LEADING OFF: Today, the Angels play the seventh game (2-4) of an all-AL West, 10-game road trip to Seattle (May 26-29; 2-2), Oakland (May 30-June 1; 0-2) and Houston (June 3-5)...Halos have lost back-to-back games for the first time since May 6 & 7...Club has only lost three straight once in 2014 (March 31-April 2 vs. SEA)...Angels are 3-5 in last eight games after winning 11 of previous 14...LAA is 5-1-1 in last seven series...Halos went 16-12 in May and have spent last two-plus weeks in second place...LAA is 19-11 in last 30 (opened season 11-13)...Seven of last 14 victories are come-from-behind efforts...Halos' 30 wins are fourth most in AL.

MAY MENTIONS: The Halos finished the month of May with a 16-12 record after a 14-13 showing in April...The 16 wins were tied for third in the A.L. and tied fourth in the Majors...The Halo staff held opposing hitters to a .233 clip in the month, good for third in the Majors...Angel relievers surrendered just 62 hits in May, the fewest in the Majors while their .225 average against ranked third in the A.L....As a team, the Angels hit .267 (65/243) with RISP in May after posting a .227 clip in April... Grant Green had a .361 clip (22/61) in his 22 games... C.J. Cron drove in 11 runs in his 23 May games...Ernesto Frieri allowed just two run in his 12.1 innings of work (1.46 ERA) while logging six saves.

KNOW THIS: Since April 12, Jered Weaver has posted a 6-1 record with a 2.01 ERA (53.2 IP - 12 ER)...The righthander registered a 1.98 ERA in his five May starts and pitched into the 7th inning four different times.

@ OAKLAND: The Angels will look to avoid being swept in a three-game series in Oakland for the first time since June 29-July 1, 2004...A's lead 2014 series 4-1...A's claimed 2013 series 11-8...Halos have lost four straight season series vs. A's (2010-2013)...LAA has dropped 15 of last 22 to Oakland at Angel Stadium but have won 10 of last 18 in Bay Area...Angels are 26-36 against the A's over the last four seasons (2011-14)...Since 2002, Halos' record against Oakland is 116-119.

HAMILTON UPDATE: Josh Hamilton (left thumb surgery) went 2-for-5 with a double and a run scored in a rehab assignment last night with Triple-A Salt Lake...In his last two rehab games, the outfielder has gone 4-for-9 with a double and two runs scored...Appeared in first rehab game on May 22 (2/4, 2B).

BACK ON THE ROAD: Club has posted a 3.58 ERA (4th in A.L.) & .205 BAA (1st in MLB) on the road...Howie Kendrick leads LAA batting .330 (35/106) in away games... Erick Aybar is at a .324 clip in road affairs this season.

LOOKING UP FOR HALOS: At 30-25, Angels have a fivewin improvement after 55 games from a season ago (25-30)...Club was 25-31 after 56 G in 2013.

RECENT RUN: During the Angels' current 14-8 run, the starters have fashioned a 3.38 ERA (141 IP - 53 ER) while holding opponents to a .217 batting average against (112/517) with 43 walks and 118 Ks...Club has 15 quality starts in the 22-game span.

THAT'S GRUBE-Y: 32-year-old Jarrett Grube (pronounced Groob) made his major league debut last night, becoming just the fourth player in Angels history to make Major League debut at age 32 or older and the first since Chris Prieto in 2005.

HOT HALOS: After an 0-2 record and 5.79 ERA in his first three starts, Jered Weaver is 6-1 with a 2.01 ERA (53.2 IP -12 ER) in his last eight starts - with 8 consecutive quality starts...Since his recall May 2, Grant Green is batting .361 (22/61)...Ernesto Frieri has allowed two earned runs in his last 14 appearances (14.1 IP) with six saves, two holds with 16 strikeouts...Prior to that, he allowed 7 ER in his previous 3.2 IP (3 HR)... Eric Aybar has a .333 average (15/45) with nine RBI his past 10 games...Mike Trout is riding a 11-game hit streak (.415: 17/41) with 10 RBI in span...Since May 17. Chris lannetta is batting .400 (10/25) with 6 runs, 2 doubles, 2 home runs & 3 RBI.

MORE COWGILL: Collin Cowgill connected for his third home run of the season and matched a season high in hits last night against his former club...Has reached base safely in 30 of 35 starts...Only Angels player to appear in every victory this season (Halos are 30-18 when he plays, 0-7 when he does not)...Has reached safely in 28 of his last 66 PA...Club is 21-14 in his 35 starts.

FROM THE START: Angels starting pitching comparison... THRU 55 G in 2013 4.37 ERA (11th in AL) 3.62 ERA (2nd in AL) THRU 55 G in 2014 **Halos' 31 quality starts in 2014 rank 3rd in AL **6.1 IP per start for Angels leads AL

<u>PITCHING POINTS:</u> Opponents batting just .228 against Angels pitching, 2nd best in A.L....23 wins by Halo starters are tied for third-most in AL...Angels have allowed 72 earned runs in their 30 wins (284 IP; 2.28 ERA) and 142 ER in their 23 losses (214.1 IP; 5.96 ERA)...<u>Club has a 4.11 ERA at home</u>

compared to 3.58 ERA on road (4th in AL).

MILESTONE MACHINE:, Albert Pujols (506 HRs) has moved past Eddie Murray for 25th on the all-time list...Gary Sheffield ranks 24th (509)... Albert's 538 career doubles have passed Lou Gehriq (534) for sole possession of 33rd on the <u>all-time list</u>...On April 22nd in D.C., Pujols became the **26**th player in MLB history to reach the 500 HR milestone (there have been 18,293 MLB players as of 4/22)...He is the first player in the 500 Club to hit #499 & #500 in the same game.

THIS N' THAT: Halos are 10-14 vs. AL West foes (20-11 vs. rest)...Angels rank 3rd in MLB with 37 first inning runs (1st in AL)...LAA set a club record for March/April with 38 HRs but have been limited to 22 HRs this month...26 of Trout's 59 hits this season are for extra-bases (11-2B, 4-3B, 11-HR)...Angels 25-man roster currently features 12 homegrown players...15 of club's 30 victories are in comeback fashion...Halos lead MLB with 16 triples.

UP NEXT - @ HOU: LAA leads 2014 series 5-2...Halos are 11-5 in last 16 meetings and have won seven of last nine games at Minute Maid Park, allowing just 10 runs in the seven victories...Astros claimed the 2013 series 10-9, the first year of their move to the AL West...These clubs met only twice in Interleague Play (2004 & 2007) with each club claiming two of three at home...Angels and Astros will meet a total of 19 times in 2014 (9 in Houston, 10 in Anaheim).

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

(1975) Nolan Ryan recorded his fourth no-hitter as an Angel with a 1-0 gem vs. Baltimore; (1995) Angels select Darin Erstad as the number one overall pick in the free agent draft...Erstad joins catcher Danny Goodwin (1975 draft) as the only two overall number one picks in Angels' history.
