OAKLAND ATHLETICS (46-28) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (34-40)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four straight and six of the last seven games to improve to a season-high 18 games over .500 at 46-28...that is the best record in the majors and the best by an A's team after 74 games since the 1990 club was 47-27 (won game 75)...have owned the best record in the majors each of the last three days and five days this year (also May 21-22)...lead the American League West by a season high six games for the second consecutive day...that is the largest lead in the majors and the A's largest lead before the All-Star Break since 1988 when they led by as many as 11 games on June 4...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 54th consecutive day (since April 28) and have held at least a share of first for 58 consecutive days (since April 24) and 67 of the last 69...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...have 67 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have held the best record in the AL every day since May 31...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 10 minutes...the Oakland record is 3:08 in 2000.

OFFENSE: The A's lead the majors in runs scored (381), walks (313) and on-base percentage (.338), rank third in home runs (84), sixth in slugging (.411) and eighth in extra base hits (224).

THE LONG BALL: Five of the A's last seven home runs have been three-run shots and six of the last nine have come with at least two men on base...lead the majors with four grand slams and rank second with 44 home runs with runners on base (Toronto, 45)...have 84 home runs overall, which ranks second in the American League and third in the majors...the pitching staff has allowed eight home runs in the last six games after yielding just one over the previous six contests...have surrendered 61 home runs for the season, which is tied for the fewest in the AL and tied for sixth fewest in the majors...only 20 of those have come with runners on base, which is second fewest in the majors (St. Louis, 18).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have outscored the opposition by 135 runs, which is more than triple the next closest team (San Francisco, 44)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973 (first All-Star Game was in 1933)...the last team with a run differential greater than 127 at the All-Star Break is Seattle in 2001 (149).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 8 for their last 15 (.533) with two doubles, a home run, seven RBI and two walks...lead the American League in pinch walks (14) and are tied for the lead in RBI (14)...the walks rank third in the majors and the RBI are tied for sixth...are tied for the AL lead in doubles (4) and extra base hits (6), rank second in hits (18), on-base percentage (.423), slugging percentage (.452) and plate appearances (78) and fourth in batting (.290).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 39 runs in eight games on the homestand for a 4.50 ERA (36 er in 72.0 ip) after yielding 25 runs in nine games on the last road trip (2.21 ERA)...that has upped the season ERA .17 points to 3.00, which is still the **lowest in the majors**...also lead the majors in opponents batting average (.227) and on-base percentage (.290) and have the second lowest slugging percentage (.343)...have issued the third fewest walks in the American League (206).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 32-17 with a 3.08 ERA (153 er in 447.1 ip)...have the fewest losses and lowest ERA in the majors and are tied for third in wins...are tied for second in the American League in complete games (2) and rank fourth in innings pitched (447.1).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 15 errors in the last 11 games and have 55 for the season, which is second most in the American League...A's outfielders have 14 assists in the last 27 games and 21 for the season, which is second most in the majors (Arizona, 22).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 6-2 on this 10-game homestand against New York-AL (2-1), Texas (2-1) and Boston (2-0)...went 5-2 on the last homestand and are 23-14 (.622) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors (Cleveland, 23-12)...are

17-5 over the last 22 home games after starting the season 6-9...are batting .267 (331 for 1238) with 48 home runs in 37 games in Oakland compared to .240 with 36 home runs in 37 games on the road...went 5-4 on the last road trip to New York-AL (2-1), Baltimore (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and are 23-14 (.622) on the road, which is the second best road record in the majors (Milwaukee, 25-15)...begin an eight-game road trip to New York-NL (two games), Miami (three games) and Detroit (three games) on Tuesday.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 43 for 51 (84.3%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Washington, 86.4%)...opponents have been successful in 42 of their 48 (87.5%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Cubs, 91.0%)...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's improved to 12-8 in games decided in the last at bat with the win last night...are tied with Milwaukee and Miami for the Major League lead in last at bat wins and rank second in the American League in last at bat games (Boston, 22)...have won each of their last three games by two runs or fewer but are 15-17 in those games for the season...are 31-11 in games decided by three runs or more...are 7-4 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning wins and are tied with the Dodgers and Mets for the most extra inning games...have the third best extra inning record in the AL.

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 12-6 in June, which is the second best record in the majors (Kansas City, 13-5)...went 16-12 in May after going 18-9 in April...have now posted a winning record in 12 consecutive months dating back to June of 2012...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972.

NO ROOKIES: The A's are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 74 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest single-season streak in Oakland history...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the longest season-opening streak by a Major League team since the 2005 Cleveland Indians went the first 82 games without playing a rookie.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Pomeranz, Reddick)...Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...O'Flaherty and Reddick are on rehab assignments...have used the DL 10 times this year after using it 13 times last year.

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's lead the season series, 3-2...have won the first two games in Oakland after losing two of three in Boston in May...the two clubs split the season series last year, 3-3...each team won two of three games in its home ballpark...the A's have won 14 of the last 19 games against the Red Sox after losing seven of the previous eight...have won 10 of the last 11 and 15 of the last 18 in Oakland...since 2006, the A's have won three season series, lost two and split three...are 41-34 over that span, which includes 27-10 in Oakland, 13-23 at Fenway and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 233-280 since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 139-115 in Oakland, 93-164 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 875-1061 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting .387 (24 for 62) with 17 runs, six doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI and 12 walks over his last 18 games...**Sean Doolittle** has a 23.1-inning scoreless streak, which is a career-high, the longest active streak in the American League and the seventh longest by a reliever in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** Vida Blue improves his record to 15-2 and strikes out 13 as the A's defeat the Twins at Minnesota, 3-2...in **2000** Eric Chavez becomes the first player to hit for the cycle in the Coliseum as the A's defeat Baltimore, 10-3...at the age of 22 years, 197 days, Chavez becomes the eighth youngest player in major league history to hit for the cycle...in **2002** Billy Koch records the save in the A's 5-3 win at Cincinnati, making him the first pitcher in Oakland history with five saves in five consecutive team games.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (6-4, 2.93 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks ninth in the American League in ERA (2.93)...is also third in highest run support (6.28)...opponents have reached base on an error seven times, which is second most (Kuroda, NYY 8).

CAREER BESTS: Won his sixth game of the season in his last start, which is a new career high (previous: 5 in 2010)...had just nine wins in 191 career appearances entering the season...also has career highs in strikeouts (78), innings pitched (86.0) and games started (14) and his 2.93 ERA is nearly a run lower than his previous best of 3.92 last year.

SINCE APRIL: Is 4-4 with a 3.75 ERA (20 er in 48.0 ip) and .284 (54 for 190) opponents batting average in eight starts in May and June after going 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...has 37 strikeouts in 48.0 innings in May and June after fanning 41 in 38.0 innings in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .190 (24 for 126) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .283 (58 for 205) against left-handers...has issued just five of his 21 walks to righties for a .222 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage against right-handers is the lowest in the majors and the batting average ranks ninth...over the last two years, he has held right-handed hitters to a .200 (45 for 225) batting average...has issued 30 of his 41 walks over that stretch to lefties.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are hitting .203 (14 for 69) with runners in scoring position, which ranks ninth in the American League...they are 4 for 30 (.133) with RISP and two outs...has walked just three batters to lead off an inning...has a .328 (20 for 61) opponents batting average in the first inning, .230 (62 for 270) after that...the opponents number three hitter is batting .395 (15 for 38) with three home runs.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed six home runs in his last seven starts (42.1 ip) after allowing three home runs over his first seven starts (43.2 ip)...has allowed nine home runs for the season, eight of which have been solo shots.

AS A STARTER: Has made 14 appearances this year, all starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 6-5 with a 3.61 ERA (38 er in 94.2 ip) in 16 career starts compared to 9-14 with a 5.30 ERA in 189 relief appearances...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 10-4 (.714) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 12 of his 14 starts and allowed two runs or fewer eight times...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk...began the season with four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

2014 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win over Seattle **April 3** in Oakland...left trailing 2-0 but the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game...had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota **April 9**...struck out a career-high nine in 7.0 innings...was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth...had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) **April 14**...matched his career high with nine strikeouts for the second consecutive start...picked up his first career win as a starter in the A's 4-1 win over Houston **April 20** in Oakland...retired seven of the final eight batters he faced...had a no decision in the A's 12-5 win at Houston **April 25**...allowed a career-high eight hits...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a run in the third inning on an Altuve RBI double...the A's scored a run in the fourth to take a 5-1 lead but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the fourth on a Dominguez RBI single, a two-run error by Donaldson and a Castro RBI ground out...the A's scored seven times in the ninth for the win...extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 12-1 victory at Texas **April 30**...did not allow a run in 7.0 innings...yielded just one

hit (Fielder two-out single in first) and one walk (Fielder, one out in fourth)...did not allow a base runner past first base...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Seattle **May 6**...allowed three runs in the first inning on a wild pitch, a Smoak RBI double and an Ackley RBI single...the A's scored twice in the second to narrow the gap to 3-2 and he blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over innings two through five before allowing a Zunino sacrifice fly in the sixth...left after that trailing 4-2...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Chicago **May 12** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings...allowed two runs on a pair of solo home runs by Vicedo in the second and Abreu to lead off the ninth...the two home runs matched his career high...the A's bullpen was charged with two more runs in the ninth before Doolittle retired the final three batters for the save...was the winning pitcher in the A's 13-3 win at Cleveland **May 18**...it was the 200th appearance of his career...tossed a career-high 109 pitches and allowed a career-high tying two home runs for the second consecutive start...allowed a leadoff home run to Bourn in the first inning but the A's scored seven unanswered runs before he allowed a one out solo home run to Brantley in the fifth...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss at Toronto **May 24**...allowed a career-high tying eight hits...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed an unearned run in the third when Gose scored on a Gentry error...then allowed three more runs in the fifth on a Lawrie home run and a two-run error by Moss...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 5-4 loss to Detroit **May 29** in Oakland...yielded a career-high tying eight hits for the second consecutive start...allowed a run to score on a ground out in the third inning and the A's scored twice in the fourth to give him a 2-1 lead...surrendered two more runs in the fifth inning on a Kinsler RBI double and a Cabrera sacrifice fly to give the Tigers the lead for good...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-4 win at New York **June 4**...allowed four runs in 6.0 innings, all in the third inning on a Jeter RBI single and an Ellsbury three-run home run...that gave the Yankees a 4-0 lead but the A's scored seven unanswered runs for the win and he retired seven of the final eight batters he faced...he was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **June 9**...allowed a career-high tying eight hits for the third time in his last four starts...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed single runs in the third, fourth and fifth innings on a Trout sacrifice fly, an Ibanez RBI single and a Trout RBI double.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-5 win over New York (AL) last Sunday in Oakland...shutout the Yankees on three hits over the first five innings...had a 10-0 lead when he allowed his only run on a Teixeira RBI double in the sixth inning.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Tommy Milone (5-3, 3.56 ERA): Is 5-0 with a 2.31 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his last eight starts...the winning streak matches his career high, is an A's season high and matches the longest active winning streak in the majors...is 3-0 with a 2.35 ERA and .214 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland compared to 2-3 with a 4.73 ERA and .274 opponents batting average in eight starts on the road...his home ERA is ninth lowest in the American League...has held the opponents number three, four and five hitters to a .154 batting average...has yielded four of his nine home runs to the number nine hitter in the order...no other pitcher in the majors has allowed more than two...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 10-6 A's win over Texas last Tuesday (5.2 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...is 0-2 with a 13.50 ERA in two career starts against Boston, both at Fenway...including a loss in a 6-3 decision earlier this year on May 3 (4.0 ip, 6 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 5 so, 3 hr).

- The A's bullpen is currently riding a three-game, 9.0 inning scoreless streak after allowing 16 earned runs over its previous five games...prior to that stretch, posted a 0.72 ERA over 12 games (3 er in 37.1 ip) from May 30-June 11....relievers struck out a season-high eight batters last night in five innings.
- The A's bullpen is third in the American League in ERA (2.86) and is tied second in wins (14)...ranks first in opponents batting average (.220), on-base percentage (.283) and slugging percentage (.313).
- Is nine for 10 (90.0%) in save chances since May 16 after converting just seven of its first 15 (46.7%) save opportunities this season...is tied for the second best save percentage in the majors over that span.
- Has issued the fewest walks (71) and has allowed the fourth fewest home runs (16) among AL bullpens.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held the opponents number three, four and five hitters to a .154 (16 for 104) batting average...has allowed a .222 (14 for 63) batting average with runners in scoring position...last year, opponents hit .216 with RISP, which ranked eighth in the American League...has yielded four of his nine home runs to the number nine hitter in the order...no other pitcher in the majors has allowed more than **two**...has walked just three batters to lead off an inning...has issued 19 of his 22 walks to right-handed hitters.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed nine runs in the first inning for a 6.23 ERA (13.0 ip)...has a 2.29 ERA (13 er in 51.0 ip) in innings two through five and a 5.65 ERA (9 er in 14.1 ip) from the sixth inning on...has issued seven of his 22 walks in the first inning.

THIS AND THAT: Has left with the lead in three of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (Gregerson each time)...is averaging 92.6 pitches per games, which is **fourth** fewest in the American League...the A's are 7-6 (.538) in his starting assignments this year and are 43-27 (.614) in his career...his teams are 48-27 (.640) in his 74 career starts.

SIX INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit, snapping his season-opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Has allowed two runs or fewer in each of his last five starts and is 4-0 with a 1.27 ERA (5 er in 35.1 ip) and .184 (23 for 125) opponents batting average over that span...it is his second four-game winning streak of the season...went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA over his first six starts and was 1-2 with a 3.38 ERA in between.

NINE-GAME WINNER: Picked up his ninth win of the season in his last start, which is **red** for **third** in the American League...has won 10 games before the All-Star Break just once in his career...that was in 2006 when he went 10-6 before the break...did not win a game after the break, going 0-2 in just five starts due to shoulder inflammation...has won 10 or more games in a season six times in his career...his nine wins are the most by an A's left-hander before the break since Mulder was 12-2 in 2004.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks **second** in the American League in ERA (2.08) and opponents batting average (.203), **third** in winning percentage (.818) and **fourth** in opponents slugging percentage (.296) and opponents on-base percentage (.255)...also has the **highest** run support (6.63), ranks **third** in fewest pitches per inning (14.9), **red** for **fifth** in complete games (1) and wild pitches (6), **sixth** in fewest pitches per game (94.2) and **ninth** in fewest walks per nine innings (1.89) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.00).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .113 (7 for 62) batting average with runners in scoring position, including .038 (1 for 26) with RISP and two outs...both marks are the **lowest** in the majors among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...has not walked a batter to lead off an inning and is the only pitcher in the majors with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title who has not walked a batter...opponents are batting .221 (21 for 95) with a .237 on-base percentage (two hit batters) and .263 slugging percentage (four doubles) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is **fourth** lowest in the American League and the on-base percentage ranks **fifth**...right-handed hitters are 1 for 25 off him over his last two starts and he has yielded a .180 (48 for 266) average against right-handers for the season compared to .278 (22 for 79) against left-handers...the mark against righties ranks **second** lowest in the AL...has surrendered all six of his home runs this year and 22 of his 25 over the last two years to righties.

INTERLEAGUE: Was the winning pitcher in his only interleague start this year, a 9-1 A's win over Washington on May 11 (7.0 ip, 4 h, 4 so)...has not allowed a run in his last three interleague starts for a 19.0-inning scoreless streak...no pitcher in Major League history has ever made four consecutive interleague starts without allowing a run...has a four-game interleague winning streak (6 er in 28.2 ip, 1.88 ERA) and is 12-5 with a 4.29 ERA (61 er in 128.0 ip) in 23 career interleague starts.

WITH THE BAT: Went 1 for 4 with a strikeout for Cleveland last year...is 2 for 18 (.111) with a RBI, sacrifice hit and seven strikeouts in his career.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-1 with a 1.61 ERA (9 er in 50.1 ip) in seven starts at home compared to 4-1 with a 2.62 ERA (13 er in 44.2 ip) in seven starts on the road...has the **second** lowest home ERA in the American League and **fifth** lowest in the majors...has walked five batters in 50.1 innings at home and 15 in 44.2 innings on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-0 with a 1.09 ERA (5 er in 41.1 ip) in six starts during the day compared to 5-2 with a 2.85 ERA (17 er in 53.2 ip) in nine starts at night...ranks **second** in the American League in day ERA...is now 9-2 with a 2.34 ERA (25 er in 96.1 ip) in 16 starts during the day over the last two years and 10-9 with a 3.91 ERA (68 er in 156.2 ip) in 28 starts at night.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 6-0 with a 2.25 ERA (10 er in 40.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest compared to 3-2 with a 1.96 ERA (12 er in 55.0 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more.

LAST 33 STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 15 starts this year and 16 of his last 33 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 16-7 with a 2.59 ERA (57 er in 198.0 ip) and .222 (164 for 739) opponents batting average over that stretch...has walked 44 (2.00 per nine innings) and struck out 187 in 198.0 innings (8.50 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.23...has yielded just 13 home runs (0.59 per nine innings).

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 3-0 with a 1.37 ERA (4 er in 26.1 ip) in four starts in June...went 2-2 with a 2.67 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in five starts in May after going 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Gray, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...of those six, only Cahill was undefeated (Cahill started the season 6-0)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 13-2 (.867) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 12 of his 15 starts

and has tossed six or more innings 13 times...has not allowed a run four times.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in a 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game **April 2**...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 win at Texas **April 29** to start a season 4-0 for the first time in his career...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-2 loss to Seattle **May 5**...that snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2013 (also May 10-June 6, 2008)...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings...struck out 56 and walked just 10...had a no decision in the A's 6-2 win at Cleveland **May 17**...tossed just 1.1 innings, which was the shortest outing of his career...was ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second...tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit **May 28** in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history...struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings **June 3** at New York, his 22nd career 10-strikeout game.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Boston last Thursday in Oakland...blanked the Red Sox on two hits over the first five innings to extend his streak of consecutive innings without allowing an earned run to 18.1...the streak ended when Pedroia hit a two-run home run in the sixth...had a 3-0 lead at the time.

DARIC BARTON

- Made his fourth career Opening Day start at first base March 31 against Cleveland, which matches Jason Giambi for second most in Oakland history...only Mark McGwire, with nine, has more.
- Was batting .158 with five RBI in 30 games when he was designated for assignment May 15...was outrighted to Sacramento May 17.

KYLE BLANKS

- Was acquired from San Diego on May 15 for minor league outfielder Jake Goebbert and a player to be named later (minor league pitcher Ronald Herrera on May 28).
- Hit his first home run of the season May 26 to snap a career-high 49-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on June 16, 2013.
- Had a career-high nine-game hitting streak from May 25 to June 8...went 10 for 22 (.455) with two home runs, seven RBI and seven walks (.567 on-base percentage) during the streak.

ALBERTO CALLASPO

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.
- Struck out a career-high tying three times May 3 at Boston (third time, first since Sept. 23, 2012 vs. Chicago-AL).
- Doubled in the fourth inning June 8 at Baltimore to snap his hitless streak at a career-high tying 20 at bats (third time).

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.
- Had a career-high five RBI May 18 at Cleveland and matched his best with two doubles.
- Matched his career-high with five RBI and nine total bases May 31 against Los Angeles (AL) and had the first three-extra base hit game of his career...had two assists in the second inning to become the first A's outfielder with two assists in an inning since Matt Stairs on April 16, 1996 at Texas...is the first to throw out two runners at home in one inning since Dave Henderson on July 7, 1990 at Cleveland.
- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...all four of his two-homer games have come on the road.

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.
- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.
- Was placed on the DL a second time May 9, retroactive to May 8, with a strained right forearm.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...it was his sixth regular season "walk-off" RBI.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.
- His second at bat May 18 at Cleveland was the 5000th of his career.
- Had an 11-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 7 (15 for 39, .385).

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a 0-for-20 streak from April 2 to 6, which was a career high at the time.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL).
- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 consecutive games from April 6 through the first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, 16 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .387 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his career May 13-16 (also: Aug. 29-31, 2012)

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year...that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).

- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was also at Los Angeles on April 9, 2013.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.

- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since

Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.

- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.
