### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (48-30) VS. MIAMI MARLINS (39-40)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Snapped their two-game losing streak Wednesday...have won six of the last eight games and eight of the last 11...are 48-30 for the season, which is the best record in the majors for the ninth consecutive day and 11<sup>th</sup> day this year (also May 21-22)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 60<sup>th</sup> consecutive day (since April 28) and have held at least a share of first for 64 consecutive days (since April 24) and 72 of the last 74...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...the last time the A's spent more than 65 consecutive days in first was in 1990 (spent the final 86 days alone in first and the final 172 with at least a share of first)...lead second place Los Angeles by 3½ games...have 73 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have held the best record in the AL every day since May 31.

**WINNING MONTHS:** The A's are 14-8 in June, which is tied for the second best record in the majors...have clinched a winning record for the 13<sup>th</sup> consecutive month, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972)...the Athletics record is 15 from July 1928-Sept. 1930...the last Major League team with 13 consecutive winning months is the Boston Red Sox (July 2004-July 2006)...the last time the A's had a losing record in a month was May of 2012 (11-16)...all winning month notes exclude March and October.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's are 4-1 in interleague play (Washington, 3-0; New York, 1-1)...only Miami (8-1) has a better record...the five interleague games are tied with Detroit for the fewest in the majors...also play at San Francisco (July 9-10) and Atlanta (Aug. 15-17) and host San Francisco (July 7-8), New York (Aug. 19-20) and Philadelphia (Sept. 19-21)...are now 26-11 (.703) over their last 37 games against the National League...went 13-7 against the NL last year, which tied for third best in the majors...it marked the second consecutive season and 10th time in 17 seasons that the A's finished with a winning record against the NL...are 171-138 (.553) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best.

**PITCHERS HITTING:** A's pitchers are 0 for 5 with two strikeouts and a grounded into double play, not including Sean Doolittle's pinch hit ground out...now have a .083 (26 for 314) average with four doubles, 10 RBI, 10 walks and 143 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .092)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by John Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-1 on this eight-game road trip to New York-NL (1-1), Miami (three games) and Detroit (three games) tonight...went 5-4 on the last road trip to New York-AL (2-1), Baltimore (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2), which marked their 10<sup>th</sup> consecutive road trip with a .500 or better record...that is the A's longest such streak since an 11-trip streak from June 26, 1989-July 11, 1990...have not finished a road trip with a losing record since going 2-5 at Texas and Seattle June 17-23, 2013...are 24-15 (.615) on the road, which is the second best road record in the American League (Detroit, 24-13)...went 7-3 on the last homestand against New York-AL (2-1), Texas (2-1) and Boston (3-1) and are 24-15 (.615) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 26-14).

**OFFENSE:** The A's lead the majors in walks (323), rank second in runs scored (398) and on-base percentage (.335), fourth in home runs (88), tied for sixth in fewest strikeouts (562), seventh in slugging (.408) and ninth in extra base hits (232)...are tied with Baltimore for the Major League lead with four grand slams and rank second with 45 home runs

with runners on base (Toronto, 47)...are the only team in the majors with three players with 50 or more RBI (Donaldson, Moss, Céspedes).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 5.16 ERA (47 er in 82.0 ip) over the last nine games...have a 3.14 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the majors...have allowed at least two home runs in each of the last three games (nine home runs total) and have surrendered 17 home runs in the last 10 games...lead the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.292) and rank second in opponents batting average (.231) and slugging percentage (.352)...have issued the third fewest walks in the American League (212).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in three of the last nine games and are 4-2 with a 5.73 ERA (31 er in 48.2 ip) over that span...are 33-18 with a 3.23 ERA (168 er in 468.2 ip) for the season...have the fewest losses in the majors, the third lowest ERA and are tied for sixth in wins.

**RUN DIFFERENTIAL:** The A's have outscored the opposition by 129 runs, which is more than double the next closest team (Seattle, 51)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973 (first All-Star Game was in 1933).

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 9 for their last 20 (.450) with two doubles, two home runs, eight RBI and two walks...are batting .284 (19 for 67) with three home runs, 15 RBI and 14 walks for the season...lead the American League in pinch RBI, walks and extra base hits (7)...the walks rank third in the majors, the RBI are sixth and the extra base hits are tied for eighth...are tied for the AL lead in doubles (4) and home runs (3), rank second in hits, slugging percentage (.478), on-base percentage (.410) and plate appearances (83) and fourth in batting.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's are 46 for 54 (85.2%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors (Washington, 84.3%)...opponents have been successful in 44 of their 51 (86.3%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the majors (Cubs, 89.3%)...A's pitchers have just one pickoff, which is tied with St. Louis for the fewest in the majors.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 8-5 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning games and wins...the 13 extra inning games match the A's season total from last year (7-6)...are 13-9 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors in last at bat wins and are tied for third in last at bat games...have won four of the last five games decided by two runs or fewer after starting the season 12-17...are 32-12 in games decided by three runs or more.

**NO ROOKIES:** The A's are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 78 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest single-season streak in Oakland history...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the longest season-opening streak by a Major League team since the 2005 Cleveland Indians went the first 82 games without playing a rookie.

**A's vs. MARLINS:** The A's trail in the all-time series, 4-5...are 3-3 in Oakland and 1-2 in Miami...this will be the A's first appearance at Marlins Park...last met in 2011 in Oakland when the A's lost two of three...won two of three in Oakland in 2008 and lost two of three in Florida in 2003.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Yoenis Céspedes** has a 10-game hitting streak (14 for 39, .359)...**Sean Doolittle** has a 25.1-inning scoreless streak, which is the longest active streak in the majors and fourth longest by a reliever in Oakland history...has retired each of the last 20 batters he has faced and 37 of the last 38.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1987** Mark McGwire ties a pair of Oakland records by hitting three home runs and scoring five runs in the A's 13-3 win at Cleveland...he has four hits and drives in five runs...in **1996** the A's hit a franchise record eight home runs in a 18-2 win at California...the A's also collect an Oakland record 44 total bases and 11 extra base hits and score in eight different innings, tying an American League record...in **2002** Miguel Tejada plays in his 348<sup>th</sup> consecutive game, breaking Alfredo Griffin's Oakland record for consecutive games played...Tejada's streak reached 594 before signing with Baltimore as a free agent.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (6-4, 2.71 ERA)

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks seventh in the American League in ERA (2.71)...is also sixth in highest run support (5.90)...opponents have reached base on an error seven times, which is tied for second most (Kuroda, NYY 8).

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** Is making his first interleague appearance of the season...is 0-2 with a 5.04 ERA (17 er in 30.1 ip) in 16 career interleague appearances...that includes two starts with Toronto in 2012 when he went 0-1 with a 10.38 ERA (10 er in 8.2 ip).

**WITH THE BAT:** Struck out in his only at bat last year (Aug. 7 at Cincinnati) and is 0 for 5 with five strikeouts and a sacrifice hit in his career...went 1 for 10 with eight strikeouts and a sacrifice hit as a minor leaguer.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** Has allowed a .191 (25 for 131) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .270 (60 for 222) against left-handers...has issued just six of his 25 walks to righties for a .227 on-base percentage...the on-base percentage against right-handers ranks second in the American League and the batting average ranks fourth...over the last two years, he has held right-handed hitters to a .200 (46 for 230) batting average...has issued 35 of his 45 walks over that stretch to lefties.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are hitting .192 (14 for 73) with runners in scoring position, which ranks seventh in the American League...they are 4 for 32 (.125) with RISP and two outs...eight of the nine home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...walked two batters to lead off an inning in his last start after issuing just three such walks over his first 14 starts...has a .317 (20 for 63) opponents batting average in the first inning, .224 (65 for 290) after that...the opponents number three hitter is batting .375 (15 for 40) with three home runs...the four through seven hitters have a combined .154 (25 for 162) average

**CAREER BESTS:** Won his sixth game of the season June 15, which is a new career high (previous: 5 in 2010)...had just nine wins in 191 career appearances entering the season...also has career highs in strikeouts (82), innings pitched (93.0) and games started (15) and his 2.71 ERA is more than a run lower than his previous best of 3.92 last year.

**MONTH BY MONTH:** Is 2-1 with a 2.52 ERA (7 er in 25.0 ip) in four starts in June after going 2-3 with a 3.90 ERA in five starts in May...was 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 3-2 with a 2.13 ERA (10 er in 42.1 ip) in seven starts during the day compared to 3-2 with a 3.20 ERA (18 er in 50.2 ip) in eight starts at night...has the ninth lowest day ERA in the American League.

**AS A STARTER:** Has made 15 appearances this year, all starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 6-5 with a 3.36 ERA (38 er in 101.2 ip) in 17 career starts compared to 9-14 with a 5.30 ERA in 189 relief appearances...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 11-4 (.733) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 12 of his 15 starts and allowed two runs or fewer nine times...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk...began the season with four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

**2014 START-BY-START:** He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win over Seattle **April 3** in Oakland...left trailing 2-0 but the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game...had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota **April 9**...struck out a career-high nine in 7.0 innings...was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth...had his third consecutive no decision in the

A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) **April 14**...matched his career high with nine strikeouts for the second consecutive start...picked up his first career win as a starter in the A's 4-1 win over Houston **April 20** in Oakland...retired seven of the final eight batters he faced...had a no decision in the A's 12-5 win at Houston **April 25**...allowed a career-high eight hits...extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 12-1 victory at Texas **April 30**...did not allow a run in 7.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Seattle **May 6**...allowed three runs in the first inning and another in the sixth and left trailing 4-2...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Chicago **May 12** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings matched his career high with two home runs...was the winning pitcher in the A's 13-3 win at Cleveland **May 18**...it was the 200<sup>th</sup> appearance of his career...tossed a career-high 109 pitches and allowed a career-high tying two home runs for the second consecutive start...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss at Toronto **May 24**...allowed a career-high tying eight hits...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 5-4 loss to Detroit **May 29** in Oakland...yielded a career-high tying eight hits for the second consecutive start...allowed a run to score on a ground out in the third inning and the A's scored twice in the fourth to give him a 2-1 lead...surrendered two more runs in the fifth inning on a Kinsler RBI double and a Cabrera sacrifice fly to give the Tigers the lead for good...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-4 win at New York **June 4**...allowed four runs in 6.0 innings, all in the third inning on a Jeter RBI single and a Ellsbury three-run home run...that gave the Yankees a 4-0 lead but the A's scored seven unanswered runs for the win and he retired seven of the final eight batters he faced...he was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **June 9**...allowed a career-high tying eight hits for the third time in his last four starts...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed single runs in the third, fourth and fifth innings on a Trout sacrifice fly, an Ibanez RBI single and a Trout RBI double...was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-5 win over New York (AL) **June 15** in Oakland...shutout the Yankees on three hits over the first five innings...had a 10-0 lead when he allowed his only run on a Teixeira RBI double in the sixth inning.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10 inning win over Boston last Saturday in Oakland...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...however, matched his career high with four walks...was aided by two double plays and allowed just one base runner as far as third base...left with a 1-0 lead but Gregerson allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save.

**CHAVEZ vs. MIAMI:** Is 1-2 with a 7.94 ERA (11.1 ip, 12 h, 10 r, 10 er, 4 bb, 8 so, 2 hr) in eight career appearances, including one start...is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (1.2 ip) in two games in his home ballparks and 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (6 er in 6.0 ip) in one start in Marlins Park...was 1-1 with a 9.82 ERA (4 er in 3.2 ip) in five relief appearances at Sun Life Stadium...last faced the Marlins on June 24, 2012 at Miami...started for Toronto in a 9-0 loss...allowed four runs in the second on a Cousins RBI single and a Buck three-run home run...also allowed a two-run home run to Dobbs in the sixth...Buehrle and Gaudin combined to shutout the Blue Jays on eight hits.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Sonny Gray (7-3, 2.91 ERA):** Ranks fourth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.320) seventh in opponents batting average (.227) and 10<sup>th</sup> in ERA (2.91)...is 2-2 with a 4.94 ERA and .269 opponents batting average over his last five starts...is 3-1 with a 2.18 ERA and .166 opponents batting average in six starts on the road compared to 4-2 with a 3.43 ERA and .267 opponents average in nine starts at home...ranks eighth in the AL in road ERA...has a 4.78 ERA in odd numbered innings compared to a 0.78 ERA in even numbered innings...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-2 A's win over Texas June 18 in Oakland (7.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...has never faced the Marlins in his career...is 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA in two career interleague appearances...including a start earlier this year on May 10 against Washington, a no decision in a 4-3 A's win (7.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 1 hr)...has never batted as a professional.

Saves/Opportunities: 17-for-27 (63.0%)

- The A's bullpen has a 5.10 ERA over its last 12 games (24 er in 42.1 ip)...prior to that stretch, had posted a 0.72 ERA over 12 games (3 er in 37.1 ip) from May 30-June 11...however, team is 8-4 overall over last 12 games.
- The A's bullpen is **second in the American League in wins** (15) and third in ERA (2.97)...ranks first in opponents batting average (.222) and on-base percentage (.283) and second in slugging percentage (.322).
- Is **10 for 12 (83.3%) in save chances since May 16** after converting just seven of its first 15 (46.7%) save opportunities this season.
- Has issued the fewest walks (71) among AL bullpens...**has issued just one walk over its last nine games and 33.1 innings** but has a 4.32 ERA over that stretch.

- Has allowed three runs over his last four games (3.1 ip) after going 14 outings without allowing an earned run...also did not allow a run over his first 14 appearances (13.1 ip) this season.
- All three runs over four-game stretch came via solo home runs...are his only extra-base hits allowed this season (14 singles, three home runs).
- Is eighth among AL relievers in opponents batting average (.165) and ninth in slugging percentage (.252).
- Has stranded all 15 inherited runners...is the only qualifying AL reliever to not have allowed an inherited runner to score.

**SIX INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER:** Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit, snapping his season-opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .134 (9 for 67) batting average with runners in scoring position, including .071 (2 for 28) with RISP and two outs...among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title, the mark with RISP is the **red lowest** in the majors and his average with RISP and two outs is **red tied for the lowest**...has not walked a batter to lead off an inning and is the only pitcher in the majors with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title who has not walked a batter...has allowed four home runs over his last two starts (10.0 ip) after yielding five over his first 14 starts (88.0 ip)...has yielded a .195 (54 for 277) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .289 (24 for 83) against left-handers...the mark against righties is **red sixth lowest in the AL**...has surrendered eight of his nine home runs this year and 24 of his 28 over the last two years to righties.

**AGAINST THE CENTRAL:** Is 3-0 with a 1.90 ERA (5 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts against American League teams compared to 6-3 with a 2.91 ERA (24 er in 74.1 ip) in 12 starts against everyone else.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 5-1 with a 1.61 ERA (9 er in 50.1 ip) in seven starts at home compared to 4-2 with a 3.78 ERA (20 er in 47.2 ip) in eight starts on the road...has the **red second** lowest home ERA in the American League and **red sixth** lowest in the majors...has walked five batters in 50.1 innings at home and 16 in 47.2 innings on the road.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 4-0 with a 1.09 ERA (5 er in 41.1 ip) in six starts during the day compared to 5-3 with a 3.81 ERA (24 er in 56.2 ip) in 10 starts at night...ranks **red second** in the American League in day ERA...is now 9-2 with a 2.34 ERA (25 er in 96.1 ip) in 16 starts during the day over the last two years and 10-10 with a 4.23 ERA (75 er in 159.2 ip) in 29 starts at night.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 6-1 with a 3.56 ERA (17 er in 43.0 ip) in seven starts on four days rest compared to 3-2 with a 1.96 ERA (12 er in 55.0 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more.

**LAST 34 STARTS:** Has allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 16 starts this year and 16 of his last 34 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 16-8 with a 2.87 ERA (64 er in 201.0 ip) and .228 (172 for 754) opponents batting average over that stretch...has walked 45 (2.01 per nine innings) and struck out 191 in 201.0 innings (8.50 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.24...has yielded just 16 home runs (0.72 per nine innings).

**MONTH BY MONTH:** His ERA and opponents batting average has gone up each month of the season...went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April, 2-2 with a 2.67 ERA and .220 opponents average in five starts in May and is 3-1 with a 3.38 ERA (11 er in 29.1 ip) and .227 (25 for 110) opponents average in five starts in June...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Gray, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...of those six, only Cahill was undefeated (Cahill started the season 6-0)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 13-3 (.813) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 13 of his 16 starts and has tossed six or more innings 13 times...has not allowed a run four times.

**2014 HIGHLIGHTS:** Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in a 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game **April 2**...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 win at Texas **April 29** to start a season 4-0 for the first time in his career...had his career-high tying six-game winning streak snapped in a 4-2 loss to Seattle **May 5**...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings...struck out 56 and

walked just 10...tossed just 1.1 innings at Cleveland **May 17**, which was the shortest outing of his career...was ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second...tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit **May 28** in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history...struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings **June 3** at New York, his 22<sup>nd</sup> career 10-strikeout game.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss at New York (NL) last Tuesday, snapping his four-game winning streak...allowed seven runs in 3.0 innings, which were his most runs in a start since yielding a career-high 13 at Oakland July 10, 2010...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the second inning on back-to-back home runs by Granderson and Chris Young...allowed four more runs in the third on a ground out and a three-run home run by d'Arnaud.

# 2014 PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

## DARIC BARTON

- Made his fourth career Opening Day start at first base March 31 against Cleveland, which matches Jason Giambi for second most in Oakland history...only Mark McGwire, with nine, has more.
- Was batting .158 with five RBI in 30 games when he was designated for assignment May 15...was outrighted to Sacramento May 17.

## KYLE BLANKS

- Was acquired from San Diego on May 15 for minor league outfielder Jake Goebbert and a player to be named later (minor league pitcher Ronald Herrera on May 28).
- Hit his first home run of the season May 26 to snap a career-high 49-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on June 16, 2013.
- Had a career-high nine-game hitting streak from May 25 to June 8...went 10 for 22 (.455) with two home runs, seven RBI and seven walks (.567 on-base percentage) during the streak.

## ALBERTO CALLASPO

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.
- Struck out a career-high tying three times May 3 at Boston (third time, first since Sept. 23, 2012 vs. Chicago-AL).
- Doubled in the fourth inning June 8 at Baltimore to snap his hitless streak at a career-high tying 20 at bats (third time).
- Was on the paternity list from June 13 to 15...had his fourth career four-hit game in his first game back June 16 against Texas...reached base safely in eight consecutive plate appearances (six hits, two walks) from June 16-17

## YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.
- Had a career-high five RBI May 18 at Cleveland and matched his best with two doubles.
- Matched his career-high with five RBI and nine total bases May 31 against Los Angeles (AL) and had the first three-extra base hit game of his career...had two assists in the second inning to become the first A's outfielder with two assists in an inning since Matt Stairs on April 16, 1996 at Texas...is the first to throw out two runners at home in one inning since Dave Henderson on July 7, 1990 at Cleveland.
- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...all four of his two-homer games have come on the road.

## RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.
- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.
- Was placed on the DL a second time May 9, retroactive to May 8, with a strained right forearm.

## COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...it was his sixth regular season "walk-off" RBI.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.

- His second at bat May 18 at Cleveland was the 5000th of his career.
- Had an 11-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 7 (15 for 39, .385).

### **JOSH DONALDSON**

- Had a 0-for-20 streak from April 2 to 6, which was a career high at the time.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL).
- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 consecutive games from April 6 through the first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, 16 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .387 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his career May 13-16 (also: Aug. 29-31, 2012)
- Scored a career-high four runs May 18 at Cleveland.
- Hit his second career walk-off home run May 28 against Detroit...his other was also against the Tigers (April 12, 2013)...it was his fourth career game-ending RBI.
- Went 0 for 5 June 3 at New York, snapping his 47-game streak of reaching base safely as a third baseman...that was the longest such streak by an Athletics third baseman since at least 1914...it also snapped his streak of 30 consecutive games reaching base safely on the road dating back to Sept. 28 of last year...that was the longest such streak by an Athletic since Mark McGwire had a 55-game streak from Sept. 3, 1995-July 26, 1996.
- Had a career-high 0-for-33 streak from June 6 to 15...the hitless streak tied for seventh longest in Oakland history.
- Struck out a career-high four times June 7 at Baltimore.
- Committed three errors June 9 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the fourth third baseman in Oakland history with three or more errors in a game...the last was Marco Scutaro, who had an Oakland record four on July 6, 2007 against Seattle.

### **SEAN DOOLITTLE**

- Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

### **SAM FULD**

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

### **CRAIG GENTRY**

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

### **LUKE GREGERSON**

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.
- Made his 400th career appearance June 19 against Boston.

### **A.J. GRIFFIN**

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

## JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was also at Los Angeles on April 9, 2013.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

## JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

## ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

## JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

## JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).

## BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.



- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).

### DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...had five RBI in the game to become the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL; Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).

### ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

### JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

### DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

### NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).

### JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).

### **FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ**

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.
- Was 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA in 11 appearances with Sacramento when he was recalled by the A's on May 9.
- Made his A's debut May 9 against Washington (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...it was his first Major League appearance since Oct. 3, 2012 at Chicago (NL).
- Logged a 1.13 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 1.

### **JOE SAVERY**

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 9 and appeared in just three games without allowing a run (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb) before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 18.

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and did not allow a run in two outings (1.1 ip) before he was optioned to Sacramento April 7 when Ryan Cook was reinstated from the DL.

- Snapped a career-high 0 for 18 streak with his fifth inning single May 18 at Cleveland.
- Had the second two-steal game of his career June 17 against Texas (June 12, 2013 vs. New York-AL).

### **STEPHEN VOGT**

- Was batting .364 with three home runs and 19 RBI in 21 games with Sacramento when he was recalled by Oakland June 1.
