OAKLAND ATHLETICS (36-22) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (29-28)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four straight and six of the last eight games after a season-high four-game losing streak...are now 17-7 over the last 24 contests and a season-high tying 14 games over .500 at 36-22 for season (also: May 21, 30-16)...that is the second best record in the majors

(San Francisco, 37-21) and the A's best record after 58 games since 1991 club also started the year 35-23 (won game 59)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 37th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 41 consecutive days and 54 of the last 56...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...have a season-high $5\frac{1}{2}$ game lead in the West, which is the A's largest lead before the All-Star Break since 1990 when they also led by $5\frac{1}{2}$ games as early as May $9\dots$ have 50days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth.

THE LONG BALL: Brandon Moss hit two home runs last night and the A's have now homered in 11 consecutive games (19 home runs total)...now have 68 home runs for the season, which ranks second in the AL and third in the majors...37 of the home runs have come with runners on base, which is tied with Toronto for the most in the majors...are tied with Boston and Chicago (AL) for the Major League lead in grand slams (3)...Yoenis Céspedes hit his 10th home run of the season Saturday and the A's are one of two teams with three players with 10 or more home runs (Colorado)...this marks the third time in Oakland history the A's had three players with 10 or more home runs by the end of May...also did it in 1997 (Berroa, Canseco, McGwire) and 2006 (Chavez, Swisher and Thomas)...the pitching staff has allowed 46 home runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL...only 14 of those have come with runners on base, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.41 ERA (58 er in 216.2 ip) over the last 24 games...**lead the majors** in ERA (2.91), opponents batting average (.222), on-base percentage (.285) and slugging percentage (.334)...also lead the majors with a .190 (81 for 426) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...are tied for the second fewest walks issued (161) in the AL and are third in shutouts (7).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 13-4 with a 2.54 ERA (41 er in 145.1 ip) over the last 24 games...are now 24-12 with a 3.00 ERA (117 er in 351.0 ip) for the season...the losses are the fewest in the majors and the ERA is second lowest (Atlanta, 2.95)...are tied for the AL lead in complete games (2) and rank fourth in innings pitched (351.0)

OFFENSE: The A's batted .278 with 48 runs scored and 14 home runs in seven games on the last homestand after hitting .216 with 43 runs scored and nine home runs in nine games on the last road trip...for the season, the A's are hitting .261 with 41 home runs in 29 games in Oakland compared to .242 (250 for 1034) with 27 home runs in 29 games on the road...overall, the A's lead the majors in runs (301), walks (254) and on-base percentage (.339), rank third in home runs (68), tied for fourth in triples (14), fifth in slugging (.417) and fewest strikeouts (405) and tied for fifth in extra base hits (184).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are now 6-3 in extra inning games following last night's win...lead the AL in extra inning games and wins and are tied for the third best record...are 11-15 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 25-7 in games decided by three runs or more...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (7) and are tied with Milwaukee for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (4)...are 10-7 in games decided in the last at bat.

IN MAY: The A's went 16-12 in May after going 18-9 in April...have now posted a winning record in 12 consecutive months dating back to June of 2012...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972...the pitching staff finished with a 3.08 ERA, which was the sixth lowest May ERA in Oakland history and the lowest since 1990 (2.43)...had five shutouts, which were the A's most in May since 1931.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this nine-game road trip to New York-AL (1-0), Baltimore (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...last night's win snapped the A's season-high four game road losing streak...are now 19-10 (.655) on the road for the season, which is the best road record in the majors (Los Angeles-NL, 18-11)...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-2) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0)...those were the A's only seven home games over a 25-game stretch from May 16 to June 11...have won 11 of the last 14 home games after losing six straight and are 17-12 (.586) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the AL (Cleveland, 20-11).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 32 for 39 (82.1%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 36 of their 40 (90.0%) attempts, which is the third highest percentage in the majors...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 38 errors, which is fourth most in the American League...the errors have led to just 12 unearned runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL...are 20-9 when committing at least one error compared to 16-13 when going errorless...are tied for second in the AL with 14 outfield assists.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters have 12 walks, which is five more than any other AL team and second most in the majors (Washington, 16)...are tied for the AL lead in home runs (1), are second in plate appearances (63), on-base percentage (.397) and extra base hits (4) and third in hits (12) and RBI (8).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 22-3 when scoring first, which is the best record in the majors...have recorded a Major League leading six series sweeps...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 58 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an A's team since they began the 1984 season with an Oakland single-season record 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Reddick)...Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL nine times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times.

vs. YANKEES: The A's won the first meeting of 2014 last night...all six meetings will take place between June 3-15...the A's won the season series last year, 5-1...went 3-0 in Oakland and 2-1 in New York...it was the A's first season series win over the Yankees since 2007...went 7-27 (.206) against the Yankees from 2008-11 before splitting the 10-game season series in 2012...six of the last 10 series between the two teams have ended in sweeps...the A's swept a threegame home series in 2013 and a four-game road series in 2012...New York won 11 straight games against Oakland July 5, 2010-July 22, 2011...also swept a three-game series over the A's in New York in May, 2012...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 232-267 against the Yankees...that includes 127-121 in Oakland and 105-146 in New York...all-time, the A's are 773-1133-9 against the Yankees

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Donaldson leads the majors with 48 runs scored...Sean **Doolittle** extended his scoreless streak to 15.1 innings last night, which is an ongoing career-high (previous: 13.2, April 29-May 29, 2013)...**Brandon Moss** hit a career-high tying two home runs last night for the sixth time in his career and second time this season (also: May 13 vs. Chicago-AL).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1971 the A's take a 3-0 lead into the bottom of the ninth at Washington before the Senators score three times to send the game into extra innings...the A's finally win with two runs in the top of the 21st inning to win the longest game (by innings) in Oakland history...in 1972 Catfish Hunter pitches a two-hit shutout in the first game of a double-header at Baltimore for his 100th career victory...the future Hall of Famer would go on to win 224 games with the A's and the Yankees.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (4-3, 2.78 ERA)

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 2-3 with a 3.90 ERA and .286 opponents batting average in five starts in May after going 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks eighth in the American League in ERA (2.78) and has the ninth lowest on-base percentage (.288)...is also seventh in highest run support (5.82)...opponents have reached base on an error five times, which is tied for second most in the AL.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are hitting .170 (9 for 53) with runners in scoring position, which ranks seventh in the American League...they are 2 for 22 (.091) with RISP and two outs...has walked just one batter to lead off an inning for a .286 on-base percentage...however, has allowed four doubles and four home runs for a .507 slugging percentage...has a .347 (17 for 49) opponents batting average in the first inning, .213 (45 for 211) after that...has a .259 (48 for 185) opponents batting average the first two times through the order, .187 (14 for 75) after that...has held the fourth through seventh hitters in the batting order to a .150 (18 for 120) batting average...all other hitters are batting .314 (44 for 140).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .185 (20 for 108) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .276 (42 for 152) against left-handers...has issued just four of his 18 walks to righties for a .211 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage against right-handers is second lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...the batting average is tied for fourth lowest in the AL...over the last two years, he has held right-handed hitters to a .198 (41 for 207) batting average...has issued 28 of his 38 walks over that stretch to lefties.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed five home runs in his last four starts (24.1 ip) after allowing three home runs over his first seven starts (43.2 ip)...has allowed eight home runs for the season, all with the bases empty.

AS A STARTER: Has made 11 appearances this year, all starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 4-4 with a 3.64 ERA (31 er in 76.2 ip) in 13 career starts compared to 9-14 with a 5.30 ERA in 189 relief appearances...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 8-3 (.727) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in nine of his 11 starts and allowed two runs or fewer seven times...has career highs in strikeouts (64), innings pitched (68.0) and games started (11)...his four wins are one short of his best of five in 2010...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk...began the season with four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

2014 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win over Seattle *April 3* in Oakland...left trailing 2-0 but the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game...had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota *April 9*...struck out a career-high nine in 7.0 innings...the A's scored four times in the first inning and he allowed a solo home run to Kubel to lead off the second...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings and he was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth...had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) *April 14*...matched his career high with nine strikeouts for the second consecutive start...allowed an unearned run in the first inning when Calhoun singled, went to second on a passed ball and scored on a Pujols single...allowed a solo home run to Pujols in the third and left after seven innings trailing 2-1...picked up his first career

win as a starter in the A's 4-1 win over Houston April 20 in Oakland...blanked the Astros on three hits and two walks over the first three innings before Gonzalez homered with two outs in the fourth...then retired seven of the final eight batters he faced...had a no decision in the A's 12-5 win at Houston April 25...allowed a careerhigh eight hits...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a run in the third inning on an Altuve RBI double...the A's scored a run in the fourth to take a 5-1 lead but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the fourth on a Dominguez RBI single, a two-run error by Donaldson and a Castro RBI ground out...the A's scored seven times in the ninth for the win...extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 12-1 victory at Texas April 30...did not allow a run in 7.0 innings...yielded just one hit (Fielder two-out single in first) and one walk (Fielder, one out in fourth)...did not allow a base runner past first base...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Seattle *May 6*...allowed three runs in the first inning on a wild pitch, a Smoak RBI double and an Ackley RBI single...the A's scored twice in the second to narrow the gap to 3-2 and he blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over innings two through five before allowing a Zunino sacrifice fly in the sixth...left after that trailing 4-2...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Chicago **May 12** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings...allowed two runs on a pair of solo home runs by Viciedo in the second and Abreu to lead off the ninth...the two home runs matched his career high...the A's bullpen was charged with two more runs in the ninth before Doolittle retired the final three batters for the save...was the winning pitcher in the A's 13-3 win at Cleveland *May* 18...it was the 200th appearance of his career...tossed a career-high 109 pitches and allowed a career-high tying two home runs for the second consecutive start...allowed a leadoff home run to Bourn in the first inning but the A's scored seven unanswered runs before he allowed a one out solo home run to Brantley in the fifth...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss at Toronto May 24...allowed a careerhigh tying eight hits...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed an unearned run in the third when Gose scored on a Gentry error...then allowed three more runs in the fifth on a Lawrie home run and a two-run error by

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 5-4 loss to Detroit last Thursday in Oakland...yielded a career-high tying eight hits for the second consecutive start...allowed a run to score on a ground out in the third inning and the A's scored twice in the fourth to give him a 2-1 lead...surrendered two more runs in the fifth inning on a Kinsler RBI double and a Cabrera sacrifice fly to give the Tigers the lead for good.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Drew Pomeranz (5-2, 2.37 ERA): Went 4-1 with a 2.70 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in six games, including five starts, in May...tied for fourth in the American League in wins in May...had just five wins over the first 42 games of his career...has a 2.37 ERA overall, which is sixth lowest in the AL among pitchers with 35 or more innings...opponents are batting .136 with runners in scoring position...has not allowed a run in innings one through three (15.0 jp) and opponents are 4 for 48 (.083)...has a 5.14 ERA in innings four through six and a 2.00 ERA from the seventh inning on...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 9-5 A's win over Los Angeles last Friday in Oakland (5.1 jp, 4 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...his 5.1 innings pitched snapped a streak of 20 consecutive starts of five innings or fewer, which was the longest such streak by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914...now has a streak of 24 consecutive starts of fewer than six innings, which is also the longest such streak by a ML pitcher since at least 1914...has never faced the Yankees in his career.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

12-10, 2.73 ERA (54 er in 178.1 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 11-for-20 (55.0%)

- The A's bullpen is second in the American League in ERA (2.73) and is tied for the second most wins (12)...ranks first in opponents batting average (.211), opponents on-base percentage (.273) and opponents slugging percentage (.284).
- Has not allowed a run over the last four games (12.2 ip, 6 h, 3 bb, 15 so) and has a 1.57 ERA over its last 10 games (5 er in 28.2 ip)...has earned two wins and two saves over the last three games after recording just two wins and three saves over its previous 20 games (May 9-30).
- Is tied for the most blown saves (9), has the lowest save percentage (55.0%) and has the third fewest saves (11)...has allowed the fourth highest inherited runners scored percent (24 of 74, 32.4%).
- Has allowed the fewest home runs (9) and the second fewest walks (54) among AL bullpens.

- Has not allowed an earned run over his last eight outings (6.1 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 4 bb, 6 so) after posting a 12.27 ERA over a five-game stretch from May 7-17 (5 er in 3.2 ip)...did not allow a run over his first 14 appearances (13.1 ip) this season.
- Is second among AL relievers in opponents batting average (.128) and slugging percentage (.128), and seventh in on-base percentage (.225)...all 10 of his hits allowed this season have
- Is seventh among AL relievers in WHIP (0.81).
- Has stranded all 12 inherited runners this season...is the third most in the AL without allowing an inherited runner to score.
- Has a 15-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011...that is the longest active losing streak in the majors and is the longest losing streak in the majors over the last 21 years...the last longer streak was a 27-game losing streak by Anthony Young from May 6, 1992-July 24, 1993.
- Last night was his first career appearance against the Yankees

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.

- Was reinstated from the DL yesterday after missing 22 games with a strained right forearm...was his second stint on the DL this season...was originally placed on the DL March 29 (retroactive to March 21) with right shoulder tendinitis...came off the DL on April 7 and pitched in 12 games with the A's (0-1, 2.92 ERA in 12.1 ip).
- Posted a 0.96 ERA (1 er in 9.1 ip) over his first nine games this season before allowing three earned runs over his last three games (3.0 ip, 9.00 ERA).
- Has a win and a save in eight career games against the Yankees (8.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 0 bb, 8 so, 4.15 ERA).
