2013 HIGHLIGHTS

- Batted a combined .227 with 18 HR and 48 RBI in 124 games between Atlanta and Milwaukee
- Batted .241 with 5 HR and 16 RBI in 35 games with the Braves
- Made 31 starts with Atlanta (29g at 3B, 2g at DH)
- Belted his first career grand slam on 5/8 at Cincinnati off J.J. Hoover
- Was designated for assignment on 5/30
- Was traded to Milwaukee on 6/3 in exchange for LHP Thomas Keeling
- Batted .221 with 13 HR and 32 RBI in 89 games with the Brewers
- Made 66 starts with Milwaukee (62g at 1B, 4g at 3B)
- Made his Brewers debut on 6/4 vs. Oakland, starting at first base (0-for-2, bb)
- Prior to his Brewers debut had never appeared in a Major League game at first base and had appeared in only 3 games at the position in the minor leagues (all in 2010 at Triple-A Louisville)
- Notched the first two multi-homer games of his career: 4/16 vs. Kansas City and 8/14 at Texas
- Played for Licey in the Dominican Winter League (40g, .260, 3hr, 24rbi)
- Signed a 1-year contract on 1/17/14, avoiding arbitration

- Was traded from Cincinnati to Atlanta on 4/1 in exchange for RHP J.J. Hoover
- Batted .234 with 9 HR and 32 RBI in 93 games
- Made 42 starts, all at third base
- Played for Licey in the Dominican Winter League (34g, .307, 9hr, 29rbi)

2011

- Entered 2011 as the seventh-best prospect in the Reds organization according to *Baseball America*
- Batted .258 with 3 HR and 15 RBI in 31 games with Cincinnati
- Made 20 starts, all at third base
- Was on the 15-day disabled list from 4/17-5/16 with a strained left calf
- Was optioned to Triple-A Louisville on 5/17 following his stint on the disabled list
- Batted .307 with 15 HR and 50 RBI in 74 games at Louisville
- Was on Louisville's disabled list from 7/4-8/4 with a torn meniscus in his right knee and underwent surgery, performed by Dr. Timothy Kremchek
- Rejoined the Reds as a September call-up
- Produced a career-high 5 RBI in an 11-8 win on 9/2 at St. Louis
- Had a career-high 4 hits in a 3-2 win on 9/4 at St. Louis, going 4-for-5 with a double and 1RBI
- Played for Licey in the Dominican Winter League (46g, .300, 5hr, 26rbi)

2010

- Entered 2010 as the fifth-best prospect in the Reds organization according to *Baseball America*
- Batted .273 with 1 HR and 7 RBI in 36 games with Cincinnati
- Had three stints with the Reds (Opening Day-4/11, 8/3-8/15 and 8/27-end)
- Made his first career Opening Day roster
- Made 6 starts, all at third base
- Batted .286 with 18 HR and 59 RBI in 77 games at Triple-A Louisville
- Was on Louisville's disabled list from 5/11-6/13 following an emergency appendectomy on 5/10, performed by Dr. John Walker

- His only appearance of the NLDS vs. Philadelphia came in Game 1 as a pinch hitter (grounded out)
- Played for Cibao in the Dominican Winter League (39g, .322, 8hr, 30rbi)

2009

- Entered 2009 as the eighth-best prospect in the Reds organization according to *Baseball America*
- Was named Reds Minor League Hitter of the Year for the second consecutive season as he batted a combined .295 with 27 HR and 93 RBI in 131 games between Double-A Carolina (109g) and Triple-A Louisville (22g)
- Began the season at Carolina, where he batted .281 with 22 HR and 74 RBI in 109 games
- Was named to both the Southern League's midseason and postseason All-Star teams
- Was among the Southern League leaders in total bases (2nd, 219), home runs (3rd, 22), slugging pct. (3rd, .501) and RBI (T4th, 74)
- Was promoted to Louisville on 8/15 and batted .359 with 5 HR and 19 RBI in 22 games
- Was recalled by the Reds on 9/14
- Made his Major League debut on 9/14 vs. Houston and struck out as a pinch hitter against Sammy Gervacio
- Recorded his first Major League hit and RBI with a pinch-hit solo homer on 9/18 vs. Florida off Leo Nunez
- Played for Cibao in the Dominican Winter League and was named league MVP (46g, .302, 11hr, 42rbi)

- Entered 2008 as the eighth-best prospect in the Reds organization according to *Baseball America*
- Was named Reds Minor League Hitter of the Year as he batted .277 with 23 HR and 92 RBI in 127 games at Class-A Sarasota

- Was named to both the Florida State League's midseason and postseason All-Star teams
- Led the FSL in total bases (256) and extra-base hits (62) and ranked among the league leaders in RBI (2nd, 92), hits (T2nd, 143), doubles (T3rd, 34), home runs (4th, 23) and slugging pct. (4th, .496)
- Participated in the All-Star Futures Game at Yankee Stadium
- Played for Cibao in the Dominican Winter League and set a league record for home runs by a left-handed batter.....was named DWL's Rookie of the Year (40g, .360, 12hr, 37rbi)

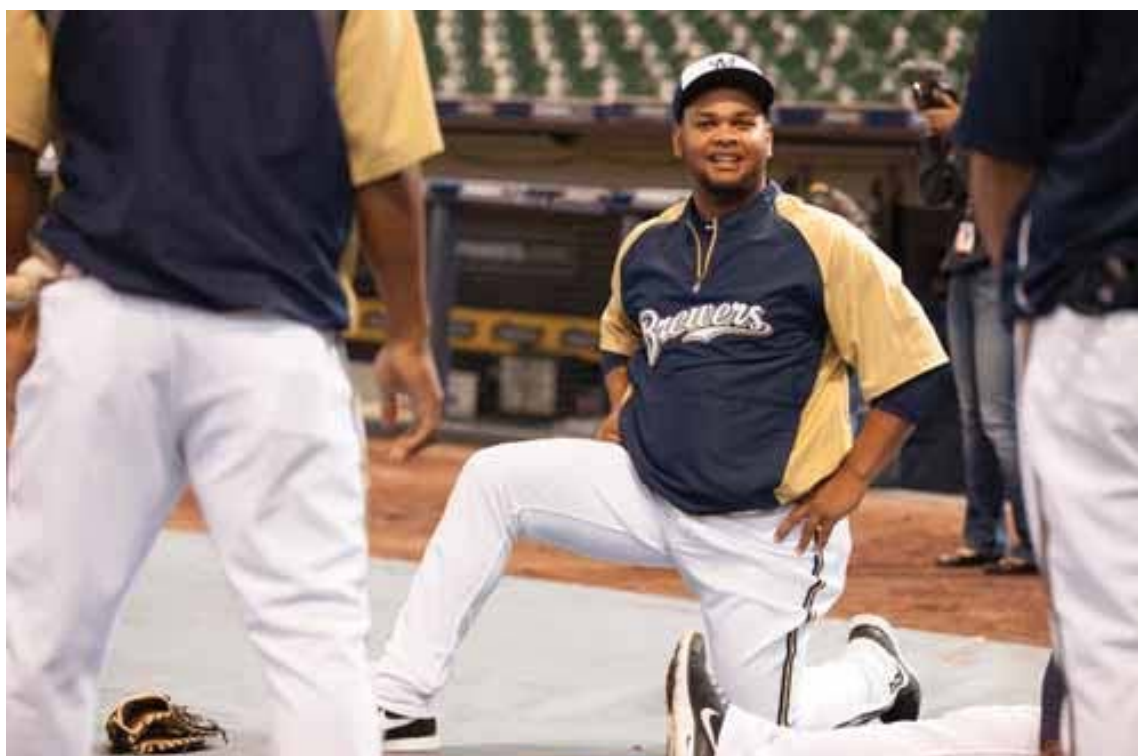
- Batted .268 with 25 HR, 90 RBI and 12 stolen bases in 135 games at Class-A Dayton

PERSONAL: Darin Paul Mastroianni (pronounced mass-tro-YAH-nee)...2003 graduate of Fox Lane (NY) High School... attended Southern Indiana University from 2006-07 and hit .409 (97-for-237) with 13 doubles, seven triples and two home runs in 66 career games...stole 64 bases in 67 attempts...in 2007, named First-Team All-American, North Central Region Player of the Year, first year All-North Central Region, North Central Regional Outstanding Player, North Central Regional All-Tournament, Great Lakes Valley Conference Player of the Year and First-Team All-GLVC...spent one year at Winthrop (SC) University appearing in only five games in 2005.

2013:

- Made Twins Opening Day roster, the first of his career.
- Placed on 15-day disabled list April 16 with a left ankle stress reaction...transferred to the 60-day disabled list May 22...went on rehab assignment with GCL Twins, Single-A Ft. Myers and Triple-A Rochester July 29-August 5...taken off the disabled list August 15 after missing 106 Twins games and had option transferred to Triple-A Rochester.
- Hit safely in 10 of final 11 games for the Red Wings and recalled by Minnesota August 30.

2012: Claimed off waivers by the Twins from Toronto February 9...was invited to Twins spring training and optioned March 15...started season with Double-A New Britain and hit just .143 (5-for-35) in nine games before being promoted to Triple-A Rochester April 14...hit safely in 15 of 20 games for Red Wings, including nine multi-hit games...recalled by Twins May 10 when Danny Valencia was optioned...went 2-for-4 with three RBI in second game for Twins, including first major league hit, a two-run single off Carlos Villanueva May 11 vs. Toronto...had first career triple June 8 vs. Chicago-NL...hit first career double June 16 vs. Milwaukee...hit first career home run, a solo shot off Will Ohman, June 27 vs. Chicago-AL...had first career three-hit game and stole three bases July 5 at Detroit...sidelined with a mallet finger on the middle finger of left hand, an injury he suffered sliding into a base September 18 at Cleveland...finished with 21 stolen bases, tying him for second-most among AL rookies in baseball...was successful in 21 of 24 stolen base attempts (87.5%), tying him for sixth best percentage in the AL and third among MLB rookies...stolen base percentage ranked fourth best in club history and highest ever for a rookie.

2011: Started season with Triple-A Las Vegas (Toronto)...transferred from Las Vegas to Double-A New Hampshire on several occasions during season...batted .405 (17-for-42) with four doubles, one triple and seven runs scored in 11 games in June...recalled by Toronto August 24 and made the start in center field that same night vs. Kansas City, going 0-for-2 and being optioned back to Las Vegas following the game...batted .268 with 26 doubles, nine triples, three home runs and 34 stolen bases in 123 games between New Hampshire and Las Vegas...stole 200th career base in the minor leagues September 3 vs. Salt Lake City.

2010: Spent season with Double-A New Hampshire (Toronto)...selected to Eastern League Mid- and Postseason All-Star teams...was first in Eastern League in stolen bases (46), tied for first in hits (158), and second in runs scored (101), on-base percentage (.390) and walks (77)...led all Blue Jays minor leaguers in runs, hits and stolen bases...batted .319 against left-handed pitching and .295 against right-handers...added to Jays 40-man roster November 19.

2009: Started season with Single-A Dunedin (Toronto)...named organizational Star of the Month for April after batting .333 (24-for-72) with 18 runs scored and 16 stolen bases in 19 games...named Florida State League Player of the Week June 8-14, batting .452 with five RBI and 11 runs scored...named to FSL Midseason All-Star team...transferred to Double-A New Hampshire at midseason...named organizational Star of the Month in August, batting .314 with 16 runs scored and 22 stolen bases...finished season with 70 stolen bases at both levels combined.

2008: Spent entire season with Single-A Lansing (Toronto)...made full-time switch from second base to the outfield defensively.

2007: Made professional debut with Single-A Auburn (Toronto)...named organizational Star of the Month for August, batting .286 with a home run and five RBI.
