WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers open a 3-game series in Oakland tonight, the 2nd stop on this 3-city, 9-game trip to the West Coast that continues on to Anaheim...Texas won 2 of 3 in Seattle over the weekend with its 3-game winning streak snapped in a 5-1 defeat on Sunday...was 1st loss since Tuesday vs. MIA...Rangers have lost 5 of 8 and are 6-7 in June but have a 12-11 record beginning May 24...club's 20-27 (.426) mark since 4/25 ranks as 2nd-lowest winning pct. in A.L., ahead of TB (.354, 17-31) and 5th lowest in ML...at 34-35, this marks the 1st time that Texas has not had a winning record through 69 games since 2008 (34-35/35-35 after 70 games)...Texas was last at .500 on 6/7 at 31-31 and was last 2 games under .500 on 6/11 at 32-34...team has been a season high 3 games under .500 on 3 occasions, last at 31-34 on 6/10 and has been season-high 6 games over .500 twice...the series win in Seattle (2-1) was the team's 1st since going 3-1 at MIN, 5/26-29 as club was 0-3-1 in previous 4 series.

STANDINGS: After moving into a tie for 3rd on Saturday, Texas fell back into 4th with Sunday's defeat...club has been in the 4th position for 13 of the last 14 days beginning 6/3...Sunday's loss also dropped the Rangers 8.0 games behind the division-leading A's, which matches the season high (9 total days)...Texas has not trailed by as many as 8.0 games through a season's 1st 69 days since 2006 (-17.5 GB)...prior to this season, Rangers had not been anywhere other than first or 2nd in the division as late as mid-May since 9/22/08 (3rd place).

ON THE ROAD: The Rangers had a 3-game road winning streak end on Sunday which matched their longest road winning streak of 2014 (3rd time)...was the 1st away defeat since 5/31 at WAS...Texas is 18-16 away from home, winning 5 of 8, 8 of 12, and 9 of last 14, the longer span beginning 5/22...the Rangers' .643 (9-5) winning percentage since 5/22 is 7th best in the majors in that period....overall, Texas' .529 away winning percentage is T7th best mark in the A.L....team was also 18-16 after 34 road games a year ago (18-17 after 35)...team is 5-4-0 in last 9 road series, winning 3 of the last 4.

--Texas ranks 2nd in the majors with a .273 batting average (BAL-.280) and its .330 on-base percentage is 3rd best in the A.L....however, the Rangers have just 20 road homers, tying Royals and Yankees for the 2nd fewest in the majors ahead of the Cardinals (19).

VERSUS OAKLAND: Texas is 3-3 vs. the A's this season, winning all 3 at O.co Coliseum, 4/21-23 and losing all 3 at Globe Life Park, 4/28-30...the Rangers have lost 7 of the last 10 to the A's, goining 0-6 at home in that span...Texas is 20-24 in the series since the start of 2012...club has won 3 straight at O.co Coliseum since a loss on 9/4/13...the sweep in April was Texas' 1st here since going 3-0, 8/12-14/11...team is 8-4 in Oakland since start of 2013...all-time, the Rangers lead, 327-316 overall with the A's having a 167-154 advantage here in Oakland.

--the Rangers are hitting just .212 (41-193) with 2 homers and 16 runs scored in the 6 games played vs. the A's in 2014.

AGAINST THE A.L. WEST: Texas opened the season with an 8-2 record against the A.L. West, but has gone 7-10 in the last 17 for a 15-12 overall mark...club has a 9-6 record in A.L. West Division parks.

- --Texas' 27 games to date in its division is the fewest of any of the 5 A.L. West clubs: 41--SEA; 33--HOU; 32--OAK; 31--LAA.
- --This is Texas' 3rd roadtrip that encompasses all 3 A.L. West Coast teams since 2008, 1st since 7/13-22/12.

<u>VERSUS LEFTHANDERS:</u> The Rangers will face lefthhanded starters in each of the 1st 2 games of this series...Only one southpaw has started against the Rangers in last 22 games, Cleveland's T.J. House on 6/9 in Arlington...in their last 2 starts, lefthanders have allowed 13 runs/12 ER in 6.2 innings versus Texas, going 0-1 with a ND...the last LH starter to defeat the Rangers was Dallas Keuchel on 5/13 at HOU...overall, Texas is 8-10 in games started by opposing lefthanders, 5-3 on the road.

- --Texas is batting .28286 (170-601) against lefthanded pitching in 2014, the 3rd highest team average in the majors behind COL (.299) and WAS (.28288)...the Rangers have a ML high .350 OBP vs. southpaws with the 5th best slugging percentage at .428.
- 5th best slugging percentage at .428.
 --Texas has 3 players at .300 or better vs. LH with at least 60 at bats: Alex Rios, 3rd in the A.L. at .417 (25-60), Elvis Andrus at .333 (22-66), and Shin-Soo Choo at .309 (21-68).

<u>PITCHING:</u> The Rangers have posted a 2.05 ERA (8 ER/35.0 IP) over the last 4 games to lower the team's season ERA from 4.60 to 4.46, still the 2nd highest in the majors (COL-4.65)...club matched its season high with 23.0 consecutive scoreless innings from 6/10 (9th) thru 6/14 (4th).

--the rotation has allowed 4 runs in 27.1 innings in the last 4 games to lower its season ERA from 4.69 to 4.45, best since 6/4 (4.40)...Texas has 4 consecutive quality starts (Darvish, Tepesch, Saunders, Martinez) for the 1st time since 5 in a row, 8/26-31/13...the starters worked 20.1 consecutive scoreless innings over 4 games, 6/10-14.

--the Rangers are 2nd in the majors with 13 shutouts, joining the 2014 Cardinals (14) as one of just 9 ML clubs since 1914 to post at least 13 SHO in a season's 1st 67 games...Texas is the 1st A.L. club to accomplish that feat since the 1968 Cleveland Indians...in the 56 games where Texas has allowed at least a run, its team ERA is 5.51.

<u>A PAIR OF FIRSTS:</u> Brad Snyder connected for his 1st major league home run in the 2nd inning on Sunday at the age of 32 years, 20 days...he is the oldest player to hit his 1st big league homer in a Texas uniform since Hector Ortiz, now the organization's minor league catching instructor, went deep at 32 years, 207 days on 5/9/02 vs. CWS...Snyder was 2-for-3 yesterday for his 1st ML multi hit game.

AND A MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: RHP Ben Rowen made his major league debut on Sunday when he retired all 3 Mariners in the 8th inning... Rowen, who was recalled from Round Rock (AAA) on June 10, became the 6th different player to make his ML debut with Texas in 2014 (Martinez, Odor, Robertson, Rosin, Sardinas)...the rest of the team's numbers are below.

JUST THE NUMBERS: The Rangers lead the majors in both overall disabled list uses (20) and current players on DL (14)...the 20 DL uses are already most by the Rangers since 2010 (25) with the club record being 29 in 2004...With Ben Rowen's appearance on Sunday, Texas has used 41 players in 2014, tied for the most in MLB and has employed 23 pitchers (including Mitch Moreland), 2nd behind NYY (24)...Rangers have also used11 rookies, T2nd in MLB (Stats, Inc.)...in 2013, the Rangers used 46 players, 24 pitchers, and 13 rookies over the entire season...Rangers rookie position players have a total of 135 games in 2014, the 3rd most among major league teams behind BOS (167) and ARI (141).

THE CLOSER: Joakim Soria has worked 7.2 scoreless innings with 7 saves in his last 8 games and has a 0.45 ERA (1 ER/20.0 IP) in his last 21 appearances to drop season ERA from 7.20 to 1.80...he is 15-for-16 in save chances, converting the last 7 since blown save on 5/27 at MIN... Soria has converted all 14 career save chances vs. OAK and has held the A's to a .132 average (7-53) over his last 14 appearances against them... he has converted all 11 save tries with a 1.15 ERA (2 ER/15.2 IP) in 15 career games here at O.co Coliseum...Soria has pitched 14.0 scoreless innings in last 13 outings here beginning 5/17/07.

MINOR LEAGUE SIGNINGS: The Rangers have signed 3 non-drafted amateur free agents: RHP Andrew Barnett from Gardner-Webb Univ., LHP Shane McCain from Troy Univ., and 1B Zach Stephens freom Tennessee Tech Univ....Barnett and McCain have been assigned to Spokane (Short A) in the Northwest League with Stephens going to the Arizona Rookie League Rangers.

SHORTS: Rangers catchers have thrown out 18 of 48 runners attempting to steal, a 37.5% success rate that is the highest in the A.L.and 3rd best in the majors,,,Texas is T4th in the A.L. with 68 total double plays turned... Sunday marked the 8th time this season that Rangers batters have not walked, something that occurred just 6 times in all of 2013...Texas was 19-for-95 (.200) with just 6 runs scored in the 3 games in SEA despite going 2-1 in the series...the club is batting .223 (51-229) over the last 7 games.

TONIGHT: The 34-year-old right-hander is slated to make his 12th start in tonight's series opener...pitching on extended 5 days' rest due to Thurs. off day... is 2-3, 6.63 (27 ER/36.2 IP) his last 7 starts to rise from 4.22 to 5.74, opponents hitting .357 (56-157) in that span...took ND in club's 8-5 loss on Tue. vs. MIA (5.0 IP, 7 H, 3 R-ER, 4 BB, 3 SO, 106 pitches/59 strikes)...has permitted at least 7 hits in 7 of his last 8 outings...has departed mid-inning in 8 of his 11 starts... opponents are hitting .336 (82-244), 2nd-highest mark in majors (min. 50.0 IP)... has opened the campaign with 11 consecutive non-quality starts...according to STATS Inc., is first Ranger with 10+ straight non-quality starts in a season since Robinson Tejeda had 13 straight in 2007...last Ranger to open season with 11 straight was Steve Comer in 1980 (11)...has completed 6.0 innings just once, but has finished at least 5.0 innings in 10 of 11 starts...re-signed to a minor league contract with an invite to spring training this past offseason after surgeries on his elbow and hip the past 2 years...Texas' Opening Day starter in 2012, he missed the entire 2013 season on the DL...prior to his 2014 debut on 4/14 vs. SEA, had not pitched in the majors since July 18, 2012 at OAK...underwent season-ending right hip resurfacing surgery on Aug. 22, 2013...also had surgery on July 27, 2012 to repair a torn flexor tendon in his right elbow.

LAST START: Took ND in club's 8-5 loss on Tue. vs. MIA (5.0 IP, 7 H, 3 R-ER, 4 BB, 3 SO, 106 pitches/59 strikes)...gave up a 2-run double to Christian Yelich in the 5th to break 1-1 tie... Texas would take 5-4 lead in the 6th, but bullpen surrendered 4 runs next 2 innings...stranded 8 runners, including the bases loaded in the 1st...suffered a bruised right triceps when struck by Justin Bour's single in the 5th inning, but was removed prior to the 6th due to pitch count and not due to the bruise...issued 4 walks, 2nd-highest total this season

VS. OAKLAND: Is 7-4, 3,10 (40 ER/116.0 IP) in 20 games/18 starts lifetime vs. OAK, most wins, starts and innings pitched vs. any opponent in his career...has limited Oakland hitters to a .213 (91-428) avg....last faced A's on 7/18/12 (5.0 IP, 3 H, 1 R-ER), his final start before missing a season-and-a-half due to multiple surgeries...11 of his 18 career starts vs. OAK have come at the Coliseum...has issued 3-walks-or-fewer in 14 straight starts vs. OAK, 3rd-longest active streak... made 26 appearances (one start) with Oakland in 2007.

AT THE COLISEUM: Is 5-2, 2.45 (19 ER/69.2 IP) in 12 games/11 starts as a visitor at the Coliseum...T7th among active pitchers in road starts here...his 2.50 ERA (19 ER/68.1 IP) as a visiting starter is 6th-lowest among active pitchers with at least 5 road starts here...has permitted 3-runs-or-fewer in all 12 appearances, with his 11-start streak with 3-runs-or-fewer the 2nd-longest as a visiting starter in the venue's history (12, Bret Saberhagen, 1984-2001)...last 6 starts here: 3-1, 2.27 (10 ER/39.2 IP), 6 BB and 33 SO.

ROAD WARRIOR: Loss on 5/30 at WSH (5.2 IP, 6 R-5 ER) snapped career-long-tying 3-start road win streak...also snapped streak of 8 consecutive road starts with 3 ER-or-fewer, T13th-longest such streak in club history...has gone 25-27, 4.57 (197 ER/387.2 IP) over 66 career road starts...prior to that 3-start road win streak, had claimed a victory in just one of his previous 8 road starts...has permitted 2 ER-or-fewer in 7 of last 9

GETTING OVER THE HUMP: Has completed 6.0 innings just once, but has made it at least 5.0 innings in 10 of 11 starts...leads the majors with 10 starts of 5.2-IP-or-less, 2nd-highest single-season total of his career (16, 2003)...has completed 6.0 innings-or-less in all 11 starts this season and 12 straight dating back to 2012, the longest streak of his career.
