OAKLAND ATHLETICS (44-28) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (34-38)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and four of the last five games to move to a season-high 16 games over .500 at 44-28...that is the best record in the majors and the best by an A's team after 72 games since the 1990 club was 46-26 (won game 73)...this is the third time this year the A's have

owned the best record in the majors (May 21 and 22)...have held the best record in the American League every day since May 31...entered play today with a five-game lead in the AL West, which is $\frac{1}{2}$ -game short of the season high of 5½ (last on June 6)...the last time the A's had a lead greater than 5½ games before the All-Star Break was in 1988 when they led by as many as 11 games on June 4...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 52nd consecutive day (since April 28) and have held at least a share of first for 56 consecutive days (since April 24) and 66 of the last 68...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 11 minutes...the Oakland record is 3:08 in 2000.

OFFENSE: The A's have 32 runs, 51 hits and five home runs over the last four games after tallying 14 runs, 32 hits and one home run over the previous five contests...**lead the majors** in runs scored (373), walks (305) and on-base percentage (.337), rank third in home runs (82), sixth in slugging (.413) and eighth in extra base hits (221).

THE LONG BALL: Four of the A's last five home runs have been three-run shots and five of the last seven have come with at least two men on base...lead the majors with 43 home runs with runners on base and four grand slams...have 82 home runs overall, which ranks second in the American League and third in the majors...the pitching staff has allowed seven home runs in the last four games after yielding just one over the previous six contests...have surrendered 60 home runs for the season, which is tied for the fewest in the AL and tied for fifth fewest in the majors...only 19 of those have come with runners on base, which is second fewest in the majors (St. Louis, 17).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 8 for their last 14 (.571) with two doubles, a home run, seven RBI and two walks...lead the American League in pinch walks (14) and RBI (14)...the walks rank third in the majors and the RBI are sixth...are tied for the AL lead in doubles (4) and extra base hits (6), rank second in hits (18), on-base percentage (.429), slugging percentage (.459) and plate appearances (77) and third in batting (.295).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 35 runs in six games on the homestand for a 5.33 ERA (32 er in 54.0 ip) after yielding 25 runs in nine games on the last road trip (2.21 ERA)...that has upped the season ERA .20 points to 3.03, which is still the **lowest in the majors**...also lead the majors in opponents batting average (.229) and on-base percentage (.291) and have the second lowest slugging percentage (.345)...have issued the third fewest walks in the American League (201) and are tied for the third most shutouts (7).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 11-9 with a 3.51 ERA (60 er in 153.2 ip) over the last 25 games but are 31-17 with a 3.07 ERA (149 er in 436.1 ip) for the season...have the fewest losses in the majors and the second lowest ERA (St. Louis, 3.00)...are tied for second in the American League in complete games (2) and rank fourth in innings pitched (436.1).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last six games (eight errors total), including a season-high tying three Monday night against Texas (third time)...now have 13 errors in the last nine games and 54 for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...however, have just 19 unearned runs, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...A's outfielders have 13 assists in the last 25 games and 20 for the season, which is tied for the most in the majors (Arizona, New York-NL).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have outscored the opposition by 132 runs, which is more than double next closest team (San Francisco, 47) and more than triple the next closest American League team (Los Angeles and Seattle, 36)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973 (first All-Star Game was in 1933).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-2 on this 10-game homestand against New York-AL (2-1), Texas (2-1) and Boston (four games)...went 5-2 on the last homestand and are 21-14 (.600) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the American League (Cleveland, 22-12)...have won 15 of the last 20 home games after losing six straight...are batting .269 (317 for 1178) with 46 home runs in 35 games in Oakland compared to .240 with 36 home runs in 37 games on the road...went 5-4 on the last road trip to New York-AL (2-1), Baltimore (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2)...are 23-14 (.622) on the road for the season, which is the best road record in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 40 for 48 (83.3%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Washington, 84.2%)...opponents have been successful in 42 of their 48 (87.5%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Cubs, 91.0%)...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 13-17 in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 31-11 in games decided by three runs or more...are 7-4 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning games...have the third best extra inning record in the AL...are 11-8 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the AL in last at bat wins and rank second in last at bat games (Boston, 21)...lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven innings (8) and are tied with Milwaukee for the lead in wins when trailing after eight innings (4).

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 10-6 in June...went 16-12 in May after going 18-9 in April...have now posted a winning record in 12 consecutive months dating back to June of 2012...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972.

NO ROOKIES: The A's are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 72 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest single-season streak in Oakland history...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the longest seasonopening streak by a Major League team since the 2005 Cleveland Indians went the first 82 games without playing a rookie.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Pomeranz, Reddick)...Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...O'Flaherty and Reddick are on rehab assignments...have used the DL 10 times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's trail in the season series 1-2 after losing two of three in Boston in May...the two clubs split the season series last year, 3-3...each team won two of three games in its home ballpark...the A's have won 12 of the last 17 games against the Red Sox after losing seven of the previous eight...have won eight of the last nine and 13 of the last 16 in Oakland...since 2006, the A's have won three season series, lost two and split three...are 39-34 over that span, which includes 25-10 in Oakland, 13-23 at Fenway and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 231-280 since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 137-115 in Oakland, 93-164 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 873-1061 against the Red Sox

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting .386 (22 for 57) with 17 runs, six doubles, two home runs, nine RBI and 11 walks over his last 16 games...**Sean Doolittle** has a 22.1-inning scoreless streak, which is a career-high and the longest active streak in the American League...**Derek Norris** leads AL catchers with a .308 (45 for 146) batting average and is tied for the lead in home runs (7) and RBI (29).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1979** Wayne Gross, Dave Revering and Mike Heath hit consecutive homers in the fourth inning of the A's 6-5 win against Kansas City...Gross, Mike Edwards and Revering also turn a triple play, the second of the A's major league recording tying three triple plays in 1979...in **2003** Miguel Tejada ties an Oakland record with five hits as the A's defeat Texas, 9-2.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (8-2, 2.05 ERA)

RECENTLY: Is 3-0 with a 0.95 ERA (3 er in 28.1 ip) over his last four starts and has allowed two runs or fewer in each start...has allowed one run or fewer in five of his last seven starts and is 4-1 with a 1.44 ERA (7 er in 43.2 ip) and .188 (29 for 154) opponents batting average over that span.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League in opponents batting average (.206), ranks second in ERA (2.05), third in opponents slugging percentage (.294) and opponents on-base percentage (.262) and tied for third in wins (8) and winning percentage (.800)...also has the highest run support (6.75), ranks second in fewest pitches per inning (14.7), fifth in fewest pitches per game (93.0), tied for fifth in complete games (1) and wild pitches (6) and ninth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.51).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-1 with a 1.45 ERA (7 er in 43.1 ip) in six starts at home compared to 4-1 with a 2.62 ERA (13 er in 44.2 ip) in seven starts on the road...has the lowest home ERA in the American League and third lowest in the majors...has walked five batters in 43.1 innings at home and 15 in 44.2 innings on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .117 (7 for 60) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is the lowest mark in the majors among pitcher that qualify for the ERA title...opponents are 1 for 25 (.040) with RISP and two outs...has not walked a batter to lead off an inning and is the only pitcher in the majors who has not walked a batter with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...opponents are batting .239 (21 for 89) with a .256 on-base percentage (two hit batters) and .284 slugging percentage (four doubles) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is sixth lowest in the AL...has yielded a .187 (47 for 252) average against right-handers compared to .279 (19 for 68) against left-handers...the mark against righties ranks fifth lowest in the AL...has surrendered all five of his home runs this year and 21 of his 24 over the last two years to righties...four of the home runs this year have been solo shots as have 17 of his 24 over the last two years.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 5-0 with a 2.18 ERA (8 er in 33.0 ip) in five starts on four days rest compared to 3-2 with a 1.96 ERA (12 er in 55.0 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more.

LAST 32 STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 14 starts this year and 16 of his last 32 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 15-7 with a 2.59 ERA (55 er in 191.0 ip) and .224 (160 for 714) opponents batting average over that stretch...has walked 44

home runs (0.57 per nine innings).

over that stretch...has walked 44 [_______] (2.07 per nine innings) and struck out 179 in 191.0 innings (8.43 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.07...has yielded just 12

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-0 with a 1.09 ERA (5 er in 41.1 ip) in six starts during the day compared to 4-2 with a 2.89 ERA (15 er in 46.2 ip) in eight starts at night...ranks second in the American League in day ERA...is now 9-2 with a 2.34 ERA (25 er in 96.1 ip) in 16 starts during the day over the last two years and 9-9 with a 3.97 ERA (66 er in 149.2 ip) in 27 starts at night.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA (2 er in 19.1 ip) in three starts in June...went 2-2 with a 2.67 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in five starts in May after going 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Gray, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...of those six, only Cahill was undefeated (Cahill started the season 6-0)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...his last four-win month was June of 2010 with Los Angeles (AL)...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history.

THIS AND THAT: Has eight wins, which is his second best total before the All-Star Break in his career (10 in 2006)...the A's are 12-2 (.857) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his 14 starts...has not allowed a run four times.

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his second career complete game May 28, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit in Oakland...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game April 2 ... tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut...combined with Abad, Otero, Gregerson and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle April 13 ... tossed 6.0 innings and allowed two of the hits but had a no decision as the A's scored twice in the eighth and once in the ninth...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 win at Texas April 29 to start a season 4-0 for the first time in his career...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-2 loss to Seattle **May 5**...that snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2013 (also May 10-June 6, 2008)...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings...struck out 56 and walked just 10...had a no decision in the A's 6-2 win at Cleveland **May 17**...tossed just 1.1 innings, which was the shortest outing of his career...was ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second...tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit *May 28* in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...allowed a solo home run to Hunter with two outs in the fourth inning...had a no decision in the A's 5-2, 10-inning win at New York *June 3*...struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings, his 22nd career 10-strikeout game.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win over New York last Saturday in Oakland...retired the first eight batters he faced...had a 2-0 lead when he was charged with his only run in the third inning when Johnson walked, went to third on a Gardner single and scored on a Parrino error.

KAZMIR vs. BOSTON: Is 8-8 with a 4.04 ERA (144.2 ip, 136 h, 71 r, 65 er, 80 bb, 149 so, 16 hr) in 26 career starts...the starts and losses are his most against any team...that includes 6-5 with a 3.89 ERA (38 er in 88.0 ip) in 16 starts at Fenway Park and 2-3 with a 4.29 ERA (27 er in 56.2 ip) in 10 starts in his home ballparks...made one start last year with Cleveland, a no decision in a 7-4 loss at Boston May 25...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a Ciriaco RBI single in the second...had a 3-1 lead before allowing a run on an error in the fourth...left with a 3-2 lead but Shaw allowed a run in the sixth for the blown save.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brad Mills (0-0, --- ERA): Will be selected from Triple-A Sacramento tomorrow to make his 2014 debut...was acquired from Milwaukee on Tuesday in a minor league trade for cash considerations...went 4-2 with a 1.56 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...the ERA is the lowest in the Pacific Coast League and second lowest among all full season minor leaguers (Daniel Winkler of Tulsa, 1.41)...also ranks third in the PCL in strikeouts (77) and opponents batting average (190)...walked just 18 batters for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.28...surrendered five home runs in 75.0 innings, an average of 0.60 per nine innings...was the losing pitcher in his last minor league start, a 2-1 Sounds loss to Tacoma on Saturday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...his last major league appearance was a start and win for the Los Angeles Angels on July 8, 2012 in a 6-0 decision over Baltimore (5.0 ip, 3 h, 6 so)...is 0-0 with a 10.50 ERA in three career appearances, including one start, against Boston, all while pitching for Toronto.

- Has allowed 17 runs (16 earned) over its last six games (19.2 ip, 7.32 ERA) after posting a 0.72 ERA over its previous 12 games (3 er in 37.1 ip)...has allowed five home runs in the last four games after giving up 11 home runs over its first 66 games this season.
- The A's bullpen is third in the American League in ERA (2.95) and has the third most wins (13) ... ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.286) and slugging percentage (.317), and second in opponents batting average (.222).
- Has the third lowest save percentage (60.9%) and the third fewest saves (14)...however, is seven for eight (87.5%) in save chances since May 16 after converting just seven of its first 15 (46.7%) save opportunities this season
- Has issued the fewest walks (70) and has allowed the fourth fewest home runs (16) among AL bullpens.

FRIDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brad Mills (0-0, --- ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was acquired from Milwaukee on Tuesday in a minor league trade for cash considerations...spent the entire season at Triple-A Nashville where he was 4-2 with a 1.56 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts...was selected from Triple-A Sacramento today and added to the 40-man roster.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 4-2 with a 1.56 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...the ERA is the lowest in the Pacific Coast League and fourth lowest among all full season minor leaguers...also ranks third in the PCL in strikeouts (77) and opponents batting average (.190)...walked just 18 batters for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.28...surrendered five home runs in 75.0 innings, an average of 0.60 per nine innings.

LAST FIVE STARTS: Allowed one earned run or fewer in each of his last five starts but was just 1-2 despite a 0.87 ERA (31.0 ip, 20 h, 7 r, 3 er, 9 bb, 40 so).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .190 batting average, including .190 (40 for 211) against right-handed hitters compared to .193 (11 for 57) against left-handers...surrendered four of his five home runs to righties...four were solo shots...opponents batted .157 with four walks (.213 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...yielded a .193 batting average with runners in scoring position.

MONTH BY MONTH: Has lowered his ERA each month of the season...went 2-0 with a 2.95 ERA in five games in April, 2-0 with a 1.16 ERA in six starts in May and was 0-2 with a 1.00 ERA in three starts in June before the trade...struck out 43 batters in 38.2 innings in May, which led all minor league pitchers...his 1.16 ERA that month tied for 11th in the minors.

THIS AND THAT: Was 1-1 with a 0.75 ERA in five games during the day compared to 3-1 with a 1.94 ERA in nine games at night...did not allow a home run and issued just one walk while striking out 26 in 24.0 innings during the day...allowed just one run over the first two innings of a game (0.38 ERA)...had a 2.12 ERA from the third inning on...the Sounds were 7-5 (.583) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in eight of his 12 starts, allowed six hits or fewer 11 times, one run or fewer eight times and two walks or fewer nine times...was 0 for 15 with 12 strikeouts as a hitter.

SINCE APRIL: Is 4-4 with a 3.75 ERA (20 er in 48.0 ip) and .284 (54 for 190) opponents batting average in eight starts in May and June after going 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...has 37 strikeouts in 48.0 innings in May and June after fanning 41 in 38.0 innings in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .190 (24 for 126) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .283 (58 for 205) against lefthanders...has issued just five of his 21 walks to righties for a .222 onbase percentage...the on-base percentage against right-handers is third lowest in the American League and the batting average ranks sixth...over the last two years, he has held right-handed hitters to a .200 (45 for 225) batting average...has issued 30 of his 41 walks over that stretch to lefties.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed six home runs in his last seven starts (42.1 ip) after allowing three home runs over his first seven starts (43.2 ip)...has allowed nine home runs for the season, eight of which have been solo shots.

AS A STARTER: Has made 14 appearances this year, all starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 6-5 with a 3.61 ERA (38 er in 94.2 ip) in 16 career starts compared to 9-14 with a 5.30 ERA in 189 relief appearances...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 10-4 (.714) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 12 of his 14 starts and allowed two runs or fewer eight times...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk...began the season with four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...all four of his two-homer games have come on the road.

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.
- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a 0-for-20 streak from April 2 to 6, which was a career high at the time.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL).
- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 consecutive games from April 6 through the first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, 16 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .387 on-base percentage) during the streak.

JIM JOHNSON

· Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

ARNOLD LEON

• Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLOM

• Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- •Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).

- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
