## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (37-23) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (30-28)

FRIDAY, JUNE 6, 2014 – CAMDEN YARDS – 7:05 P.M. EDT LHP TOMMY MILONE (3-3, 3.60) VS. LHP WEI-YIN CHEN (6-2, 4.26) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their five-game winning streak snapped yesterday afternoon, which was one short of tying their season-high (6, May 7-13)...have won seven of the last 10 games after a season-high four game losing streak...are now 14 games over .500 at 37-23 which is one short of their

37-23, which is one short of their season-high of 15 (June 4, 37-22)...have the **best record** in the American League and second best in the majors (San Francisco, 39-21)...it is the A's best record after 60 games since the since the 1990 club started the year 40-20 (won game 61)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 39<sup>th</sup> consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 43 consecutive days and 56 of the last 58...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...have a season-high 5½ game lead in the West for the third consecutive day, which is the A's largest lead before the All-Star Break since 1990 when they also led by 5½ games as early as May 9...the last time the A's had a lead larger than 5½ games before the break was 1988 when they led by 6½ games as early as May 5...have 52 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth.

THE LONG BALL: John Jaso hit a home run yesterday afternoon and the A's have now homered in a season-high 13 consecutive games (23 home runs total)...have 72 home runs for the season, which ranks second in the AL and third in the majors...37 of the home runs have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors...are tied with Boston and Chicago (AL) for the Major League lead in grand slams (3)...had three players record 10 or more home runs by the end of May (Cespedes, Donaldson, Moss)...this marks the third time in Oakland history the A's had three players with at least 10 home runs by the end of May...also did it in 1997 (Berroa, Canseco, McGwire) and 2006 (Chavez, Swisher and Thomas)...the pitching staff has allowed 48 home runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL...only 15 of those have come with runners on base, which is tied with Chicago (NL) for the fewest in the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's **lead the majors** in walks (259) and on-base percentage (.338), are second in runs scored (309), third in home runs (72) and slugging percentage (.419), tied for fourth in triples (14), tied for sixth in extra base hits (189) and are seventh in fewest strikeouts (422).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 2.43 ERA (63 er in 233.2 ip) over the last 26 games...**lead the majors** in ERA (2.90), opponents batting average (.222), on-base percentage (.284) and slugging percentage (.335)...also lead the majors with a .192 (84 for 438) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...have the third most shutouts in the AL (7) and have allowed the third fewest walks (163).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 14-5 with a 2.61 ERA (46 er in 158.1 ip) over the last 26 games...are now 25-13 with a 3.02 ERA (122 er in 364.0 ip) for the season...the losses are the fewest in the majors and the ERA is second lowest (Atlanta, 2.92)...are tied for the AL lead in complete games (2) and are third in innings pitched (364.0).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 6-3 in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning games and wins and are tied for the third best record...are 11-16 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 26-7 in games decided by three runs or more...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (7) and are tied with Milwaukee for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (4)...are 10-7 in games decided in the last at hat

**IN MAY:** The A's went 16-12 in May after going 18-9 in April...have now posted a winning record in 12 consecutive months dating back to June of 2012...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972...the pitching staff finished with a 3.08 ERA, which was the sixth lowest May ERA in Oakland history and the lowest since 1990 (2.43)...had five shutouts, which were the A's most in May since 1931.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this nine-game road trip to New York-AL (2-1), Baltimore (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...are 20-11 (.645) on the road, which is the **best road record in the majors**...are hitting .244 (270 for 1105) with 31 home runs in 31 games on the road compared to .261 with 41 home runs in 29 games in Oakland...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-2) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0)...those were the A's only seven home games over a 25-game stretch from May 16 to June 11...have won 11 of the last 14 home games after losing six straight and are 17-12 (.586) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the AL (Cleveland, 21-11).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's are 33 for 40 (82.5%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 40 of their 44 (90.9%) attempts, which is the highest percentage in the majors...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 41 errors, which is fourth most in the American League...the errors have led to just 13 unearned runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL...are 21-10 when committing at least one error compared to 16-13 when going errorless...are tied for second in the AL with 14 outfield assists.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters have 12 walks, which is five more than any other AL team and tied for second most in the majors...are tied for the AL lead in home runs (1), are second in plate appearances (64), on-base percentage (.391) and extra base hits (4) and third in hits (12) and RBI (8).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 22-4 when scoring first, which is the best record in the majors...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 60 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an A's team since they began the 1984 season with an Oakland single-season record 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 9 minutes...averaged 3:05 last year, which was second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have five players on the disabled list (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Reddick)...Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL nine times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ORIOLES: This is the first meeting of 2014...the A's lost the season series last year, 2-5...it was the A's first season series loss to Baltimore since 1998...went 1-3 in Oakland and lost two of three at Camden Yards...are 84-44 (.656) against Baltimore since the start of the 1999 season, which is the best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 251-250 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 125-129 in Oakland and 126-121 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 987-930 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Coco Crisp** is on a season-high nine-game hitting streak (11 for 34, .324)...**Josh Donaldson** leads the majors in runs scored (50) and game-winning RBI (11)...**Sean Doolittle** has a 16.1 inning scoreless streak, which is an ongoing career-high (previous: 13.2, April 29-May 29, 2013).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1990** Rickey Henderson collects his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform...he finished his career with the A's with an Oakland record 1640 hits...in **2003** the A's return to Philadelphia for the first time in 49 years as Oakland defeats the Philadelphia Phillies in interleague play, 7-4...Miguel Tejada collects four hits, including an Oakland record tying three doubles.

#### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Tommy Milone (3-3, 3.60 ERA)

LAST FIVE STARTS/FIRST FIVE STARTS: Is 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA (6 er in 32.1 ip) and .208 (25 for 120) opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 0-3 with a 5.86 ERA and .274 opponents average over his first five starts...has 23 strikeouts, seven walks and two home runs over his last five starts after tallying 16 strikeouts, 12 walks and four home runs over his first five starts.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .224 (11 for 49) batting average with runners in scoring position...last year, opponents hit .216 with RISP, which ranked eighth in the American League...has issued 16 of his 19 walks and allowed five of his six home runs this year to right-handed hitters...has yielded 26 of his 31 home runs over the last two years to righties...has yielded three home runs to the number nine hitter in the order, which is the most in the majors...has held the opponents number three, four and five hitters to a .138 (11 for 80) batting average.

**THE FIRST INNING:** Has allowed eight runs in the first inning for a 7.20 ERA (10.0 ip)...has a 2.88 ERA (16 er in 50.0 ip) from the second inning on...has issued seven of his 19 walks and allowed two of his six home runs in the first inning.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received two runs of support or fewer in five of his 10 starts this year and is 0-3 in those games...is 3-0 in five starts with support of three or more runs...is 6-19 in 35 career starts with support of two runs or fewer, 23-3 in 37 starts with support of three runs or more...has received no run support in his three losses this year...last year, he received just 10 runs of support in his nine losses (1.78 RSA)...has received just 22 runs of support in his 22 losses in three seasons with the A's (124.2 ip, 1.59 RSA)

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA (7 er in 32.2 ip) and .210 (25 for 119) opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland compared to 1-3 with a 5.60 ERA (17 er in 27.1 ip) and .272 (31 for 114) opponents batting average in six starts on the road...his home ERA is tied for sixth lowest in the American League...has allowed four of his six home runs on the road...last year, he went 5-4 with a 3.44 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 7-5 with a 4.69 ERA in 16 games on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 14-8 with a 2.84 ERA (63 er in 199.1 ip) in 32 games in Oakland compared to 14-14 with a 4.87 ERA (112 er in 207.0 ip) in 37 games on the road.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 2-1 with a 3.19 ERA (13 er in 36.2 ip) in six starts at night compared to 1-2 with a 4.24 ERA (11 er in 23.1 ip) in four starts during the day...has yielded two home runs in 36.2 innings at night, four home runs in 23.1 innings during the day.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 1-1 with a 2.87 ERA (10 er in 31.1 ip) in five starts on four days rest compared to 2-2 with a 4.39 ERA (14 er in 28.2 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more.

**THIS AND THAT:** Has left with the lead in three of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (Gregerson each time)...the A's are 4-6 (.400) in his starting assignments this year and are 40-27 (.597) in his career...his teams are 45-27 (.625) in his 72 career starts.

2014 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss at Seattle April 11...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and two unearned runs in the second on errors by Donaldson and Lowrie...surrendered a two-run home run to Zunino in the sixth and left trailing 5-0...Hernandez shutout the A's three hits over the seven innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 16...allowed a run in the third inning on a Trout RBI double, but the A's scored four times in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead...put the first two batters on base in the seventh inning and was relieved by Otero, who allowed both runners to score...Gregerson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Texas *April 22* in Oakland...walked a career-high tying four batters...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Murphy RBI single and a Chirinos bases loaded walk...the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first but he allowed a run in the third when Rios scored on a Kouzmanoff grounded into double play...the A's then scored twice in the fourth to take the lead...left after six innings with a 4-3 lead but Gregerson allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss at Houston *April* 27...allowed just one run over the first six innings and that was in the third inning when Villar doubled and later scored on a Fowler ground out...then allowed a two-out two-run triple to Villar in the seventh inning...was relieved by Otero, who allowed Villar to score on an Altuve home run...McHugh shutout the A's on one hit over the first eight innings before Callaspo had a RBI single in the ninth...fell to 0-3

in the A's 6-3 loss at Boston  ${\it May 3}$ ...matched his career-highs by walking four batters (sixth time) and allowing three home runs (fourth time)...allowed a grand slam to Gomes in the first inning and solo home runs to Ortiz in the third and Ross in the fourth...left after walking Napoli to start the fifth with the A's trailing 6-0...combined with Fernando Rodriguez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Washington *May 9* in Oakland...tossed eight innings and allowed two of the hits, both to Hairston...also walked three batters but allowed just two base runners as far as second base...had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss to Chicago (AL) *May 14* in Oakland...allowed a home run to Beckham on the first pitch of the game but blanked the White Sox on four hits and a hit batter after that...left after six innings with the A's lead 2-1 but Gregerson allowed a three-run home run in the eighth inning for the blown save...he extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 3-2 win at Tampa Bay *May 21*...the A's scored twice in the second and once in the fourth and he blanked the Rays on three hits over the first five innings...allowed a RBI single to Loney and was relieved by Rodriguez with runners on first and second and two outs...Rodriguez allowed one of the inherited runners to score...combined with Otero and Doolittle on a five-hit shutout in the A's 10-0 win over Detroit May 26 in Oakland...tossed 6.2 innings and allowed four of the hits...allowed just two runners as far as second base: a Romine double in the third and a leadoff double by Cabrera in

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 11-3 win over Los Angeles last Saturday in Oakland...allowed two hits in the first inning and four in the second but did not allow a run...surrendered his only runs on a three-run home run by Cowgill in the fourth...retired each of the final seven batters he faced and left after six innings trailing 3-1...the A's scored six times in the seventh and four times in the eighth for the win.

MILONE vs. BALTIMORE: Is 1-1 with a 0.69 ERA (13.0 ip, 12 h, 3 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, both starts in Oakland...the loss came in a 3-0 loss last year on April 26...blanked the Orioles on four hits and a walk over the first five innings before allowing an unearned run in the seventh...Hardy singled and went to second on a Reddick error before scoring on a Pearce single...Chen and Johnson combined to shutout the A's on three hits...the win came in the A's 3-2 victory on September 14, 2012...allowed an unearned run in the third inning when Machado scored when Hardy reached on a two-out error by Donaldson...the A's scored twice in the fourth to give him a 2-1 lead but he allowed a home run to Davis to lead off the fifth and tie the game...Gomes had a RBI single in the fifth for the win.

RHP Sonny Gray (6-1, 2.45 ERA): Is 2-0 with a 3.18 ERA (14 er in 39.2 ip) over his last six starts after going 4-1 with a 1.76 ERA over his first six starts...is 10-2 with a 2.40 ERA (31 er in 116.1 ip) and .226 (97 for 430) opponents batting average over his last 18 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...the wins are tied for second in the American League over that span and the ERA is fourth lowest (min. 80 ip)...is tied for fourth in the AL in winning percentage (.857), fifth in ERA (2.45) and opponents slugging percentage (.322), sixth in opponents batting average (.224) and ninth in opponents on-base percentage (.291)...is 3-0 with a 1.25 ERA (5 er in 36.0 ip) and .160 (20 for 125) opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 3-1 with a 3.43 ERA and .271 opponents average in seven starts at home...leads the AL in road ERA...is scheduled to start on five days rest...is 4-0 with a 2.08 ERA (12 er in 52.0 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more compared to 2-1 with a 3.14 ERA (10 er in 28.2 ip) in four starts on four days rest...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against the Orioles, a start in the A's 10-3 loss at Baltimore last year on August 25 (3.1 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 3 so).

- The A's bullpen ranks first in the American League in ERA (2.67) and is tied for the second most wins (12)...is first in opponents batting average (.210), opponents on-base percentage (.271) and opponents slugging percentage (.282).
- Has not allowed a run over its last six games (16.2 ip. 9 h. 3 bb. 17 so)...marks the longest scoreless streak in terms of games and innings this season... has a 1.38 ERA over its last 12 games (5 er in 32.2 ip).
- Is tied for the second most blown saves (9), has the second lowest save percentage (57.1%) and has the third fewest saves (12)...has allowed the fourth highest inherited runners scored percent (24 of 76, 31.6%).
- Has allowed the fewest home runs (9) and the fewest walks (54) among AL bullpens.
