ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last four games and five of the last eight and are now 10-11 over the last 21 contests...however, are 40-27 for the season, which is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco, 43-25)...it matches the A's best record after 67 games over the last 24 years...were 40-27 after 67 games last year (won game

68)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 47th consecutive day (since April 28) and have held at least a share of first for 51 consecutive days (since April 24) and 63 of the last 65...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...have 60 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have a 3½ game lead over Los Angeles in the West...have owned the best record in the AL every day since May 31.

THE LAST EIGHT GAMES: The A's have been held to one run or fewer in four of the last eight games...are 3-5 over that span...are hitting .206 (59 for 287) with 28 runs scored (3.5 runs per game)...however, have outscored the opposition 28-26 as the pitching staff has a 2.62 ERA (22 er in 75.2 ip).

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout for the third time this year last night, all of which have come in games started by Sonny Gray...**lead the majors** in walks (283), rank second in runs (336) and on-base percentage (.332), third in home runs (77), seventh in slugging (.407), extra base hits (205) and fewest strikeouts (485) and tied for eighth in triples (14).

MARGIN OF VICTORY: The A's have outscored the opposition by 123 runs, which is more than double next closest team (San Francisco, 56) and more than triple the next closest American League team (Toronto, 37)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973...the last Major League team to outscore its opponents by more than 127 runs before the break is the 2001 Seattle Mariners (149).

PITCHING: The A's allowed seven runs last night after allowing eight runs over the previous four games...**lead the majors** in ERA (2.89), opponents batting average (.228), on-base percentage (.291) and slugging percentage (.340)...also lead the majors with a .200 (101 for 506) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...have issued the third fewest walks in the American League (188) and are tied for the third most shutouts (7).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-8 with a 3.38 ERA (47 er in 125.1 ip) over the last 20 games...however, are 27-16 with a 3.00 ERA (136 er in 408.0 ip) for the season...have the lowest ERA and fewest losses in the majors...lead the American League in innings pitched (408.0) and are tied for second in complete games (2).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: A's outfielders have 13 assists in the last 20 games and 20 for the season, which is the **most in the majors**...the A's have committed six errors in the last four games, including a season-high tying three Monday night...now have 47 errors for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...however, have just 16 unearned runs, which is second fewest in the AL (Baltimore, 13)...are 21-13 (.618) when committing at least one error compared to 19-14 (.575) when going errorless.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered just once over the last four games after a season-best streak of 16 consecutive games with a home run (27 home runs total)...have 77 home runs for the season, which ranks second in the American League and third in the majors...lead the majors with four grand slams and rank second with 39 home runs with runners on base (Toronto, 40)...the pitching staff has allowed 53 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and fifth fewest in the majors...only 16 of those have come with runners on base, which is the fewest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this 10-game homestand against New York-AL (0-1), Texas (three games) and Boston (four games)...went 5-2 on the last homestand and are 17-13 (.567) at home for the season, which is the third best home record in the

American League...only the Cubs and Yankees, with 29 each, have played fewer home games than the A's (30)...have won 11 of the last 15 home games after losing six straight...this homestand is the second of three 10-game homestands this year...the last time the A's had at least three 10-game homestands in one season was in 2002 when they had four...are batting .257 (258 for 1004) with 41 home runs in 30 games in Oakland compared to .240 with 36 home runs in 37 games on the road...went 5-4 on the last road trip to New York-AL (2-1), Baltimore (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2)...it marked their 10th consecutive road trip with a .500 or better record, which is the A's longest such streak since an 11-trip streak from June 26, 1989-July 11, 1990...have not finished a road trip with a losing record since going 2-5 at Texas and Seattle June 17-23, 2013...are 23-14 (.622) on the road for the season, which is the third best mark in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 12-17 in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 28-10 in games decided by three runs or more...are 7-4 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning wins and are tied with the Dodgers and Mets for the most extra inning games...have the third best extra inning record in the American League...are 11-8 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Miami and Milwaukee for the most last at bat wins in the majors and are tied with Boston for the most last at bat games in the AL...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (8) and are tied with Milwaukee for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (4)...have four walk-off wins, which is tied for third in the AL.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 6 for their last 10 (.600) with a walk and four RBI...lead the American League in hits (16) and walks (13) and are tied for the lead in doubles (4), home runs (1), RBI (11) and extra base hits (5)...rank second in on-base percentage (.417) and plate appearances (72) and third in slugging (.404).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 37 for 45 (82.2%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 41 of their 47 (87.2%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Cubs, 90.2%)...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-9 against the American League East...are batting .198 (107 for 540) with 51 runs scored (3.19 per game)...have the best record in the AL on Sunday (8-2)...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 67 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the second longest single-season streak in Oakland history...the record is a 73-game streak to start the 1984 season.

A's vs. YANKEES: The season series is even at two games each...the A's lost the first game in Oakland last night to snap their seven-game winning streak against the Yankees in the Coliseum...won two of three at Yankee Stadium to start the last road trip...won the season series last year 5-1...it was their first season series win since 2007 (4-2) and it was the A's second best record against the Yankees in franchise history (12-0 in 1990)...have won 12 of their last 17 games against the Yankees...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 233-269 against the Yankees...that includes 127-122 in Oakland and 106-147 in New York...all-time, the A's are 774-1135 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes leads Major League outfielders with nine assists...has 28 career assists, which is tied for second most in the majors since 2012...Sean Doolittle has a 19.1 innings scoreless streak, which is a career-high and the longest active streak in the American League.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1964 Jim Gentile drives in four runs, including the game winning home run in the top of the 10th inning in a 6-5 win at Cleveland...in 1969 the A's defeat the Boston Red Sox 21-7, setting what was then a club record for most runs in a game...Oakland scores five times in the fifth, seventh and eighth innings...Reggie Jackson is 5 for 6 with two doubles, two homers and a club record 10 RBI...in 1975 Campy Campaneris steals his 500th career base in the A's 3-2 loss at Detroit.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (7-2, 2.20 ERA)

LAST SIX STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in four of his last six starts and is 3-1 with a 1.67 ERA (7 er in 37.2 ip) and .195 (26 for 133) opponents batting average over that span...went 4-1 with a 2.64 ERA and .223 opponents average over his first seven starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League lead in opponents batting average (.211), ranks third in ERA (2.20), opponents on-base percentage (.263) and slugging percentage (.301), tied for seventh in winning percentage (.778) and tied for eighth in wins (7)...also has the second highest run support (6.70), ranks third in fewest pitches per inning (14.7), fourth in fewest pitches per game (92.6), tied for fifth in complete games (1) and wild pitches (6), ninth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.97), tied for ninth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.55) and 10th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.12).

LAST 31 STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 13 starts this year and 15 of his last 31 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 14-7 with a 2.68 ERA (55 er in 185.0 ip) and .227 (157 for 693) opponents batting average over that stretch...has walked 41

(1.99 per nine innings) and struck out 177 in 185.0 innings (8.61 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.32...has yielded just 12 home runs (0.58 per nine innings).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.69 ERA (7 er in 37.1 ip) in five starts at home compared to 4-1 with a 2.62 ERA (13 er in 44.2 ip) in seven starts on the road...has the second lowest home ERA in the American League...has walked two batters in 37.1 innings at home and 15 in 44.2 innings on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .125 (7 for 56) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is the lowest in the majors among qualifiers for the ERA title...opponents are 1 for 23 (.043) with RISP and two outs...has not walked a batter to lead off an inning...opponents are batting .232 (19 for 82) with a .250 on-base percentage (two hit by pitches) and .268 slugging percentage (three doubles) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is fifth lowest in the AL and the on-base percentage is tied for eighth...has yielded a .195 (47 for 241) average against right-handers compared to .276 (16 for 58) against left-handers...the mark against righties ranks sixth lowest in the AL...has surrendered all five of his home runs this year and 21 of his 24 over the last two years to righties...four of the home runs this year have been solo shots as have 17 of his 24 over the last two years.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-0 with a 1.09 ERA (5 er in 41.1 ip) in six starts during the day compared to 3-2 with a 3.32 ERA (15 er in 40.2 ip) in seven starts at night...ranks second in the American League in day ERA...is now 9-2 with a 2.34 ERA (25 er in 96.1 ip) in 16 starts during the day over the last two years and 8-9 with a 4.13 ERA (66 er in 143.2 ip) in 26 starts at night.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 5-0 with a 2.18 ERA (8 er in 33.0 ip) in five starts on four days rest compared to 2-2 with a 2.20 ERA (12 er in 49.0 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more.

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his second career complete game May 28, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit in Oakland...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 1-0 with a 1.35 ERA (2 er in 13.1 ip) in two starts in June...went 2-2 with a 2.67 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in five starts in May after going 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Gray, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...of those six, only Cahill was undefeated (Cahill started the season 6-0)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...his last four-win month was June of 2010 with Los Angeles (AL)...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history.

THIS AND THAT: Has seven wins, which matches his second best total before the All-Star Break in his career...had 10 wins before the break in 2006...the A's are 11-2 (.846) in his starting

assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his 13 starts...has not allowed a run four times.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game *April* 2...tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut...won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Minnesota *April* 7...retired 11 of the final 13 batters he faced...combined with Abad, Otero, Gregerson and Doolittle on a 13 batters he three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle April 13...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed two of the hits but had a no decision as the A's scored twice in the eighth and once in the ninth...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Houston April 19 in Oakland...left trailing 3-1 but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the ninth for the win...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 win at Texas *April 29* to start a season 4-0 for the first time in his career...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-2 loss to Seattle May 5....that snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2013 (also May 10-June 6, 2008)...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings...struck out 56 and walked just 10...had a no decision in the A's 6-2 win at Cleveland *May* 17...tossed just 1.1 innings, which was the shortest outing of his career...was ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second...tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit *May 28* in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...allowed a solo home run to Hunter with two outs in the fourth inning...had a no decision in the A's 5-2, 10-inning win at New York *June* 3...struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings, his 22^{nd} career 10-strikeout game.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-1 win at Baltimore last Sunday...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed four hits and two walks...allowed just two base runners as far as second base.

SUNDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (5-4, 3.04 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks eighth in the American League in ERA (3.04)...is also seventh in highest run support (5.63)...opponents have reached base on an error six times, which is tied for second most.

SINCE APRIL: Is 3-4 with a 4.07 ERA (19 er in 42.0 ip) and .293 (49 for 167) opponents batting average in seven starts in May and June after going 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...has 33 strikeouts in 42.0 innings in May and June after fanning 41 in 38.0 innings in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are hitting .200 (13 for 65) with runners in scoring position, which is tied for seventh in the American League...they are 3 for 27 (.111) with RISP and two outs...has walked just three batters to lead off an inning...has a .345 (20 for 58) opponents batting average in the first inning, .228 (57 for 250) after that...has a .273 (59 for 216) opponents batting average the first two times through the order, .196 (18 for 92) after that...has held the fourth through seventh hitters in the batting order to a .149 (21 for 141) batting average...all other hitters are batting .352 (56 for 167).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .187 (23 for 123) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .292 (54 for 185) against left-handers...has issued just five of his 21 walks to righties for a .220 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage against right-handers is second lowest in the American League and the batting average ranks third...over the last two years, he has held right-handed hitters to a .198 (44 for 221) batting average...has issued 30 of his 41 walks over that stretch to lefties.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed six home runs in his last six starts (36.1 ip) after allowing three home runs over his first seven starts (43.2 ip)...has allowed nine home runs for the season, eight of which have been solo shots.

AS A STARTER: Has made 13 appearances this year, all starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 5-5 with a 3.76 ERA (37 er in 88.2 ip) in 15 career starts compared to 9-14 with a 5.30 ERA in 189 relief appearances...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 9-4 (.692) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his 13 starts and allowed two runs or fewer seven times...has career highs in strikeouts (74), innings pitched (80.0) and games started (13) and has matched his best in wins (5)...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk...began the season with four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Has allowed two runs or fewer in six of his seven starts and is 4-2 with a 1.88 ERA (8 er in 38.1 ip) and .199 (27 for 136) opponents batting average as a starter...began the season in the bullpen and allowed one run or fewer in each of his nine relief appearances...was 1-1 with a 1.98 ERA and .220 opponents average as a reliever...moved into the rotation May 7.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-0 with a 2.33 ERA (5 er in 19.1 ip) and .134 (9 for 67) opponents batting average in seven games at home compared to 1-3 with a 1.65 ERA (6 er in 32.2 ip) and .244 (29 for 119) opponents batting average in eight games on the road...is tied for sixth in the American League in home wins.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .161 (5 for 31) with runners in scoring position...are 2 for 17 (.118) with RISP and two outs...opponents are 8 for 49 (.163) with four walks (.226 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...five of the six home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...four have been hit by right-handed hitters, as have 21 of 24 in his career...has a .443 career slugging percentage against righties compared to .266 by lefties...has a .161 (14 for 87) opponents average over his first 30 pitches in a game, .242 (24 for 99) after that.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-1 with a 0.53 ERA (1 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts on five days rest or more compared to 2-1 with a 2.95 ERA (7 er in 21.1 ip) in four starts on four days rest.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 0.43 ERA (1 er in 21.0 ip) and .141 (10 for 71) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game...has a 3.60 ERA (8 er in 20.0 ip) in innings four through six and a 1.64 ERA (2 er in 11.0 ip) from the seventh inning on.

IN MAY: Went 4-1 with a 2.70 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in six games, including five starts, in May...tied for fourth in the American League in wins in May...had just five wins over the first 42 games of his career.
