OAKLAND ATHLETICS (51-33) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (47-39)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept in a three-game series at Detroit after sweeping a three-game series at Miami...are 4-5 over the last nine games but are 11-6 over the last 17 contests...are 51-33 for the season, which is the **best record in the majors** for the 15th consecutive day and 17th day this year (also May 21-22)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 66th consecutive day (since April 28) and have held at least a share of first for 70 consecutive days (since April 24) and 78 of the last 80...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since 1990 (spent the final 86 days alone in first and the final 172 with at least a share of first)...lead second place Los Angeles by 3½ games...have spent 79 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have held the best record in the AL every day since May 31.

OFFENSE: The A's have gone back-to-back games without a walk for the first time since July 7-8, 2008...have walked just once over the last four games, which are the fewest walks over a four-game span in Oakland history (previous: 2, four times)...however, have 332 walks for the season, which is 29 more than any other team...also **lead the majors** in runs scored (425), rank second in on-base percentage (.333), fourth in fewest strikeouts (593), tied for fourth in home runs (91) and seventh in slugging (.404)...are tied with Baltimore for the Major League lead with four grand slams and rank second with 46 home runs with runners on base (Toronto, 50)...are the only two in the majors with two players with 60 or more RBI (Moss 62, Donaldson 61)...the other 29 teams have a combined six players.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.01 ERA (82 er in 147.1 ip) over the last 16 games...now have a 3.26 ERA for the season, which is a season high...however, it ranks second in the American League...rank second in the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.296) and slugging percentage (.353) and are third in batting average (.233)...are tied for third in the AL in fewest home runs (74).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in seven of the last 15 games and are 5-4 with a 5.60 ERA (51 er in 82.0 ip) over that span...are 34-20 with a 3.37 ERA (188 er in 502.0 ip) for the season...have the fewest losses in the majors and the lowest ERA in the American League...Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez have made 17 starts each, marking the first time the A's have two 30-year olds with 15 or more starts since 2000 (Appier, Heredia, Olivares).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have outscored the opposition by 125 runs, which is the best differential in the majors (Seattle, 70)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973 (first All-Star Game was in 1933)...the last team with a run differential greater than 127 at the break is Seattle in 2001 (149).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game homestand tonight against Toronto (four games) and San Francisco (two games)...went 7-3 on the last homestand against New York-AL (2-1), Texas (2-1) and Boston (3-1) and are 24-15 (.615) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 26-14)...are 18-6 over the last 24 home games after starting the season 6-9...went 4-4 on the last road trip to New York-NL (1-1), Miami (3-0) and Detroit (0-3), marking their 11th consecutive road trip with a .500 or better record...that matches the second longest such streak in Oakland history (June 26, 1989-July 11, 1990)...have not finished a road trip with a losing record since going 2-5 at Texas and Seattle June 17-23, 2013...are 27-18 (.600) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League...are batting .265 (346 for 1308) with 50 home runs in 39 games in Oakland compared to .244 with 41 home runs in 45 games on the road.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 9 for their last 25 (.360) with two doubles, two home runs, eight RBI and three walks...are batting .264 (19 for 72) with three home runs, 15 RBI and 15 walks for the season...the walks lead the American League and rank third in the

majors...also lead the AL in extra base hits (7), are tied for the lead in RBI, doubles (4) and home runs (3), rank second in hits, slugging percentage (.444) and plate appearances (89), third in on-base percentage (.393) and fourth in batting.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 48 for 58 (82.8%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Washington, 83.3%)...opponents have been successful in 48 of their 58 (82.8%) attempts, which is the fourth highest percentage in the majors...A's pitchers have just two pickoffs, which is tied for second fewest in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 9-5 (.643) in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning games and wins and have the fifth best record...the 14 extra inning games are already one more than the A's played last year (7-6)...are 15-10 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors in last at bat wins and rank third in games decided in the last at bat...have won six of the last eight games decided by two runs or fewer after starting the season 12-17...are 33-14 in games decided by three runs or more.

NO ROOKIES: The A's are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 84 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest single-season streak in Oakland history...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the longest season-opening streak by a Major League team since the 1971 Baltimore Orioles went the first 152 games without using a rookie.

WINNING MONTHS: The A's went 17-9 in June, which was the best record in the majors...have now posted a winning record in 13 consecutive months, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972)...the Athletics record is 15 from July 1928-Sept. 1930...the last Major League team with 13 consecutive winning months is the Boston Red Sox (July 2004-July 2006)...the last time the A's had a losing record in a month was May of 2012 (11-16)...all winning month notes exclude March and October.

THIS AND THAT: A's outfielders have 23 assists, which is second most in the majors (Arizona, 25)...the A's are 28-3 when outthuring the opposition, which is the best record in the majors...are 34-9 (.791) when scoring first, which is second best (Atlanta, 30-7, .811)...today marks the A's fourth consecutive game against a division leader...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 10 minutes...the Oakland record is 3:08 in 2000

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Blanks, Griffin, Parker, Pomeranz, Reddick)...Griffin and Parker are on the 60-day DL and will miss the remainder of the season...have used the DL 12 times this year after using it 13 times last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's trail in the season series 0-3 after being swept in a three-game series at Toronto May 23-25...won the season series last year 4-3 and have won each of the previous two season series...however, are 24-31 against the Blue Jays since 2008...the A's are 207-182 all-time against Toronto...that includes 100-93 in Oakland, 107-87 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes has a 15-game hitting streak, which is an A's season high and the second longest active streak in the majors...is 21 for 61 (.344) with 14 runs scored and 13 RBI during the streak...**Coco Crisp** is hitting .367 (36 for 98) with 24 runs, seven doubles, four home runs and 15 RBI over his last 27 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1983** Carney Lansford hits the 7000th home run in the history of the A's franchise, but the A's lose to Texas 16-4 when the Rangers score 12 times in the top of the 15th inning...in **1988** Jose Canseco hits three home runs but its Mark McGwire's 16th inning solo home run that lifts the A's to a 9-8 victory at Toronto...the following day, McGwire again homers in the 16th inning of the A's 4-2 win at Cleveland...in **1994** Bobby Witt ties Mike Torrez' club record with his third consecutive shutout, a six-hit, 10-0 win at Boston.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (7-3, 3.20 ERA)

LAST SIX STARTS: Is 2-2 with a 5.50 ERA (22 er in 36.0 ip) and .277 (39 for 141) opponents batting average over his last six starts...went 5-1 with a 1.99 ERA and .206 opponents average over his first 10 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fifth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.322) and ninth in opponents batting average (.232)...is also tied for third in shutouts (1) and tied for sixth in complete games (1) and wild pitches (6).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .144 (14 for 97) with a double and a home run (.186 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...the batting average and slugging percentage are the lowest in the majors and his .217 on-base percentage is fifth lowest...has allowed a .164 (26 for 159) career batting average and .195 slugging percentage (two doubles, one home run) against batters leading off an inning...the opponents number four hitter is batting .095 (4 for 42), which is the lowest mark in the majors.

THE LONG BALL: Has not allowed a home run in his last three starts (18.0 ip) and has yielded just one home run in his last five starts (30.0 ip)...has surrendered just six home runs in 104.0 innings for the season, an average of 0.52 per nine innings...that is the seventh lowest mark in the American League...all six home runs have come with the bases empty...has yielded just 10 home runs in 168.0 career innings (0.54 per nine innings).

AGAINST THE EAST: Is 0-2 with a 3.91 ERA (11 er in 25.1 ip) in four starts against American League East competition compared to 7-1 with a 2.97 ERA (26 er in 78.2 ip) in 12 starts against everyone else...his career splits are 1-4 with a 4.14 ERA (19 er in 41.1 ip) in seven starts against the East, 11-2 with a 2.63 ERA (37 er in 126.2 ip) in 21 games against everyone else.

MONTH BY MONTH: His ERA has increased each month of the season...did not allow a run in one start in March, went 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA in April, 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA in May and 2-2 with a 5.40 ERA in five starts in June...his June ERA is the highest single month ERA of his career...was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the month of April...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings and held the opposition to a .211 batting average...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Committed his first error of the season in his last start...ranks second among American League pitchers with 31 total chances (Keuchel, HOU 38).

THAT'S ODD: Has a 4.53 ERA (28 er in 55.2 ip) in odd numbered innings compared to a 1.68 ERA (9 er in 48.1 ip) in even numbered innings...has a 4.50 ERA (8 er in 16.0 ip) in the first inning this year and a 5.19 ERA (15 er in 26.0 ip) in his career.

WINS: Has won seven games this year and now has 12 wins in 28 career games...in Oakland history, only Tim Hudson has won more games over the first 28 games of his career (14)...recorded his 10th career win in his 21st career game May 16 at Cleveland...is the fifth pitcher in Oakland history to reach 10 career wins in 21 games or fewer: Tim Hudson (18 games), Barry Zito (19), A.J. Griffin (20) and Bill Krueger (20).

THIS AND THAT: Has received run support of two runs or fewer in seven of his 16 starts...the A's have been shut out four times this year, three times in his starts...the A's are 10-6 (.625) in his starting assignments this year and are 16-10 (.615) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 14 of his 16 starts and allowed two runs or fewer seven times...lost back-to-back starts on June 7 at Baltimore and June 13 against New York (AL), marking the first time he has lost consecutive decisions in his career (6.35 ERA).

SIX INNINGS OR MORE, THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Allowed four runs in 6.0 innings May 27 against Detroit, snapping his season-opening streak of 10 consecutive starts with six innings or more and three runs or fewer...that is the longest such streak to start a season by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1914...it is the longest such streak by an American League pitcher to start a season since Pedro Martinez had a 12-game streak in 2001.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night **March 31**...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle **April 6** in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle **April 12**...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-3 win over Houston **April 18** in Oakland...allowed a career-high nine hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas **April 23** in Oakland...walked a career-high four batters...the loss snapped a career-high six-game winning streak dating back to September 11, 2013...went 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak...tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas **April 28**...became just the fifth pitcher (third visiting pitcher) to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win at Boston **May 4**...blanked the Red Sox on one hit over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high tying 14.0 innings...was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-1 win at Cleveland **May 16**...matched his career-high with nine strikeouts...was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss at Baltimore **June 7**...matched his career-high by walking four batters.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6, 14-inning win at Miami last Saturday...tossed a season-low 5.0 innings...the A's scored four times in the top of the first but he allowed three runs in the bottom of the second on a Solano RBI single and a Johnson two-run double...allowed two more runs in the fourth on a Stanton RBI single and a Jones RBI ground out...the A's then tied the game with a run in the fifth.

LHP Tommy Milone (6-3, 3.79 ERA):	Is 6-0 with a 2.87 ERA and .237 opponents batting average over his last 10 starts...the winning streak is a career high and an A's season high...it matches the longest winning streak in the American League for the season and matches the longest active winning streak in the majors (Kershaw, LAD and Morris, PIT/MIA)...is 3-0 with a 3.12 ERA in seven starts in Oakland compared to 3-3 with a 4.40 ERA in nine starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 15-8 with a 3.04 ERA in 34 games in Oakland compared to 16-14 with a 4.69 ERA in 40 games on the road...has held the opponents number three, four and five hitters to a .168 batting average...has yielded five of his 12 home runs to the number nine hitter, which is tied for the most in Athletics history (Greg Smith, 2008 and Barry Zito, 2004)...had was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-3 A's win at Miami on Sunday (7.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...is 0-2 with a 7.62 ERA in two career starts against Toronto, both in 2012.

- Converted seven straight save chances from June 1-20 but have converted just three of seven saves (42.9%) since June 21 (10 games).
- The A's bullpen is **second in the American League in wins (17) and ERA (3.05)**...ranks first in opponents on-base percentage (.284), second in slugging percentage (.323) and third in batting average (.224).
- Has issued the fewest walks (77) among AL bullpens...**has issued just seven walks over its last 15 games and 56.1 innings.**

- Save Sunday was the 17th of his career but his first since July 24, 2013 at Houston...14 of 17 career saves came in 2012.
- Has appeared in 12 games since coming off the DL June 3 (6 er in 11.1 ip, 4.76 ERA)...prior to that DL stint, pitched in 12 games and posted an 0-1 record with a 2.92 ERA (4 er in 12.1 ip).
- Had a 0.96 ERA (1 er in 9.1 ip) in nine games in April...has pitched 15 times since, and posted a combined ERA of 5.65 (9 er in 14.1 ip).
- Righties are 10 for 56 (.179) with 20 strikeouts against him this season...lefties are 10 for 32 (.313) with five strikeouts.

MONTH BY MONTH: His ERA and opponents batting average has gone up each month of the season...went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April, 2-2 with a 2.67 ERA and .220 opponents average in five starts in May and 3-1 with a 3.12 ERA and .223 opponents average in five starts in June...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Gray, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...of those six, only Cahill was undefeated (Cahill started the season 6-0)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 13-4 (.765) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 13 of his 17 starts and has tossed six or more innings 13 times...has not allowed a run four times.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in a 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game **April 2**...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 win at Texas **April 29** to start a season 4-0 for the first time in his career...had his career-high tying six-game winning streak snapped in a 4-2 loss to Seattle **May 5**...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings...struck out 56 and walked just 10...tossed just 1.1 innings at Cleveland **May 17**, which was the shortest outing of his career...was ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second...tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit **May 28** in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout

against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history...struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings **June 3** at New York (AL), his 22nd career 10-strikeout game...had his four-game winning streak snapped in the A's 10-1 loss at New York (NL) on **June 24**...allowed seven runs on eight hits in 3.0 innings, which were his most runs in a start since yielding a career-high 13 at Oakland July 10, 2010...allowed six runs on 23 hits in 35.1 innings during the winning streak, which spanned five starts from May 28 to June 19 (1.27 ERA, .184 opponents batting average).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Detroit on Monday...shut out the Tigers on three hits and two walks over the first five innings but Sanchez also blanked the A's before Oakland scored a run in the sixth...Kazmir allowed a leadoff home run to Cabrera in the bottom of the sixth and he was relieved two batters later with the scored tied 1-1.

- Made his fourth career Opening Day start at first base March 31 against Cleveland, which matches Jason Giambi for second most in Oakland history...only Mark McGwire, with nine, has more.
- Was batting .158 with five RBI in 30 games when he was designated for assignment May 15...was outrighted to Sacramento May 17.

KYLE BLANKS

- Was acquired from San Diego on May 15 for minor league outfielder Jake Goebbert and a player to be named later (minor league pitcher Ronald Herrera on May 28).
- Hit his first home run of the season May 26 to snap a career-high 49-game homerless streak dating back to his last home run on June 16, 2013.
- Had a career-high nine-game hitting streak from May 25 to June 8...went 10 for 22 (.455) with two home runs, seven RBI and seven walks (.567 on-base percentage) during the streak.

ALBERTO CALLASPO

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.
- Struck out a career-high tying three times May 3 at Boston (third time, first since Sept. 23, 2012 vs. Chicago-AL).
- Doubled in the fourth inning June 8 at Baltimore to snap his hitless streak at a career-high tying 20 at bats (third time).
- Was on the paternity list from June 13 to 15...had his fourth career four-hit game in his first game back June 16 against Texas...reached base safely in eight consecutive plate appearances (six hits, two walks) from June 16-17

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.
- Had a career-high five RBI May 18 at Cleveland and matched his best with two doubles.
- Matched his career-high with five RBI and nine total bases May 31 against Los Angeles (AL) and had the first three-extra base hit game of his career...had two assists in the second inning to become the first A's outfielder with two assists in an inning since Matt Stairs on April 16, 1996 at Texas...is the first to throw out two runners at home in one inning since Dave Henderson on July 7, 1990 at Cleveland.
- Hit a career-high tying two home runs June 4 at New York (AL)...all four of his two-homer games have come on the road.

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.
- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.
- Was placed on the DL a second time May 9, retroactive to May 8, with a strained right forearm.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...added a walk-off RBI single June 21 against Boston...now has five regular season "walk-off" RBI with the A's and seven in his career.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.

- His second at bat May 18 at Cleveland was the 5000th of his career.
- Had an 11-game hitting streak from May 26 to June 7 (15 for 39, .385).

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a 0-for-20 streak from April 2 to 6, which was a career high at the time.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston...his second came on May 30 against Los Angeles (AL).
- Reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 consecutive games from April 6 through the first game of the May 7 doubleheader...hit .303 (36 for 119) 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, 16 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .387 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his career May 13-16 (also: Aug. 29-31, 2012)
- Scored a career-high four runs May 18 at Cleveland.
- Hit his second career walk-off home run May 28 against Detroit...his other was also against the Tigers (April 12, 2013)...it was his fourth career game-ending RBI.
- Went 0 for 5 June 3 at New York, snapping his 47-game streak of reaching base safely as a third baseman...that was the longest such streak by an Athletics third baseman since at least 1914...it also snapped his streak of 30 consecutive games reaching base safely on the road dating back to Sept. 28 of last year...that was the longest such streak by an Athletic since Mark McGwire had a 55-game streak from Sept. 3, 1995-July 26, 1996.
- Had a career-high 0-for-33 streak from June 6 to 15...the hitless streak tied for seventh longest in Oakland history.
- Struck out a career-high four times June 7 at Baltimore.
- Committed three errors June 9 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the fourth third baseman in Oakland history with three or more errors in a game...the last was Marco Scutaro, who had an Oakland record four on July 6, 2007 against Seattle.

SEAN DOOLITTLE

- Agreed to terms on a five-year contract through the 2018 season with club options for 2019 and 2020, April 18.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.
- Made his 400th career appearance June 19 against Boston.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.
- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.
- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.

- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...had five RBI in the game to become the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL; Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.

- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
- Went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA on an eight-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from April 3 to 28...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Sacramento April 29.
- Was 1-0 with a 0.73 ERA in 11 appearances with Sacramento when he was recalled by the A's on May 9.
- Made his A's debut May 9 against Washington (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...it was his first Major League appearance since Oct. 3, 2012 at Chicago (NL).
- Logged a 1.13 ERA in six relief appearances before he was optioned back to Sacramento June 1.

JOE SAVERY

- Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento May 9 and appeared in just three games without allowing a run (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb) before he was optioned back to Sacramento May 18.

EVAN SCRIBNER

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and did not allow a run in two outings (1.1 ip) before he was optioned to Sacramento April 7 when Ryan Cook was reinstated from the DL.

ERIC SOGARD

- Snapped a career-high 0 for 18 streak with his fifth inning single May 18 at Cleveland.
- Had the second two-steal game of his career June 17 against Texas (June 12, 2013 vs. New York-AL).

STEPHEN VOGT

- Was batting .364 with three home runs and 19 RBI in 21 games with Sacramento when he was recalled by Oakland June 1.
- Became the first player in Oakland history to play catcher, first base and right field in the same game June 22 against Boston...it was his Major League debut at first base...had 68 games in the minors at first (last in 2012)...since 1914, the only other Athletic to do it was Bert Campaneris, who did it Sept. 8, 1965 when he played all nine positions.
