OAKLAND ATHLETICS (38-24) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (31-29)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their five-game winning streak snapped Thursday, which was one short of tying their season-high (6, May 7-13)...however, have now won six of their last eight games and eight of the last 12 after a season-high four game losing streak...are 14 games over .500 at 38-24, which is one shy of their season-high (June 4, 37-22; June 7, 38-23)...have the **best record** in the American League and second best in the majors (San Francisco, 41-21)...it is the A's best record after 62 games since the 1990 club started the year 42-20 (lost game 63)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 41st consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 45 consecutive days and 58 of the last 60...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...have a 4½ game lead over Los Angeles in the West, one game shy of their season-high of 5½ games held for the four consecutive days prior to last night...have 54 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth.

THE LONG BALL: Coco Crisp hit a game-tying solo home run in the third inning last night and the A's have now homered in a season-high 15 consecutive games (26 home runs total)...have 75 home runs for the season, which ranks second in the AL and third in the majors...37 of the home runs have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors...are tied with Boston and Chicago (AL) for the Major League lead in grand slams (3)...had three players record 10 or more home runs by the end of May (Cespedes, Donaldson, Moss)...this marks the third time in Oakland history the A's had three players with at least 10 home runs by the end of May...also did it in 1997 (Berroa, Canseco, McGwire) and 2006 (Chavez, Swisher and Thomas)...the pitching staff has allowed 52 home runs, which is tied for the fourth fewest in the AL...only 16 of those have come with runners on base, which is second fewest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's **lead the majors** in runs (316), walks (263) and on-base percentage (.336), are third in home runs (75), fifth in slugging percentage (.418) and extra base hits (196), tied for sixth in triples (14), and are seventh in fewest strikeouts (442).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.56 ERA (72 er in 252.2 ip) over the last 28 games...**lead the majors** in ERA (2.95), opponents batting average (.224), on-base percentage (.286) and slugging percentage (.340)...also lead the majors with a .195 (88 for 452) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...are tied for the third most shutouts in the AL (7) and have allowed the third fewest walks (170).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 14-6 with a 2.86 ERA (54 er in 169.2 ip) over the last 28 games...are now 25-14 with a 3.12 ERA (130 er in 375.1 ip) for the season...the losses are the fewest in the majors and the ERA is second lowest (Atlanta, 2.86)...are tied for the AL lead in complete games (2) and are third in innings pitched (375.1).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 7-3 in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning games and wins and have the second best record (Cleveland, 4-1)...are 12-16 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 26-8 in games decided by three runs or more...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (8) and are tied with Milwaukee for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (4)...are 10-7 in games decided in the last at bat.

IN MAY: The A's went 16-12 in May after going 18-9 in April...have now posted a winning record in 12 consecutive months dating back to June of 2012...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972...the pitching staff finished with a 3.08 ERA, which was the sixth lowest May ERA in Oakland history and the lowest since 1990 (2.43)...had five shutouts, which were the A's most in May since 1931.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this nine-game road trip to New York-AL (2-1), Baltimore (1-1, one game) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...are 21-12 (.636) on the road, which is the **best road**

record in the majors...are hitting .243 (287 for 1180) with 34 home runs in 33 games on the road compared to .261 with 41 home runs in 29 games in Oakland...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-2) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0)...those were the A's only seven home games over a 25-game stretch from May 16 to June 11...have won 11 of the last 14 home games after losing six straight and are 17-12 (.586) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the AL behind Cleveland (21-11).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 35 for 42 (83.3%) in stolen base attempts, which is tied for the best percentage in the majors (NYY)...opponents have been successful in 40 of their 45 (88.9%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the AL (MIN)...**the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.**

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 41 errors, which is fourth most in the American League...the errors have led to just 13 unearned runs, which is tied for fewest in the AL...are 21-10 when committing at least one error compared to 17-14 when going errorless...are tied for first in the majors with 16 outfield assists.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters have 13 walks, which is six more than any other AL team and are second most in the majors...rank first in the AL in on-base percentage (.426) and RBI (11), are tied for the AL lead in hits (15), home runs (1) and extra base hits (5), and are second in plate appearances (68).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 23-4 when scoring first, which is the best record in the majors...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 62 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an A's team since they began the 1984 season with an Oakland single-season record 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader...

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Reddick)...Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL nine times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's and Orioles have split the first two meetings of 2014...the A's lost the season series last year, 2-5...it was the A's first season series loss to Baltimore since 1998...went 1-3 in Oakland and lost two of three at Camden Yards...are 85-45 (.654) against Baltimore since the start of the 1999 season, which is the **best winning percentage against the Orioles by an American League team over that span**...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 252-251 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 125-129 in Oakland and 127-122 in Baltimore...all-time, the A's are 987-931 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is on a 11-game hitting streak (15 for 39, .385), the team's longest this year...**Josh Donaldson** leads the majors in runs scored (51) and game-winning RBI (11)...**Sean Doolittle** has a 17.1 inning scoreless streak, which is an ongoing career-high (previous: 13.2, April 29-May 29, 2013), and has struck out 42 batters while walking only one this season...**Brandon Moss** has 92 RBI since the 2013 All-Star Break, which is tied for second most in the majors during that span...**Craig Gentry** has been successful in each of his 11 stolen base attempts this year, and has a current streak of 23 consecutive steals dating back to Aug. 14 of last year.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1933**, Jimmie Foxx homers in his first three at bats in the A's 14-10 win over the New York Yankees...he had homered in his last at bat the day before to give him four consecutive home runs...in **1965**, Rick Monday is chosen by the Kansas City A's as the first player ever taken in baseball's free agent draft... in **1975**, Ken Holtzman one-hits the Detroit Tigers in the Athletics' 4-0 win...Claudell Washington homers twice and drives in all four Oakland runs in the game..

SUNDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (6-2, 2.40 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in ERA (2.40) and tied for eighth in wins (6)...is second in opponents on-base percentage (.265), batting average (.215) and slugging percentage (.309)...ranks third in fewest pitches per inning (14.8)...is also tied for third in wild pitches (6), tied for fourth in complete games (1), fifth in highest run support (6.12, seventh in fewest walks per nine innings (1.80), ninth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.20), 10th in grounded into double plays per nine innings (0.96) and tied for 11th in hit batters (4).

LAST FIVE STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in three of his last five starts and is 2-1 with a 2.05 ERA (7 er in 30.2 ip) and .202 (22 for 109) opponents batting average over that span...has walked one batter or fewer in three of those five starts and has issued just six walks in 30.2 innings.

LAST 30 STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in six of his 12 starts this year and 14 of his last 30 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 13-7 with a 2.78 ERA (55 er in 178.0 ip) and .229 (153 for 669) opponents batting average over that stretch...has walked 39 (1.97 per nine innings) and struck out 170 in 178.0 innings (8.60 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.36...has yielded just 12 home runs (0.61 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .135 (7 for 52) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is tied for second in the American League...opponents are 1 for 21 (.048) with RISP and two outs...has not walked a batter to lead off an inning...opponents are batting .213 (16 for 75) with a .234 on-base percentage (two hit by pitches) and .240 slugging percentage (two doubles) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is third lowest in the AL and the on-base percentage ranks sixth...has yielded a .198 (44 for 222) average against right-handers compared to .283 (15 for 53) against left-handers...the mark against righties ranks sixth lowest in the AL...has surrendered all five of his home runs this year and 21 of his 24 over the last two years to righties...four of the home runs this year have been solo shots as have 17 of his 24 over the last two years.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.69 ERA (7 er in 37.1 ip) in five starts at home compared to 3-1 with a 3.11 ERA (13 er in 37.2 ip) in seven starts on the road...has the second lowest home ERA in the American League...has walked two batters in 37.1 innings at home and 13 in 37.2 innings on the road...has allowed three of his five home runs at home.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-0 with a 1.31 ERA (5 er in 34.1 ip) in five starts during the day compared to 3-2 with a 3.32 ERA (15 er in 40.2 ip) in seven starts at night...ranks ninth in the American League in day ERA...is now 8-2 with a 2.52 ERA (25 er in 89.1 ip) in 15 starts during the day over the last two years and 8-9 with a 4.13 ERA (66 er in 143.2 ip) in 26 starts at night.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 4-0 with a 2.77 ERA (8 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts on four days rest compared to 2-2 with a 2.20 ERA (12 er in 49.0 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more.

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his second career complete game May 28, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit in Oakland...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 2-2 with a 2.67 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in five starts in May after going 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Gray, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...of those six, only Cahill was undefeated (Cahill started the season 6-0)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...his last four-win month was June of 2010 with Los Angeles (AL)...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 10-2 (.833) in his starting assignments...has walked one batter or fewer in seven of his 12 starts...has not allowed a run three times.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game **April 2**...tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut...won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Minnesota **April 7**...retired 11 of the final 13 batters he faced...combined with Abad, Otero, Gregerson and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle **April 13**...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed two of the hits but had a no decision as the A's scored twice in the eighth and once in the ninth...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Houston **April 19** in Oakland...left trailing 3-1 but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the ninth for the win...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 win at Texas **April 29** to start a season 4-0 for the first time in his career...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-2 loss to Seattle **May 5**...that snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2013 (also May 10-June 6, 2008)...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings...struck out 56 and walked just 10...had a no decision in the A's 6-2 win at Cleveland **May 17**...tossed just 1.1 innings, which was the shortest outing of his career...was ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second...tossed his second career complete game **May 28**, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit in Oakland.

LAST START: He had a no decision in his last start, a 5-2 A's win in 10 innings at New York on Tuesday...recorded an A's season-high 10 strikeouts...allowed a RBI single to Teixeira in the first and a solo homer to Teixeira in the sixth, but that is all he would allow in 6.1 innings...was relieved in the seventh by Abad with the A's trailing 2-1...the A's tied the game on a pinch-hit RBI double by Vogt in the eighth and then scored three times in the 10th for the win.

KAZMIR vs. BALTIMORE: Is 5-5 with a 4.43 ERA (91.1 ip, 92 h, 48 r, 45 er, 43 bb, 84 so, 13 hr) in 16 career appearances, all starts...is 3-2 with a 4.14 ERA (25 er in 54.1 ip) in nine starts in his home ballparks and 2-3 with a 4.86 ERA (20 er in 37.0 ip) in seven starts at Camden Yards...faced the Orioles once last year, a no decision in the Indians 4-3 win at Baltimore on June 26...no-hit the Orioles over the first six innings...Machado double to lead off the seventh, went to third on a Kazmir error on a pickoff attempt and scored on a Davis sacrifice fly...left with a 2-1 lead but Smith allowed two runs in the eighth inning for the blown save.

MONDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Chavez (5-3, 3.04 ERA): Is 3-3 with a 4.25 ERA (17 er in 36.0 ip) and .285 (41 for 144) opponents batting average over his past six starts after going 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in his first six starts...overall, ranks eighth in the American League in ERA (3.04)...has allowed a .184 batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .281 against left-handers...has issued just four of his 20 walks to righties for a .208 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage against right-handers is second lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...the batting average is fourth lowest in the AL...the A's are 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignments...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 7-4 A's win against the Yankees Wednesday in New York (6.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...is 1-2 with a 4.70 ERA in nine career appearances, one start, against Los Angeles-AL (15.1 ip, 15 h, 12 r, 8 er, 4 bb, 17 so, 2 hr)...the start came this year, a no decision on April 14 in Anaheim (7.0 ip, 4 h, 2 h, 1 er, 9 so, 1 hr).

- With Friday's win, broke a 15-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011...that was the longest active losing streak in the majors and the longest losing streak in the majors over the last 21 years...the last longer streak was a 27-game losing streak by Anthony Young from May 6, 1992-July 24, 1993.
- Has not allowed an earned run over his last 10 outings (7.2 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 5 bb, 6 so) after posting a 12.27 ERA over a five-game stretch from May 7-17 (5 er in 3.2 ip)...did not allow a run over his first 14 appearances (13.1 ip) this season.
