**June 15, 1957:** The Yankees trade Billy Martin, Woodie Held, Bob Martyn and Ralph Terry to the Kansas City A's for Ryne Duren, Jim Pisoni and Harry Simpson.

**June 15, 1923:** Lou Gehrig makes his Major League debut at 19 years old during a 10-0 win over the St. Louis Browns, entering the game as a defensive replacement at first base.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**June 16, 2007:** The Yankees record only one assist during an 11-8 win vs. the Mets at Yankee Stadium, a 4-3 groundout (Robinson Cano to Miguel Cairo) in the top of the third inning.

**June 16, 1996:** Mel Allen, the "Voice of the Yankees," dies at the age of 83.

**June 16, 1977:** Ron Guidry allows just 3H and 2BB in the first of 26 career shutouts with a 7-0 win over K.C. at the original Yankee Stadium. The game lasts just 2:02.

**AT A GLANCE:** Today the Yankees play the final game of a three-game series at Oakland...are 5-3 thus far on their current nine-game road trip...began the trip 1-2 at Kansas City (with a rainout on 6/9), swept three games at Seattle and are 1-1 at Oakland...went 2-5 on their most recent homestand from 5/30-6/5 (1-2 vs. Minnesota, 0-1 vs. Seattle, 1-2 vs. Oakland)...will have an off day on Monday before beginning a six-game homestand vs. Toronto (6/17-19) and Baltimore (6/20-22).

- ▶ Had their four-game winning streak snapped with Saturday's loss at Oakland...have won four of their last five and six of their last nine.
- ▶ Their four-game winning streak that was snapped last night (with all four wins on the road), was their longest road winning streak since a four-game sweep at Minnesota from 7/1-4/13).
- ▶ Are 16-13 over their last 29G since 5/14 with a 3.29 ERA (263.0IP, 96ER, 240H, 65BB, 245K), marking the third-best ERA in the AL over the stretch and the fifth-best in the Majors.
- ▶ Are 18-11 in their last 29 road games (since 4/20).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** On Saturday, the Yankees lost, 5-1, to Oakland at O.co Coliseum, snapping their four-game winning streak...**Yankees batters** tied their season low with three hits (Gardner-single, McCann-single, Johnson-double) and scored their only run on a throwing error in the third inning...**RHP Hiroki Kuroda** started and allowed 4ER in 4.2IP (5H, 3BB, 3K), taking the loss to fall to 4-5 this season...**CF Jacoby Ellsbury** (0-for-3, 1BB) had his 17-game hitting streak snapped...**3B Kelly Johnson** (1-for-2, 1BB) doubled to lead off the fifth, which was the Yankees' final hit of the game...**LHP David Huff** made his Yankees season debut, allowing 1ER in 3.0IP (3H, 1BB, 1K).



**HOPE WEEK 2014 (June 16-20):** This year marks the fifth anniversary of HOPE Week (Helping Others Persevere & Excel), an initiative rooted in the belief that acts of good will provide hope and encouragement to more than just the recipient of the gesture...each day during the five days of HOPE Week, the Yankees will reach out to an individual, family or organization worthy of recognition and support...activities and outreach in the community is always coupled with recognition at Yankee Stadium during a Yankees game.

- ▶ This year's initiative begins on Monday, 6/16, with a reunion of all prior honorees on the U.S.S. Intrepid Sea, Air and Space Museum, which media is invited to attend (please RSVP to mmargolis@yankees.com)...**Brian Cashman, Mariano Rivera, David Cone, Ivan Nova and Jennifer Steinbrenner Swindal** will all attend and be available to media...information on the history of the initiative is available on yankeespressbox.com.

**DAY OWLS:** The Yankees are 15-7 (.682) in day games this season, marking the second-best such winning pct. in the Majors (S.F., 19-7, .731)...are 20-25 (.444) in night games in 2014...over the last four seasons, are a Major League-best 124-63 (.663) in day games...the Majors' second-best such record over that stretch is Cincinnati's (116-83, .583).

**THEY SAY IT'S YOUR BIRTHDAY:** Today former Yankees **LHP Andy Pettitte** turns 42 years old (DOB: 6/15/72)...tallied a 219-127 record with a 3.94 ERA (2,796.1IP, 1,223ER, 889BB, 2,020K) in 447G/438GS over 15 seasons as a Yankee (1995-2003, '06-10, '12-13)...in franchise history, is first in strikeouts, tied for first in starts, third in wins and IP, and fifth in games pitched.

**SKIPPING 'STONES:** Manager **Joe Girardi** has 599 wins as Yankees manager and needs one win to reach the 600-win milestone with the club...would become the sixth Yankees manager in franchise history to reach the plateau, joining Joe McCarthy (1,460), Joe Torre (1,173), Casey Stengel (1,149), Miller Huggins (1,067) and Ralph Houk (944).

**FOUR SCORE:** The Yankees are 34-7 (.829) in 2014 when holding their opponent to four-or-fewer runs, marking the third-best such record in MLB (Toronto, 36-6, .857; and Texas, 31-6, .838).

**JETER METER:** Over his last five games since Tuesday, **SS Derek Jeter** is 9-for-20 (.450) with 5R, 1 double, 2RBI, 2BB and a .500OBP...had four straight multi-hit games from Tues.-Fri., marking his longest such streak since 7/3-7/12 (also 4G).

**CENTER OF ATTENTION:** **CF Jacoby Ellsbury** had his 17-game hitting streak (5/26-6/13) snapped in Saturday's loss at Oakland...marked the longest by a Yankee since Derek Jeter's 19G hitting streak from 9/4-25/12...was the longest active streak in the Majors at the time it was snapped and tied with three others for the third-longest in the Majors this season...only Colorado's Nolan Arenado (28) and Baltimore's Nick Markakis (18) have had longer streaks in 2014...the *Elias Sports Bureau* noted that it was the longest by a *Yankees centerfielder* since Melky Cabrera in 2007 (18G)...over the span, Ellsbury batted .373 (25-for-67) with 9R, 3 doubles, 2HR, 13RBI, 8BB, 7SB and a .440 OBP...was his longest hitting streak since 6/19-7/11/13 with Boston (19G)...his career best is a 22G streak from 5/2-27/09 w/ Boston...is tied for second in the AL in 2014 with 18SB (Jose Altuve-24, Rajai Davis-18).

- ▶ Has had the game-winning RBI in four straight Yankees games (6/10-13)...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, it was the longest such streak of GWRBI in consecutive team games by a Yankee since Reggie Jackson had a four-game streak from (8/10-12G/77).

**MARKED TERRITORY:** **1B Mark Teixeira** has hit 36HR against the A's, marking his most vs. any opponent and the second-most vs. the A's among active players (Alex Rodriguez-43)...his 20HR at O.co Coliseum are his most in any stadium as a visitor and the second-most at O.co among active players (Rodriguez-21).

**YOUTH SERVED:** The Yankees are 21-8 in games started by rookie pitchers (Tanaka, 11-2; Nuno, 5-5; Whitley, 5-1), including 15-1 on the road (Tanaka, 6-1; Nuno, 4-0; Whitley, 5-0)...Yankees rookie starters have a 2.73 ERA (181.0IP, 55ER)...have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in each of their last 8GS (53.0IP, 11ER, 1.87 ERA).

**ROAD WARRIORS:** The Yankees are 22-16 (.579) on the road this season...are 18-11 (.621) on the road since 4/20, marking the third-highest such winning pct. in the Majors in that span...*in their last 29 road games:*

- ▶ **Yankees pitchers** have posted a 2.72 ERA (261.2IP, 79ER), the lowest mark in the Majors in that span.
- ▶ **Yankees starters** have recorded a 2.93 ERA (175.1IP, 57ER), allowing 3ER or less in 26 of the 29 games over the stretch.
- ▶ **Yankees relievers** have a 2.29 ERA (86.1IP, 22ER) and .197 opponents' batting average (62-for-315).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The Yankees are an MLB-best 19-11 (.633) in games decided by two-or-fewer runs this season.

**POWER BULLPEN:** The **Yankees bullpen** leads MLB with 243K and an average of 10.55K/9.0IP this season (in 207.1IP)...the seven pitchers currently in the Yankees bullpen (Betances, Huff, Kelley, Ramirez, Robertson, Thornton and Warren) own an 11.59K/9.0IP ratio (170K, 132.0IP) with the Yankees in 2014...**RHP David Robertson** is averaging 16.28K/9.0IP (41K, 22.2IP), the best mark in MLB among pitchers w/ at least 20.0IP.

**QUALITY GUY:** With a 10-1 record and 2.02 ERA (93.2IP, 21ER, 74H, 14BB, 103K) in 13GS this season, **RHP Masahiro Tanaka** is tied for the MLB lead in wins with Toronto's Mark Buehrle (10-3)...leads the AL in ERA and is third in the Majors, trailing only San Francisco's Tim Lincecum (1.81) and Cincinnati's Johnny Cueto (1.85)...has recorded quality starts (at least 6.0IP and 3ER or fewer) in each of his 13 starts this season, the longest active streak of its kind in MLB...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, is the fifth pitcher since 1900 to strike out 100 batters over his first 13 Major League games, joining Hideo Nomo (119), Kerry Wood (118), Herb Score (107) and Jose DeLeon (106).

**OUT OF THE BLOCKS:** The Yankees are 13-3 in 2014 when leading after the first inning...are 22-29 in all other games...after three innings, are 31-12 when leading (22-10) or tied (9-2) and 4-20 when trailing at that point.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP VIDAL NUNO (1-2, 4.97 ERA)

**LHP Vidal Nuno** makes his 11th start (14th appearance) of the season today...last started on 6/10 at Seattle, earning a no-decision in a 3-2 Yankees win (5.2IP, 4H, 1R/1ER, 1BB, 2K).

**ROUND TWO:** Started against Oakland on 6/4 at Yankee Stadium, earning a no-decision in a 7-4 Yankees loss (4.2IP, 6H, 2R/2ER, 1HR, 1BB, 5K).

**START ME UP:** Is 2-3 with a 3.69 ERA (70.2IP, 29ER) in 13 career starts, with the Yankees going 7-6 in those games...has recorded at least 5.0IP and allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in seven of his 13 starts...has allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in 10 of his 13 starts.

**#TRENDING:** Has produced a 3.60 ERA (30.0IP, 12ER) in his last five starts, after recording a 4.94 ERA (23.2IP, 13ER) in his first five...has struck out 23 batters and issued only four walks in his last five outings.

**WANNA GET AWAY?:** Is 2-0 with a 1.80 ERA (35.0IP, 7ER) in six career road starts, compared to 0-3 with a 5.55 ERA (35.2IP, 22ER) in seven home starts.

- Has not allowed a home run on the road this season (25.0IP)...no pitcher has thrown more innings on the road this season without allowing a home run (courtesy *Elias*)...dating back to 5/25/13, Nuno has not surrendered a home run in his last 31.0IP on the road (has allowed 11HR at home in that span).
- Has allowed only 1HR on the road in his career (9G/6GS, 36.0IP), a 10th-inning, leadoff, walk-off home run to Nate McLouth on 5/21/13 at Baltimore.

**DON'T LEAVE HOME WITHOUT HIM:** The Yankees are 6-0 in Nuno's six career starts on the road, outscoring opponents by a 32-11 margin in those games.

- Prior to Nuno's current stretch, the Yankees had not won each of a pitcher's first six-or-more road starts with the club since the 1950s, when they went 13-0 in Whitey Ford's first 13 career starts away from Yankee Stadium (1950-53) and 6-0 in Art Schalllock's first six (1951-53).
- Since 1969, only one pitcher has begun his Major League career with a longer such streak (the Mets won each of Dillon Gee's first eight career road starts from 2010-11).

**YOUNG GUNS:** The Yankees are 21-8 in games started by rookie pitchers this season (Tanaka, 11-2; Nuno, 5-5; Whitley, 5-1), including 15-1 on the road (Tanaka, 6-1; Nuno, 4-0; Whitley, 5-0).

- The Yankees have won each of their last five games started by rookie pitchers.
- The Yankees have won each of their last eight road games started by rookie pitchers.
- Yankees rookie starting pitchers have combined for a 2.73 ERA (181.0IP, 55ER) this season.
- Yankees rookie starters have allowed 2ER or fewer in each of their last eight outings (53.0IP, 11ER, 1.87 ERA).

**MATCHING UP:** Left-handed hitters are 2-for-16 (.125) vs. Nuno in his last two starts, after batting .414 (12-for-29) against him in his first 11 appearances of the season.

**STRETCHING OUT:** Has thrown at least 90 pitches in each of his last four starts, including 101 in consecutive outings on 5/24 and 5/30...had thrown 90-or-more pitches only once in his first nine career starts.

**WHO'S REALLY AHEAD?:** Opponents are batting only .218 (12-for-55) against Nuno when they are ahead in the count (1-0, 2-0, 2-1, 3-0, 3-1, 3-2), compared to .299 (50-for-167) when they are behind in the count or when the count is even (0-0, 0-1, 0-2, 1-1, 1-2, 2-2).

- Opponents are batting only .198 (20-for-101) against Nuno with two strikes.
- Opponents are batting .400 against Nuno in counts of 0-0 (8-for-24), 0-1 (16-for-35) or 0-2 (6-for-16).

**THEFT PREVENTION:** Opponents are 1-for-2 against Nuno in stolen base attempts in his career (both in 2014).

- In the Yankees' 6-1 loss to Minnesota on 5/30, a player attempted to steal a base off Nuno for the first time in his career (Danny Santana successfully stole third base in the third inning)...according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, Nuno became the first Yankees pitcher not to allow a stolen base in his first 10 Major League starts since Doug Drabek in 1986 (first 11 starts).

**QUALITY CONTROL:** According to *Elias*, Nuno became the first Yankees pitcher to record at least 5.0IP and allow two-or-fewer runs in each of his first four Major League starts since **Chuck Cary** did so in his first five starts from 6/14-8/3/89...became only the 12th pitcher (and first Yankee) since 1900 to record at least 5.0IP while allowing two-or-fewer runs and five-or-fewer hits in each of his first four Major League starts.

**SUCCESS ALONG THE WAY:** In 2011, combined with short-season Single-A Staten Island and Single-A Charleston to go 7-1 with one save and a 1.38 ERA (65.0IP, 10ER, 66K, 5BB) in 15G/7GS...in 2012, led all Yankees minor leaguers in ERA (2.54) and strikeouts (126), combining to go 10-6 in 31G/21GS with Single-A Tampa and Double-A Trenton...was the recipient of the 2013 "James P. Dawson Award," given annually to the most outstanding Yankees rookie in spring training, after producing a 0.61 ERA (14.2IP, 1ER) in 7G/2GS (10H, 4BB, 13K).
