AMAZING ENDING: The Red Sox won 2-1 in 10 innings over the Twins at Fenway Park yesterday...The Sox fell behind 1-0 in the top of the 10th before David Ortiz and Mike Napoli hit back-to-back homers, just the 2nd and 3rd hits of the game, to walk off with the win in the 10th inning.

- According to Elias, it was the 3rd time the Sox have walked off on back-to-back homers, also 6/14/99 vs. MIN (Darren Lewis, Jeff Frye HRs in the 9th) and 7/3/40 vs. PHA (Ted Williams, Jimmie Foxx in the 9th).
- The Red Sox became the 1st team in MLB history to win on back-to-back home runs in extra innings after being shut out through the game's first 9 innings.
- Elias says it was also the 1st time the Red Sox ever hit back-to-back homers in extra innings with one to tie the game and the other to win it...The last MLB team to do it was the 1996 Reds (Eric Anthony, Eric Davis).

SWEEP STUFF: Yesterday's win finished a 3-game sweep over which Boston outscored Minnesota, 5-2...The 5 runs were the Sox' fewest ever in a sweep of 3+ games (Elias).

STATE OF THE SOX: Boston has won 3 straight games for the 1st time since a season-long 7-game win streak, 5/26-6/1...The Sox have also taken 5 of their last 7 and 6 of their last 9...They are 7-4 (.636) beginning on 6/8, 3rd best in the AL in that time behind KC (1.000, 9-0) and NYY (.667, 6-3).

- The Sox are in 4th place in the AL East, 6.5 games back in the division, and 4.0 games back in the race for the AL's 2nd Wild Card playoff berth.
- Boston is 30 days and 29 games (14-15) into a stretch from 5/20-6/25 in which the club plays 36 games in 37 days...Their only off-day in this time was on 6/5.

LEFT IS RIGHT: This year the Red Sox are 13-11 (.542) when facing a lefty starter and 21-27 (.438) when opposing a righty, but Boston has lost its last 4 games facing lefties and has won 5 of its last 6 against right-handed starters.

RAZOR THIN: Each of the Red Sox' last 5 games have been decided by 1 run, winning the last 3 after dropping the first 2...This is Boston's longest string of 1-run games since 5 in a row from 4/23-27/10 (4-1)...They last played more consecutive 1-run games with 6 in a row, 5/17-23/64 (STATS).

- Boston has played an AL-high 26 1-run games this year, going 11-15 in those games...The Sox' 15 1-run losses are the most among AL teams.

LOW SCORES AT FENWAY: The Sox went 5-2 on their recently-completed homestand, allowing just 13 runs all series (10 ER) in those 7 games...The 13 runs are the fewest runs allowed by the Red Sox in a homestand of at least 7 games since 9/26-10/2/78 (8 runs in a 7-game homestand).

HOMETOWN TURNAROUND: Boston has won 10 of its last 12 home games beginning on 5/28 after a 10-17 start to the home slate...The Sox are now 20-19 at Fenway Park, above .500 at home for the 1st time this year.

- Boston has allowed just 19 total runs and 16 earned runs in 112.0 innings over those 12 home games beginning on 5/28 (1.29 ERA, 77 H, 25 BB, 111 SO).
- The last 12 home games have improved the club's season ERA at home from 4.23 to its current 3.32, 3rd best in the AL behind only OAK (3.26) and SEA (3.30).
- Sox hurlers have given up no more than 3 runs in 12 straight home games, the club's longest such streak since 12 straight at home 99 years ago, 8/3-16/1915.

BACK ON THE ROAD: The Sox open a season-long-tying 10-day, 11-game road trip tonight with the 1st of 7 games on the west coast against OAK (4 G) and SEA (3 G)...After an off-day next Thursday, they close it out with 3 at NYY.

- This road trip completes a 28-day, 26-game stretch (6/2-29) over which the Sox were slated for only 7 games in Boston, all in the just-completed homestand.

FACING THE A'S: Today Boston and Oakland continue their 7-game season series with the 1st of a 4-game set at O.co Coliseum...The Sox took 2 of 3 at Fenway from 5/2-4.

- Boston is looking for its 1st series win in Oakland since taking 3 of 4 to open the 2008 season (1-1 in Tokyo, 2-0 in Oakland)...The Sox last won a road series of at least 2 games here taking 2 of 3 from 7/24-26/06.

SCORING CHANGES: On 6/10 at BAL, Nick Markakis hit a foul ball in the 9th inning that was originally ruled as a dropped foul ball error on A.J. Pierzynski...That has since been changed to a no-play, removing the error.

- On 6/13 vs. CLE, Mike Napoli hit a single in the 7th inning in which Dustin Pedroia moved from second to third base, then scored on an error by David Murphy...The error has been removed, giving Napoli an RBI on the play and now 500 RBI in his major league career.

ON THE OFFENSE: Despite ranking 3rd in the AL in walks (263) and 4th in times on base (898), the Sox offense is averaging 3.9 runs per game, ahead of only TB (3.6) in the AL.

- The Sox are seeing 4.04 pitches/PA, 2nd most in the majors to MIN (4.08).

PITCHING IN: With a 1.36 ERA (10 ER/66.0 IP) over the last 7 games, Boston now ranks 3rd in the AL with a 3.62 ERA overall in 2014, trailing OAK (3.03) and SEA (3.29), Boston's first 2 opponents on the current road trip.

- Boston has received a season-high 7 straight quality starts...The club's 43 quality starts overall this year are tied with KC for 3rd in the AL behind only OAK (47).
- Boston has the fewest blown saves in the AL (6) and the AL's 2nd-best relief ERA at 2.80 (SEA, 2.70).

KOJI AND FLASH: Koji Uehara has converted all 15 save chances this season and each of his last 31 in the regular season beginning on 7/9/13, the longest active streak in MLB and the 2nd-longest in Red Sox history behind Tom Gordon's AL-record 54 straight from 4/19/98-5/31/99.

- Despite allowing a run yesterday, he ranks 2nd among AL relievers with a 0.83 ERA (3 ER/32.2 IP), better than his 1.09 ERA in 2013, which topped MLB relievers.

BURKE ROLLING: Burke Badenhop, amidst a career-best 16.0-inning scoreless streak, has gone 30.1 consecutive IP without allowing an earned run (1 run allowed in that stretch, which began with his 2nd inning of work on 4/18)...According to Elias, it is the 3rd-longest streak without an earned run as a reliever in Red Sox history.

BROCK STARS: Brock Holt's .329 AVG leads all major league rookies (min. 125 PA) and ranks 2nd among AL batters with at least 125 PA.

- Holt has reached safely in 24 of 27 starts as Boston's leadoff hitter and has a .333 AVG (40-for-120) from the top spot...He leads the majors with 38 hits since being installed as the leadoff hitter on 5/23.

REHAB UPDATES: Clay Buchholz, on the 15-day DL since 5/28 (retro to 5/27) with a hyperextended right knee, made his 2nd rehab start today with Triple-A Pawtucket at Rochester (MIN) and went 6.0 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 5 SO on 87 pitches.

- Will Middlebrooks, on the 15-day DL since 5/17 with a fractured right index finger, and Shane Victorino, on the 15-day DL since 5/24 with a right hamstring strain, have both played 3 games on rehab stints with the PawSox...Middlebrooks has gone 3-for-10 with a walk and 2 runs scored, and Victorino has gone 0-for-6 with a run scored.

TONIGHT'S START:

- ⚡ Making his 7th road start of the season, going 1-2 with a 5.40 ERA (22 ER/36.2 IP) in his previous 6 outings on the road...Has lost each of his last 4 decisions beginning on 5/1 (G1), a 5th would match the longest losing streak of his career (6/6-7/21/06 with SD).
- ⚡ Since starting the season 1-0 with a 2.87 ERA (10 ER/31.1 IP) over his 1st 5 starts, he is 0-4 with a 5.46 ERA.
- ⚡ Making his 15th start of the season, joining Jon Lester and John Lackey as the only BOS pitchers to make every start this year.
- ⚡ Has averaged 3.19 runs of support this year, the 2nd-lowest rate among qualifying AL pitchers behind BAL's Ubaldo Jimenez (2.61).
- ⚡ 8 of his 14 outings this season have been quality starts and has gone at least 6.0 innings in 12 of those starts.
- ⚡ **Last start:** Tied his season low for the 4th time, holding CLE to 1 run over 6.0 innings on 6/14, but did not factor in the decision as the Red Sox lost, 3-2...It marked his fewest runs allowed in a start since also allowing 1 run on 4/25 at TOR...Gave up 7 hits and 2 walks while striking out 5.

VS. THE ATHLETICS:

- ⚡ Tossed a 3-hit, complete game shutout in his last appearance against the A's on 4/23/12 while with CWS...It was his only career appearance at O.Co Coliseum...Has a 1.80 ERA (3 ER/15.0 IP) in 2 career starts against OAK.

RECENT HIGHLIGHTS:

- ⚡ Issued 1 or no walks in 5 straight starts from 5/18-6/9, tying the longest such streak of his career for the 5th time.
- ⚡ Tossed 8.0 innings of 3-run ball on 5/29 vs. ATL, his longest outing since throwing a complete game on 8/25/13 at LAD.
- ⚡ Picked up 1st win of season on 4/25 at TOR after matching his season low for the 3rd time with 1 run allowed over 7.0 innings...Had 7 SO and walked 2.
- ⚡ Struck out 8 batters in back-to-back games from 4/9-15, marking the 1st time he had at least that many SO in consecutive games since he did it in 2 straight games from 4/14-20/13 with CWS.
- ⚡ Allowed 3 runs or less in 6 of his 1st 7 starts of the year from 4/4-5/7, going 1-1 with a 3.09 ERA (15 ER/43.2 IP) and held opponents to a .215 AVG.
- ⚡ Did not earn a decision in his 1st 4 starts of the year from 4/4-20 despite posting a 3.33 ERA (9 ER/24.1 IP) with 25 strikeouts.

CAREER NOTES:

- ⚡ Has recorded 1,936 SO over his big league career which is 7th most among active players and ranks 85th on MLB's all-time list.
- ⚡ Won the National League Cy Young Award in 2007 after receiving all 32 first-place votes from the BBWAA...Marked the 12th time that award winner was selected unanimously.
- ⚡ Has been selected to 3 All-Star teams for his career, twice with the Padres (2005, 2007) and once with the White Sox (2012)...Won his 1st career Gold Glove Award in 2012 with CWS.
- ⚡ Began his professional career with San Diego where he remains the franchise's all-time leader in strikeouts (1,348).
