ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost back-to-back games for the first time since dropping four straight from May 22-25...have also lost four of the last six games and are 9-10 over the last 19 contests...however, are 39-26 for the season, which is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco, 42-23)...it is the A's best record after 65 games since the 1992 club started also started the year 39-26...a win tonight would give the A's their best record after 66 games since the 1990 club was 43-23...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 44th consecutive day (since April 28) and have held at least a share of first for 48 consecutive days (since April 24) and 61 of the last 63...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...have 57 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have a 2½ game lead over Los Angeles in the West...have held the best record in the AL every day since May 31.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost last night 2-1 in 14 innings, which was their longest game of the season by innings and time (4:39)...fell to 9-9 in one-run games and are now 12-17 in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 27-9 in games decided by three runs or more...are 7-4 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning wins and are tied with the Dodgers for the most extra inning games...have the third best extra inning record in the American League...are 11-8 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Miami for the most last at bat wins in the majors and are tied with Boston for the most last at bat games in the AL...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (8) and are tied with Milwaukee for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (4).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-4 on this nine-game road trip to New York-AL (2-1), Baltimore (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (0-2)...have not finished a road trip with a losing record since going 2-5 at Texas and Seattle June 17-23, 2013...have a streak of nine consecutive road trips with a .500 record or better, which is the A's longest such streak since an 11-trip streak from June 26, 1989-July 11, 1990...are 22-14 (.611) on the road for the season, which is the second best mark in the American League (Toronto, 19-11)...are hitting .239 (309 for 1293) with 35 home runs in 36 games on the road compared to .261 with 41 home runs in 29 games in Oakland...return home following the game tonight and begin a 10-game homestand Friday against New York-AL (three games), Texas (three games) and Boston (four games)...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-2) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and are 17-12 (.586) at home for the season, which is the third best home record in the AL...have won 11 of the last 14 home games after losing six straight.

PITCHING: The A's lead the majors in ERA (2.85), opponents batting average (.225), on-base percentage (.288) and slugging percentage (.339)...also lead the majors with a .194 (94 for 484) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...are tied for the third most shutouts in the AL (7) and have issued the fourth fewest walks (183).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-7 with a 3.43 ERA (43 er in 112.2 ip) over the last 18 games...however, are 26-15 with a 3.01 ERA (132 er in 395.1 ip) for the season...have the lowest ERA and fewest losses in the majors...are tied for the American League lead in complete games (2) and rank second in innings pitched (395.1).

MARGIN OF VICTORY: The A's have outscored the opposition by 124 runs, which is more than double next closest team (San Francisco, 57) and more than triple the next closest AL team (Toronto, 40)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973...the last Major League team to outscore its opponents by more than 127 runs before the break is the 2001 Seattle Mariners (149).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored one run in each of the first two games of this series, marking the first time this year the A's have been held to one run or fewer in consecutive games...lead the majors in runs scored (329) and walks (277), rank second in on-base percentage (.334), third in home runs (76), sixth in slugging (.410) and extra base hits (201) and tied for eighth in triples (14).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: A's outfielders have three assists in the last two games, 12 in the last 18 contests and 19 for the season, which is the most in the majors...five of those assists have come against the

Angels...the A's made two errors last night after committing a season-high tying three Monday night...now have 46 errors for the season, which is fourth most in the AL...however, have just 16 unearned runs, which is second fewest in the AL (Baltimore, 13)...are 21-12 when committing at least one error compared to 18-14 when going errorless.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have gone homerless in back-to-back games after a season-best streak of 16 consecutive games with a home run (27 home runs total)...have not gone more than two straight games without a home run since May 2-4 when they went a season-high tying three straight...have 76 home runs for the season, which ranks second in the American League and third in the majors...lead the majors with four grand slams and rank second with 38 home runs with runners on base (Toronto, 39)...the pitching staff has allowed 53 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for fifth fewest in the majors...only 16 of those have come with runners on base, which is the fewest in the majors.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 6 for their last 9 (.667) with a walk and four RBI...lead the American League in hits (16), RBI (11) and walks (13) and are tied for the lead in doubles (4), home runs (1) and extra base hits (5)...rank second in on-base percentage (.423) and plate appearances (71) and third in batting (.286) and slugging (.411).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 37 for 45 (82.2%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Washington, 82.9%)...opponents have been successful in 41 of their 47 (87.2%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Cubs, 89.5%)...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

THIS AND THAT: The A's lead the majors in series swept (6) and have the best record in the AL when scoring first (24-5) and on Sunday (8-2)...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 65 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the second longest single-season streak in Oakland history...the record is a 73-game streak to start the 1984 season...went 16-12 in May after going 18-9 in April...have now posted a winning record in 12 consecutive months dating back to June of 2012...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 5-3...are 3-0 in Oakland and 2-3 in Anaheim...have scored just one run in each of the first two games of this series and have been held to one run or fewer in 15 of their last 20 losses to the Angels (including seven shutouts)...three of the A's five games at Anaheim have gone extra innings and the average time of game in those five games is 3:48 (1141 minutes)...have won each of the previous three season series and are 37-28 (.569) against the Angels over the last four years...including 30-3 when scoring four or more runs...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 402-324 against the Angels...that includes 208-153 in Oakland and 194-171 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 451-401 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has stranded all 14 of his inherited runners and is the only qualifying American League reliever that has not allowed an inherited runner to score...**Yoenis Céspedes** leads Major League outfielders with eight assists...has 27 career assists, which is tied for third most in the majors since 2012...**Sean Doolittle** extended his scoreless streak to 19.1 innings yesterday, which is a career-high and the longest active streak in the AL.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1978, at the age of 18 years, 246 days, Mike Morgan becomes the youngest pitcher to start a game for the Oakland A's...he goes the distance, allowing 10 hits against Baltimore but takes the loss as Scott McGregor shuts out the A's 3-0...Morgan's honor is short lived as Tim Conroy, at the age of 18 years, 81 days, gets a start 12 days later...in 1995 Mark McGwire hits three home runs in the A's 8-1 win at Boston after hitting two home runs the day before...his five home runs in consecutive games tied a major league record which he already shared...in 1999 Miguel Tejada hits three home runs in a game against Los Angeles to tie the Athletics record...he is the only Athletics shortstop to hit three home runs in a game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Tommy Milone (3-3, 3.68 ERA)

LAST SIX/FIRST FIVE: Is 3-0 with a 2.11 ERA (9 er in 38.1 ip) and .226 (33 for 146) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 0-3 with a 5.86 ERA and .274 opponents average over his first five starts...has 26 strikeouts and seven walks over his last six starts after tallying 16 strikeouts and 12 walks over his first five starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .218 (12 for 55) batting average with runners in scoring position...last year, opponents hit .216 with RISP, which ranked eighth in the American League...has held the opponents number three, four and five hitters to a .135 (12 for 89) batting average...has yielded three home runs to the number nine hitter in the order, which is the most in the majors...has issued 16 of his 19 walks and allowed six of his eight home runs this year to right-handed hitters...has yielded 27 of his 33 home runs over the last two years to righties

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed eight runs in the first inning for a 6.52 ERA (11.0 ip)...has a 2.30 ERA (11 er in 43.0 ip) in innings two through five and a 6.00 ERA (8 er in 12.0 ip) from the sixth inning on...has issued seven of his 19 walks in the first inning.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in six of his 11 starts and is 0-3 in those games...is 3-0 in five starts with support of three or more runs...is 6-19 in 36 career starts with support of two runs or fewer, 23-3 in 37 starts with support of three runs or more...has received no run support in his three losses this year...last year, he received just 10 runs of support in his nine losses (1.78 RSA)...has received just 22 runs of support in his 22 losses in three seasons with the A's (124.2 ip, 1.59 RSA).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-1 with a 2.87 ERA (10 er in 31.1 ip) in five starts on four days rest compared to 2-2 with a 4.41 ERA (17 er in 34.2 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA (7 er in 32.2 ip) and .210 (25 for 119) opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland compared to 1-3 with a 5.40 ERA (20 er in 33.1 ip) and .279 (39 for 140) opponents batting average in seven starts on the road...his home ERA is fifth lowest in the American League...has allowed six of his eight home runs on the road...last year, he went 5-4 with a 3.44 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 7-5 with a 4.69 ERA in 16 games on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 14-8 with a 2.84 ERA (63 er in 199.1 ip) in 32 games in Oakland compared to 14-14 with a 4.86 ERA (115 er in 213.0 ip) in 38 games on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.38 ERA (16 er in 42.2 ip) in seven starts at night compared to 1-2 with a 4.24 ERA (11 er in 23.1 ip) in four starts during the day...has yielded four home runs in 42.2 innings at night, four home runs in 23.1 innings during the day.

THIS AND THAT: Has left with the lead in three of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (Gregerson each time)...is averaging 92.9 pitches per start, which is fifth fewest in the American League...the A's are 5-6 (.455) in his starting assignments this year and are 41-27 (.603) in his career...his teams are 46-27 (.630) in his 73 career starts.

2014 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss at Seattle **April 11**...left after five innings trailing 5-0 and Hernandez shutout the A's three hits over the first seven innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) **April 16**...left with a 4-1 lead but Gregerson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Texas **April 22** in Oakland...walked a career-high tying four batters...left after six innings with a 4-3 lead but Gregerson allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss at Houston **April 27**...McHugh shutout the A's on one hit over the first eight innings before Callaspo had a RBI single in the ninth...fell to 0-3 in the A's 6-3 loss at Boston **May 3**...matched his career-highs by walking four batters (sixth time) and allowing three home runs (fourth time)...allowed a grand slam to Gomes in the first inning and solo home runs to Ortiz in the third and Ross in the fourth...left after walking Napoli to start the fifth with the A's trailing 6-0...combined with Fernando Rodriguez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Washington **May 9** in Oakland...tossed eight innings and allowed two of the hits, both to Hairston...also walked three batters but allowed just two base runners as far as second base...had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss to Chicago (AL) **May 14** in Oakland...allowed a home run to Beckham on the first pitch of the game but blanked the White Sox on four hits and a hit batter after that...left after six innings with the A's lead 2-1 but Gregerson allowed a three-run home run in the eighth

inning for the blown save...he extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 3-2 win at Tampa Bay **May 21**...the A's scored twice in the second and once in the fourth and he blanked the Rays on three hits over the first five innings...allowed a RBI single to Loney and was relieved by Rodriguez with runners on first and second and two outs...Rodriguez allowed one of the inherited runners to score...combined with Otero and Doolittle on a five-hit shutout in the A's 10-0 win over Detroit **May 26** in Oakland...tossed 6.2 innings and allowed four of the hits...allowed just two runners as far as second base: a Romine double in the third and a leadoff double by Cabrera in the fourth...had a no decision in the A's 11-3 win over Los Angeles **May 31** in Oakland...allowed two hits in the first inning and four in the second but did not allow a run...surrendered his only runs on a three-run home run by Cowgill in the fourth...retired each of the final seven batters he faced and left after six innings trailing 3-1...the A's scored six times in the seventh and four times in the eighth for the win.

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 4-3, 11-inning win at Baltimore last Friday...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Schoop in the second...also yielded a leadoff home run to Davis in the fourth and a solo home run to Machado in the fifth...left after six innings with the A's trailing 3-2 but Oakland tied the game in the eighth.

MILONE vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 5-2 with a 4.21 ERA (51.1 ip, 60 h, 28 r, 24 er, 13 bb, 40 so, 8 hr) in nine career starts...the five wins are his most against any team...is 2-2 with a 4.20 ERA (14 er in 30.0 ip) in five starts in Oakland and 3-0 with a 4.22 ERA (10 er in 21.1 ip) in four starts in Anaheim...is 0-0 with a 3.75 ERA (12.0 ip, 15 h, 6 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 4 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year...the first no decision came in a 5-4 A's loss in 11 innings on April 16 at Anaheim...allowed a run in the third inning on a Trout RBI double, but the A's scored four times in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead...put the first two batters on base in the seventh inning and was relieved by Otero, who allowed both runners to score...Gregerson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save...then had a no decision in the A's 11-3 win May 31 in Oakland...allowed two hits in the first inning and four in the second but did not allow a run...surrendered his only runs on a three-run home run by Cowgill in the fourth...retired each of the final seven batters he faced and left after six innings trailing 3-1...the A's scored six times in the seventh and four times in the eighth for the win.

RHP Sonny Gray (6-2, 2.83 ERA): Is 1-1 with a 6.00 ERA and .279 opponents batting average over his last three starts...went 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .206 opponents average over his first 10 starts...ranks sixth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.327), seventh in ERA (2.83) and opponents batting average (.222), tied for eighth in winning percentage (.750) and 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.293)...has a 2.76 ERA in his career, which is fifth lowest in the AL since July 10, 2013, the day he made his Major League debut (min. 130 ip)...opponents are batting .152 with a double and a home run (.203 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is the lowest in the majors and the batting average is second lowest in the AL...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's loss at Baltimore last Saturday (5.1 ip, 4 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 7 so)...has never faced the Yankees in his career.

- With Friday's win, broke a 15-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011...that was the longest losing streak in the majors over the last 21 years...the last longer streak was a 27-game losing streak by Anthony Young from May 6, 1992-July 24, 1993.
- Has not allowed an earned run over his last 12 outings (8.2 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 5 bb, 7 so) after posting a 12.27 ERA over a five-game stretch from May 7-17 (5 er in 3.2 ip)...did not allow a run over his first 14 appearances (13.1 ip) this season.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .152 (12 for 79) with a double and a home run (.203 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is the **lowest** in the majors and the batting average is **second** lowest in the American League...has allowed a .170 (24 for 141) career batting average and .206 slugging percentage (two doubles, one home run) against batters leading off an inning...the opponents number four hitter is batting .114 (4 for 35), which is **second** lowest in the AL...has allowed a .123 (18 for 146) batting average with two strikes...has surrendered six home runs all solo shots...has yielded just 10 home runs in 150.0 career innings (0.60 per nine innings).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 2.18 ERA (10 er in 41.1 ip) and .166 (24 for 145) opponents batting average in six starts on the road compared to 3-1 with a 3.43 ERA (17 er in 44.2 ip) and .271 (46 for 170) opponents average in seven starts at home...ranks **ninth** in the American League in road ERA.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-1 with a 2.67 ERA (17 er in 57.1 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more compared to 2-1 with a 3.14 ERA (10 er in 28.2 ip) in four starts on four days rest...his career numbers are 7-2 with a 2.30 ERA (22 er in 86.0 ip) in 14 starts on five days rest or more, 4-3 with a 3.60 ERA (24 er in 60.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest.

THAT'S ODD: Has a 4.73 ERA (24 er in 45.2 ip) in odd numbered innings compared to a 0.67 ERA (3 er in 40.1 ip) in even numbered innings.

THIS AND THAT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in six of his 13 starts...the A's have been shut out twice this year, both times in his starts...the A's are 8-5 (.615) in his starting assignments this year and are 14-9 (.609) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 18 of his 23 career starts and allowed two runs or fewer 12 times.

SIX INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit, snapping his season-opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.

10th CAREER WIN: Recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20).

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the month of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in five starts...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night **March 31**...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to

- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.
- Was placed on the DL a second time May 9, retroactive to May 8, with a strained right forearm.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was also at Los Angeles on April 9, 2013.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.

- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.
