YESTERDAY'S GAME: Boston lost to the A's last night, 4-3, and has dropped the 1st 2 games of the current series in Oakland by a combined 3 runs...Boston's 3 runs yester-day snapped a 6-game stretch of scoring 2 runs or less.

STATE OF THE SOX: Boston has dropped 2 straight following a 3-game win streak, which was the club's longest since a season-long 7-game stretch from 5/26-6/1...The Sox have taken 5 of their last 9 and 6 of their last 11...They are 7-6 (.538) beginning on 6/8.

- The Sox are in 4th place in the AL East, 7.5 games back in the division, and are 6.0 games back in the race for the AL's 2nd Wild Card playoff berth.
- Boston is 32 days and 31 games (14-17) into a stretch from 5/20-6/25 in which the club plays 36 games in 37 days...Their only off-day in this time was on 6/5.

RAZOR THIN: The Red Sox have played 7 consecutive games decided by 2 runs or less beginning on 6/14 (3-4), including 6, 1-run decisions (3-3)...The Sox have been outscored just 16-14 in this 7-game stretch.

Boston has played an AL-high 27 1-run games this year, going 11-16 in those contests...The Sox' 16 1-run losses are also the most among AL teams.

BACK ON THE ROAD: The Sox continue a season-longtying 10-game road trip today with the 3rd of 7 games on the west coast against OAK (4 G) and SEA (3 G)...After an off-day on Thursday, they close it out with 3 at NYY.

This road trip completes a 28-day, 26-game stretch (6/2-29) over which the Sox were slated for only 7 games in Boston, all in the just-completed homestand.

MOUND MATTERS: Overall this season, the Sox rank 3rd in the AL with a 3.63 ERA, trailing OAK (3.00) and SEA (3.33), Boston's first 2 opponents on the current road trip.

- Boston leads the majors with a team 2.81 ERA (67 ER/214.1 IP) in 24 games dating back to 5/27.
- Boston's bullpen has the lowest ERA in the AL at 2.78, 4th-best in the majors.
- The club's 44 quality starts this year are tied with KC for 2nd in the AL behind only OAK (48).

LAST NINE: Boston hurlers have allowed 4 runs or less in a season-long 9 straight games dating back to 6/12 (1.87 ERA, 17 ER/82.0 IP).

- Sox starters have allowed 3 ER or less in each of the last 9 games, a season-long streak...Starting pitchers are 4-1 with a 2.11 ERA (14 ER/59.2 IP) in this stretch.
- Club relievers have allowed 3 ER in these last 9 games (1.21 ERA) with 30 strikeouts in 22.1 IP but have suffered the loss 3 times (1-3 record).

ON THE OFFENSE: Boston has gone 3-4 in its last 7 games, totaling 14 runs in that stretch...The Sox' 5 runs scored in a 3-game sweep of the Twins to begin the week were the club's fewest ever in a sweep of 3+ games (Elias).

- The Sox have drawn the AL's 3rd-most walks this year (268) and have the 5th-most times on base (916) but have averaged 3.8 runs per game, ahead of only TB (3.6) in the AL.
- The Sox are seeing 4.04 pitches/PA, 2nd most in the majors to MIN (4.08)...The Sox have reached base a ML-leading 401 times on 2-strike counts, including an AL-high 252 2-strike hits.

BROCK STARS: Brock Holt's .319 AVG leads all major league rookies (min. 150 PA) and ranks 9th among all AL batters with at least 150 PA this season.

Holt has reached base safely in 26 of his 29 starts as Boston's leadoff hitter and has a .320 AVG (41-for-128) from the top spot...He leads the majors with 39 hits since being installed as the leadoff hitter on 5/23. **FACING THE A'S:** Today Boston and Oakland continue their 7-game season series with the 3rd of a 4-game set at 0.co Coliseum...The Sox took 2 of 3 at Fenway from 5/2-4.

Boston last won a road series against the A's taking 3 of 4 to open the 2008 season (1-1 in Tokyo, 2-0 in Oakland)...The Sox last won a road series of at least 3 games here in Oakland taking 2 of 3 from 7/24-26/06.

1 YEAR AS CLOSER: Today marks the 1-year anniversary of Koji Uehara being named the Red Sox' closer on 6/21/13 after injuries to Joel Hanrahan and Andrew Bailey.

- Since 6/21/13, Uehara has 42 saves in 44 chances in the regular and post season (95.5%)...In those 44 save opportunities he has allowed only 2 ER (0.39 ERA) with a 65 SO/3 BB ratio over 46.1 IP.
- Uehara has converted all 15 save chances this season and each of his last 31 in the regular season beginning on 7/9/13...It marks the longest active streak in MLB and the 2nd-longest in Red Sox history behind Tom Gordon's AL-record 54 straight from 4/19/98-5/31/99.

BURKE ROLLING: Burke Badenhop is amidst a career-best 18.0-IP scoreless streak over his last 17 games beginning on 5/16, the AL's 4th-longest active scoreless innings streak.

Badenhop has also gone 32.1 consecutive IP without allowing an earned run (1 run allowed in that stretch, which began with his 2nd inning of work on 4/18)... According to Elias, it is the 3rd-longest streak without an earned run as a reliever in Red Sox history.

CENTRAL COMMAND: Jackie Bradley Jr.'s 9 outfield assists this season are tied for 2nd most in the majors, 1 shy of OAK's Yoenis Cespedes (9).

- He leads all major league CF in assists, the most by a Red Sox CF since Carl Everett had 11 from CF in 2000.
- In the last 61 years from 1954-2014, only Ellis Burks (15 in 1987), and Fred Lynn (11 in 1975) had as many assists from CF as a Red Sox rookie.

LEFT AND RIGHT: This year the Red Sox are 13-13 (.500) when facing a lefty starter and 21-27 (.438) when opposing a righty, but Boston has lost its last 6 games facing a lefty and has won 5 of its last 6 against right-handed starters.

GOOD RETURNS: Since his 6/2 recall from Triple-A Pawtucket, Daniel Nava is 13-for-37 (.351) with 3 2B, 4 BB, and a .442 OBP, including a .375 AVG vs. rightes (12-for-32).

STINGY STAND: The Red Sox allowed just 13 runs (10 ER) in their 7-game homestand, 6/12-18...The 13 runs mark the fewest allowed by Boston in a homestand of at least 7 games since 9/26-10/2/78 (8 runs, a 7-game homestand).

REHAB UPDATES: Will Middlebrooks, on the 15-day DL since 5/17 with a fractured right index finger, went 1-for-3 last night at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (NYY) in his 4th rehab game with Triple-A Pawtucket (.308, 4-for-13, 2 R, BB).

Clay Buchholz, on the 15-day DL since 5/28 (retro to 5/27) with a hyperextended right knee, made his 2nd rehab start Thursday with Pawtucket at Rochester (MIN)...He went 6.0 scoreless IP, allowing 2 hits and 2 walks while fanning 5...He threw 87 pitches.

TODAY IN RED SOX HISTORY: JUNE 21, 2003 (11 YEARS AGO): Nomar Garciaparra went 6-for-6 with 6 singles in a 13-inning, 5-6 loss at PHI...He became the 4th Sox player with 6 hits in a game, joining Jerry Remy (9/3/81) as the only player to do it with 6 singles.
