OAKLAND ATHLETICS (51-30) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (44-34)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four straight games, nine of the last 11 and 11 of the last 14...are a season-high 21 games over the .500 mark at 51-30 for the season...it's tied for the third best start in Oakland history and the best record in the majors for the 12th consecutive day and 14th day this year (also May 21-22)...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 63rd consecutive day (since April 28) and have held at least a share of first for 67 consecutive days (since April 24) and 75 of the last 77...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...the last time the A's spent more than 65 consecutive days in first was in 1990 (spent the final 86 days alone in first and the final 172 with at least a share of first)...lead second place Los Angeles by 5½ games...have 76 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have held the best record in the AL every day since May 31...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 10 minutes...the Oakland record is 3:08, set in 2000.

WINNING MONTHS: The A's are 17-8 in June, which is the best record in the majors...have clinched a winning record for the 13th consecutive month, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972)...the Athletics record is 15 from July 1928-Sept. 1930...the last Major League team with 13 consecutive winning months is the Boston Red Sox (July 2004-July 2006)...the last time the A's had a losing record in a month was May of 2012 (11-16)...all winning month notes exclude March and October.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-1 on this eight-game road trip to New York-NL (1-1), Miami (3-0) and Detroit (three games)...went 5-4 on the last road trip to New York-AL (2-1), Baltimore (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2)...are guaranteed at least a .500 mark on this road trip, marking their 11th consecutive road trip with a .500 or better record...that is the A's longest such streak since an 11-trip streak from June 26, 1989-July 11, 1990...have not finished a road trip with a losing record since going 2-5 at Texas and Seattle June 17-23, 2013...are 27-15 (.643) on the road, which is tied for the best record in the majors (Milwaukee, 27-15)...went 7-3 on the last homestand against New York-AL (2-1), Texas (2-1) and Boston (3-1) and are 24-15 (.615) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 26-14)...are 18-6 over the last 24 home games after starting the season 6-9...are batting .265 (346 for 1308) with 50 home runs in 39 games in Oakland compared to .245 (373 for 1525) with 39 home runs in 42 games on the road.

OFFENSE: The A's lead the majors in walks (331) and runs scored (418) and are second in on-base percentage (.335)...rank fourth in home runs (89), are sixth in fewest strikeouts (583), rank seventh in slugging (.407), and are ninth in extra base hits (238)...are tied with Baltimore for the Major League lead with four grand slams and rank second with 46 home runs with runners on base (Toronto, 48)...are the only team in the majors with three players with 50 or more RBI (Donaldson 61, Moss 59, Céspedes 55)...there have been four seasons in Oakland history in which three players have driven in 100 or more runs (1996, 1999, 2000, 2001).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.74 ERA (60 er in 114.0 ip) over the last 12 games...have a 3.16 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the majors (WAS, 3.07)...have allowed 10 home runs in the last six games and have surrendered 18 homers in the last 13 games...lead the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.293) and opponents batting average (.232), and rank second in slugging percentage (.351)...have issued the third fewest walks in the AL (223).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five or fewer innings in six of the last 12 games and are 5-2 with a 5.76 ERA (42 er in 65.2 ip) over that span...however, the team is 9-3 overall during that stretch...are 34-18 with a 3.32 ERA (179 er in 485.2 ip) for the season...have the fewest losses in the majors...own the lowest ERA and are tied for second-most wins in the AL.

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have outscored the opposition by 135 runs, which is more than double the next closest team (LAD, 54)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973 (first All-Star Game was in 1933)...the last team with a run differential greater than 127 at the break is Seattle in 2001 (149).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 9 for their last 24 (.375) with two doubles, two home runs, eight RBI and three walks...are batting .268 (19 for 71) with three home runs, 15 RBI and 15 walks for the season...lead the American League in walks and extra base hits (7), and are tied for the lead in RBI...the walks are third in the majors, the RBI are tied for sixth and the extra base hits are tied for eighth...are tied for the AL lead in doubles (4) and home runs (3), rank second in hits, slugging percentage (.444) and plate appearances (89), are third in on-base percentage (.393), and fourth in batting.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 47 for 56 (83.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors (Washington, 82.7%)...opponents have been successful in 45 of their 52 (86.5%) attempts, which is the third highest percentage in the...A's pitchers have just one pickoff, tied with St. Louis for the fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 57 errors, which is third most in the American League...A's outfielders have 23 assists, which is second most in the majors (Arizona, 25)...the A's have four outfielders with at least two assists (Céspedes, 10; Gentry, 5; Moss, 4; Reddick, 2)...Céspedes leads all Major League outfielders in assists.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Blanks, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Pomeranz, Reddick)...Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...O'Flaherty is on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 12 times this year after using it 13 times last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 9-5 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning games and wins...the 14 extra inning games are already one more than the A's played last year (7-6)...are 13-9 in games decided in the last at bat...tied for the most last at bat wins (MIL) in the majors...have won six of the last seven games decided by two runs or fewer after starting the season 12-17...are 33-12 in games decided by three runs or more.

NO ROOKIES: The A's are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 81 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest single-season streak in Oakland history...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the longest season-opening streak by a Major League team since the 2005 Cleveland Indians went the first 82 games without playing a rookie.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's and Tigers split a four-game series in Oakland from May 26-29...Oakland won the season series last year, 4-3...lost two of three in Oakland but won three of four in Detroit...then lost to the Tigers in the ALDS in five games for the second consecutive season...last year's season series win was the A's first since 2008...are 21-22 against the Tigers since 2009...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 245-237 against Detroit...that includes 137-107 in Oakland, 106-128 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 913-990-14 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes has a career-high 13-game hitting streak (19 for 54, .352), the longest by an Athletic this season...since June 18 (10 games), **four different A's relievers have earned at least one save** (Cook; Doolittle, 2; Francis; Otero)...team is six for nine in save chances and 8-2 overall during that span.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1995** Mark McGwire hits a two-out grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning off California's Lee Smith to lift the A's to an 8-5 victory over the Angels...in **2001** Miguel Tejada has three home runs and eight RBI in the A's 15-4 win at Texas...in **2012**, the A's dropped their third straight game at Texas to fall to 37-42 on the year...they would go 16-2 in their next 18 games and 57-26 (.687) over their last 83 games to win the American League West on the final day of the regular season.

MONDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (9-3, 2.66 ERA)

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Allowed seven runs on eight hits in 3.0 innings in his last start last Tuesday at New York to snap his four-game winning...allowed six runs on 23 hits in 35.1 innings during the winning streak, which spanned five starts from May 28 to June 19 (1.27 ERA, .184 opponents batting average).

NINE-GAME WINNER: Has nine wins, which is tied for fifth in the American League...has won 10 games before the All-Star Break just once in his career...that was in 2006 when he went 10-6 before the break...did not win a game after the break, going 0-2 in just five starts due to shoulder inflammation...has won 10 or more games in a season six times in his career...his nine wins are the most by an A's left-hander before the break since Mulder was 12-2 in 2004.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks third in the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.268), fourth in batting average (.217), fifth in ERA (2.66), seventh in slugging percentage (.336) and tied for fifth in winning percentage (.750)...also has the highest run support (6.52), ranks third in fewest pitches per game (92.2), tied for fifth in complete games (1), sixth in fewest pitches per inning (15.1), tied for sixth in wild pitches (6) and eighth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.93) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.00).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .134 (9 for 67) batting average with runners in scoring position, including .071 (2 for 28) with RISP and two outs...among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title, the mark with RISP is the lowest in the majors and his average with RISP and two outs second lowest (Sale, .063)...has not walked a batter to lead off an inning and is the only pitcher in the majors with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title who has not walked a batter...has allowed four home runs over his last two starts (10.0 ip) after yielding five over his first 14 starts (88.0 ip)...has yielded a .195 (54 for 277) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .289 (24 for 83) against left-handers...the mark against righties is fourth lowest in the AL...has surrendered eight of his nine home runs this year and 24 of his 28 over the last two years to righties.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is 3-0 with a 1.90 ERA (5 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts against American League Central teams compared to 6-3 with a 2.91 ERA (24 er in 74.1 ip) in 12 starts against everyone else.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-1 with a 1.61 ERA (9 er in 50.1 ip) in seven starts at home compared to 4-2 with a 3.78 ERA (20 er in 47.2 ip) in eight starts on the road...has the second lowest home ERA in the American League and sixth lowest in the majors...has walked five batters in 50.1 innings at home and 16 in 47.2 innings on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-0 with a 1.09 ERA (5 er in 41.1 ip) in six starts during the day compared to 5-3 with a 3.81 ERA (24 er in 56.2 ip) in 10 starts at night...ranks first in the American League in day ERA...is now 9-2 with a 2.34 ERA (25 er in 96.1 ip) in 16 starts during the day over the last two years and 10-10 with a 4.23 ERA (75 er in 159.2 ip) in 29 starts at night.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 6-1 with a 3.56 ERA (17 er in 43.0 ip) in seven starts on four days rest compared to 3-2 with a 1.96 ERA (12 er in 55.0 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more.

LAST 34 STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in eight of his 16 starts this year and 16 of his last 34 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 16-8 with a 2.87 ERA (64 er in 201.0 ip) and .228 (172 for 754) opponents batting average over that stretch...has walked 45 (2.01 per nine innings) and struck out 191 in 201.0 innings (8.50 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.24...has yielded just 16 home runs (0.72 per nine innings).

MONTH BY MONTH: His ERA and opponents batting average has gone up each month of the season...went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April, 2-2 with a 2.67 ERA and .220 opponents average in five starts in May and is 3-1 with a 3.38 ERA (11 er in 29.1 ip) and .227 (25 for 110) opponents average in five starts in June...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Gray, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...of those six, only Cahill was undefeated (Cahill started the season 6-0)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 13-3 (.813) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 13 of his 16 starts and has tossed six or more innings 13 times...has not allowed a run four times.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in a 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game **April 2**...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 win at Texas **April 29** to start a season 4-0 for the first time in his career...had his career-high tying six-game winning streak snapped in a 4-2 loss to Seattle **May 5**...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings...struck out 56 and walked just 10...tossed just 1.1 innings at Cleveland **May 17**, which was the shortest outing of his career...was ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second...tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit **May 28** in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history...struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings **June 3** at New York, his 22nd career 10-strikeout game.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-1 loss at New York (NL) last Tuesday, snapping his four-game winning streak...allowed seven runs in 3.0 innings, which were his most runs in a start since yielding a career-high 13 at Oakland July 10, 2010...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the second inning on back-to-back home runs by Granderson and Chris Young...allowed four more runs in the third on a ground out and a three-run home run by d'Arnaud.

KAZMIR vs. DETROIT: Is 5-5 with a 3.64 ERA (76.2 ip, 64 h, 33 r, 31 er, 36 bb, 74 so, 10 hr) in 14 career starts...is 2-2 with a 4.36 ERA (16 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts in his home ballparks and 3-3 with a 3.09 ERA (15 er in 43.2 ip) in eight starts at Comerica Park...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a complete game six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win in Oakland May 28...it was his second career complete game...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...allowed a solo home run to Hunter with two outs in the fourth inning...Sanchez shutout the A's on two hits over the first eight innings...he then allowed a one-out double to Crisp in the ninth and was relieved by Nathan who allowed a single to Jaso and a three-run walk-off home run to Donaldson...went 0-1 with a 5.06 ERA (10.2 ip, 11 h, 6 r, 6 er, 5 bb, 9 so) in two starts last year with Cleveland.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Brad Mills (1-0, 4.35 ERA): Was acquired from Milwaukee on June 17 in a minor league trade for cash considerations...spent the entire season at Triple-A Nashville where he was 4-2 with a 1.56 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts...was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 20 and has made two starts since then...including a win in his last start, an 8-5 A's win at New York (NL) last Wednesday (6.1 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 so)...it was his first big league win since July 8, 2012 against Baltimore...has never faced Detroit in his career...his ERA at Nashville was the lowest in the Pacific Coast League and second lowest among all full season minor leaguers (Daniel Winkler of Tulsa, 1.41) at the time of his June 20 promotion...also ranked third in the PCL in strikeouts (77) and opponents batting average (.190)...walked just 18 batters for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.28...surrendered five home runs in 75.0 innings, an average of 0.60 per nine innings.

- A's relievers have allowed just two earned runs over their last 16.0 ip (1.13 ERA)...have a decision in five of the last eight games (4-1 record)...**since June 18 (10 games), four different relievers have earned at least one save** (Doolittle, 2; Cook, Francis, Otero)...team is 8-2 during span and six for nine in save chances.
- The A's bullpen is **second in the American League in wins** (17) and ERA (2.87)...ranks first in on-base percentage (.282) and second in opponents batting average (.223) and slugging percentage (.320).
- Is **12 for 16 (75.0%) in save chances since May 16** after converting just seven of its first 15 (46.7%) save opportunities this season.
- Has issued the fewest walks (74) among AL bullpens...**has issued just four walks over its last 12 games and 48.1 innings.**
