ABOUT THE A'S: Are 3-4 over the last seven games and 10-10 over the last 20 contests...however, are 40-26 for the season, which is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco, 43-24)...it is the A's best record after 66 games since the 1990 club started the year 43-23 (lost game 67)...are in sole Detroit 215 171 .557 possession of first place in the American League West for the 46th consecutive day (since April 28)

and have held at least a share of first for 50 consecutive days (since April 24) and 63 of the last 65...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...have 59 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have a 3½ game lead over Los Angeles in the West...have held the best record in the AL every day since May 31.

MARGIN OF VICTORY: The A's have outscored the opposition by 130 runs, which is more than double next closest team (San Francisco, 59) and nearly quadruple the next closest American League team (Toronto, 33)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973...the last Major League team to outscore its opponents by more than 127 runs before the break is the 2001 Seattle Mariners (149).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed five earned runs in the last four games (39.2 ip, 1.13 ERA)...for the season, **lead the majors** in ERA (2.83), opponents batting average (.226), on-base percentage (.289) and slugging percentage (.340)...also lead the majors with a .193 (95 for 493) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...have issued the third fewest walks in the AL (185) and are for 493) tied for the third most shutouts (7).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-7 with a 3.32 ERA (44 er in 119.1 ip) over the last 19 games...however, are 27-15 with a 2.98 ERA (133 er in 402.0 ip) for the season...have the lowest ERA and fewest losses in the majors...lead the American League in innings pitched (402.0) and are tied for second in complete games (2).

OFFENSE: The A's **lead the majors** in walks (280), rank second in runs (336) and on-base percentage (.333), third in home runs (77), sixth in slugging (.410), seventh in extra base hits (204) and fewest strikeouts (478) and tied for eighth in triples (14)

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: A's outfielders have an assist in three consecutive games (four assists total)...have 13 assists in the last 19 games and 20 for the season, which is the **most in the majors**...the A's have committed five errors in the last three games, including a season-high tying three Monday night...now have 46 errors for the season, which is fourth most in the American League...however, have just 16 unearned runs, which is second fewest in the AL (Baltimore, 13)...are 21-12 when committing at least one error compared to 19-14 when going errorless

THE LONG BALL: The A's homered just once in the three-game series at Los Angeles (AL) after a season-best streak of 16 consecutive games with a home run (27 home runs total)...have 77 home runs for the season, which ranks second in the American League and third in the majors...lead the majors with four grand slams and are tied with Toronto for the lead with 39 home runs with runners on base...the pitching staff has allowed 53 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for fifth fewest in the majors...only 16 of those have come with runners on base, which is the fewest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a 10-game homestand tonight against New York-AL (three games), Texas (three games) and Boston (four games)...went 5-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-2) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and are 17-12 (.586) at home for the season, which is the third best home record in the American League...the 29 home games are tied with the Yankees and Cubs for the fewest in the majors...have won 11 of the last 14 home games after losing six straight...this homestand is the second of three 10game homestands this year...the last time the A's had at least three 10-game homestands in one season was in 2002 when they had four...are batting .262 (256 for 976) with 41 home runs in 29 games in Oakland compared to .240 with 36 home runs in 37 games on the road...went 5-4 on the last road trip to New York-AL (2-1), Baltimore

(2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2)...it marked their 10th consecutive road trip with a .500 or better record, which is the A's longest such streak since an 11-trip streak from June 26, 1989-July 11, 1990...have not finished a road trip with a losing record since going 2-5 at Texas and Seattle June 17-23, 2013...are 23-14 (.622) on the road for the season, which is the second best mark in the majors (San Francisco, 20-12).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 12-17 in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 28-9 in games decided by three runs or more...are 7-4 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning wins and are tied with the Dodgers and Mets for the most extra inning games...have the third best extra inning record in the American League...are 11-8 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Miami and Milwaukee for the most last at bat wins in the majors and are tied with Boston for the most last at bat games in the AL...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (8) and are tied with Milwaukee for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (4).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 6 for their last 10 (.600) with a walk and four RBI...lead the American League in hits (16) and walks (13) and are tied for the lead in doubles (4), home runs (1), RBI (11) and extra base hits (5)...rank second in on-base percentage (.417) and plate appearances (72) and third in batting (.281) and slugging (.404).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 37 for 45 (82.2%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 41 of their 47 (87.2%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Cubs, 90.2%)...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

THIS AND THAT: The A's lead the majors in series swept (6) and are tied with San Francisco for the lead in best record when scoring first (25-5)...have the best record in the American League on Sunday (8-2)...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 66 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the second longest single-season streak in Oakland history...the record is a 73-game streak to start the 1984 season...went 16-12 in May after going 18-9 in April...have now posted a winning record in 12 consecutive months dating back to June of 2012...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's lead the season series 2-1 after taking two of three at Yankee Stadium to start the last road trip...won the season series last year 5-1...it was their first season series win since 2007 (4-2) and it was the A's second best record against the Yankees in franchise history (12-0 in 1990)...have won 12 of their last 16 games against the Yankees, including seven straight in the Coliseum...that is the second longest home winning streak against the Yankees in Oakland history (10, Sept. 9, 1989-May 1, 1991)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 233-268 against the Yankees...that includes 127-121 in Oakland and 106-147 in New York...all-time, the A's are 774-1134 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's are 18-23 on **Friday the 13th since moving to Oakland in 1968** but have a three-game winning streak...are 8-15 in Oakland and 10-8 on the road...are 3-2 against the Yankees on Friday the 13th...Major League Baseball has made a scoring change in the A's vs. Angels game of June 1...in the eighth inning, credit Craig Gentry with a hit instead of an error on Kendrick...the change is reflected in the game notes but not the stat packets...Yoenis Céspedes leads Major League outfielders with nine assists...has 28 career assists, which is tied for second most in the majors since 2012...Sean Doolittle has a 19.1 innings scoreless streak, which is a career-high and the longest active streak in the AL.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1931** George Earnshaw goes 4 for 5 with a home run and three RBI and tosses a complete game five-hitter in the A's 14-1 win over St. Louis in the second game of a doubleheader...in **1968** Jim Nash, Paul Lindblad and Ed Sprague combine to shutout the Cleveland Indians 1-0 in 11 innings...it is the A's third straight shutout...in **1992** Carney Lansford homers off Texas pitcher Bobby Witt for the 2000th hit of his major league career.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (6-2, 2.83 ERA)

LAST THREE STARTS: Is 1-1 with a 6.00 ERA (12 er in 18.0 ip) and .279 opponents batting average over his last three starts...went 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .206 opponents average over his first 10 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks seventh in the American League in ERA (2.83) and opponents slugging percentage (.327), tied for seventh in opponents batting average (.222) and ninth in opponents on-base percentage (.293)...is also tied for second in shutouts (1) and tied for fifth in complete games (1) and wild pitches (6).

(24 for 141) career batting average and .206 slugging percentage (two doubles, one home run) against batters leading off an inning...the opponents number four hitter is batting .114 (4 for 35), which is second lowest in the American League...has allowed a .123 (18 for 146) batting average with two strikes...has surrendered six home runs all solo shots...has yielded just 10 home runs in 150.0 career innings (0.60 per nine innings).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 2.18 ERA (10 er in 41.1 ip) and .166 (24 for 145) opponents batting average in six starts on the road compared to 3-1 with a 3.43 ERA (17 er in 44.2 ip) and .271 (46 for 170) opponents average in seven starts at home...ranks 10th in the American League in road ERA.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-1 with a 2.67 ERA (17 er in 57.1 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more compared to 2-1 with a 3.14 ERA (10 er in 28.2 ip) in four starts on four days rest...his career numbers are 7-2 with a 2.30 ERA (22 er in 86.0 ip) in 14 starts on five days rest or more, 4-3 with a 3.60 ERA (24 er in 60.0 ip) in nine starts on four days rest.

THAT'S ODD: Has a 4.73 ERA (24 er in 45.2 ip) in odd numbered innings compared to a 0.67 ERA (3 er in 40.1 ip) in even numbered innings.

THIS AND THAT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in six of his 13 starts...the A's have been shut out twice this year, both times in his starts...the A's are 8-5 (.615) in his starting assignments this year and are 14-9 (.609) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 18 of his 23 career starts and allowed two runs or fewer 12 times.

SIX INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit, snapping his seasonopening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.

10th CAREER WIN: Recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20).

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the month of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in five starts...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night *March 31*...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow

a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003) ... it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle April 6 in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle April 12...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-3 win over Houston April 18 in Oakland...allowed a career-high nine hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas April 23 in Oakland ... walked a career-high four batters...the loss snapped a career-high six-game winning streak dating back to September 11, 2013...went 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak...tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas *April 28*...became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win at Boston *May* 4...blanked the Red Sox on one hit over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high tying 14.0 innings...was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-1 win at Cleveland May 16 ... matched his career-high with nine strikeouts.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss at Baltimore last Saturday...tossed a season-low 5.1 innings and matched his career-high by walking four batters...allowed a solo home run to Jones in the first inning but the A's tied the game with a run in the third...he then allowed three runs in the fifth inning on a Joseph RBI double and RBI singles by Markakis and Jones...was also charged with a run in the sixth inning.

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season at Triple-A Sacramento where he was 10-7 with a 3.42 ERA in 20 starts...also had two stints with the A's...after making two relief appearances in his Major League debut in July, he returned to Oakland Aug. 10 and finished the season in the starting rotation...was 5-3 with a 2.67 ERA in 12 games, 10 starts, with the A's...also went 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA in two ALDS starts against Detroit...based upon a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he had the lowest opponents on-base percentage among American League rookies (.272), ranked second in opponents batting average (.214) and slugging percentage (.298) and third in ERA...struck out 67 batters in 64.0 innings and his average of 9.42 strikeouts per nine innings was second best (Allen, CLE 11.26).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER LHP Scott Kazmir (7-2, 2.20 ERA): Has allowed one run or fewer in four of his last six starts and is 3-1 with a 1.67 ERA and .195 opponents batting average over that span...is tied for the American League lead in opponents batting average (.211), ranks second in opponents on-base percentage (.263) and slugging percentage (.301), third in ERA (2.20) and tied for seventh in wins (7) and winning percentage (.778)...is 3-1 with a 1.69 ERA in five starts at home compared to 4-1 with a 2.62 ERA in seven starts on the road...has the second lowest home ERA in the American League...has allowed a .125 (7 for 56) batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranks is the lowest in the majors among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 11-1 A's win at Baltimore last Sunday (7.0 ip, 4 h, 2 bb, 7 so)...is 7-7 with a 3.46 ERA in 10 career appearances, including 18 starts, against New York...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 5-2 A's win in 10 innings on June 3 (6.1 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 10 so).

- Has allowed just three earned runs over its last 12 games (37.1 ip, 31 h, 4 r, 12 bb, 34 so, 0.72 ERA)...is averaging 8.2 strikeouts per nine innings during stretch and opponents are hitting just .226...team is 8-4.
- The A's bullpen is first in the American League lead in ERA (2.53) and has the second most wins (13) ... ranks first in opponents batting average (.218), opponents on-base percentage (.280) and opponents slugging percentage (.296).
- Is tied for the third most blown saves (9), is tied for the second lowest save percentage (59.1%) and the second fewest saves (13)...however, has just one blown save since May 16 (6 for 7 in save chances).
- Has allowed the second fewest home runs (11) and issued the second fewest walks (63) among AL bullpens.
- Did not allow a run in the three-game series at Yankee Stadium on June 3-5 (7.2 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 5 so)...went 2 for 2 in save chances.

- Has not allowed an earned run over his last 12 outings (8.2 ip, 6 h, ٠ 1 r, 5 bb, 7 so) after posting a 12.27 ERA over a five-game stretch from May 7-17 (5 er in 3.2 ip)...did not allow a run over his first 14 appearances (13.1 ip) this season.
- Is second among AL relievers in opponents slugging percentage (.151) and fourth in opponents batting average (.151)...all 13 of his hits allowed this season have been singles.
- Is eighth among AL relievers in WHIP (0.90).
- Has stranded all 14 inherited runners this season...is the only qualifying AL reliever to have not allowed an inherited runner to score.
- With last Friday's win, broke a 15-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011...that was the longest active losing streak in the majors and the longest losing streak in the majors over the last 21 years...the last longer streak was a 27-game losing streak by Anthony Young from May 6, 1992-July 24, 1993.
- Has not allowed a run in two career games against the Yankees, both this season (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 1 so).

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.

- Posted a 0.96 ERA (1 er in 9.1 ip) over his first nine games this season.
- Righties are 3 for 31 (.097) against him this season with 13 strikeouts...lefties are 7 for 21 (.333) with three strikeouts.
- Has yet to face the Yankees this season... is 1-0 with one save in eight career games against New York (8.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 0 bb, 8 so, 4.15 ERA).

Last Year: Was 6-4 with two saves and a 2.54 ERA in a team-leading 71 relief appearances...allowed just two home runs in 67.1 innings, an average of 0.27 per nine innings, which was fourth lowest among AL relievers

- Was batting .158 with five RBI in 30 games when he was designated for assignment May 15...was outrighted to Sacramento May 17.

KYLE BLANKS

- Was acquired from San Diego on May 15 for minor league outfielder Jake Goebbert and a player to be named later (minor league pitcher Ronald Herrera on May 28).
- Hit his first home run of the season May 26 to snap a career-high 49-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on June 16, 2013.

ALBERTO CALLASPO

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.
- Struck out a career-high tying three times May 3 at Boston (third time, first since Sept. 23, 2012 vs. Chicago-AL).

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.
- · Had a career-high five RBI May 18 at Cleveland and matched his best with two doubles.
- Matched his career-high with five RBI and nine total bases May 31 against Los Angeles (AL) and had the first three-extra base hit game of his career...had two assists in the second inning to become the first A's outfielder with two assists in an inning since Matt Stairs on April 16, 1996 at Texas... is the first to throw out two runners at home in one inning since Dave Henderson on July 7, 1990 at Cleveland.

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.
- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.
- Was placed on the DL a second time May 9, retroactive to May 8, with a strained right forearm.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...it was his sixth regular season "walk-off" RBI.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.
- His second at bat May 18 at Cleveland was the 5000th of his career.

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a career-high 0 for 20 streak from April 2 to 6.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL).

- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 consecutive games from April 6 through the first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, 16 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .387 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his career May 13-16 (also: Aug. 29-31, 2012)
- Scored a career-high four runs May 18 at Cleveland.
- Hit his second career walk-off home run May 28 against Detroit...his other was also against the Tigers (April 12, 2013)...it was his fourth career game-ending RBI.
- Went 0 for 5 June 3 at New York, snapping his 47-game streak of reaching base safely as a third baseman...that was the longest such streak by an Athletics third baseman since at least 1914...it also snapped his streak of 30 consecutive games reaching base safely on the road dating back to Sept. 28 of last year...that was the longest such streak by an Athletic since Mark McGwire had a 55-game streak from Sept. 3, 1995-July 26, 1996.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

• Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

LUKE GREGERSON

- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was also at Los Angeles on April 9, 2013.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.

JIM JOHNSON

· Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

ARNOLD LEON

 Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLOM

• Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- •Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego).
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's

catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).

• Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

• Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
