### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (38-23) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (30-29)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Had their five-game winning streak snapped Thursday, which was one short of tying their season-high (6, May 7-13)...rebounded with a 4-3, 11-inning win last night and have now won eight of the last 11 games after a season-high four game losing streak...are 15 games over .500

losing streak...are 15 games over .500 at 38-23, which equals their season-high (June 4, 37-22)...have the **best record** in the American League and second best in the majors (San Francisco, 40-21)...it is the A's best record after 60 games since the 1990 club started the year 40-20 (won game 62)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 40<sup>th</sup> consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 44 consecutive days and 57 of the last 59...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...have a season-high 5½ game lead in the West for the fourth consecutive day, which is the A's largest lead before the All-Star Break since 1990 when they also led by 5½ games as early as May 9...the last time the A's had a lead larger than 5½ games before the break was 1988 when they led by 6½ games as early as May 5...have 53 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth.

**THE LONG BALL:** Josh Donaldson (17<sup>th</sup>) and Derek Norris (6<sup>th</sup>) hit solo shots last night and the A's have now homered in a season-high 14 consecutive games (25 home runs total)...have 74 home runs for the season, which ranks second in the AL and third in the majors...37 of the home runs have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors...are tied with Boston and Chicago (AL) for the Major League lead in grand slams (3)...had three players record 10 or more home runs by the end of May (Cespedes, Donaldson, Moss)...this marks the third time in Oakland history the A's had three players with at least 10 home runs by the end of May...also did it in 1997 (Berroa, Canseco, McGwire) and 2006 (Chavez, Swisher and Thomas)...the pitching staff has allowed 50 home runs, which is tied for fewest in the AL...only 15 of those have come with runners on base, which is tied with Chicago (NL) for the fewest in the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's **lead the majors** in walks (261) and on-base percentage (.337), are second in runs scored (313), third in home runs (74), fourth in slugging percentage (.420),fifth in extra base hits (194), tied for sixth in triples (14), and are seventh in fewest strikeouts (433).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 2.43 ERA (66 er in 244.2 ip) over the last 27 games...**lead the majors** in ERA (2.89), opponents batting average (.224), on-base percentage (.285) and slugging percentage (.338)...also lead the majors with a .193 (86 for 446) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...are tied for the third most shutouts in the AL (7) and have allowed the third fewest walks (165).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 14-5 with a 2.68 ERA (49 er in 164.1 ip) over the last 27 games...are now 25-13 with a 3.04 ERA (125 er in 370.0 ip) for the season...the losses are the fewest in the majors and the ERA is second lowest (Atlanta, 2.91)...are tied for the AL lead in complete games (2) and are tied for third in innings pitched (370.0).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 7-3 in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning games and wins and have the second best record...are 12-16 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 26-7 in games decided by three runs or more...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (8) and are tied with Milwaukee for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (4)...are 10-7 in games decided in the last at bat.

**IN MAY:** The A's went 16-12 in May after going 18-9 in April...have now posted a winning record in 12 consecutive months dating back to June of 2012...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972...the pitching staff finished with a 3.08 ERA, which was the sixth lowest May ERA in Oakland history and the lowest since 1990 (2.43)...had five shutouts, which were the A's most in May since 1931. **HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-1 on this nine-game road trip to New York-AL (2-1), Baltimore (1-0, two games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...are 21-11 (.656) on the road, which is the **best road record in the majors**...are hitting .244 (280 for 1147) with 33 home runs in 32 games on the road compared to .261 with 41 home runs in 29 games in Oakland...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-2) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0)...those were the A's only seven home games over a 25-game stretch from May 16 to June 11...have won 11 of the last 14 home games after losing six straight and are 17-12 (.586) at home for the season, which is the third best home record in the AL behind Cleveland, (21-11) and Toronto (19-13).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's are 35 for 42 (83.3%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 40 of their 45 (88.9%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the AL...**the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.** 

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 41 errors, which is fourth most in the American League...the errors have led to just 13 unearned runs, which is tied for fewest in the AL...are 21-10 when committing at least one error compared to 17-13 when going errorless...are tied for first in the AL with 16 outfield assists.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters have 13 walks, which is six more than any other AL team and are second most in the majors...rank first in the AL in on-base percentage (.418), are tied for the AL lead in home runs (1) and extra base hits (5), are second in plate appearances (67) and hits (14), and third in RBI (9).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 23-4 when scoring first, which is the best record in the majors...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 61 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an A's team since they began the 1984 season with an Oakland single-season record 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 9 minutes...averaged 3:05 last year, which was second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have five players on the disabled list (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Reddick)...Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL nine times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's won the first meeting of 2014 last night...the A's lost the season series last year, 2-5...it was the A's first season series loss to Baltimore since 1998...went 1-3 in Oakland and lost two of three at Camden Yards...are 85-44 (.659) against Baltimore since the start of the 1999 season, which is the **best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team over that span**...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 252-250 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 125-129 in Oakland and 127-121 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 987-930 against the Orioles Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Coco Crisp** is on a season-high 10-game hitting streak (12 for 35, .343)...**Josh Donaldson** leads the majors in runs scored (51) and game-winning RBI (11)...**Sean Doolittle** has a 17.1 inning scoreless streak, which is an ongoing career-high (previous: 13.2, April 29-May 29, 2013).

#### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1994** Rickey Henderson steals second base against Milwaukee for the 1100th steal of his career...in **2001** the A's set an Oakland record when they are hit by a pitch five times in a 6-4 loss to Anaheim...Frank Menechino is hit by a pitch twice...in **2008** Carlos Gonzalez doubles twice against Los Angeles, giving him seven career hits, all doubles...he is the first player in major league history to produce extra base hits for each of his first seven hits since Johnny Mize in 1936.

### SATURDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (6-1, 2.45 ERA)

**LAST SIX, FIRST SIX:** Is 2-0 with a 3.18 ERA (14 er in 39.2 ip) and four home runs allowed in 39.2 innings over his last six starts...went 4-1 with a 1.76 ERA and one home run allowed in 41.0 innings over his first six starts.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Is fourth in the American League in winning percentage (.857), fifth in ERA (2.45), sixth in opponents slugging percentage (.322), eighth in opponents batting average (.224) and 10<sup>th</sup> in opponents on-base percentage (.291)...is also tied for second in shutouts (1), tied for third in wild pitches (6) and tied for fourth in complete games (1).

LAST 18 STARTS: Is 10-2 with a 2.40 ERA (31 er in 116.1 ip) and .226 (97 for 430) opponents batting average over his last 18 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...the ERA is the lowest in the American League over that span (min. 100 ip) and the wins are tied for second.



**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are batting .164 (12 for 73) with a double and a home run (.219 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is the lowest in

the American League and the batting average is third lowest...the opponents number four hitter is batting .125 (4 for 32), which is tied for second lowest in the AL...has allowed a .119 (16 for 134) batting average with two strikes...opponents are 4 for 31 (.129) with runners in scoring position and two outs...has surrendered five home runs, all solo shots...has yielded just nine home runs in 144.2 career innings (0.56 per nine innings).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 4-0 with a 2.30 ERA (12 er in 47.0 ip) in seven starts at night compared to 2-1 with a 2.67 ERA (10 er in 33.2 ip) in five starts during the day...has the second lowest night ERA in the American League...his career numbers are 6-1 with a 2.04 ERA (19 er in 83.2 ip) in 14 night games, 5-3 with a 3.25 ERA (22 er in 61.0 ip) in 10 day games.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 3-0 with a 1.25 ERA (5 er in 36.0 ip) and .160 (20 for 125) opponents batting average in five starts on the road compared to 3-1 with a 3.43 ERA (17 er in 44.2 ip) and .271 (46 for 170) opponents average in seven starts at home...leads the American League in road ERA.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-0 with a 2.08 ERA (12 er in 52.0 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more compared to 2-1 with a 3.14 ERA (10 er in 28.2 ip) in four starts on four days rest...his career numbers are 7-1 with a 1.90 ERA (17 er in 80.2 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more, 4-3 with a 3.60 ERA (24 er in 60.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest.

**THAT'S ODD:** Has a 4.22 ERA (20 er in 42.2 ip) in odd numbered innings compared to a 0.47 ERA (2 er in 38.0 ip) in even numbered innings.

THIS AND THAT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in five of his 12 starts...the A's have been shut out twice this year, both times in his starts...the A's are 8-4 (.667) in his starting assignments this year and are 14-8 (.636) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 18 of his 22 career starts and allowed two runs or fewer 12 times.

**SIX INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER:** Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit, snapping his seasonopening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.

**10<sup>th</sup> CAREER WIN:** Recorded his 10<sup>th</sup> career win in his 21<sup>st</sup> career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20).

**PITCHER OF THE MONTH:** Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the month of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in five starts...allowed just one home

run in 35.0 innings...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

**2014 HIGHLIGHTS:** He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night *March 31...*tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003) ... it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle April 6 in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle April 12...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-3 win over Houston April 18 in Oakland...allowed a career-high nine hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oakland ... walked a career-high four batters...the loss snapped a career-high six-game winning streak dating back to September 11, 2013...went 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak...tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas *April 28*...became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win at Boston **May 4**...blanked the Red Sox on one hit over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high tying 14.0 innings...was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-1 win at Cleveland May 16 ... matched his career-high with nine strikeouts.

**LAST START:** Earned the win in the A's 6-3 win in Oakland against Los Angeles (AL) June 1...tossed a season-high 113 pitches...did not surrender a run over the first four innings and then allowed sacrifice flies to Aybar and Pujols in the fifth...allowed a third run when Aybar hit a RBI double in the seventh...was relieved after 6.2 innings by Otero, who struck out the only batter he faced (Pujols)...Gregerson threw a scoreless eighth and Doolittle a scoreless ninth to preserve the win.

**GRAY vs. BALTIMORE:** Was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 10-3 loss at Baltimore last year on August 25...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the first on a Jones RBI single and a Wieters sacrifice fly...then allowed three runs in the second inning on a Roberts RBI single, a Machado sacrifice fly and a Davis RBI single...also allowed a Machado sacrifice fly in the fourth and was relieved by Blevins with one out in the fourth and the A's trailing 6-1.

LHP Scott Kazmir (6-2, 2.40 ERA): Ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (2.40) and tied for seventh in wins (6)...is second in opponents onbase percentage (.265), batting average (.215) and slugging percentage (.309)...is 2-1 with a 2.05 ERA and .202 opponents batting average over his last five starts...is 13-7 with a 2.78 ERA over his last 30 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...his ERA is second lowest in the AL over that span (min. 140 ip)...has allowed a .135 batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranks second in the AL...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-2 A's win in 10 innings at New York on Tuesday...recorded an A's season-high 10 strikeouts...allowed a RBI single to Teixeira in the first and a solo homer to Teixeira in the sixth, but that is all he would allow in 6.1 innings...is 5-5 with a 4.43 ERA (91.1 ip, 92 h, 48 r, 45 er, 43 bb, 84 so, 13 hr) in 16 career appearances, all starts, against Baltimore...is 3-2 with a 4.46 ERA (25 er in 37.0 ip) in seven starts at Camden Yards.

- Has not allowed a run over its last seven games (21.2 ip, 14 h, 4 23 so)...marks the longest scoreless innings streak for the Athletics bullpen since they ended the 2012 season allowing no runs over its final 24.1 innings... has a 1.19 ERA over its last 13 games (5 er in 37.2 ip).
- The A's bullpen is first in the American League lead in ERA (2.59) and has the second most wins (13)...ranks first in opponents batting average (.213), opponents on-base percentage (.273) and opponents slugging percentage (.283).
- Is tied for the third most blown saves (9), has the second lowest save percentage (59.1%) and is tied for the third fewest saves (13)...has allowed the fourth highest inherited runners scored percent (24 of 76, 31.6%).
- Has allowed the fewest home runs (9) and is tied for fewest walks allowed (55) among AL bullpens.

- With last night's win, broke a 15-game losing streak dating back to • April 9, 2011...that was the longest active losing streak in the majors and the longest losing streak in the majors over the last 21 years...the last longer streak was a 27-game losing streak by Anthony Young from May 6, 1992-July 24, 1993.
- Has not allowed an earned run over his last 10 outings (7.2 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 5 bb, 6 so) after posting a 12.27 ERA over a five-game stretch from May 7-17 (5 er in 3.2 ip)...did not allow a run over his first 14 appearances (13.1 ip) this season.
