Career Highlights

- In 2nd year with Red Sox after signing a 1-year contract on 5/21/14...Helped Boston to the 2013 World Series title as the primary SS in his 1st season with the team.
- Is the younger brother of former Red Sox OF and 14-year major league veteran J.D. Drew...Marks the 11th time a set of brothers have both played for the Red Sox...Wears the same No. as J.D. (7)...Also has an older brother, Tim, who pitched for parts of 5 seasons in the majors...All 3 brothers were 1st-round selections.
- A 1st-round selection of the D-backs in the 2004 draft, spent entire professional career with ARI until being traded to OAK on 8/20/12...Has appeared in 936 career big league games over the last 8 seasons from 2006-13.
- All 916 of his career appearances in the field have come at SS and his .979 fielding pct. ranked 5th among active SS with at least 500 games played from 2006-13.
- Owns the D-backs' franchise record for games played at SS (753)...Also still ranks among ARI all-time leaders in triples (1st, 52), doubles (3rd, 176), hits (3rd, 776), games (5th, 773), AB (4th, 2,917), and extra-base hits (4th, 300).
- Has hit at a .400 clip (10-for-25) in his career as a pinch-hitter.
- Finished with the 2nd-most triples in the NL on 3 occasions (2008, 2009, and 2010)...His 49 triples since the start of 2008 rank 6th in the majors...Has finished among the top 5 players in triples in the AL or NL 4 of the last 6 years.
- Is 1 of 3 players to have 3 seasons with at least 20 doubles, 10 triples and 10 home runs since 2008 (2008-10), along with current Red Sox Shane Victorino and TOR's Jose Reyes.
- Ranks 4th among primary ML SS over the past 6 seasons (2008-13) with a .441 SLG (min. 1,500 PA)... Among that group, has the 3rd best SLG (.463) and OPS (.813) against righties, with only Tulowitzki (.518 SLG, .878 OPS) and Ramirez (.505 SLG, .879 OPS) ahead of him.
- Named D-backs' 2008 Player of the Year by the Arizona chapter of the BBWAA...That year, became the 3rd SS in ML history with at least 40 doubles (44), 10 triples (11), and 20 home runs (21) in a season, joining Nomar Garciaparra (BOS, 1997) and Hall of Famer Robin Yount (MIL, 1980 and 1982).
- Became 3rd D-backs player ever to hit for the cycle on 9/1/08 vs. STL...Marked the 1st cycle at Chase Field.
- His teams have reached the postseason 3 times...He started at SS in all 7 of the D-backs' postseason games in 2007 (NLDS and NLCS), all 5 of the A's postseason contests in 2012 (ALDS), and all 16 postseason games in the Red Sox' run to the 2013 World Series title.
- Hit at a .500 clip (7-for-14) with 2 homers and 4 RBI in ARI's 3-game sweep of the Cubs in the 2007 NLDS.
- Started at SS in all 16 of the Red Sox' 2013 postseason games and made just 1 error in 70 chances for a .986 fielding percentage...Homered in World Series clinching Game 6, becoming the 2nd Red Sox SS ever to hit a home run in the Fall Classic, along with Rico Petrocelli in 1967.

2013: Won the World Series title as the team's primary SS in his 1st season with BOS.

- Played in 124 regular season games, all at SS...Made 122 starts at the position...His .443 SLG was best single-season mark by a primary Red Sox SS (min. 425 PA) since Nomar Garciaparra in 2003 (.524).
- Matched single-season career high with 67 RBI (also 2008)...Also matched career marks for go-ahead RBI (16, 3rd time, last 2009) and game-winning RBI (10, also 2008).
- Recorded 5th career double-digit HR season (13) and 1st since 2010 (15).
- Finished T-3rd in the AL with 8 triples.
- Drew 54 walks, 2nd most as a SS in the AL...His 67 RBI ranked 2nd in AL as a SS behind BAL's J.J. Hardy (76) and his 13 HR were T-3rd in that group...His 10 game-winning RBI and 16 go-ahead RBI led the AL as a SS.
- Had a .306 AVG/.376 OBP/.571 SLG/.946 OPS batting with 2 out, including a .311 AVG (19-for-61), .639 SLG, and 1.022 OPS in 2 out RISP situations.
- Hit .316 (18-for-57) in Interleague play, including 6-for-9 (.667) against his former team, the Diamondbacks.
- Hit .284 (82-for-289) with 9 homers vs. RHP compared to .196 (30-for-153) with 4 homers vs. LHP...Posted career bests

in SLG (.498) and OPS (.876) vs. RHP.

Had 2 walk-off hits, both in extra innings, his most game-ending RBI in a single season...Was the 1st Red Sox SS with multiple walk-off RBI in a season since Orlando Cabrera had 2 in 2004, and the 1st Sox SS with 2 extra-inning walk-off RBI in a season since Nomar Garciaparra had 2 in 1997.

Finished 2nd among AL qualifiers at SS with a .984 fielding percentage (8 E/516 TC), trailing only TB's Yunel Escobar (.989)...His 8 errors were his fewest in his 5 seasons with at least 100 games.

From 6/18 through the end of the season, hit .283 (70-for-247) with 19 doubles, 5 triples, 8 homers, and 39 RBI in 68 games...Before that point, had a .215 AVG (42-for-195) over his 1st 56 contests.

Beginning 7/27 through the end of the season, led ML primary shortstops with a .513 SLG and .879 OPS, and was tied in that group with 35 RBI...Hit .292 (57-for-195) with 15 doubles, 2 triples, 8 homers, 28 runs, and 24 walks in that time.

Began season on the 7-day concussion DL after suffering a concussion in his 6th Grapefruit League game, 3/7 vs. MIN (hit on the helmet by a pitch).

Activated 4/10 after a 4-game rehab stint with Double-A Portland from 4/4-8 (2-for-13, 2B, HR, 3 RBI).

Reached in a season-high 13 consecutive games from 4/24-5/9.

Had a season-high-tying 4 hits on 5/6 vs. MIN, including a game-tying solo homer in the 7th and a walk-off RBI double in the 11th...Was his 1st walk-off hit since 4/17/12 for ARI vs. SF.

Knocked 2nd career grand slam on 5/15 at TB off Jamey Wright (also 4/28/11 vs. CHC off Ryan Dempster).

Tallied a season-high-tying 4 hits and a season-high 3 XBH (2 2B, HR) on 6/4 vs. TEX, his most XBH in a game since 8/25/10 for ARI at SD (2 2B, 2 HR).

Went 3-for-5 with 2 homers on 7/27 at BAL...Was his 2nd career multi-homer game, also 8/25/10 for ARI at SD (2 HR)...Tied a career high with 5 RBI, also 4/28/11 for ARI vs. CHC.

Reached in 27 of 30 games from GM 2 of a 6/18 doubleheader through 8/11 (.336, 36-for-107, 8 2B, 3 3B, 4 HR, 18 RBI, 14 BB)...His .960 OPS from 6/18-8/11 ranked 5th among AL batters with at least 100 PA during that stretch.

Tallied season-long 12-game hitting streak from 7/31-8/11 (.422, 19-for-45, 3 2B, 2 HR, 9 RBI, 9 BB)...Was his longest since a 12-gamer from 7/3-8/5/10 with ARI, and the longest as a Red Sox SS since Alex Gonzalez hit in 12 straight games from 8/26-9/8/09.

With the Sox trailing 5-4, hit a go-ahead 3-run homer in the top of the 9th inning for a 7-5 win on 8/7 at HOU...Was his 1st go-ahead shot in the 9th inning or later since 2008 with ARI.

Doubled off Max Scherzer and scored winning run on Middlebrooks' single in the 5th inning of a 2-1 win, 9/3 vs. DET.

Reached in all 4 PA on 9/4 vs. DET, going 2-for-2 with a double, home run, and 2 walks.

Reached in 12 of his last 14 games beginning 9/11, hitting .321 (17-for-53) with 8 RBI in that time.

POSTSEASON: Started at SS in all 16 of BOS' postseason games en route to the World Series title...Went 6-for-54 (.111) at the plate, but committed just 1 error in 70 total chances (.986 fielding pct.)...Homered in clinching Game 6 of the World Series, becoming the 2nd Red Sox SS to go deep in the Fall Classic (Rico Petrocelli, Game 6 in 1967).

2012: Named Limited to 79 games after beginning season on the 15-day DL while recovering from right ankle surgery...After spending entire pro career with ARI, traded to OAK at the end of August and helped the A's win the American League West championship.

Went 4-for-6 (.667) with 7 RBI with the bases loaded between the 2 stops.

Posted .383 AVG (18-for-47) in 11 games against AL East opponents, tops among all major Leaguers with at least 50 PA against that division.

Hit .293 (27-for-92) with 7 of his 13 doubles and 3 of 7 home runs when leading off an inning...Batted at a .333 clip (17-for-51) with 4 doubles and 2 homers in those situations with the A's.

Went deep in consecutive games twice, including his 1st 2 homers of the year, 8/5 at PHI and 8/7 at PIT, and 9/15-16 vs. BAL.

Missed ARI's first 73 games while recovering from surgery on fractured right ankle (137 games total after sustaining the injury on 7/20/11)...Played 11 rehab games between Double-A Mobile and Triple-A Reno from 6/7-25 before coming off the DL on 6/27.

Started 36 of ARI's 48 games at SS before being traded to the A's on 8/20 in exchange for minor league INF Sean Jamieson...After reporting to OAK on 8/21, started 39 of the A's last 41 games at SS, helping the team to the AL West title...Knocked 5 home runs with OAK, including 4 roundtrippers in 16 tilts at O.co Coliseum.

Tallied a .315 mark (17-for-54) over his final 13 games beginning with a season-best 8-game hitting streak from 9/21-28 (.429, 15-for-35).

Collected a pair of 4-hit games over a 5-game stretch on the A's final road trip...Went 4-for-8 with a double, home run, RBI and career-high tying 3 runs in the A's 14-inning, 10-9 loss at NYY on 9/22...Went 4-for-5 in a 9-3 win at TEX on 9/26...Marked his 11th and 12th career games with at least 4 hits.

POSTSEASON: Started at SS in all 5 of the A's ALDS contests vs. DET...Hit safely in 3 of the 5 games.

2011: Played in 86 games before suffering a season-ending right ankle injury in July.

☞ Drove in game-winning run with a 12th-inning single on 4/17 vs. SF...Hit 1st-career grand slam and drove in a career-high 5 runs on 4/28 vs. CHC...Knocked the slam off Ryan Dempster.

☞ Suffered a fractured right ankle on a slide into home plate on 7/20 vs. MIL...Underwent surgery on the ankle on 7/21, performed by Dr. Peter Mitchell.

2010: Established career highs in OBP (.352), stolen bases (10), and walks (62)... Tied career best with 12 triples, 2nd-most among NL leaders.

☞ Hit Was 1 of 4 Major Leaguers to reach double-digits in doubles, triples, and home runs (33/12/15), joining Carl Crawford (TB), Jose Reyes (NYM), and Shane Victorino (PHI).

☞ Hit 3 leadoff home runs: 8/25 at SD, 9/22 vs. COL, and 9/29 at SF.

☞ Edged by the Rockies' Troy Tulowitzki (.98357) for the NL lead with a club-record .984 (.98352) fielding percentage at SS (10 E in 607 TC).

☞ Hit 1st career inside-the-park home run on Opening Day (4/5) vs. SD...Joined brother, J.D. (1999) as 1st pair of siblings to have hit inside-the park homers since George (1984) and Juan Bell (1992) (Elias)...The ITPHR marked the 6th in club history (2nd at Chase Field).

☞ Surpassed Tony Womack (487) for most games played by a D-backs SS on 4/6 vs. SD.

☞ Reached base safely in a career-high 22 straight games from 7/23-8/15 (.256, 20-for-78, 14 BB).

☞ Hit the last of 4 consecutive homers in the 4th inning on 8/11 at MIL, tying a major league record (7th time)...A Drew was involved in 3 of the 7 total times (also J.D. on 9/18/06 vs. SD and 4/22/07 vs. NYY).

☞ Recorded 1st career multi-homer game on 8/25 at SD, going 4-for-4 with 2 doubles and 2 homers.

2009: Was 1 of only 2 major leaguers (also PHI's Shane Victorino) to record double-digits in doubles (29), triples (12), and home runs (12).

☞ Set a career-high and tied for 2nd in the majors with 12 triples, trailing only Victorino's 13...Ranked 3rd in the NL with a ratio of 133.3 at-bats per GIDP.

☞ On DL from 4/26 (retro to 4/25) to 5/11 with a strained left hamstring.

☞ Tallied a season-high 14-game hit streak from 5/26-6/10 (.344, 21-for-61), his 2nd-longest career streak behind a 17-gamer in 2008.

2008: Named the D-backs' Player of the Year by the Arizona chapter of the BBWAA after becoming the 3rd SS in ML history with at least 40 2B (44), 10 3B (11), and 20 HR (21) in a season, joining Nomar Garciaparra (BOS, 1997) and Hall of Famer Robin Yount (MIL, 1980 and 1982).

☞ Set career highs in AVG (.291), homers (21), doubles (44), extra-base hits (76), RBI (67), runs (91), games (152), and hits (178)...Ranked among NL leaders in triples (T-2nd), doubles (T-4th), extra-base hits (T-8th), and hits (T-8th).

☞ Was 1 of 3 major leaguers to reach double-digits in doubles (44), triples (11), and home runs (21), joining DET's Curtis Granderson and NYM's Jose Reyes...Became 2nd player in D-backs history to accomplish the feat (also Steve Finley in 1999 and 2003).

☞ Batted .360 (27-for-75) during a career-high 17-game hitting streak from 7/29-8/15.

☞ Became 3rd D-backs player to hit for the cycle on 9/1 vs. STL, going 5-for-5 with 2 doubles, a triple and a home run...Established a career high and tied a team record (12th time) with 5 hits...Was the 1st cycle at Chase Field.

2007: Spent 1st full season at the big league level with the D-backs.

☞ Went 9-for-9 in stolen base attempts, tied with BOS's Jacoby Ellsbury for most SB without being caught.

☞ Made 1st Opening Day start at SS.

☞ Hit 1st career walk-off home run, a 2-run shot off Trevor Hoffman in the 9th of a 3-2 win on 4/25 vs. SD.

POSTSEASON: Started at SS in all 7 of the D-backs' playoff games during the NLDS vs. CHC and NLCS vs. COL... Hit safely in each of the 7 contests, batting .387 (12-for-31) with 6 runs, a double, triple, 2 home runs and 4 RBI...

Went 7-for-14 (.500) with all of his extra-base hits and RBI in 3-game NLDS sweep against the Cubs...Had 2 hits in Games 1 and 2 and then went 3-for-5 with a double and a home run in Game 3...Batted .294 (5-for-17) in 4 NLCS games when the Diamondbacks were swept by the Rockies.

2006: Made major league debut in July in just 2nd professional season.

☞ Led all D-backs hitters with at least 200 PA with a .316 AVG (66-for-209), the 3rd-best clip among all ML rookies with at least 200 PA.

☞ Appeared in 83 games with Triple-A Tucson before being recalled to ARI on 7/15 for the remainder of the season... Made ML debut that night vs. MIL with a start at SS (0-for-3).

☞ Singled off Aaron Sele on 7/17 vs. LAD for 1st ML hit...Knocked 1st home run on 7/31 at CHC (off Glendon Rusch).

☞ Rated by *Baseball America* as the Pacific Coast League's Best Defensive SS following the season...Entered the year ranked as the 5th-best prospect in baseball (No. 1 in D-backs' system), according to *Baseball America*.

2005: Combined to hit .320 (80-for-250) with 21 doubles, 14 home runs, and 52 RBI in 65 games with High-A Lancaster and Double-A Tennessee.

☞ Played in 19 games with Camden of the Independent Atlantic League before signing with D-backs on 5/31.

☞ Selected as the ARI farm system's Player of the Month for July, batting .393 (46-for-117) with 7 homers and 28 RBI for Lancaster...Homered in 4 consecutive contests (5 total) from 7/5-8.

☞ Played for the Arizona Fall League-champion Phoenix Desert Dogs, batting .337 (30-for-89) with 6 home runs and 17 RBI in 23 games...Selected as a SS on the AFL All-Star Team...Ranked among AFL leaders in triples (T-1st, 4), SLG (3rd, .738), runs (T-3rd, 25), OBP (4th, .439), and extra-base hits (4th, 17).
