OAKLAND NOTES

 The Oakland Athletics are now 14-5 in their last 19 games against New York since July 19, 2012...it was the first time the A's scored 10 or more runs against the Yankees since July 1, 2007 at New York...their 42-27 record is their best after 69 games since going 44-25 in 1990.

The A's hit two home runs in today's game...had just one home run over their previous five games after a season-best streak of 16 consecutive games with a
home run.

• Jesse Chavez tossed six innings...allowed one earned run or fewer for the sixth time this season, and the first time since April 30 at Texas.

Coco Crisp (2 for 4, 3 r, hr, 3 rbi, bb, 2 so) is 21 for 61 (.344) with 16 runs, six doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, and 10 walks over his last 17 games.
 Josh Donaldson (1 for 4, rbi) snapped his career-long 0 for 33 hitless streak with an RBI single in the fourth inning.

• Derek Norris (3 for 5, r, 2b, hr, 3 rbi) recorded a career-high tying three hits (fifth time, last: April 30, 2014 at Texas)...hit a three-run home run in the first inning...five of his seven home runs this year have come with at least two men on base.

NEW YORK NOTES

- The New York Yankees went 5-4 on their nine-game road trip to Kansas City (1-2), Seattle (3-0), and Oakland (1-2).
- Vidal Nuno tossed three innings and allowed a career-high eight runs.
- Brett Gardner (1 for 4, r, hr, 2 bi, bb, gidp) grounded into a double play in the third inning...went 250 at bats without grounding into a double play this season, the longest such streak in the American League.
- Derek Jeter (1 for 3, r, 2b, rbi, so, sf) played his final regular season game at the O.Co Coliseum...finishes with a lifetime batting average of .338 (104 for 308) with 17 doubles, three triples, seven home runs, 41 RBI, and 30 walks in 76 regular season games at the Coliseum from 1996-2014.
- **Chiro Suzuki** (2 for 4, r, so) recorded two hits to tie Ken Griffey Jr. for 49th place on MLB's all-time hits list (2,781).
