ABOUT THE A'S: The A's are 11-11 over the last 22 games...however, are 41-27 for the season, which is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco, 43-26)...it matches the A's best record after 68 games over the last 24 years (2013)...with a win today, the A's would have their best record after 69 games since going 44-25 in 1990...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 48th consecutive day (since April 28) and have held at least a share of first for 52 consecutive days (since April 24) and 63 of the last 65...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...have 61 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have a 3½ game lead over Los Angeles in the West...have owned the best record in the AL every day since May 31.

THE LAST NINE GAMES: The A's have been held to one run or fewer in four of the last nine games...are 4-5 over that span...are hitting .210 (67 for 319) with 33 runs scored (3.67 runs per game)...however, have outscored the opposition 33-27 as the pitching staff has a 2.34 ERA (22 er in 84.2 ip).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have outscored the opposition by 127 runs, which is more than double next closest team (San Francisco, 55) and more than triple the next closest American League team (Toronto, 36)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973...the last Major League team to outscore its opponents by more than 127 runs before the break is the 2001 Seattle Mariners (149).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed one run in three of the last six games...lead the majors in ERA (2.85), opponents batting average (.226), on-base percentage (.289) and slugging percentage (.337)...also lead the majors with a .198 (101 for 510) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...have issued the third fewest walks in the American League (191) and are tied for the third most shutouts (7).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-8 with a 3.22 ERA (47 er in 131.1 ip) over the last 21 games...however, are 28-16 with a 2.96 ERA (136 er in 414.0 ip) for the season...have the lowest ERA and fewest losses in the majors...lead the American League in innings pitched (414.0) and are tied for second in complete games (2).

OFFENSE: The A's lead the majors in walks (287), rank second in runs (341), third in home runs (77) and on-base percentage (.332), seventh in fewest strikeouts (490) and eighth in slugging (.405) and extra base hits (206).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: A's outfielders have 13 assists in the last 21 games and 20 for the season, which is the most in the majors...the A's have committed seven errors in the last five games, including a season-high tying three Monday night at Los Angeles (AL)...now have 48 errors for the season, which is fourth most in the American League...however, have just 17 unearned runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL (Baltimore, 13)...are 22-13 (.629) when committing at least one error compared to 19-14 (.575) when going errorless.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered just once over the last five games after a season-best streak of 16 consecutive games with a home run (27 home runs total)...have 77 home runs for the season, which ranks second in the American League and third in the majors...lead the majors with four grand slams and rank second with 39 home runs with runners on base (Toronto, 40)...the pitching staff has allowed just one home run over the last six games...has surrendered 53 for the season, which is the fewest in the AL and fifth fewest in the majors...only 16 of those have come with runners on base, which is the fewest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this 10-game homestand against New York-AL (1-1), Texas (three games) and Boston (four games)...went 5-2 on the last homestand and are 18-13 (.581) at home for the season, which is the third best home record in the American League...have won 12 of the last 16 home games after

losing six straight...this homestand is the second of three 10-game homestands this year...the last time the A's had at least three 10-game homestands in one season was in 2002 when they had four...are batting .257 (266 for 1036) with 41 home runs in 31 games in Oakland compared to .240 with 36 home runs in 37 games on the road...went 5-4 on the last road trip to New York-AL (2-1), Baltimore (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2)...it marked their 10th consecutive road trip with a .500 or better record, which is the A's longest such streak since an 11-trip streak from June 26, 1989-July 11, 1990...have not finished a road trip with a losing record since going 2-5 at Texas and Seattle June 17-23, 2013...are 23-14 (.622) on the road for the season, which is the second best mark in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 12-17 in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 29-10 in games decided by three runs or more...are 7-4 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning wins and are tied with the Dodgers and Mets for the most extra inning games...have the third best extra inning record in the American League...are 11-8 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the AL in last at bat wins and are tied with Boston for the most last at bat games...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (8) and are tied with Milwaukee for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (4)...have four walk-off wins, which is tied for third in the AL.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 7 for their last 11 (.636) with a walk and four RBI...lead the American League and are tied for sixth in the majors in pinch hits (17)...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in walks (13)...are tied for the lead in doubles (4), home runs (1), RBI (11) and extra base hits (5)...rank second in on-base percentage (.425) and plate appearances (73) and third in batting (.293) and slugging (.414).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 37 for 45 (82.2%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 41 of their 47 (87.2%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Cubs, 90.3%)...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 8-9 against the American League East...are batting .201 (115 for 572) with 56 runs scored (3.29 per game)...have the best record in the AL on Sunday (8-2)...are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 68 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the second longest single-season streak in Oakland history...the record is a 73-game streak to start the 1984 season.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's lead the season series 3-2 entering the final game today...are 1-1 in Oakland and 2-1 in New York...the loss Friday night snapped the A's seven-game winning streak against the Yankees in the Coliseum...won the season series last year 5-1...it was their first season series win since 2007 (4-2) and it was the A's second best record against the Yankees in franchise history (12-0 in 1990)...have won 13 of their last 18 games against the Yankees...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 234-269 against the Yankees...that includes 128-122 in Oakland and 106-147 in New York...all-time, the A's are 775-1135 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 27-22 on Father's Day...that includes 15-9 at home and 12-13 on the road...are 0-2 against the Yankees, both times in Oakland (1974 and 1980)...**Yoenis Céspedes** leads Major League outfielders with nine assists...has 28 career assists, which is tied for second most in the majors since 2012...**Sean Doolittle** has a 20.1 innings scoreless streak, which is a career-high and the longest active streak in the American League.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1925 the A's trail 15-3 entering the bottom of the seventh inning before scoring once in the seventh and 13 times in the eighth inning to defeat Cleveland 17-15...the 12 run deficit overcome to win is a Major League record...in 1983 Davey Lopes drives in seven runs and is a single short of the cycle in the A's 10-1 win at Toronto...in 2002 the A's go errorless for the 12th consecutive game, breaking the Oakland record of 11.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (5-4, 3.04 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks ninth in the American League in ERA (3.04)...is also seventh in highest run support (5.63)...opponents have reached base on an error six times, which is tied for second most.

SINCE APRIL: Is 3-4 with a 4.07 ERA (19 er in 42.0 ip) and .293 (49 for 167) opponents batting average in seven starts in May and June after going 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...has 33 strikeouts in 42.0 innings in May and June after fanning 41 in 38.0 innings in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are hitting .200 (13 for 65) with runners in scoring position, which is tied for ninth in the American League...they are 3 for 27 (.111) with RISP and two outs...has walked just three batters to lead off an inning...has a .345 (20 for 58) opponents batting average in the first inning. .228 (57 for 250) after that...has a .273 (59 for 216) opponents batting average the first two times through the order, .196 (18 for 92) after that...has held the fourth through seventh hitters in the batting order to a .149 (21 for 141) batting average...all other hitters are batting .352 (56 for 167).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .187 (23 for 123) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .292 (54 for 185) against left-handers...has issued just five of his 21 walks to righties for a .220 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage against right-handers is second lowest in the American League and the batting average ranks fifth...over the last two years, he has held right-handed hitters to a .198 (44 for 221) batting average...has issued 30 of his 41 walks over that stretch to lefties.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed six home runs in his last six starts (36.1 ip) after allowing three home runs over his first seven starts (43.2 ip)...has allowed nine home runs for the season, eight of which have been solo shots.

AS A STARTER: Has made 13 appearances this year, all starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 5-5 with a 3.76 ERA (37 er in 88.2 ip) in 15 career starts compared to 9-14 with a 5.30 ERA in 189 relief appearances...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 9-4 (.692) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his 13 starts and allowed two runs or fewer seven times...has career highs in strikeouts (74), innings pitched (80.0) and games started (13) and has matched his best in wins (5)...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk...began the season with four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

2014 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win over Seattle **April 3** in Oakland...left trailing 2-0 but the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game...had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota **April 9**...struck out a career-high nine in 7.0 innings...was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth...had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) **April 14**...matched his career high with nine strikeouts for the second consecutive start...picked up his first career win as a starter in the A's 4-1 win over Houston **April 20** in Oakland...retired seven of the final eight batters he faced...had a no decision in the A's 12-5 win at Houston **April 25**...allowed a career-high eight hits...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a run in the third inning on an Altuve RBI double...the A's scored a run in the fourth to take a 5-1 lead but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the fourth on a Dominguez RBI single, a two-run error by Donaldson and a Castro RBI ground out...the A's scored seven times in the ninth for the win...extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 12-1 victory at Texas **April 30**...did not allow a run in 7.0 innings...yielded just one hit (Felder two-out single in first) and one walk (Felder, one out in fourth)...did not allow a base runner past first base...was the losing

pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Seattle **May 6**...allowed three runs in the first inning on a wild pitch, a Smoak RBI double and an Ackley RBI single...the A's scored twice in the second to narrow the gap to 3-2 and he blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over innings two through five before allowing a Zunino sacrifice fly in the sixth...left after that trailing 4-2...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Chicago **May 12** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings...allowed two runs on a pair of solo home runs by Vicedo in the second and Abreu to lead off the ninth...the two home runs matched his career high...the A's bullpen was charged with two more runs in the ninth before Doolittle retired the final three batters for the save...was the winning pitcher in the A's 13-3 win at Cleveland **May 18**...it was the 200th appearance of his career...tossed a career-high 109 pitches and allowed a career-high tying two home runs for the second consecutive start...allowed a leadoff home run to Bourn in the first inning but the A's scored seven unanswered runs before he allowed a one out solo home run to Brantley in the fifth...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss at Toronto **May 24**...allowed a career-high tying eight hits...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed an unearned run in the third when Gose scored on a Gentry error...then allowed three more runs in the fifth on a Lawrie home run and a two-run error by Moss...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 5-4 loss to Detroit **May 29** in Oakland...yielded a career-high tying eight hits for the second consecutive start...allowed a run to score on a ground out in the third inning and the A's scored twice in the fourth to give him a 2-1 lead...surrendered two more runs in the fifth inning on a Kinsler RBI double and a Cabrera sacrifice fly to give the Tigers the lead for good...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-4 win at New York **June 4**...allowed four runs in 6.0 innings, all in the third inning on a Jeter RBI single and a Ellsbury three-run home run...that gave the Yankees a 4-0 lead but the A's scored seven unanswered runs for the win and he retired seven of the final eight batters he faced.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Monday...allowed a career-high tying eight hits for the third time in his last four starts...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed single runs in the third, fourth and fifth innings on a Trout sacrifice fly, an Ibanez RBI single and a Trout RBI double.

CHAVEZ vs. NEW YORK: Is 2-0 with a 2.63 ERA (13.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 13 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances, including one start...the start came in his only outing this year, a 7-4 A's win at New York June 4...allowed four runs in 6.0 innings, all in the third inning on a Jeter RBI single and a Ellsbury three-run home run...that gave the Yankees a 4-0 lead but the A's scored seven unanswered runs for the win and he retired seven of the final eight batters he faced...also pitched in relief at Kansas City on Aug. 13, 2010 (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 1 so) and picked up the win in the A's 3-2, 18-inning win in Oakland on June 13, 2013 (5.2 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 7 so).

LHP Drew Pomeranz (5-3, 1.90 ERA): Has allowed two runs or fewer in six of his seven starts and is 4-2 with a 1.88 ERA and .199 opponents batting average...based on a minimum of 50 innings pitched, he has the lowest ERA in the American League (1.90) and third lowest in the majors...using the same minimum, he ranks fifth in the AL in opponents batting average (.204) and ninth in slugging (.317)...is 4-0 with a 2.33 ERA and .134 opponents batting average in seven games at home compared to 1-3 with a 1.65 ERA and .244 opponents batting average in eight games on the road...opponents are batting .161 with runners in scoring position...has a 0.43 ERA and .141 opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game...had a no decision in his last start, a 2-1, 14-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Tuesday (7.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 0 er, 3 bb, 2 so)...has faced the Rangers once in his career and it came in relief earlier this year on April 23 in Oakland (1.0 ip, 1 bb, 2 so).

- The A's bullpen is first in the American League in ERA (2.63) and is has the third most wins (13)...ranks first in opponents batting average (.219), on-base percentage (.283) and slugging percentage (.294).
- Is tied for the third most blown saves (9), is tied for the second lowest save percentage (59.1%) and the second fewest saves (13)...however, has just one blown save since May 16 (6 for 7 in save chances).
- Is tied for the fewest home runs allowed (11) and has issued the fewest walks (65) among AL bullpens.
- Has allowed zero runs in four of five games against the Yankees this season and six of seven overall.

MONDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Drew Pomeranz (5-3, 1.90 ERA)

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Has allowed two runs or fewer in six of his seven starts and is 4-2 with a 1.88 ERA (8 er in 38.1 ip) and .199 (27 for 136) opponents batting average as a starter...began the season in the bullpen and allowed one run or fewer in each of his nine relief appearances...was 1-1 with a 1.98 ERA and .220 opponents average as a reliever...moved into the rotation May 7.

QUALIFICATIONS: Has 52.0 innings pitched and does not qualify for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 50 innings pitched, he has the **lowest** ERA in the American League (1.90) and **third** lowest in the majors...using the same minimum, he ranks **fourth** in the AL in opponents batting average (.204) and **eighth** in slugging (.317).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-0 with a 2.33 ERA (5 er in 19.1 ip) and .134 (9 for 67) opponents batting average in seven games at home compared to 1-3 with a 1.65 ERA (6 er in 32.2 ip) and .244 (29 for 119) opponents batting average in eight games on the road...is **tied for sixth** in the American League in home wins.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .161 (5 for 31) with runners in scoring position...are 2 for 17 (.118) with RISP and two outs...opponents are 8 for 49 (.163) with four walks (.226 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...five of the six home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...four have been hit by right-handed hitters, as have 21 of 24 in his career...has a .443 career slugging percentage against righties compared to .266 by lefties...has a .161 (14 for 87) opponents average over his first 30 pitches in a game, .242 (24 for 99) after that.

INNINGS PITCHED: Has tossed a career-high 7.0 innings in each of his last two starts...prior to that, he had a streak of 24 consecutive starts from July 15, 2012 to May 30, 2014, in which he tossed fewer than six innings...that was the longest such streak by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914 (previous: Don Wengert, June 25, 1997-May 26, 2001)...had a 20-start stretch of five innings pitched or fewer from Aug. 1, 2012 to May 25, 2014, which was also the longest such streak by a Major Leaguer since at least 1914 (previous: Len Barker, 14 from May 21, 1985-June 10, 1987)...has tossed more than five innings in just nine of his 37 career starts.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-1 with a 0.53 ERA (1 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts on five days rest or more compared to 2-1 with a 2.95 ERA (7 er in 21.1 ip) in four starts on four days rest.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 0.43 ERA (1 er in 21.0 ip) and .141 (10 for 71) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game...has a 3.60 ERA (8 er in 20.0 ip) in innings four through six and a 1.64 ERA (2 er in 11.0 ip) from the seventh inning on.

IN MAY: Went 4-1 with a 2.70 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in six games, including five starts, in May...tied for fourth in the American League in wins in May...had just five wins over the first 42 games of his career.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: First batters faced were 0 for 8 with a walk in his relief appearances this year and he stranded all three of his inherited runners...began his career with 30 consecutive starts before making his final four appearances of 2013 in relief...is 8-16 with a 4.41 ERA (87 er in 170.0 ip) in 37 career starts compared to 1-1 with a 1.45 ERA (3 er in 18.2 ip) in 13 relief appearances.

THIS AND THAT: Has tossed seven innings in each of his last two starts and has a 0.64 ERA (1 er) over that stretch...has a loss and a no decision in those two starts, both 2-1 A's losses...had a career-high 18.0 inning scoreless streak from May 7 to 25...began the streak with three consecutive scoreless starts of exactly 5.0 innings from May 7 to 20...is the first A's pitcher with three consecutive scoreless outings of five or more innings since Ted Lilly (Sept. 10-21, 2003)...allowed three hits or fewer in each of those three starts, joining Steve Ontiveros (June 14-24, 1994) as the only A's pitchers since 1914 with three consecutive scoreless outings of five innings or more and three hits or fewer...had a three-game winning streak from May 7 to 20 and did not allow a run during the streak (15.0 ip)...it marked the first time in his career he put together consecutive wins...now has five wins in 2014 after tallying four wins in 34 games over his first three seasons.

2013 START-BY-START: He combined with Dan Otero and Jim Johnson on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win in the second game of the doubleheader **May 7** against Seattle...it was his first win as a starter since Sept. 26, 2012 against Chicago (NL)...tossed 5.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...won his second consecutive start in the A's 11-0 win over Chicago (AL) **May 13** in Oakland...it marked the first time in his career he has put together back-to-back wins...combined with Dan Otero, Fernando Abad and Joe Savery on a four-hit shutout...tossed five innings and allowed three of the hits while striking out a career-high eight...combined with Dan Otero, Luke Gregerson and Sean Doolittle on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Tampa Bay **May 20**...tossed 5.0 innings and allowed three of the hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Toronto **May 25**...blanked the Blue Jays on two walks over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings...the streak was snapped on a one-out solo home run by Encarnacion in the fourth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-5 win over Los Angeles **May 30** in Oakland...retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced (Iannetta walk) and had a 7-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fourth inning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at New York **June 5**...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 14-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Tuesday...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings for the second consecutive start...shut out the Angels on two hits and two walks over the first five innings...then allowed an unearned run in the sixth when Josh Hamilton had a RBI single following a Donaldson error...the A's tied the game with a run in the eighth to get him off the hook.

LHP Scott Kazmir (7-2, 2.20 ERA): Has allowed one run or fewer in four of his last six starts and is 3-1 with a 1.67 ERA and .195 opponents batting average over that span...is tied for the American League lead in opponents batting average (.211), ranks second in opponents on-base percentage (.263) and slugging percentage (.301), third in ERA (2.20) and tied for seventh in wins (7) and winning percentage (.778)...is 3-1 with a 1.69 ERA in five starts at home compared to 4-1 with a 2.62 ERA in seven starts on the road...has the second lowest home ERA in the American League...has allowed a .125 (7 for 56) batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranks is the lowest in the majors among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 11-1 A's win at Baltimore last Sunday (7.0 ip, 4 h, 2 bb, 7 so)...is 7-7 with a 3.46 ERA in 19 career appearances, including 18 starts, against New York...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 5-2 A's win in 10 innings on June 3 (6.1 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 10 so).

2014 PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

DARIC BARTON

- Made his fourth career Opening Day start at first base March 31 against Cleveland, which matches Jason Giambi for second most in Oakland history...only Mark McGwire, with nine, has more.
- Was batting .158 with five RBI in 30 games when he was designated for assignment May 15...was outrighted to Sacramento May 17.

KYLE BLANKS

- Was acquired from San Diego on May 15 for minor league outfielder Jake Goebbert and a player to be named later (minor league pitcher Ronald Herrera on May 28).
- Hit his first home run of the season May 26 to snap a career-high 49-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on June 16, 2013.

ALBERTO CALLASPO

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.
- Struck out a career-high tying three times May 3 at Boston (third time, first since Sept. 23, 2012 vs. Chicago-AL).

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.
- Had a career-high five RBI May 18 at Cleveland and matched his best with two doubles.
- Matched his career-high with five RBI and nine total bases May 31 against Los Angeles (AL) and had the first three-extra base hit game of his career...had two assists in the second inning to become the first A's outfielder with two assists in an inning since Matt Stairs on April 16, 1996 at Texas...is the first to throw out two runners at home in one inning since Dave Henderson on July 7, 1990 at Cleveland.
- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...all four of his two-homer games have come on the road.

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.
- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.
- Was placed on the DL a second time May 9, retroactive to May 8, with a strained right forearm.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...it was his sixth regular season "walk-off" RBI.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.
- His second at bat May 18 at Cleveland was the 5000th of his career.

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a 0-for-20 streak from April 2 to 6, which was a career high at the time.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.

- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL).
- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 consecutive games from April 6 through the first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, 16 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .387 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his career May 13-16 (also: Aug. 29-31, 2012)
- Scored a career-high four runs May 18 at Cleveland.
- Hit his second career walk-off home run May 28 against Detroit...his other was also against the Tigers (April 12, 2013)...it was his fourth career game-ending RBI.
- Went 0 for 5 June 3 at New York, snapping his 47-game streak of reaching base safely as a third baseman...that was the longest such streak by an Athletics third baseman since at least 1914...it also snapped his streak of 30 consecutive games reaching base safely on the road dating back to Sept. 28 of last year...that was the longest such streak by an Athletic since Mark McGwire had a 55-game streak from Sept. 3, 1995-July 26, 1996.
- Struck out a career-high four times June 7 at Baltimore.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

- Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year...that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was also at Los Angeles on April 9, 2013.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.

- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...became the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego).
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came

on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).

- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
