June 15, 1957: The Yankees trade Billy Martin, Woodie Held, Bob Martyn and Ralph Terry to the Kansas City A's for Ryne Duren, Jim Pisoni and Harry Simpson.

June 15, 1930: In a 17-10 Yankees win over the Indians at League Park, Lou Gehrig goes 3-for-5 with 2HR and 7RBI. In the Yanks' next game, a 17-2 win over Cleveland, Gehrig goes 4-for-6 with 4RBI, 3R and 1HR.

June 15, 1923: Lou Gehrig makes his Major League debut at 19 years old during a 10-0 win over the St. Louis Browns, entering the game as a defensive replacement at first base.

AT A GLANCE: Tonight the Yankees play the second game of a three-game series at Oakland after Friday's 7-0 win...are 5-2 thus far on their current nine-game road trip...began the trip 1-2 at Kansas City (with a rainout on 6/9), swept three games at Seattle and are 1-0 at Oakland...went 2-5 on their most recent homestand from 5/30-6/5 (1-2 vs. Minnesota, 0-1 vs. Seattle, 1-2 vs. Oakland)...following this road trip, will have an off day on Monday before beginning a six-game homestand vs. Toronto (6/17-19) and Baltimore (6/20-22).

- Have won four straight and six of their last eight...with a win tonight, would tie their season-high winning streak (5G: 4/12-17).
- Their current four-game winning streak (with all four wins on the road), marks their longest road winning streak since a four-game sweep at Minnesota from 7/1-4/13...last had a
- longer road winning streak from 5/8-12/13 (5G). Are 16-12 over their last 28G since 5/14 with a 3.21 ERA (255.0IP, 91ER, 232H, 61BB, 240K), marking the third-best ERA in the AL over the stretch and the fifth-best in the Majors.
- Are 18-10 in their last 28 road games (since 4/20).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: On Friday, the Yankees shut out Oakland, 7-0, in the series opener at O.co Coliseum...Yankees pitchers allowed just 2H, marking their fewest surrendered since a 3-0 win on 8/14/12 vs. Texas (2H) and fewest in a road game since an 8-1 win on 8/19/11 at Minnesota (2H)... Yankees batters totaled 12H (all singles) and were 6-for-13 with RISP...scored 4R on 5H in the eighth...five different players had RBI-singles (Ellsbury, Gardner, Suzuki, Roberts, Johnson)...**RHP David Phelps** started and tossed 6.2 scoreless IP, improving to 2-4 this season (2H, 3BB, 4K)...**CF Jacoby Ellsbury** (1-for-4, 1BB) drove in the Yankees' first run with an RBI-single in the first, extending his hitting streak to 17G...**1B Mark Teixeira** (1-for-4) had a sac fly in the first...RHP Dellin Betances (1.1IP, 2K) and RHP Jose Ramirez (1.0IP, 1K) were perfect in relief.

THEY SAY IT'S YOUR BIRTHDAY: Today RHP Chase Whitley turns 25 years old (DOB: 6/14/89)...on Sunday, former Yankees LHP Andy Pettitte turns 42 (DOB: 6/15/72)...tallied a 219-127 record with a 3.94 ERA (2,796.1IP, 1,223ER, 889BB, 2,020K) in 447G/438GS over 15 seasons as a Yankee (1995-2003, '06-10, '12-13)...in franchise history, is first in strikeouts, tied for first in starts, third in wins and IP, and fifth in games pitched.

SKIPPING 'STONES: Manager Joe Girardi has 599 wins as Yankees manager and needs one win to reach the 600-win milestone with the club...would become the sixth Yankees manager in franchise history to reach the plateau, joining Joe McCarthy (1,460), Joe Torre (1,173), Casey Stengel (1,149), Miller Huggins (1,067) and Ralph Houk (944).

SIGNS OF THE TIMES: The Yankees today announced the following 2014 First-Year Player draft pick signings: LHP Jacob Lindgren (Rd. 2); RHP Austin DeCarr (3); RHP Jordan Foley (5); RHP Jonathan Holder (6); LHP Derek Callahan (16); RHP Corey Holmes (20) and RHP Lee Casas (28)...also signed postdraft free agent RHP Michael Noteware (Lewis-Clark State College)...for a complete list of Yankees draft picks (and those who have signed) please visit yankeespressbox.com.

CENTER OF ATTENTION: CF Jacoby Ellsbury has a 17-game hitting streak since 5/26, marking the longest by a Yankee since Derek Jeter's 19G hitting streak from 9/4-25/12...is the longest active streak in the Majors and tied with three others for the third-longest in the Majors this season...only Colorado's Nolan Arenado (28) and Baltimore's Nick Markakis (18) have had longer streaks in 2014...the Elias Sports Bureau notes that it's the here the Vankees centerfielder since Melky Cabrera in 2007 longest by a Yankees centerfielder since Melky Cabrera in 2007 (18G)...over the span, Ellsbury is batting .373 (25-for-67) with 9R, 3 doubles, 2HR, 13RBI, 8BB, 7SB and a .440 OBP...is his longest hitting streak since 6/19-7/11/13 with Boston (19G)...his career best is a 22G streak from 5/2-27/09 w/ Boston...is tied for second in the AL in 2014 with 18SB (Jose Altuve-24, Rajai Davis-18).

Has had the game-winning RBI in the Yankees' last four games (6/10-13)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the longest such streak of GWRBI in consecutive team games by a Yankee since Reggie Jackson had a four-game streak from (8/10-12G2/77).

MARKED TERRITORY: 1B Mark Teixeira has hit 36HR against the A's, marking his most vs. any opponent and the second-most vs. the A's among active players (Alex Rodriguez-43)...his 20HR at O.co Coliseum (20) are his most in any stadium as a visitor and the second-most at O.co among active players (Rodriguez-21).

YOUTH SERVED: The Yankees are 21-8 in games started by rookie pitchers (Tanaka, 11-2; Nuno, 5-5; Whitley, 5-1), including 15-1 on the road (Tanaka, 6-1; Nuno, 4-0; Whitley, 5-0)... Yankees rookie starters have a 2.73 ERA (181.0IP, 55ER)...have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of their last 8GS (53.0IP, 11ER, 1.87 ERA).

ROAD WARRIORS: The Yankees are 22-15 (.595) on the road this season, marking the third-best road record in the AL and sixth-best in the Majors...are 18-10 (.643) on the road since 4/20, marking the fourth-highest such winning pct. in the Majors in that span...in their last 28 road games:

- Yankees pitchers have posted a 2.63 ERA (253.2IP, 74ER), the lowest mark in the Majors in that span. Yankees starters have recorded a 2.79 ERA (170.2IP, 53ER),
- allowing 3ER or less in 26 of the 28 games over the stretch.
- Yankees relievers have a 2.28 ERA (83.0IP, 21ER) and .195 ۲ opponents' batting average (59-for-302).

CLOSE CALLS: The Yankees are an MLB-best 19-11 (.633) in games decided by two-or-fewer runs this season.

**POWER BULLPEN:** The **Yankees bullpen** leads the Majors with 241K and an average of 10.63K/9.0IP this season (in 204.0IP)...the seven pitchers currently in the Yankees bullpen (Betances, Huff, Kelley, Ramirez, Robertson, Thornton and Warren) own an 11.75K/9.0IP ratio (168K, 128.2IP) with the Yankees in 2014...RHP David Robertson is averaging 16.28K/9.0IP (41K, 22.2IP), the second-best mark in MLB among pitchers w/ at least 20.0IP (Atlanta's Craig Kimbrel-16.48K/9.0IP).

TAKING IT FROM THE TOP: Yankees starters have a 2.94 ERA (174.2IP, 57ER) since 5/14, marking the second-best starters ERA in the Majors over the stretch (Washington-2.45).

QUALITY GUY: With a 10-1 record and 2.02 ERA (93.2IP, 21ER, 74H, 14BB, 103K) in 13GS this season, **RHP Masahiro Tanaka** is tied for the MLB lead in wins with Toronto's Mark Buehrle (10-3)...leads the AL in ERA and is third in the Majors, trailing only San Francisco's Tim Hudson (1.81) and Cincinnati's Johnny Cueto (1.85)... has recorded quality starts (at least 6.0IP and 3ER or fewer) in each of his 13 starts this season, the longest active streak of its kind in MLB...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, is the fifth pitcher since 1900 to strike out 100 batters over his first 13 Major League games, joining Hideo Nomo (119), Kerry Wood (118), Herb Score (107) and Jose DeLeon (106).

FOUR SCORE: The Yankees are 34-7 (.829) in 2014 when holding their opponent to four-or-fewer runs, marking the third-best such record in MLB (Toronto, 36-5, .878; and Texas, 30-6, .833).

**OUT OF THE BLOCKS:** The Yankees are 13-3 in 2014 when leading *after the first inning...* are 22-28 in all other games... after three innings, are 31-12 when leading (22-10) or tied (9-2) and 4-19 when trailing at that point.

## YANKEES at OAKLAND

**OVERALL FACTS:** Tonight the Yankees play the second game of a three-game series at Oakland in their only visit to the O.co Coliseum this season...are 5-12 in the last 17 games between the teams since 7/19/12...despite the current stretch, are 25-16 in the last 41 match-ups since 8/18/09 and 35-19 in the last 54 since the start of the 2008 season...IN 2013: Went 1-5 vs. Oakland (.167), which was their second-worst all-time single-season mark vs. the A's since the Yankees were established in 1903 (went 0-12 vs. Oakland in 1990)...IN SEASON SERIES: Are 4-1-1 vs. Oakland over the previous six seasons (2008-13)...IN POSTSEASON: The Yankees have won all three postseason series against the A's (2001 ALDS, 3-2; 2000 ALDS, 3-2; and 1981 ALCS, 3-0)...AT O.co COLISEUM: The Yankees are making their lone trip to Oakland this season...with Friday's win, snapped a seven-game losing streak at O.co Coliseum, which marked the Yankees' second-longest road losing streak to the A's franchise since 1914 (lost 10 straight from 9/9/89-5/1/91)...the streak is tied for the third-longest Yankees road losing streak in the history of the rivalry (also 9G in 1902-03, and 7G in 1912-13 and 1913)...had won nine straight at the Coliseum prior to the losing streak...are 14-9 at the A's since the start of 2009...IN 2013: Went 0-3 at Oakland, which was the first time they had been held winless in a season at Oakland since 2001(0-6)...IN SEASON SERIES: Are 4-2 at Oakland over the previous six seasons (2008-13).
