OAKLAND ATHLETICS (51-31) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (45-34)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their four-game winning streak snapped last night...however, have won nine of the last 12 and 11 of the last 15 games...are 20 games over the .500 mark at 51-31 for the season, which is one short of the season-high (51-30, June 29)...it is tied for the fourth best start in Oakland history and is the **best record in the majors** for the 13th consecutive day and 15th day this year (also May 21-22)...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 64th consecutive day (since April 28) and have held at least a share of first for 68 consecutive days (since April 24) and 76 of the last 78...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since spending the final 65 days of the 2006 season in first...the last time the A's spent more than 65 consecutive days in first was in 1990 (spent the final 86 days alone in first and the final 172 with at least a share of first)...lead second place Los Angeles by five games...have 77 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have held the best record in the AL every day since May 31.

WINNING MONTHS: The A's went 17-9 in June, which was the **best record in the majors**...have now posted a winning record in 13 consecutive months, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972)...the Athletics record is 15 from July 1928-Sept. 1930...the last Major League team with 13 consecutive winning months is the Boston Red Sox (July 2004-July 2006)...the last time the A's had a losing record in a month was May of 2012 (11-16)...all winning month notes exclude March and October.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-2 on this eight-game road trip to New York-NL (1-1), Miami (3-0) and Detroit (0-1)...went 5-4 on the last road trip to New York-AL (2-1), Baltimore (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2)...will post at least a .500 mark on this road trip, marking their **11th consecutive road trip with a .500 or better record**...that is the A's longest such streak since they also had an 11-trip streak from June 26, 1989-July 11, 1990...have not finished a road trip with a losing record since going 2-5 at Texas and Seattle June 17-23, 2013...are 27-16 (.628) on the road, which is the second best record in the majors (Milwaukee, 27-15)...went 7-3 on the last homestand against New York-AL (2-1), Texas (2-1) and Boston (3-1) and are 24-15 (.615) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 26-14)...are 18-6 over the last 24 home games after starting the season 6-9...are batting .265 (346 for 1308) with 50 home runs in 39 games in Oakland compared to .245 (383 for 1562) with 39 home runs in 43 games on the road.

OFFENSE: The A's **lead the majors** in runs scored (422) and walks (332)...rank second in on-base percentage (.335), fourth in home runs (89), fifth in fewest strikeouts (586), seventh in slugging (.406) and tied for eighth in extra base hits (240)...are tied with Baltimore for the Major League lead with four grand slams and rank second with 46 home runs with runners on base (Toronto, 48)...**are the only team in the majors with three players with 50 or more RBI** (Donaldson 61, Moss 60, Céspedes 55)...there have been four seasons in Oakland history in which three players have driven in 100 or more runs (1996, 1999, 2000, 2001).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.78 ERA (65 er in 122.1 ip) over the last 13 games...have a 3.19 ERA (267 er in 754.1 ip) for the season, which **leads the American League** and ranks third in the majors...have allowed 12 home runs in the last seven games and 20 in the last 14 games...**lead the majors** in opponents on-base percentage (.294) and rank second in opponents batting average (.232) and slugging percentage (.352)...have issued the fourth fewest walks in the AL (229).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five or fewer innings in six of the last 13 games and are 5-2 with a 5.45 ERA (43 er in 71.0 ip) over that span...are 34-18 with a 3.30 ERA (180 er in 491.0 ip) for the season...have the fewest losses in the majors...have the lowest ERA in the AL and are tied for the second most wins.

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have outscored the opposition by 134 runs, which is more than double the next closest team (SEA, 56)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973 (first All-Star Game was in 1933)...the last team with a run differential greater than 127 at the break is Seattle in 2001 (149).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 9 for their last 24 (.375) with two doubles, two home runs, eight RBI and three walks...are batting .264 (19 for 72) with three home runs, 15 RBI and 15 walks for the season...lead the American League in walks and extra base hits (7) and are tied for the lead in RBI...the walks are third in the majors, the RBI are tied for sixth and the extra base hits are tied for eighth...are tied for the AL lead in doubles (4) and home runs (3), rank second in hits, slugging percentage (.444) and plate appearances (89), are third in on-base percentage (.393) and fourth in batting.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 48 for 57 (84.2%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors (Washington, 83.0%)...opponents have been successful in 48 of their 55 (87.3%) attempts, which is the third highest percentage in the majors...A's pitchers have just one pickoff, which is tied with St. Louis for the fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 57 errors, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...A's outfielders have 23 assists, which is second most in the majors (Arizona, 25).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Blanks, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Pomeranz, Reddick)...Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...O'Flaherty is on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 12 times this year after using it 13 times last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 9-5 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning games and wins...the 14 extra inning games are already one more than the A's played last year (7-6)...are 13-10 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Milwaukee for the most last at bat wins in the majors...have won six of the last eight games decided by two runs or fewer after starting the season 12-17...are 33-12 in games decided by three runs or more.

NO ROOKIES: The A's are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 82 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest single-season streak in Oakland history...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the longest season-opening streak by a Major League team since the 2005 Cleveland Indians also went the first 82 games without playing a rookie...the last team with a streak longer than 82 games is the 1971 Baltimore Orioles, who went 152 games without using a rookie.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's trail the season series, 3-2...lost the first game in Detroit last night after splitting a four-game series in Oakland May 26-29...Oakland won the season series last year, 4-3...lost two of three in Oakland but won three of four in Detroit...then lost to the Tigers in the ALDS in five games for the second consecutive season...last year's season series win was the A's first since 2008...are 21-23 against the Tigers since 2009...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 245-238 against Detroit...that includes 137-107 in Oakland, 106-129 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 913-991-14 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes extended his hitting streak to 14 games last night, which is an ongoing career-high (previous, 12: May 18-30, 2013) and the longest by an Athletic this year...is 20 for 57 (.351) with two home runs and 13 RBI during the streak...**Brandon Moss** is on a career-high tying eight-game hitting streak (also Sept. 20-27, 2012)...is 11 for 33 (.333) with two doubles, one home run and five RBI during the streak.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1979** the A's collect a club record 29 hits in a 13-12, 15 inning win at Texas...Jim Essian has five hits and Rickey Henderson, Mike Heath and Mike Edwards add four each...Texas starter Jon Matlack allows 12 hits in 5 1/3 and losing pitcher Doc Medich allows 12 hits in 8 1/3 innings of relief.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Brad Mills (1-0, 4.35 ERA)

BRIEFLY: Was acquired from Milwaukee on June 17 in a minor league trade for cash considerations...spent the entire season at Triple-A Nashville where he was 4-2 with a 1.56 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts...was selected from Triple-A Sacramento June 20 and is 1-0 with a 4.35 ERA (5 er in 10.1 ip) in two starts with the A's.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Boston June 20 in Oakland...it was his first Major League appearance since July 8, 2012...walked a career-high tying four batters (fourth time)...struck out three of the four batters he faced in the first inning before allowing two runs, one earned, in the second on a two-run single by Bradley...also allowed a RBI single to Ortiz in the third...was relieved by Johnson to start the fifth inning with the scored tied at 3-3.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-5 win at New York (NL) last Wednesday...it was his first big league win since July 8, 2012 against Baltimore...allowed a career-high nine hits...shut out the Mets on six hits over the first six innings and had an 8-0 lead when he allowed a three-run home run to Duda in the seventh.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 4-2 with a 1.56 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...the ERA was the lowest in the Pacific Coast League and second lowest among all full season minor leaguers (Daniel Winkler, Tulsa, 1.41) at the time of his promotion to Oakland on June 20...also ranked third in the PCL in opponents batting average (.190) and fourth in strikeouts (77) at the time...walked just 18 batters for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.28...surrendered five home runs in 75.0 innings, an average of 0.60 per nine innings.

LAST FIVE MINOR LEAGUE STARTS: Allowed one earned run or fewer in each of his last five starts but was just 1-2 despite a 0.87 ERA (31.0 ip, 20 h, 7 r, 3 er, 9 bb, 40 so).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .190 batting average, including .190 (40 for 211) against right-handed hitters compared to .193 (11 for 57) against left-handers...surrendered four of his five home runs to righties...four were solo shots...opponents batted .157 with four walks (.213 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...yielded a .193 batting average with runners in scoring position.

MONTH BY MONTH: Lowered his ERA each month of the season at Nashville...went 2-0 with a 2.95 ERA in five games in April, 2-0 with a 1.16 ERA in six starts in May and was 0-2 with a 1.00 ERA in three starts in June before the trade...struck out 43 batters in 38.2 innings in May, which led all minor league pitchers...his 1.16 ERA that month tied for 11th in the minors.

THIS AND THAT: Was 1-1 with a 0.75 ERA in five games during the day compared to 3-1 with a 1.94 ERA in nine games at night...did not allow a home run and issued just one walk while striking out 26 in 24.0 innings during the day...allowed just one run over the first two innings of a game (0.38 ERA)...had a 2.12 ERA from the third inning on...the Sounds were 7-5 (.583) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in eight of his 12 starts, allowed six hits or fewer 11 times, one run or fewer eight times and two walks or fewer nine times...was 0 for 15 with 12 strikeouts as a hitter.

2014 NASHVILLE HIGHLIGHTS: Made his season debut with a start in the second game of a double header April 5 at Omaha...then

pitched in relief in each of his next two outings (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 0 so) before returning to the rotation for the rest of the season...did not allow a hit in 6.0 innings against New Orleans May 1...issued three walks and allowed an unearned run in the third inning on a walk, wild pitch and error...left with a 5-1 lead but the bullpen allowed four runs before Nashville scored once in the bottom of the 11th for the win...did not allow a run in his next two starts on May 8 at Colorado Springs (7.0 ip) and May 13 at Iowa (6.0 ip) and had a 18.0-inning scoreless streak from May 1 to 19...extended his season-opening winning streak to four games by tossing 8.0 shutout innings and striking out a season-high 13 in a 3-0 win over Colorado Springs May 29...logged a 1.73 ERA during the streak, which spanned nine games, including eight starts, from April 12 to May 29...went 0-2 over his final three starts but allowed just two earned runs for a 1.00 ERA.

MAJOR LEAGUE CAREER: Made his Major League debut with Toronto in 2009...went 2-3 with an 8.57 ERA in 14 games, including nine starts, in three seasons with Toronto from 2009 to 2011...was traded to Los Angeles (AL) following the 2011 season and appeared in one game for the Angels in 2012 (see last Major League appearance above)...is 4-3 with a 7.21 ERA (51 er in 63.2 ip) in 17 career appearances, including 12 starts...has 59 strikeouts in 63.2 innings (8.34 per nine innings), but has also issued 35 walks (4.95 per nine innings)...is 4-3 with a 6.83 ERA (43 er in 56.2 ip) in 12 starts, 0-0 with a 10.29 ERA in five relief appearances.

PROFESSIONAL CAREER: Is 52-45 with a 3.73 ERA in 144 games, including 135 starts, in eight seasons in the minors...was originally drafted by Toronto in the fourth round of the 2007 First-Year Player Draft...was traded to Los Angeles (AL) on Dec. 3, 2011 for catcher Jeff Mathis...was claimed off waivers by Texas March 24, 2013 and pitched for Triple-A Round Rock before he was released July 18...also made one start for Orix in the Japanese Leagues following his release, a loss (2.2 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 10.12 ERA).

2013 RECAP: Was with Los Angeles (AL) during the spring but was claimed off waivers by Texas March 24...was outrighted to Triple-A Round Rock March 28 and went 7-5 with a 3.87 ERA in 18 games, 17 starts, before he was released July 18...pitched for Orix in the Japanese Leagues and made one start, a loss (2.2 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 10.12 ERA)...held the opposition to a .248 batting average at Round Rock, including .239 (28-for-117) against left-handed hitters compared to .252 (64-for-254) against right-handers...surrendered seven of his nine home runs to righties...began the season by going 6-0 with a 2.87 ERA over his first 11 games through June 6, including 10 starts...then went 1-5 with a 5.45 ERA over his final seven starts...including 0-4 with a 7.58 ERA over his final four starts...was on the disabled list from May 15 to 22 with a strained left elbow.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Jesse Chavez (6-4, 2.94 ERA): Ranks 10 th in the American League in ERA (2.94)...is also fifth in highest run support (5.97)...has allowed a .199 batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .273 against left-handers...has the fifth lowest batting average and on-base percentage (.241) in the AL against righties...is 3-2 with a 2.13 ERA in seven starts during the day compared to 3-2 with a 3.56 ERA in nine starts at night...eight of the nine home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...had a no decision in his last start, a 9-5 A's win at Miami last Friday (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...the A's are 12-4 (.750) in his starting assignments...is 0-2 with a 10.20 ERA and .412 opponents batting average in eight career appearances, including one start, against Detroit...that includes 0-0 with a 23.14 ERA in four games at Comerica Park...his start came in his only outing this year, a 5-4 A's loss in Oakland on May 29 (6.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 3 so).

- Had a 0.96 ERA (1 er in 9.1 ip) in nine games in April...pitched 14 times in May and June and posted a combined ERA of 5.93 (9 er in 13.2 ip).
