OAKLAND NOTES

- The Oakland Athletics allowed 14 runs, which is the most runs allowed this season (previous: nine, April 15 at Lost Angeles-AL)...also allowed a seasonhigh 16 hits (previous: 13, April 9 at Minnesota)...allowed six runs in the fourth inning, which is the most runs allowed in a single inning by the A's this season (previous: four, eight times; last: June 13 vs. New York- AL, 8th).
- Drew Pomeranz tossed three and two thirds innings, which is a season low as a starter...allowed a career-high eight runs, and a career-high tying seven earned runs.
- · Fernando Abad allowed his first extra-base hits of the season on back-to-back home runs in the ninth inning.
- John Jaso (1 for 2, r, rbi, bb, so) hit a single in the first inning to snap his 0 for 21 hitless streak, which was the longest hitless streak of his career (previous: 18, Sept. 30, 2010-April 8, 2011).

TEXAS NOTES

- The **Texas Rangers** recorded a season-high tying 14 runs (second time, previous: May 4 at Los Angeles-AL)...hit back-to-back home runs in the ninth inning...it was the second time the Rangers hit back-to-back home runs this season (previous: Fielder, Kouzmanoff, April 15 vs. Seattle).
- Colby Lewis had his 11-game streak of allowing three runs or fewer as a starter at the Coliseum snapped...it was the second-longest such streak for an opposing pitcher in Coliseum history (longest: 12, Bret Saberhagen, 1984-2001).
- Michael Choice (1 for 3, 2 r, hr, 2 rbi, bb, so) snapped his 0 for 16 hitless streak with a two-run home run in the fifth inning.
- Donnie Murphy (2 for 4, 2 r, 2 hr, 3 rbi) snapped his 0 for 14 hitless streak with a two-run home run in the fourth inning... hit a second home run in the ninth inning to record his fourth career multi-homer game (last: August 19, 2013 vs. Washington).
