OAKLAND ATHLETICS (34-22) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (30-25)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last six games after a season-high four-game losing streak...are now 15-7 over the last 22 contests and 34-22 for the season...that is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco, 36-20) and the A's best record after 56 games since 1991 club also started the year 34-22 (won game 57)...have won the first two games of this series...with a win today, the A's will record their Major League leading sixth series sweep of the season...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 34th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 38 consecutive days and 51 of the last 53...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...have a 3½ game lead in the West, which is ½ game short of the season high (4, last on May 21)...have not led the West by more than four games before the All-Star Break since 1990 when they led by as many as 5½ games as early as May 9...have 47 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth.

IN MAY: The A's went 16-12 in May after going 18-9 in April...have now posted a winning record in 12 consecutive months dating back to June of 2012...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972...the pitching staff finished with a 3.08 ERA, which was the sixth lowest May ERA in Oakland history and the lowest since 1990 (2.43)...had five shutouts, which were the A's most in May since 1931.

THE LONG BALL: Yoenis Céspedes hit his 10th home run of the season last night and the A's are one of two teams with three players with 10 or more home runs (Colorado)...this marks the third time in Oakland history the A's had three players with 10 or more home runs by the end of May...also did it in 1997 (Berroa, Canseco, McGwire) and 2006 (Chavez, Swisher and Thomas)...the A's have now homered in nine consecutive games (16 home runs total) and have 65 home runs for the season, which ranks second in the AL and third in the majors...37 of the home runs have come with runners on base, which is the most in the majors...are tied with Boston and Chicago (AL) for the Major League lead in grand slams...the pitching staff has allowed 45 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL and ninth fewest in the majors...only 14 of those have come with runners on base, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.41 ERA (53 er in 197.2 ip) over the last 22 games...lead the majors in ERA (2.93), opponents batting average (.222), on-base percentage (.285) and slugging percentage (.336)...also lead the majors with a .192 (79 for 412) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...are tied for second in the AL in shutouts (7) and have issued the third fewest walks (154).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 12-4 with a 2.45 ERA (36 er in 132.1 ip) and .217 (106 for 488) opponents batting average over the last 22 games...are 23-12 with a 2.98 ERA (112 er in 338.0 ip) for the season...the losses are the fewest in the majors and the ERA is second lowest (Atlanta, 2.92)...are tied for the AL lead in complete games (2) and rank third in innings pitched (338.0).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .266 (53 for 199) with 42 runs scored and 13 home runs in six games on the homestand after hitting .216 with 43 runs scored and nine home runs in nine games on the last road trip...for the season, the A's are hitting .258 (243 for 941) with 40 home runs in 28 games in Oakland compared to .243 with 25 home runs in 28 games on the road...overall, the A's lead the majors in runs (290), walks (248) and on-base percentage (.339), rank third in home runs (65), tied for third in triples (14), fifth in slugging percentage (.416) and extra base hits (178) and eighth in fewest strikeouts (397).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 11-15 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 23-7 in games decided by three runs or more...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (6) and are tied with Milwaukee for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (4)...are 9-7 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the American League in last at bat wins and are tied for second in last at bat games...are 5-3 in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning games, are tied for the

lead in wins and have the fourth best record...have four walk-off wins, which is tied for second in the AL (Chicago, 6).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-2 on this seven-game homestand against Detroit (2-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0)...these are the A's only seven home games over a 25-game stretch from May 16 to June 11...have won 10 of the last 13 home games after losing six straight and are 16-12 (.571) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the AL (Cleveland, 17-11)...begin a nine-game road trip to New York-AL (three games), Baltimore (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games) on Tuesday...went 5-4 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Tampa Bay (2-1) and Toronto (0-3)...have a season-high four-game road losing streak after winning a season-high six straight on the road...are 18-10 (.643) on the road for the season, which is the best road record in the majors (Detroit, 17-10).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 32 for 37 (86.5%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 35 of their 39 (89.7%) attempts, which is also the highest percentage in the majors...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 38 errors, which is fourth most in the American League...the errors have led to just 12 unearned runs, which is third fewest in the AL...are 20-9 when committing at least one error compared to 14-13 when going errorless...are tied for second in the AL with 14 outfield assists.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters have 12 walks, which is five more than any other AL team and second most in the majors (Washington, 15)...are tied for the AL lead in home runs (1) and plate appearances (62), rank second in on-base percentage (.387), tied for second in extra base hits (3), third in hits (11) and tied for third in RBI (7).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 6-2 on Sunday, which is the best record in the American League...are 21-3 when scoring first, which is the best record in the majors...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 56 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an A's team since they began the 1984 season with an Oakland single-season record 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Cook, Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL eight times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 4-1...have won the two games of this series after taking two of three at Los Angeles in April...with a win today, the A's would record their first sweep of the Angels in Oakland in a series of three or more games since June 29-July 1, 2004...won the season series last year 11-8...went 6-4 in Oakland and 5-4 in Los Angeles...it was the A's third consecutive season series win...are 36-26 (.581) against the Angels over the last four seasons...including 29-3 when scoring four or more runs...have been shutout in seven of their last 18 losses to the Angels and have scored just one run in six of those games...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 401-322 against the Angels...that includes 207-153 in Oakland and 194-169 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 450-399 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Donaldson leads the majors with 48 runs scored...those are the most in Oakland history by a player at the end of May (previous: 47, Jose Canseco in 1988 and Rickey Henderson in 1982)...**Sean Doolittle** has a 13.1 inning scoreless streak, which is the second longest of his career (13.2, April 29-May 29, 2013).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** Reggie Jackson homers in the third inning of the A's 5-2 win at New York to give the A's a home run in 13 consecutive games, what was then a club record...the A's hit 25 round trippers during the streak, including six by Jackson...in **2006** Barry Zito strikes out Lew Ford in the sixth inning to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history and the eighth in Athletics history with 1000 career strikeouts.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (5-1, 2.31 ERA)

LAST FIVE, FIRST SIX: Is 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (11 er in 33.0 ip) and four home runs allowed in 33.0 innings over his last five starts...went 4-1 with a 1.76 ERA and one home run allowed in 41.0 innings over his first six starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second in the American League in ERA (2.31), fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.316), tied for fifth in winning percentage (.833), sixth in opponents batting average (.217) and eighth in opponents on-base percentage (.284)...is also tied for second in shutouts (1), tied for third in wild pitches (6) and tied for fourth in complete games (1).

LAST 17 STARTS: Is 9-2 with a 2.30 ERA (28 er in 109.2 ip) and .221 (90 for 407) opponents batting average over his last 17 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...the ERA is the lowest in the American League over that span (min. 80 ip) and the wins are tied for sixth.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .164 (11 for 67) with a double and a home run (.224 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is the lowest in the American League and the batting average is fourth lowest...the opponents number four hitter is batting .138 (4 for 29), which is second lowest in the AL...has allowed a .100 (12 for 120) batting average with two strikes...opponents are 3 for 28 (.107) with runners in scoring position and two outs...has surrendered five home runs all solo shots...has yielded just nine home runs in 138.0 career innings (0.59 per nine innings).

SIX INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings in his last start, snapping his season-opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-0 with a 2.30 ERA (12 er in 47.0 ip) in seven starts at night compared to 1-1 with a 2.33 ERA (7 er in 27.0 ip) in four starts during the day...has the lowest night ERA in the American League...his career numbers are 6-1 with a 2.04 ERA (19 er in 83.2 ip) in 14 night games, 4-3 with a 3.15 ERA (19 er in 54.1 ip) in nine day games.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 1.25 ERA (5 er in 36.0 ip) and .160 (20 for 125) opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA (14 er in 38.0 ip) and .265 (39 for 147) opponents average in six starts at home...leads the American League in road ERA.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 4-0 with a 2.08 ERA (12 er in 52.0 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-1 with a 2.86 ERA (7 er in 22.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest...his career numbers are 7-1 with a 1.90 ERA (17 er in 80.2 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more, 3-3 with a 3.54 ERA (21 er in 53.1 ip) in eight starts on four days rest.

THAT'S ODD: Has a 3.92 ERA (17 er in 39.0 ip) in odd numbered innings compared to a 0.51 ERA (2 er in 35.0 ip) in even numbered innings.

THIS AND THAT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in five of his 11 starts...the A's have been shut out twice this year, both times in his starts...the A's are 7-4 (.636) in his starting assignments this year and are 13-8 (.619) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 17 of his 21 career starts and allowed two runs or fewer 12 times.

10th CAREER WIN: Recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20).

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the month of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in five starts...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night **March 31**...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle **April 6** in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle **April 12**...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-3 win over Houston **April 18** in Oakland...allowed a career-high nine hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas **April 23** in Oakland...walked a career-high four batters...the loss snapped a career-high six-game winning streak dating back to September 11, 2013...went 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak...tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas **April 28**...became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win at Boston **May 4**...blanked the Red Sox on one hit over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high tying 14.0 innings...was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-1 win at Cleveland **May 16**...matched his career-high with nine strikeouts.

LAST START: He had a no decision for the fourth time in his last five starts in the A's 6-5 loss to Detroit on Tuesday in Oakland...allowed two runs in the first inning on a RBI single by Cabrera and a RBI double by J.D. Martinez but the A's tied the game with two runs in the second...allowed a solo home run to Cabrera in the third and a RBI double to Avila in the fourth but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the fourth...left after six innings with a 5-4 lead but Otero allowed a run in the seventh for the blown save and Abad was charged with a run in the eighth for the loss.

GRAY vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 0-0 with a 1.13 ERA (8.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 8 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, one start, both last year...pitched in relief in his second career outing July 19 at Los Angeles (AL)...entered the game in the sixth inning with the A's trailing 4-0 and pitched 2.0 scoreless innings...walked Callaspo with two outs in the sixth and then retired the side in order in the seventh...allowed a leadoff single to Pujols in the eighth and was relieved by Blevins...then had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win September 17 in Oakland...allowed a two-out solo home run to Trout in the first inning but that was the only run he would allowed in six innings of work...the A's tied the game with a run in the bottom of the first and won it on a Donaldson single in the bottom of the ninth.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Scott Kazmir (6-2, 2.36 ERA): Tossed his second career complete game in his last start, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit last Wednesday (0 bb, 8 so)...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006 and his streak of 161 consecutive starts without a complete game was seventh longest in Major League history...ranks fifth in the American League in ERA (2.36) and tied for fifth in wins (6)...is second in opponents slugging percentage (.304) and on-base percentage (.262) and third in batting average (.212)... is 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA and .190 opponents batting average over his last four starts...is 13-7 with a 2.78 ERA over his last 29 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...his ERA is third lowest in the AL over that span (min. 140 ip)...has allowed a .125 batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranks second in the AL...is 7-7 with a 3.50 ERA in 18 career appearances, including 17 starts, against New York.

- The A's bullpen is second in the American League lead in ERA (2.87) and is tied for the second most wins (11) and losses (10)...ranks first in opponents batting average (.216), opponents on-base percentage (.277) and opponents slugging percentage (.291).
- Has the most blown saves (9), has the lowest save percentage (50.0%) and is tied for the fewest saves (9)...has allowed the fourth highest inherited runners scored percent (24 of 70, 34.3%).
- Has allowed the second fewest walks (52) and is tied for the fewest home runs allowed (9).
- Earned its first win last night since May 17 (Otero, at Cleveland) and now has a 1.99 ERA over its last eight games (5 er in 22.2 ip)...has not allowed a run over this first two games of this series (6.2 ip, 5 h, 1 bb, 6 so).
- Has just four saves since April 23 (35 games)...is the fewest saves in the Major Leagues during that span...team is 20-15 during stretch.

- Has two losses and a 4.82 ERA (5 er in 9.1 ip) in his last 12 games after not allowing a run over his first 14 appearances (13.1 ip) this season...walked two hitters in a game Tuesday for the first time this season.
- Is second among AL relievers in opponents batting average (.132) and slugging percentage (.132), and sixth in on-base percentage (.221)...all 10 of his hits allowed this season have been singles.
- Is sixth among AL relievers in WHIP (0.79).
- Has a 15-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011...that is the longest active losing streak in the majors and is the longest losing streak in the majors over the last 21 years...the last longer streak was a 27-game losing streak by Anthony Young from May 6, 1992-July 24, 1993.
- Has two appearances against the Angels this season (1.1 ip, 1 so)...are his only two career outings against Los Angeles.

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.

- Was placed on the DL for the second time this season on May 9 (retroactive to May 8) with a strained right forearm.
- Was originally placed on the DL March 29 (retroactive to March 21) with right shoulder tendinitis...came off the DL on April 7 and pitched in 12 games with the A's (0-1, 2.92 ERA in 12.1 ip).

TUESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (6-2, 2.36 ERA)

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his second career complete game in his last start, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit last Wednesday in Oakland...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks **fifth** in the American League in ERA (2.36) and **tied for fifth** in wins (6)...is **second** in opponents slugging percentage (.304) and on-base percentage (.262) and **fourth** in batting average (.212)...also ranks **third** in fewest pitches per inning (14.5), tied for **third** in wild pitches (6), **fourth** in highest run support (6.55), **tied for fourth** in complete games (1), **eighth** in fewest walks per nine innings (1.70), **tied for eighth** in grounded into double plays (8), **tied for ninth** in hit batters (4) and **10th** in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.52) and **strikeout-to-walk ratio** (4.08).

LAST FOUR STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in three of his last four starts and is 2-1 with a 1.85 ERA (5 er in 24.1 ip) and .190 (16 for 84) opponents batting average over that span...has walked one batter or fewer in three of those four starts and has issued just four walks in 24.1 innings.

LAST 29 STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in six of his 11 starts this year and 14 of his last 29 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 13-7 with a 2.78 ERA (53 er in 171.2 ip) and .228 (147 for 644) opponents batting average over that stretch...has walked 37 (1.94 per nine innings) and struck out 160 in 171.2 innings (8.39 per nine innings) for a **strikeout to walk ratio** of 4.32...has yielded just 11 home runs (0.58 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .125 (6 for 48) batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranks **second** in the American League (**Buehrle, TOR .119**)...opponents are 1 for 20 (.050) with RISP and two outs...has not walked a batter to lead off an inning...opponents are batting .206 (14 for 68) with a .229 on-base percentage (two hit by pitches) and .235 slugging percentage (two doubles) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is **second** lowest in the AL, the on-base percentage ranks **fourth** and the batting average is **10th**...has yielded a .197 (40 for 203) average against right-handers compared to .277 (13 for 47) against left-handers...the mark against righties ranks **sixth** lowest in the AL...has surrendered all four of his home runs this year and 20 of his 23 over the last two years to righties...three of the home runs this year have been solo shots as have 16 of his 23 over the last two years.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.69 ERA (7 er in 37.1 ip) in five starts at home compared to 3-1 with a 3.16 ERA (11 er in 31.1 ip) in six starts on the road...has the **fourth** lowest home ERA in the American League...has walked two batters in 37.1 innings at home and 11 in 31.1 innings on the road...has allowed three of his four home runs at home.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-0 with a 1.31 ERA (5 er in 34.1 ip) in five starts during the day compared to 3-2 with a 3.41 ERA (13 er in 34.1 ip) in six starts at night...ranks **fourth** in the American League in day ERA...is now 8-2 with a 2.52 ERA (25 er in 89.1 ip) in 15 starts during the day over the last two years and 8-9 with a 4.19 ERA (64 er in 137.1 ip) in 25 starts at night.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 2-2 with a 2.67 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in five starts in May after going 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Gray, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...of those six, only Cahill was undefeated (Cahill started the season 6-0)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...his last four-win month was June of 2010 with Los Angeles (AL)...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 9-2 (.818) in his starting assignments...has walked one batter or fewer in seven of his 11 starts...has not allowed a run three times.

RHP Jesse Chavez (4-3, 2.78 ERA): Went 2-3 with a 3.90 ERA and .286 opponents batting average in five starts in May after going 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...ranks **eighth** in the American League in ERA (2.78) and has the **10th** lowest on-base percentage (.288)...opponents are hitting .170 with runners in scoring position, which ranks **seventh** in the AL...has allowed a .185 batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .276 against left-handers...has issued just four of his 18 walks to righties for a .211 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage against right-handers is the **lowest** in the AL and **third** lowest in the majors...the batting average is **third** lowest in the AL...the A's are 8-3 (.727) in his starting assignments...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss to Detroit last Thursday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (7.2 ip) in two career appearances against New York, both in relief.

WEDNESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (4-3, 2.78 ERA)

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 2-3 with a 3.90 ERA and .286 opponents batting average in five starts in May after going 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks **eighth** in the American League in ERA (2.78) and has the **10th** lowest on-base percentage (.288)...is also **seventh** in highest run support (5.82)...opponents have reached base on an error five times, which is **tied for second** most in the AL.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are hitting .170 (9 for 53) with runners in scoring position, which ranks **seventh** in the American League...they are 2 for 22 (.091) with RISP and two outs...has walked just one batter to lead off an inning for a .286 on-base percentage...however, has allowed four doubles and four home runs for a .507 slugging percentage...has a .347 (17 for 49) opponents batting average in the first inning, .213 (45 for 211) after that...has a .259 (48 for 185) opponents batting average the first two times through the order, .187 (14 for 75) after that...has held the fourth through seventh hitters in the batting order to a .150 (18 for 120) batting average...all other hitters are batting .314 (44 for 140).

AS A STARTER: Has made 11 appearances this year, all starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 4-4 with a 3.64 ERA (31 er in 76.2 ip) in 13 career starts compared to 9-14 with a 5.30 ERA in 189 relief appearances...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 8-3 (.727) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in nine of his 11 starts and allowed two runs or fewer seven times...has career highs in strikeouts (64), innings pitched (68.0) and games started (11)...his four wins are one short of his best of five in 2010...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk...began the season with four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

LHP Drew Pomeranz (5-2, 2.37 ERA): Went 4-1 with a 2.70 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in six games, including five starts, in May...**tied for third** in the American League in wins in May...had just five wins over the first 42 games of his career...has a 2.37 ERA overall, which is **sixth** lowest in the AL among pitchers with 35 or more innings...opponents are batting .136 with runners in scoring position...has not allowed a run in innings one through three (15.0 ip) and opponents are 4 for 48 (.083)...has a 5.14 ERA in innings four through six and a 2.00 ERA from the seventh inning on...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 9-5 A's win over Los Angeles last Friday in Oakland (5.1 ip, 4 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...his 5.1 innings pitched snapped a streak of 20 consecutive starts of five innings or fewer, which was the longest such streak by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914...now has a streak of 24 consecutive starts of fewer than six innings, which is also the longest such streak by a ML pitcher since at least 1914...has never faced the Yankees in his career.

THURSDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Drew Pomeranz (5-2, 2.37 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 1-1 with a 1.98 ERA in nine relief appearances before moving into the starting rotation May 7...is 4-1 with a 2.59 ERA (7 er in 24.1 ip) in five starting assignments...has a 2.37 ERA overall, which is **sixth** lowest in the American League among pitchers with 35 or more innings...using the same minimum, he has the **fourth** lowest opponents batting average (.204) and **ninth** lowest slugging percentage (.321).

IN MAY: Went 4-1 with a 2.70 ERA (8 er in 26.2 ip) and .208 (20 for 96) opponents batting average in six games, including five starts, in May...**led for third** in the American League in wins in May...had just five wins over the first 42 games of his career.

FIVE INNINGS OR FEWER/FEWER THAN SIX INNINGS: Tossed 5.1 innings in his last start, which was his longest outing since July 27, 2012 against Cincinnati when he also pitched 5.1 innings...that snapped a streak of 20 consecutive starts of five innings or fewer, which was the longest such streak by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914 (previous: Len Barker, 14 from May 21, 1985-June 10, 1987)...now has a streak of 24 consecutive starts of fewer than six innings, which is also the longest such streak by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914 (previous: Don Wengert, June 25, 1997-May 26, 2001)...has not tossed at least six innings in a start since July 6, 2012 when he logged 6.1 innings at Washington...has tossed more than five innings in just seven of his 35 career starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .136 (3 for 22) with runners in scoring position...has allowed a .179 (5 for 28) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .211 (23 for 109) against right-handers...his career splits are .168 (24 for 143) against left-handers, .279 (145 for 519) against right-handers...has surrendered four of his five home runs this year and 21 of 23 in his career to right-handers...has a .464 career slugging percentage against righties compared to .224 by lefties...four of his five home runs have been solo shots...has a .116 (8 for 69) opponents average over his first 30 pitches in a game, .294 (20 for 68) after that...has allowed a .130 (10 for 77) batting average with two strikes...opponents are 6 for 36 (.167) with three walks (.231 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning

INNING BY INNING: Has not allowed a run in innings one through three (15.0 ip) and opponents are 4 for 48 (.083)...has a 5.14 ERA (8 er in 14.0 ip) and .273 (15 for 55) opponents batting average in innings four through six...has a 2.00 ERA (2 er in 9.0 ip) and .265 (9 for 34) opponents average from the seventh inning on.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (10.0 ip) in two starts on five days rest or more compared to 2-1 with a 4.40 ERA (7 er in 14.1 ip) in three starts on four days rest.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-0 with a 2.33 ERA (5 er in 19.1 ip) and .134 (9 for 67) opponents batting average in seven games at home compared to 1-2 with a 2.41 ERA (5 er in 18.2 ip) and .271 (19 for 70) opponents batting average in seven games on the road...is **tied for second** in the American League in home wins.

SCORELESS STREAK SNAPPED: Had his scoreless streak snapped at a career-high and A's season-high 18.0 innings in the fourth inning May 25 at Toronto...began the streak with three consecutive scoreless starts of exactly 5.0 innings from May 7 to 20...is the first A's pitcher with three consecutive scoreless outings of five or more innings since Ted Lilly (Sept. 10-21, 2003)...allowed three hits or fewer in each of those three starts, joining Steve Ontiveros (June 14-24, 1994) as the only A's pitchers since 1914 with three consecutive scoreless outings of five innings or more and three hits or fewer.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Had his three-game winning streak snapped May 25...went 3-0 and did not allow a run over a three start stretch from May 7 to 20 (15.0 ip, 8 h, 4 bb, 16 so)...it marked the first time in his career he put together consecutive wins...now has five wins in 2014 after tallying four wins in 34 games over his first three seasons.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: First batters faced were 0 for 8 with a walk in his relief appearances this year and he stranded all three of his inherited runners...began his career with 30 consecutive starts before making his final four appearances of 2013 in relief...is 8-15 with a 4.96 ERA (86 er in 156.0 ip) in 35 career starts compared to 1-1 with a 1.45 ERA (3 er in 18.2 ip) in 13 relief appearances.

FIRST START: He combined with Dan Otero and Jim Johnson on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win in the second game of the doubleheader May 7 against Seattle...it was his first win as a starter since Sept. 26, 2012 against Chicago (NL)...tossed 5.0 innings and allowed two of the hits: a two-out single by Cano in the first and a one out single by Smoak in the fourth...allowed just one base runner as far as second base.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 11-0 win over Chicago (AL) May 13 in Oakland...it marks the first time in his career he has put together back-to-back wins...combined with Dan Otero, Fernando Abad and Joe Savery on a four-hit shutout...tossed five innings and allowed three of the hits while striking out a career-high eight.

THIRD START: He combined with Dan Otero, Luke Gregerson and Sean Doolittle on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Tampa Bay May 20...tossed 5.0 innings and allowed three of the hits...retired the

side in order in the first and second inning but was aided by double plays in the third and fifth.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Toronto May 25...blanked the Blue Jays on two walks over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings...the streak was snapped on a one-out solo home run by Encarnacion in the fourth...loaded the bases with no outs in the fifth and was relieved by Johnson, who allowed one of the inherited runners to score...Happ shut out the A's on four hits over the first seven innings.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-5 win over Los Angeles last Friday in Oakland...retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced (Ianneta walk) and had a 7-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fourth inning on a solo home run by Trout and a two-run home run by Kendrick...the A's increased the lead to 9-3 before he was relieved by Otero with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth...Otero allowed a two-run double to Cron.

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a career-high 0 for 20 streak from April 2 to 6.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston.
- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 consecutive games from April 6 through the first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, 16 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .387 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his career May 13-16 (also: Aug. 29-31, 2012)
- Scored a career-high four runs May 18 at Cleveland.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

- Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...it was his fifth career two-homer game (last: Aug. 28, 2013 at Detroit) and his fourth game with five or more RBI... became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)... that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).

- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
