# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (42-28) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (35-35)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 2-2 over the last four games, 6-6 over the last 12 games and 12-12 over the last 24 games...however, are 42-28 for the season, which is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco, 43-27)...it is the A's best record after 70 games since the 1992 club was also 42-28 (won game 71)...are in sole possession

of first place in the American League West for the 50<sup>th</sup> consecutive day (since April 28) and have held at least a share of first for 54 consecutive days (since April 24) and 64 of the last 66...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...have 63 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have a 4½ game lead over Los Angeles in the West, which is one game short of the season-high of 5½ (last on June 6)...have owned the best record in the AL every day since May 31.

**PITCHING:** The A's allowed 14 runs last night, which were their most in a game since a 22-9 loss at New York (AL) on Aug. 25, 2011...that was 425 games ago...13 of the runs were earned, which upped the A's season ERA .14 runs to 3.02...that is the first time it has been 3.00 or higher since May 12 (3.04)...also had season-highs last night in runs in an inning (6), hits (16) and home runs (4)...**lead the majors** in ERA (3.02), opponents batting average (.229) and on-base percentage (.292) and rank second in slugging percentage (.346)...also lead the majors with a .201 (106 for 528) opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...have issued the third fewest walks in the American League (198) and are tied for the third most shutouts (7).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 9-9 with a 3.51 ERA (55 er in 141.0 ip) over the last 23 games but are 29-17 with a 3.06 ERA (144 er in 423.2 ip) for the season...have the fewest losses in the majors and the second lowest ERA (St. Louis, 3.03)...are tied for second in the American League in complete games (2) and rank fourth in innings pitched (423.2).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have 18 runs, 27 hits and four home runs over the last two games after tallying 14 runs, 32 hits and one home run over the previous five contests...**lead the majors** in runs scored (359) and walks (296), rank second in on-base percentage (.335), third in home runs (81), sixth in slugging (.411) and eighth in extra base hits (215).

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have three three-run home runs in the last two games and lead the majors with 42 home runs with runners on base...also top the majors with four grand slams...have 81 home runs for the season, which ranks second in the American League and third in the majors...the pitching staff has allowed six home runs in the last two games after yielding just one over the previous six contests...have surrendered 59 home runs for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...only 19 of those have come with runners on base, which is second fewest in the majors (St. Louis, 17).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed a season-high tying three errors last night (third time)...now have 11 errors in the last seven games and 52 for the season, which is third most in the American League...however, have just 18 unearned runs, which is tied for second fewest in the AL (Baltimore, 14)...A's outfielders have 13 assists in the last 23 games and 20 for the season, which is **tied for the most in the majors** (Arizona, New York-NL).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this 10-game homestand against New York-AL (2-1), Texas (0-1) and Boston (four games)...went 5-2 on the last homestand and are 19-14 (.576) at home for the season, which is the third best home record in the American League...have won 13 of the last 18 home games after losing six straight...this homestand is the second of three 10-game homestands this year...the last time the A's had at least three 10-game homestands in one season was in 2002 when they had four...are batting .263 (293 for 1122) with 45 home runs in 33 games in Oakland compared to .240 with 36 home runs in 37 games on the road...went 5-4 on the last road trip to New York-AL (2-1), Baltimore (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2)...it marked their 10<sup>th</sup> consecutive road trip with a .500 or better record, which is the A's longest such streak since an 11-trip

streak from June 26, 1989-July 11, 1990...have not finished a road trip with a losing record since going 2-5 at Texas and Seattle June 17-23, 2013...are 23-14 (.622) on the road for the season, which is the second best mark in the majors (San Francisco, 20-12).

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 7 for their last 11 (.636) with two walks and four RBI...lead the American League in pinch walks (14), are tied for the lead in doubles (4), rank second in hits (17), extra base hits (5), on-base percentage (.432) and plate appearances (74), tied for second in RBI (11) and third in batting (.293) and slugging (.414).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's are 38 for 46 (82.6%) in stolen base attempts, which is the third best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 41 of their 47 (87.2%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Cubs, 90.9%)...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 12-17 in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 30-11 in games decided by three runs or more...are 7-4 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning wins and are tied with the Dodgers and Mets for the most extra inning games...have the third best extra inning record in the American League...are 11-8 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the AL in last at bat wins and rank second in last at bat games (Boston, 20)...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (8) and are tied with Milwaukee for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (4)...have four walk-off wins, which is tied for third in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 70 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the second longest single-season streak in Oakland history...the record is a 73-game streak to start the 1984 season...the A's have outscored the opposition by 126 runs, which is more than double next closest team (San Francisco, 54) and more than triple the next closest American League team (Toronto, 39)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973 (first All-Star Game was in 1933)...the A's are 8-6 in June...went 16-12 in May after going 18-9 in April...have now posted a winning record in 12 consecutive months dating back to June of 2012...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 10 minutes...the Oakland record is 3:08 in 2000.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have five players on the disabled list (Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Pomeranz, Reddick)...Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...O'Flaherty is on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 10 times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's trail in the season series, 3-4...are 0-4 in Oakland and 3-0 in Texas...have won each of the previous two season series after losing five of the previous six...are 24-21 over the last three years...are 316-328 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 167-155 in Oakland and 149-173 in Texas...have an all-time record of 413-410 against the Rangers/Senators.

# TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Coco Crisp** is batting .396 (21 for 53) with 16 runs, six doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, 11 walks (.500 on-base percentage) and six multiple hit games over his last 15 games...**Sean Doolittle** has a 20.1 innings scoreless streak, which is a career-high and the second longest active streak in the AL.

# THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1967 the A's and Tigers set an American League record for longest doubleheader with a combined time of nine hours and five minutes...the first game includes a rain delay and the second goes 19 innings before Dave Duncan homers for a 6-5 win...in 1988 Stan Javier's RBI single in the bottom of the 14th inning leads the A's to a 7-6 win over Texas...the A's would play three extra inning games in the this three game series with the Rangers...in 1996 Terry Steinbach hits a grand slam in the 10th inning as the A's defeat Detroit, 8-4.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Tommy Milone (4-3, 3.47 ERA)

**FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK:** Is 4-0 with a 2.00 ERA (10 er in 45.0 ip) and .229 (39 for 170) opponents batting average over his last seven starts...the winning streak is one short of his career high of five (Sept. 19, 2012-April 15, 2013)...it matches the A's season high...went 0-3 with a 5.86 ERA and .274 opponents average over his first five starts...has 30 strikeouts and nine walks over his last seven starts after tallying 16 strikeouts and 12 walks over his first five starts.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA (7 er in 32.2 ip) and .210 (25 for 119) opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland compared to 2-3 with a 4.73 ERA (21 er in 40.0 ip) and .274 (45 for 164) opponents batting average in eight starts on the road...has allowed six of his eight home runs on the road...last year, he went 5-4 with a 3.44 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 7-5 with a 4.69 ERA in 16 games on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 14-8 with a 2.84 ERA (63 er in 199.1 ip) in 32 games in Oakland compared to 15-14 with a 4.75 ERA (116 er in 219.2 ip) in 39 games on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-1 with a 3.10 ERA (17 er in 49.1 ip) in eight starts at night compared to 1-2 with a 4.24 ERA (11 er in 23.1 ip) in four starts during the day...has yielded four home runs in 49.1 innings at night, four home runs in 23.1 innings during the day...in three seasons with the A's, he is 22-12 with a 3.55 ERA (114 er in 289.1 ip) in 49 games at night, 7-10 with a 4.51 ERA (65 er in 129.1 ip) in 22 starts during the day.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .217 (13 for 60) batting average with runners in scoring position...last year, opponents hit .216 with RISP, which ranked eighth in the American League...has held the opponents number three, four and five hitters to a .144 (14 for 97) batting average...has yielded three home runs to the number nine hitter in the order, which is the most in the majors...has issued 18 of his 21 walks and allowed six of his eight home runs this year to right-handed hitters...has yielded 27 of his 33 home runs over the last two years to righties.

**THE FIRST INNING:** Has allowed eight runs in the first inning for a 6.00 ERA (12.0 ip)...has a 2.30 ERA (12 er in 47.0 ip) in innings two through five and a 5.27 ERA (8 er in 13.2 ip) from the sixth inning on...has issued seven of his 21 walks in the first inning.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-1 with a 2.61 ERA (11 er in 38.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest compared to 2-2 with a 4.41 ERA (17 er in 34.2 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Has received two runs of support or fewer in six of his 12 starts and is 0-3 in those games...is 4-0 in six starts with support of three or more runs...is 6-19 in 36 career starts with support of two runs or fewer, 24-3 in 38 starts with support of three runs or more...has received no run support in his three losses this year...last year, he received just 10 runs of support in his nine losses (1.78 RSA)...has received just 22 runs of support in his 22 losses in three seasons with the A's (124.2 ip, 1.59 RSA).

**THIS AND THAT:** Has left with the lead in three of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (Gregerson each time)...is averaging 93.1 pitches per games, which is sixth fewest in the American League...the A's are 6-6 (.500) in his starting assignments this year and are 42-27 (.609) in his career...his teams are 46-27 (.635) in his 74 career starts.

2014 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss at Seattle April 11...left after five innings trailing 5-0 and Hernandez shutout the A's three hits over the first seven innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 16...left with a 4-1 lead but Gregerson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Texas April 22 in Oakland...walked a career-high tying four batters...left after six innings with a 4-3 lead but Gregerson allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss at Houston April 27...McHugh shutout the A's on one hit over the first eight innings before Callaspo had a RBI single in the ninth...fell to 0-3 in the A's 6-3 loss at Boston May 3...matched his career-highs by walking four batters (sixth time) and allowing three home runs (fourth time)...combined with Fernando Rodriguez on a three-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Washington *May 9* in Oakland...tossed eight innings and allowed two of the hits, both to Hairston...also walked three batters but allowed just two base runners as far as second base...had a no decision in the A's 4-2 loss to Chicago (AL) *May 14* in Oakland...allowed a home run to Beckham on the first pitch of the game but blanked the White Sox on four hits and a hit batter after that...left after six innings with the A's lead 2-1 but Gregerson allowed

a three-run home run in the eighth inning for the blown save...he extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 3-2 win at Tampa Bay May 21...the A's scored twice in the second and once in the fourth and he blanked the Rays on three hits over the first five innings...allowed a RBI single to Loney and was relieved by Rodriguez with runners on first and second and two outs...Rodriguez allowed one of the inherited runners to score...combined with Otero and Doolittle on a five-hit shutout in the A's 10-0 win over Detroit *May 26* in Oakland...tossed 6.2 innings and allowed four of the hits...allowed just two runners as far as second base: a Romine double in the third and a leadoff double by Cabrera in the fourth...had a no decision in the A's 11-3 win over Los Angeles *May 31* in Oakland...allowed two hits in the first inning and four in the second but did not allow a run...surrendered his only runs on a three-run home run by Cowgill in the fourth...retired each of the final seven batters he faced and left after six innings trailing 3-1...the A's scored six times in the seventh and four times in the eighth for the win...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 4-3, 11-inning win at Baltimore June 6...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Schoop in the second...also yielded a leadoff home run to Davis in the fourth and a solo home run to Machado in the fifth...left after six innings with the A's trailing 3-2 but Oakland tied the game in the eighth.

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-1 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Wednesday...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Hamilton in the fourth inning...that was the only run he would allow in 6.2 innings and the A's scored three times in the sixth to give him the win.

MILONE vs. TEXAS: Is 1-4 with a 4.97 ERA (38.0 ip, 49 h, 28 r, 21 er, 7 bb, 22 so, 6 hr) in seven career starts...is 0-1 with an 8.38 ERA (9 er in 9.2 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 1-3 with a 3.72 ERA (12 er in 29.0 ip) in five starts in Texas...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 5-4 A's loss in Oakland April 22...walked a career-high tying four batters...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Murphy RBI single and a Chirinos bases loaded walk...the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first but he allowed a run in the third when Rios scored on a Kouzmanoff grounded into double play...the A's then scored twice in the fourth to take the lead...left after six innings with a 4-3 lead but Gregerson allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save...was 1-2 with a 8.36 ERA (14.0 ip, 23 h, 13 r, 13 er, 2 bb, 8 so, 3 hr) in three starts last year.

# TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (6-3, 2.93 ERA): Has lost each of his last two starts (6.35 ERA), marking the first time he has lost consecutive decisions in his career...is 1-2 with a 5.63 ERA and .283 opponents batting average over his last four starts...ranks sixth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.324), ninth in ERA (2.93) and opponents batting average (.227) and 10<sup>th</sup> in opponents on-base percentage (.294)...opponents are batting .153 with a double and a home run (.200 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the batting average and slugging percentage are the lowest in the majors...is 5-1 with a 2.38 ERA in six starts against American League West competition compared to 1-2 with a 3.40 ERA in eight starts against everyone else...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-0 A's loss to New York on Friday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...is 1-1 with a 1.69 ERA in two career starts against Texas, both this year.

- The A's bullpen is third in the American League in ERA (2.94) and has the third most wins (13)...ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.289) and slugging percentage (.319), and second in opponents batting average (.224).
- Has the second lowest save percentage (59.1%) and is tied for the second fewest saves (13)...however, is six for seven (85.7%) in save chances since May 16 after converting just seven of its first 15 (46.7%) save opportunities this season

LAST 32 STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 14 starts this year and 16 of his last 32 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 15-7 with a 2.59 ERA (55 er in 191.0 ip) and .224 (160 for 714) opponents batting average over that stretch...has walked 44

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 4-0 with a 1.09 ERA (5 er in 41.1 ip) in six starts during the day compared to 4-2 with a 2.89 ERA (15 er in 46.2 ip) in eight starts at night...ranks second in the American League in day ERA...is now 9-2 with a 2.34 ERA (25 er in 96.1 ip) in 16 starts during the day over the last two years and 9-9 with a 3.97 ERA (66 er in 149.2 ip) in 27 starts at night.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA (2 er in 19.1 ip) in three starts in June...went 2-2 with a 2.67 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in five starts in May after going 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Gray, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...of those six, only Cahill was undefeated (Cahill started the season 6-0)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...his last four-win month was June of 2010 with Los Angeles (AL)...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history.

**GO THE DISTANCE:** Tossed his second career complete game May 28, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit in Oakland...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game *April* 2...tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut...combined with Abad, Otero, Gregerson and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle *April* 13...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed two of the hits but had a no decision as the A's scored twice in the eighth and once in the ninth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 win at Texas *April* 29 to start a season 4-0 for the first time in his career...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-2 loss to Seattle *May* 5....that snapped a careerhigh tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2013 (also

May 10-June 6, 2008)...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings...struck out 56 and walked just 10...had a no decision in the A's 6-2 win at Cleveland *May 17*...tossed just 1.1 innings, which was the shortest outing of his career...was ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second...tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit *May 28* in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...allowed a solo home run to Hunter with two outs in the fourth inning...had a no decision in the A's 5-2, 10-inning win at New York *June 3*...struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings, his 22<sup>nd</sup> career 10-strikeout game.

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.
- · Had a career-high five RBI May 18 at Cleveland and matched his best with two doubles.
- Matched his career-high with five RBI and nine total bases May 31 against Los Angeles (AL) and
  had the first three-extra base hit game of his career...had two assists in the second inning to become
  the first A's outfielder with two assists in an inning since Matt Stairs on April 16, 1996 at Texas...
  is the first to throw out two runners at home in one inning since Dave Henderson on July 7, 1990
  at Cleveland.
- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...all four of his two-homer games have come on the road.

#### **RYAN COOK**

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.
- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.
- Was placed on the DL a second time May 9, retroactive to May 8, with a strained right forearm.

- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL).

#### SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- · Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

#### **CRAIG GENTRY**

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one
  in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment
  before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

#### **LUKE GREGERSON**

• Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

#### A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was also at Los Angeles on April 9, 2013.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at
  Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four
  times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least

- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.

#### JIM JOHNSON

· Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

#### **ARNOLD LEON**

 Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

#### **JOSH LINDBLOM**

 Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

#### **JED LOWRIE**

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.

#### **BRANDON MOSS**

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with
  eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556
  on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one
  triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the
  mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.

#### **DEREK NORRIS**

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

#### **JARROD PARKER**

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was
  performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy
  John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).
