season-high six straight on the road...are 18-10 (.643) on the road for the season, which is the second best road record in the majors (Detroit, 17-9).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 30 for 34 (88.2%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 35 of their 39 (89.7%) attempts, which is also the highest percentage in the majors...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 37 errors, which is fourth most in the American League...the errors have led to just 12 unearned runs, which is third fewest in the AL...are 19-9 when committing at least one error compared to 14-13 when going errorless...rank third in the AL with 12 outfield assists.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters have 12 walks, which is five more than any other American League team and second most in the majors (Washington, 15)...are tied for the AL lead in home runs (1), rank second in plate appearances (61), tied for second in extra base hits (3), rank third in on-base percentage (.377) and tied for third in RBI (7).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 21-3 when scoring first, which is the best record in the majors...are 6-2 on Sunday, which is the best record in the American League...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 55 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an A's team since they began the 1984 season with an Oakland record 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Cook, Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL eight times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 3-1...won the first game in Oakland last night after taking two of three at Los Angeles in April...won the season series last year 11-8...went 6-4 in Oakland and 5-4 in Los Angeles...it was the A's third consecutive season series win...are 35-26 (.574) against the Angels over the last four seasons...including 28-3 when scoring four or more runs...have been shutout in seven of their last 18 losses to the Angels and have scored just one run in six of those games...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 400-322 against the Angels...that includes 206-153 in Oakland and 194-169 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 449-399 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Donaldson has homered five times in his last six games...is batting .333 (23 for 69) with 22 runs scored, two doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 21 RBI and 15 walks over his last 19 games...**Sean Doolittle** has a 13.1 inning scoreless streak, which is the second longest of his career (13.2, April 29-May 29, 2013)...**Brandon Moss** has set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (19).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1987** Mark McGwire homers twice in the A's 9-5 loss at New York...the two homers give McGwire 15 in May, an Oakland record for homers in one month...he would go on to hit what was then an Oakland record 49 home runs en route to Rookie of the Year honors...in **2006** Bobby Crosby hits a solo home run in the fourth inning of the A's 7-0 victory over Kansas City, the 6000th home run in Oakland history.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Tommy Milone (3-3, 3.50 ERA)

LAST FOUR STARTS: Is 3-0 with a 1.03 ERA (3 er in 26.1 ip) and .168 (16 for 95) opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 0-3 with a 5.86 ERA and .274 opponents average over his first five starts...has 20 strikeouts, six walks and one home run over his last four starts after tallying 16 strikeouts, 12 walks and four home runs over his first five starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 1.35 ERA (4 er in 26.2 ip) and .170 (16 for 94) opponents batting average in four starts in Oakland compared to 1-3 with a 5.60 ERA (17 er in 27.1 ip) and .272 (31 for 114) opponents batting average in six starts on the road...his home ERA is the lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 25 innings at home...has allowed four of his five home runs on the road...last year, he went 5-4 with a 3.44 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 7-5 with a 4.69 ERA in 16 games on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 14-8 with a 2.79 ERA (60 er in 193.1 ip) in 31 games in Oakland compared to 14-14 with a 4.87 ERA (112 er in 207.0 ip) in 37 games on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .175 (7 for 40) batting average with runners in scoring position...last year, opponents hit .216 with RISP, which ranked eighth in the American League...has issued 15 of his 18 walks and allowed four of his five home runs this year to right-handed hitters...has yielded 25 of his 30 home runs over the last two years to righties...has held the opponents number three, four and five hitters to a .141 (10 for 71) batting average.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA (10 er in 30.2 ip) in five starts at night compared to 1-2 with a 4.24 ERA (11 er in 23.1 ip) in four starts during the day...has yielded one home run in 30.2 innings at night, four home runs in 23.1 innings during the day.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-1 with a 2.49 ERA (7 er in 25.1 ip) in four starts on four days rest compared to 2-2 with a 4.39 ERA (14 er in 28.2 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed eight runs in the first inning this year for a 8.00 ERA (9.0 ip)...has a 2.60 ERA (13 er in 45.0 ip) from the second inning on...has issued seven of his 18 walks and allowed two of his five home runs in the first inning.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in three of his nine starts, all losses...last year, he received just 10 runs of support in his nine losses (1.78 RSA)...has received just 22 runs of support in his 22 losses in three seasons with the A's (124.2 ip, 1.59 RSA)...has received no support 12 times over the last three years as a starter and one run of support eight times...is 3-0 with three runs of support or more this year and 23-3 in his career.

THIS AND THAT: Is 3-1 with a 2.67 ERA (9 er in 30.1 ip) in five starts in the month of May...this marks the fourth time he has won three games in a month...has never won four...has left with the lead in three of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (Gregerson each time)...the A's are 3-6 (.33) in his starting assignments this year and are 39-27 (.591) in his career...his teams are 44-27 (.620) in his 71 career starts.

2014 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss at Seattle April 11...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and two unearned runs in the second on errors by Donaldson and Lowrie...surrendered a two-run home run to Zunino in the sixth and left trailing 5-0...Hernandez shutout the A's three hits over the seven innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) *April 16*...allowed a run in the third inning on a Trout RBI double, but the A's scored four times in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead...put the first two batters on base in the seventh inning and was relieved by Otero, who allowed both runners to score...Gregerson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Texas April 22 in Oakland...walked a career-high tying four batters...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Murphy RBI single and a Chirinos bases loaded walk...the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first but he allowed a run in the third when Rios scored on a Kouzmanoff grounded into double play...the A's then scored twice in the fourth to take the lead...left after six innings with a 4-3 lead but Gregerson allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss at Houston *April* 27...allowed just one run over the first six innings and that was in the third inning when Villar doubled and later scored on a Fowler ground out...then allowed a two-out two-run triple to Villar in the seventh inning...was relieved by Otero, who allowed Villar to score on an Altuve home run...McHugh shutout the A's on one hit over the first eight innings before Callaspo had a RBI single in the ninth...fell to 0-3 in the A's 6-3 loss at Boston May 3...matched his career-highs by walking four batters (sixth time) and allowing three home runs (fourth time)...allowed a grand slam to Gomes in the first inning and solo home runs to Ortiz in the third and Ross in the fourth...left after walking Napoli to start the fifth with the A's trailing 6-0...combined with Fernando Rodriguez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Washington May 9 in Oakland...tossed eight innings and allowed two of the hits, both to Hairston...also walked three batters but allowed just two base runners as far as second base...had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss to Chicago (AL) *May 14* in Oakland...allowed a home run to Beckham on the first pitch of the game but blanked the White Sox on four hits and a hit batter after that...left after six innings with the A's lead 2-1 but Gregerson allowed a three-run home run in the eighth inning for the blown save...he extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 3-2 win at Tampa Bay May 21...the A's scored twice in the second and once in the fourth and he blanked the Rays on three hits over the first five innings...allowed a RBI single to Loney and was relieved by Rodriguez with runners on first and second and two outs...Rodriguez allowed one of the inherited runners to score.

LAST START: He combined with Otero and Doolittle on a five-hit shutout in the A's 10-0 win over Detroit on Monday in Oakland...tossed 6.2 innings and allowed four of the hits...allowed just two runners as far as second base: a Romine double in the third and a leadoff double by Cabrera in the fourth.

MILONE vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 5-2 with a 4.17 ERA (45.1 ip, 51 h, 25 r, 21 er, 12 bb, 37 so, 7 hr) in eight career starts...the five wins are his most against any team...is 2-2 with a 4.13 ERA (11 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 3-0 with a 4.22 ERA (10 er in 21.1 ip) in four starts in Anaheim...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 5-4 A's loss in 11 innings on April 16 at Anaheim...allowed a run in the third inning on a Trout RBI double, but the A's scored four times in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead...put the first two batters on base in the seventh inning and was relieved by Otero, who allowed both runners to score...Gregerson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save...went 3-1 with a 4.07 ERA (24.1 ip, 23 h, 14 r, 11 er, 8 bb, 29 so, 5 hr) in four starts last year...including May 1 when he did not walk a batter and matched his career-high with 10 strikeouts in 7.0 innings.

RHP Sonny Gray (5-1, 2.31 ERA): Is 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA and four home runs allowed in 33.0 innings over his last five starts after going 4-1 with a 1.76 ERA and one home run allowed in 41.0 innings over his first six starts...ranks second in the American League in ERA (2.31), fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.316), tied for fifth in winning percentage (.833), sixth in opponents batting (.217) and seventh in opponents on-base percentage (.284)...is 9-2 with a 2.30 ERA over his last 17 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...the ERA is the lowest in the AL over that span (min. 80 ip) and the wins are tied for sixth...opponents are batting .164 with a .224 slugging percentage when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is the lowest in the American League and the batting average is fourth lowest...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-5 A's loss to Detroit on Tuesday (6.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 0-0 with a 1.13 ERA (8.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 8 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, one start, against Los Angeles, both last year.

- The A's bullpen is second in the American League lead in ERA (2.87) and is tied for the third most wins (10) and second most losses (10)...ranks first in opponents batting average (.216), opponents on-base percentage (.278) and opponents slugging percentage (.293).
- Has the most blown saves (9), has the lowest save percentage (50.0%) and is tied for the fewest saves (9)...has allowed the fourth highest inherited runners scored percent (24 of 70, 34.3%).
- Has allowed the second fewest walks (52) and is tied for the fewest home runs allowed (9).
- Is 0-2 with a 3.63 ERA (9 er in 22.1 ip) over its last eight games after going 10-8 with a 2.76 ERA over its first 45 games.
- Has just four saves since April 23 (34 games)...team is 19-15 during that stretch.

- Has two losses and a 5.40 ERA (5 er in 8.1 ip) in his last 11 games after not allowing a run over his first 14 appearances (13.1 ip) this season...walked two hitters in a game Tuesday for the first time this season.
- Is second among AL relievers in opponents slugging percentage (.137), third in opponents batting average (.137) and tied for eighth in on-base percentage (.229)...all 10 of his hits allowed this season have been singles.
- Is eighth among AL relievers in WHIP (0.83).
- Has a 15-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011...that is the longest active losing streak in the majors and is the longest losing streak in the majors over the last 21 years...the last longer streak was a 27-game losing streak by Anthony Young from May 6, 1992-July 24, 1993.
- Has one appearance against the Angels this season (0.1 ip)...is his lone career outing against Los Angeles.

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.

WEDNESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (4-3, 2.78 ERA)

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 2-3 with a 3.90 ERA and .286 opponents batting average in five starts in May after going 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks eighth in the American League in ERA (2.78) and has the 10th lowest on-base percentage (.288)...is also seventh in highest run support (5.82)...opponents have reached base on an error five times, which is tied for second most in the AL.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are hitting .170 (9 for 53) with runners in scoring position, which ranks **seventh** in the American League...they are 2 for 22 (.091) with RISP and two outs...has walked just one batter to lead off an inning for a .286 on-base percentage...however, has allowed four doubles and four home runs for a .507 slugging percentage...has a .347 (17 for 49) opponents batting average in the first inning, .213 (45 for 211) after that...has a .259 (48 for 185) opponents batting average the first two times through the order, .187 (14 for 75) after that...has held the fourth through seventh hitters in the batting order to a .150 (18 for 120) batting average...all other hitters are batting .314 (44 for 140).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .185 (20 for 108) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .276 (42 for 152) against left-handers...has issued just four of his 18 walks to righties for a .211 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage against right-handers is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the batting average is third lowest in the AL...over the last two years, he has held right-handed hitters to a .198 (41 for 207) batting average...has issued 28 of his 38 walks over that stretch to lefties.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed five home runs in his last four starts (24.1 ip) after allowing three home runs over his first seven starts (43.2 ip)...has allowed eight home runs for the season, all with the bases empty.

AS A STARTER: Has made 11 appearances this year, all starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 4-4 with a 3.64 ERA (31 er in 76.2 ip) in 13 career starts compared to 9-14 with a 5.30 ERA in 189 relief appearances...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 8-3 (.727) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in nine of his 11 starts and allowed two runs or fewer seven times...has career highs in strikeouts (64), innings pitched (68.0) and games started (11)...his four wins are one short of his best of five in 2010...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk...began the season with four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one
 in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment
 before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

LUKE GREGERSON

Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was also at Los Angeles on April 9, 2013.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at
 Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four
 times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least
 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.

JIM JOHNSON

• Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

ARNOLD LEON

 Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLOM

 Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.

BRANDON MOSS

 Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.

- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...it was his fifth career two-homer game (last: Aug. 28, 2013 at Detroit) and his fourth game with five or more RBI... became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one
 triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the
 mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
