AT A GLANCE: Tonight the Yankees play the first game of a three-game series at Oakland...are 4-2 thus far on their current nine-game road trip...began the trip by going 1-2 at Kansas City (with a rainout on 6/9) and swept three games at Seattle...went 2-5 on their most recent homestand from 5/30-6/5 (1-2 vs. Minnesota, 0-1 vs. Seattle, 1-2 vs. Oakland)...following this road trip, will have an off day on Monday before beginning a sixgame homestand vs. Toronto (6/17-19) and Baltimore (6/20-22).

- Are 15-12 over their last 27G since 5/14 with a 3.33 ERA (246.0IP, 91ER, 230H, 58BB, 233K).
- ▶ Are 17-10 in their last 27 road games (since 4/20).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: On Thursday, the Yankees defeated Seattle, 6-3, completing a three-game sweep at Safeco Field...**Yankees batters** outhit the Mariners, 10-7...**RHP Chase Whitley** started and recorded the win, improving to 2-0 (7.2IP, 5H, 2ER, 0BB, 6K, 1HR, 1HP)...marked his longest career outing...**CF Jacoby Ellsbury** (1-for-3, 1BB) drove in the Yankees' first runs with a two-run homer in the first...also extended his hitting streak to 16G...RF/LF Alfonso Soriano (1-for-5) had a two-run double in the third inning...SS Derek Jeter (3-for-4, 1BB) reached base safely four times and had a two-run single in the fourth...**RHP David Robertson** struck out the final two batters of the game for his 16th save of the season (0.2IP, 2K).



HOPE WEEK 2014 (June 16-20): This year marks the fifth anniversary of HOPE Week (Helping Others Persevere & Excel), an initiative rooted in the belief that acts of good will

provide hope and encouragement to more than just the recipient of the gesture...each day during the five days of HOPE Week, the Yankees will reach out to an individual, family or organization worthy of recognition and support...activities and outreach in the community is always coupled with recognition

at Yankee Stadium during a Yankees game.

This year's initiative begins on Monday, 6/16, with a reunion of all prior honorees on the U.S.S. Intrepid Sea, Air and Space Museum, which media is invited to attend (please RSVP to mmargolis@yankees.com)...**Brian Cashman,** Mariano Rivera, David Cone, Ivan Nova and Jennifer **Steinbrenner Swindal** will all attend and be available to media...information on the history of the initiative is available on yankeespressbox.com.

REVERSAL OF FORTUNE: This season the Yankees lost their three home games to Seattle (4/29, 5/1 and 6/2) and two home games to the Mets (5/12-13) and won their respective three road games at Safeco Field (6/10-12) and two at Citi Field (5/14-15)...this marks the only two instances in Yankees franchise history that the team lost all of its home games and won all its road games against the same opponent in a single season.

MARKED TERRITORY: 1B Mark Teixeira has hit more home runs against the A's (36) than he has against any other opponent...his 36HR vs. Oakland ranks second among all active players (Alex Rodriguez-43HR)...has hit more home runs at O.co Coliseum (20) than he has at any other ballpark as a visiting player...among active players who have never played with the A's, Teixeira's 20HR at the venue ranks second behind only Rodriguez (21).

CENTER OF ATTENTION: CF Jacoby Ellsbury has a 16-game hitting streak since 5/26, marking the longest by a Yankee since Derek Jeter's 19G hitting streak from 9/4-25/12...is the longest active streak in the Majors, the third-longest in the AL this season, and tied for the sixth-longest in the Majors...the Elias Sports Bureau notes that it's the longest by a Yankees centerfielder since Melky Cabrera in 2007 (18G)...over the span, Ellsbury is batting .381 (24-for-63) with 9R, 3 doubles, 2HR, 12RBI, 7BB, 7SB and a .443 OBP...is his longest hitting streak since 6/19-7/11/13 with Boston (19G)...his career best is a 22G streak from 5/2-27/09 w/ Boston...is tied for second in the AL in 2014 with 18SB (Jose Altuve-24, Rajai Davis-18).

▶ Has had the game-winning RBI in the Yankees' last three games (6/10-12)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first Yankees player with the GWRBI in three straight team games since Nick Swisher from 8/13-15/12.

YOUTH SERVED: The Yankees are 21-8 in games started by rookie pitchers (Tanaka, 11-2; Nuno, 5-5; Whitley, 5-1), including 15-1 on the road (Tanaka, 6-1; Nuno, 4-0; Whitley, 5-0)... Yankees rookie starters have a 2.73 combined ERA (181.0IP, 55ER) this season...have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of their last eight outings (53.0IP, 11ER, 1.87 ERA).

The Elias Sports Bureau notes that the Yankees have started rookies in 29 of their first 65 games, marking their highest such total since 1910 (30 in first 65G by three pitchers: Russ Ford, Hippo Vaughn and John Frill).

ROAD WARRIORS: The Yankees are 17-10 (.630) on the road since 4/20, marking the fourth-highest such winning pct. in the Majors in that span...in their last 27 road games:

- Yankees pitchers have posted a 2.72 ERA (244.2IP, 74ER), the lowest mark in the Majors in that span.
- Yankees starters have recorded a 2.91 ERA (164.0IP, 53ER),
- allowing 3ER or less in 25 of the 27 games over the stretch. **Yankees relievers** have a 2.34 ERA (80.2IP, 21ER) and .200 opponents' batting average (59-for-295).

CLOSE CALLS: The Yankees are an MLB-best 19-11 (.633) in games decided by two-or-fewer runs this season.

POWER BULLPEN: The Yankees bullpen leads the Majors with 238K and an average of 10.62K/9.0IP this season (in 201.2IP)...the seven pitchers currently in the Yankees bullpen (Betances, Huff, Kelley, Ramirez, Robertson, Thornton and Warren) own an 11.75K/9.0IP ratio (165K, 126.1IP) with the Yankees in 2014...**RHP David Robertson** is averaging 16.28K/9.0IP (41K, 22.2IP), the second-best mark in MLB among pitchers w/ at least 20.0IP (Atlanta's Craig Kimbrel-16.42K/9.0IP).

TAKING IT FROM THE TOP: Yankees starters have a 3.05 ERA (168.0IP, 57ER) since 5/14, marking the second-best starters ERA in the AL and third-best in the Majors over the stretch.

QUALITY GUY: With a 10-1 record and 2.02 ERA (93.2IP, 21ER, 74H, 14BB, 103K) in 13GS this season, **RHP Masahiro Tanaka** is tied for the MLB lead in wins with Toronto's Mark Buehrle (10-3)...leads the AL in ERA and is third in the Majors, trailing only San Francisco's Tim Hudson (1.81) and Cincinnati's Johnny <u>Cueto (1.85)</u>...has recorded quality starts (at least 6.0IP and 3ER or fewer) in each of his 13 starts this season, the longest active streak of its kind in MLB...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, is the fifth pitcher since 1900 to strike out 100 batters over his first 13 Major League games, joining Hideo Nomo (119), Kerry Wood (118), Herb Score (107) and Jose DeLeon (106).

FOUR SCORE: The Yankees are 33-7 (.825) in 2014 when holding their opponent to four-or-fewer runs, marking the third-best such record in MLB (Toronto, 35-5, .875; and Texas, 29-6, .829).

OUT OF THE BLOCKS: The Yankees are 12-3 in 2014 when leading *after the first inning*...are 22-28 in all other games...after three innings, are 30-12 when leading (21-10) or tied (9-2) and 4-19 when trailing at that point.

ON THE MEND: Currently with Double-A Trenton, C Francisco Cervelli has played seven minor league rehab games (3G-SWB, 2G-TAM, 2-TRE), going 3-for-23 with 3 singles and 3BB (4GS-C, 2GS-DH, 1GS-1B).

TINO MARTINEZ DAY / OLD-TIMERS' DAY: On Saturday, 6/21, the Yankees will honor former 1B Tino Martinez with a plaque in Monument Park...on the following day, Sun., 6/22, nearly 50 former Yankees will attend the 68th annual Old-Timers' Day at Yankee Stadium...ceremonies are scheduled to begin at 11:30 a.m. with the traditional OTD game to follow...both the OTD game and the regular game at 2:05 vs. Baltimore will air only on YES...gates will open to ticketholders at 10:00 a.m...fans are encouraged to be in their seats by 11:15 a.m...as part of pre-game ceremonies, the Yankees will honor **Rich "Goose"** Gossage with a Monument Park plaque...the Old-Timers are headlined by Hall-of-Famers Yogi Berra, Whitey Ford, Rickey Henderson and Reggie Jackson, as well as Joe Torre, who will be inducted in July...Johnny Damon, Hideki Matsui and John Montefusco will make their OTD debuts.

June 13, 2003: In a 5-2 win vs. St. Louis at Yankee Stadium, Roger Clemens records both his 300th career win and 4,000th career strikeout (Edgar Renteria).

June 13, 1948: An ailing Babe Ruth makes his final appearance at Yankee Stadium as the Yankees retire his No. 3 during ceremonies commemorating the Stadium's 25th anniversary. A little more than two months later, the 53-year-old Ruth will pass away from those cancer. Ruth will pass away from throat cancer.

June 14, 1953: The Yankees sweep a doubleheader from the Indians, 6-2 and 3-0 at Cleveland Stadium. The Game 2 win marks the Yankees' 18th consecutive victory and 15th straight road win, the latter mark establishing a club record that still stands today

OVERALL FACTS: Tonight the Yankees play the first game of a three-game series at Oakland in their only visit to the O.co Coliseum this season... are 4-12 in the last 16 games between the teams since 7/19/12...despite the current stretch, are 24-16 in the last 40 match-ups since 8/18/09 and 34-19 in the last 53 since the start of the 2008 season...IN 2013: Went 1-5 vs. Oakland (.167), which was their second-worst all-time single-season mark vs. the A's since the Yankees were established in 1903 (went 0-12 vs. Oakland in 1990)... IN SEASON SERIES: Are 4-1-1 vs. Oakland over the previous six seasons (2008-13)... IN POSTSEASON: The Yankees have won all three postseason series against the A's (2001 ALDS, 3-2; 2000 ALDS, 3-2; and 1981 ALCS, 3-0)... AT O.co COLISEUM: The Yankees are making their lone trip to Oakland this season... have lost seven straight at O.co Coliseum, marking the Yankees' second-longest road losing streak to the A's franchise since 1914 (lost 10 straight from 9/9/89-5/1/91)... the streak is tied for the third-longest Yankees road losing streak in the history of the rivalry (also 9G in 1902-03, and 7G in 1912-13 and 1913)... had won nine straight at the Coliseum prior to the current losing streak...are 13-9 at the As since the start of 2009...IN 2013: Went 0-3 at Oakland, which was the first time they had been held winless in a season at Oakland since 2001(0-6)...IN SEASON SERIES: Are 4-2 at Oakland over the previous six seasons (2008-13).

RHP David Phelps is making his eighth start and 17th appearance of the season...last started on 6/7 at Kansas City, suffering the loss in an 8-4 Yankees defeat (5.2IP, 10H, 7R/7ER, 1HR, 2BB, 4K).
