ABOUT THE A'S: Had their five-game winning streak snapped on Sunday and are now 7-2 over the last nine games...are 47-29 for the season, which is the best record in the majors for six consecutive days and eight days this year (also May 21-22)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 57th consecutive day (since April 28) and have held at least a share of first for 61 consecutive days (since April 24) and 69 of the last 71...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...lead

second place Los Angeles by five games...have 70 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have held the best record in the AL every day since May 31...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 10 minutes...the Oakland record is 3:08 in 2000.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have played back-to-back extra inning games for the second time this year and now have a Major League leading 13 for the season...played just 13 extra inning games all last year (7-6)...are 8-5 this year and lead the majors in extra inning wins...each of the A's last three games have been decided in the last at bat and they are 13-9 in those games for the season...lead the majors in last at bat wins and are tied for third in last at bat games...each of the A's last five games have been decided by two runs or fewer and the A's are 4-1 in those games after starting the season 12-17...are 31-11 in games decided by three runs or more.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 3-0 in interleague play after sweeping a three-game series from Washington in May...the three interleague games are the fewest in the majors (Detroit, 5)...also play at Miami (June 27-29), San Francisco (July 9-10) and Atlanta (Aug. 15-17) and host San Francisco (July 7-8), New York (Aug. 19-20) and

Philadelphia (Sept. 19-21)...are now 25-10 (.714) over their last 35 games against the National League...went 13-7 against the NL last year, which tied for third best in the majors...it marked the second consecutive season and 10th time in 17 seasons that the A's finished with a winning record against the NL...are 170-137 (.554) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best.

PITCHERS HITTING: Sean Doolittle grounded out as a pinch hitter Sunday to become the first A's pitcher to pinch hit since Bob Welch on May 13, 1994 against Kansas City...A's pitchers went 2 for 22 (.091) with two runs, one RBI, two walks and 11 strikeouts last year...now have a .084 (26 for 309) average with four doubles, 10 RBI, 10 walks and 141 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .092)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by John Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California.

WINNING MONTHS: The A's are 13-7 in June, which is the second best record in the majors (Kansas City, 14-7)...need one more win to clinch a winning record for the 13th consecutive month...that would match the longest such streak in Oakland history (Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972)...the Athletics record is 15 from July, 1928-Sept. 1930...the last Major League team with 13 consecutive winning months is the Boston Red Sox (July, 2004-July, 2006).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin an eight-game road trip to New York-NL (two games), Miami (three games) and Detroit (three games) tonight...went 5-4 on the last road trip to New York-AL (2-1), Baltimore (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2), which marked their 10th consecutive road trip with a .500 or better record...that is the A's longest such streak since an 11-trip streak from June 26, 1989-July 11, 1990...are 23-14 (.622) on the road, which is the second best road record in the majors (Milwaukee, 27-15)...went 7-3 on the last homestand against New York-AL (2-1), Texas (2-1) and Boston (3-1) and are 24-15 (.615)

at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 23-14).

OFFENSE: Yoenis Céspedes drove in his 50th run of the season Sunday, giving the A's three players with 50 or more RBI (Donaldson, Moss)...no other team has more than one...there have been four seasons in Oakland history in which three players have driven in 100 or more runs (1996, 1999, 2000, 2001)...the A's **lead the majors** in runs scored (389), walks (318) and on-base percentage (.336), rank fourth in home runs (86), seventh in slugging (.410) and eighth in extra base hits (228).

PITCHING: The A's **lead the majors** in opponents on-base percentage (.290) and rank second in ERA (3.02), opponents batting average (.228) and slugging percentage (.345)...have issued the third fewest walks in the American League (210)...A's starting pitchers are 32-17 with a 3.10 ERA (158 er in 459.1 ip)...have the fewest losses in the majors, the second lowest ERA and are fifth in wins.

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have outscored the opposition by 135 runs, which is nearly triple the next closest team (Seattle, 46)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973 (first All-Star Game was in 1933)...the last team with a run differential greater than 127 at the break is Seattle in 2001 (149).

THE LONG BALL: The A's lead the majors with four grand slams and rank second with 44 home runs with runners on base (Toronto, 46)...have 86 home runs overall, which ranks third in the AL and fourth in the majors...the pitching staff has allowed 11 home runs in the last eight games after yielding just one over the previous six contests...have surrendered 64 home runs for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...only 20 of those have come with runners on base, which is second fewest in the majors (St. Louis, 18).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 9 for their last 19 (.474) with two doubles, two home runs, eight RBI and two walks...are batting .288 (19 for 66) with three home runs, 15 RBI and 14 walks for the season...lead the American League in pinch RBI, walks and extra base hits (7)...the walks rank third in the majors, the RBI are sixth and the extra base hits are tied for seventh...are tied for the AL lead in doubles (4), rank second in hits, slugging percentage (.485) and plate appearances (82), tied for second in on-base percentage (.415) and fourth in batting.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 45 for 53 (84.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors (Washington, 84.8%)...opponents have been successful in 44 of their 50 (88.0%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Cubs, 89.2%)...the A's are the only Major League team without a pickoff.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 15 errors in the last 13 games and have 55 for the season, which is second most in the American League...A's outfielders have 14 assists in the last 29 games and 21 for the season, which is second most in the majors (Arizona, 23).

NO ROOKIES: The A's are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 76 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest single-season streak in Oakland history...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the longest seasonopening streak by a Major League team since the 2005 Cleveland Indians went the first 82 games without playing a rookie.

A's vs. METS: The A's trail in the all-time series, 3-6...are 2-1 in Oakland and 1-5 in New York...including 1-2 at Citi Field...last met in 2011 when the A's lost two of three at New York...also met in the 1973 World Series, which the A's won in seven games.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's used four first baseman on Sunday, matching the most by an A's team since at least 1914 (Aug. 23, 1975 vs. Milwaukee, G#1)...**Sean Doolittle** has a 24.1-inning scoreless streak, which is the longest active streak in the American League and tied for fourth longest by a reliever in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1979** Rickey Henderson steals the first base of his career in his ML debut in the first game of a doubleheader against Texas...he doubles in his first big league at bat and adds a single in three other at bats...in **2012** Derek Norris hits his first Major League home run, a walk-off three-run blast in the A's 4-2 win over San Francisco.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (9-2, 2.08 ERA)

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Has allowed two runs or fewer in each of his last five starts and is 4-0 with a 1.27 ERA (5 er in 35.1 ip) and .184 (23 for 125) opponents batting average over that span...it is his second four-game winning streak of the season...went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA over his first six starts and was 1-2 with a 3.38 ERA in between.

NINE-GAME WINNER: Picked up his ninth win of the season in his last start, which is tied for third in the American League...has won 10 games before the All-Star Break just once in his career...that was in 2006 when he went 10-6 before the break...did not win a game after the break, going 0-2 in just five starts due to shoulder inflammation...has won 10 or more games in a season six times in his career...his nine wins are the most by an A's left-hander before the break since Mulder was 12-2 in 2004.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Leads the American League in ERA (2.08) and opponents batting average (.203), ranks third in opponents slugging percentage (.296) and on-base percentage (.255) and tied for fourth in winning percentage (.818)...also has the highest run support (6.63), ranks fourth in fewest pitches per inning (14.9), tied for fifth in complete games (1), sixth in fewest pitches per game (94.2), tied for sixth in wild pitches (6), eighth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.89) and ninth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.00).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .113 (7 for 62) batting average with runners in scoring position, including .038 (1 for 26) with RISP and two outs...both marks are the lowest in the majors among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...has not walked a batter to lead off an inning and is the only pitcher in the majors with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title who has not walked a batter...opponents are batting .221 (21 for 95) with a .237 on-base percentage (two hit batters) and .263 slugging percentage (four doubles) when leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is fourth lowest in the American League and the on-base percentage ranks seventh...right-handed hitters are 1 for 25 off him over his last two starts and he has yielded a .180 (48 for 266) average against right-handers...the mark against righties ranks second lowest in the AL (Weaver, LAA .172)...has surrendered all six of his home runs this year and 22 of his 25 over the last two years to righties.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 6-0 with a 2.25 ERA (10 er in 40.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest compared to 3-2 with a 1.96 ERA (12 er in 55.0 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more.

INTERLEAGUE: Was the winning pitcher in his only interleague start this year, a 9-1 A's win over Washington on May 11 (7.0 ip, 4 h, 4 so)...has not allowed a run in his last three interleague starts for a 19.0-inning scoreless streak...no pitcher in Major League history has ever made four consecutive interleague starts without allowing a run...has a four-game interleague winning streak (6 er in 28.2 ip, 1.88 ERA) and is 12-5 with a 4.29 ERA (61 er in 128.0 ip) in 23 career interleague starts.

WITH THE BAT: Went 1 for 4 with a strikeout for Cleveland last year...is 2 for 18 (.111) with a RBI, sacrifice hit and seven strikeouts in his career.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-1 with a 1.61 ERA (9 er in 50.1 ip) in seven starts at home compared to 4-1 with a 2.62 ERA (13 er in 44.2 ip) in seven starts on the road...has the second lowest home ERA in the American League and sixth lowest in the majors...has walked five batters in 50.1 innings at home and 15 in 44.2 innings on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-0 with a 1.09 ERA (5 er in 41.1 ip) in six starts during the day compared to 5-2 with a 2.85 ERA (17 er in 53.2 ip) in nine starts at night...ranks second in the American League in day ERA...is now 9-2 with a 2.34 ERA (25 er in 96.1 ip) in 16 starts during the day over the last two years and 10-9 with a 3.91 ERA (68 er in 156.2 ip) in 28 starts at night.

LAST 33 STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 15 starts this year and 16 of his last 33 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 16-7 with a 2.59 ERA (57 er in 198.0 ip) and .222 (164 for 739) opponents batting average over that stretch...has walked 44 (2.00 per nine innings) and struck of

over that stretch...has walked 44 (2.00 per nine innings) and struck out 187 in 198.0 innings (8.50 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.23...has yielded just 13 home runs (0.59 per nine innings).

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 3-0 with a 1.37 ERA (4 er in 26.1 ip) in four starts in June...went 2-2 with a 2.67 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in five starts in May after going 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Gray, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...of those six, only Cahill was undefeated (Cahill started the season 6-0)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 13-2 (.867) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 12 of his 15 starts and has tossed six or more innings 13 times...has not allowed a run four times.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in a 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game *April* 2...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 win at Texas *April* 29 to start a season 4-0 for the first time in his career...was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-2 loss to Seattle *May* 5...that snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2013 (also May 10-June 6, 2008)...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings...struck out 56 and walked just 10...had a no decision in the A's 6-2 win at Cleveland *May* 17...tossed just 1.1 innings, which was the shortest outing of his career...was ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit *May* 28 in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history...struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings *June* 3 at New York, his 22nd career 10-strikeout game.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Boston last Thursday in Oakland...blanked the Red Sox on two hits over the first five innings to extend his streak of consecutive innings without allowing an earned run to 18.1...the streak ended when Pedroia hit a two-run home run in the sixth...had a 3-0 lead at the time.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brad Mills (0-0, 4.50 ERA): Was acquired from Milwaukee on June 17 in a minor league trade for cash considerations...spent the entire season at Triple-A Nashville where he was 4-2 with a 1.56 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts...was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 20 and had a no decision in a start that night in Oakland against Boston, a 4-3 A's win (4.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...has never faced Mets in his career...is 0-1 with a 14.09 ERA in two career interleague starts...both came in 2009 with Toronto against Philadelphia and they were the first two starts of his career...is 0 for 1 as a hitter...went 0 for 15 with 12 strikeouts at Nashville this year...his ERA at Nashville was the lowest in the Pacific Coast League and second lowest among all full season minor leaguers (Daniel Winkler of Tulsa, 1.41) at the time of his June 20 promotion...also ranked third in the PCL in strikeouts (77) and opponents batting average (.190)...walked just 18 batters for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.28...surrendered five home runs in 75.0 innings, an average of 0.60 per nine innings.

- The A's bullpen has a 1.59 ERA over its last five games (3 er in 17.0 ip) after allowing 16 earned runs over its previous five games...prior to that stretch, posted a 0.72 ERA over 12 games (3 er in 37.1 ip) from May 30-June 11...is 2-1 in the last five games after 12 straight games without a win.
- The A's bullpen is second in the American League in ERA (2.88) and wins (15)...ranks first in opponents batting average (.222), on base percentage (.283) and slugging percentage (.318). Is nine for 11 (81.8%) in save chances since May 16 after
- converting just seven of its first 15 (46.7%) save opportunities this season.
- Has issued the fewest walks (71) and has allowed the fourth fewest home runs (17) among AL bullpens...has issued just one walk over its last seven games and 25.2 innings.

- Has allowed three runs over his last four games (3.1 ip) after going 14 outings without allowing an earned run...also did not allow a run over his first 14 appearances (13.1 ip) this season.
- All three runs over four-game stretch came via solo home runs...are his only extra-base hits allowed this season (14 singles, three home runs).
- Is seventh among AL relievers in opponents batting average (.165) and eighth in slugging percentage (.252).
- Has stranded all 15 inherited runners...is the only qualifying AL reliever to not have allowed an inherited runner to score.
- Has a loss in 14 career games against the Mets (15.1 ip, 10 h, 1 r, 1 er, 7 bb, 11 so, 0.59 ERA)...one of his six career starts came against the Mets (Aug. 25, 2012 at New York). Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06

ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.

RHP Jesse Chavez (6-4, 2.93 ERA): Ranks 10th in the American League in ERA (2.93)...is 4-4 with a 3.75 ERA and .284 opponents batting average in eight starts in May and June after going 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...opponents are hitting. 203 with runners in scoring position...has allowed a .190 batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .283 against left-handers...has the second lowest on-base percentage against righties in the AL (.222) and the seventh lowest batting average...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 10-5 A's win over New York (AL) last Sunday here in Oakland (6.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 4 so)...the win was his sixth of the season, which is a new career high...the A's are 10-4 (.714) in his starting assignments...is 0-0 with a 1.69 ERA (5.1 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 6 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances against Boston, all in relief.

FRIDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (6-4, 2.71 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks seventh in the American League in ERA (2.71)...is also fourth in highest run support (5.90)...opponents have reached base on an error seven times, which is tied for second most (Kuroda, NYY 8).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is making his first interleague appearance of the season...is 0-2 with a 5.04 ERA (17 er in 30.1 ip) in 16 career interleague appearances...that includes two starts with Toronto in 2012 when he went 0-1 with a 10.38 ERA (10 er in 8.2 ip).

WITH THE BAT: Struck out in his only at bat last year (Aug. 7 at Cincinnati) and is 0 for 5 with five strikeouts and a sacrifice hit in his career...went 1 for 10 with eight strikeouts and a sacrifice hit as a minor leaguer.

AS A STARTER: Has made 15 appearances this year, all starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 6-5 with a 3.36 ERA (38 er in 101.2 ip) in 17 career starts compared to 9-14 with a 5.30 ERA in 189 relief appearances...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 11-4 (.733) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 12 of his 15 starts and allowed two runs or fewer nine times...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.

- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

• Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

DREW POMERANZ

• Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

 Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
