OAKLAND ATHLETICS (53-33) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (47-41)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won back-to-back games after losing three straight...are now 13-6 over the last 19 games and 53-33 for the season, which is the **best record in the majors** for the 17th consecutive day and 19th day this year (also May 21-22)...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the 68th consecutive day (since April 28) and have held at least a share of first for 72 consecutive days (since April 24) and 80 of the last 82...this is the A's longest stretch of consecutive days in first place since 1990 (spent the final 86 days alone in first and the final 172 with at least a share of first)...lead second place Los Angeles by 3½ games for the fourth consecutive day...have spent 81 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...have held the best record in the AL every day since May 31.

50 home runs in 41 games in Oakland compared to .244 with 41 home runs in 45 games on the road.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 10 for their last 26 (.385) with three doubles, two home runs, eight RBI and three walks...are batting .274 (20 for 73) with three home runs, 15 RBI and 15 walks for the season...the 20 pinch hits match the A's season total from last year...the walks lead the American League and are tied for third in the majors...also lead the AL in doubles (5) and extra base hits (8), are tied for the lead in hits, RBI and home runs, rank second in slugging percentage (.466) and plate appearances (90), third in on-base percentage (.400) and fourth in batting average.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 49 for 59 (83.1%) in stolen base attempts, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Washington, 83.3%)...opponents have been successful in 50 of their 60 (83.3%) attempts, which is the fourth highest percentage in the majors...A's pitchers have just two pickoffs, which is tied for second fewest in the majors.

BEFORE THE BREAK: The A's pitching staff has 660 strikeouts, which is the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (650 in 2013)...the A's .616 (53-33) winning percentage is currently fifth best in Oakland history...are averaging 5.00 runs per game, which is eighth best in Oakland history.

NO ROOKIES: The A's are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 86 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest single-season streak in Oakland history...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the longest season-opening streak by a Major League team since the 1971 Baltimore Orioles went the first 152 games without using a rookie.

THIS AND THAT: A's outfielders have 24 assists, which is second most in the majors (Arizona, 25) and one short of the A's season total from last year...have posted a winning record in 13 consecutive months, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (Sept. 1970-Sept. 1972)...the Athletics record is 15 from July 1928-Sept. 1930...the last Major League team with 13 consecutive winning months is the Boston Red Sox (July 2004-July 2006)...are 28-3 when outperforming the opposition, which is the best record in the majors...are 35-9 (.795) when scoring first, which is second best (Atlanta, 31-7, .816).

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's trail in the season series 2-3...have won the first two games in Oakland after being swept in a three-game series at Toronto May 23-25...won the season series last year 4-3 and have won each of the previous two season series...however, are 26-31 against the Blue Jays since 2008...the A's are 209-182 all-time against Toronto...that includes 102-93 in Oakland, 107-87 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

CLOSE CALLS: Yesterday's 12-inning win equaled the fourth longest 1-0 victory in Oakland history and was the longest since a 14-inning win on July 20, 2004, also against Toronto...the A's are now 10-5 (.667) in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning games and wins...are tied for the American League lead for best record...the 15 extra inning games are already two more than the A's played last year (7-6)...are 16-10 in games decided in the last at bat...lead the majors in last at bat wins and are tied for second in games decided in the last at bat (Miami, 28)...have six walk-off wins, which is second in the AL (Chicago, 7)...have won seven of the last nine games decided by two runs or fewer after starting the season 12-17...are 34-14 in games decided by three runs or more.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff tossed its eighth shutout of the season yesterday...it was the 12th extra inning shutout in Oakland history, the first since April 16, 2005 against the Angels (1-0 in 10)...A's pitchers have allowed one run in the last two games (21.0 ip, 0.43 ERA) after surrendering 53 over the previous nine contests (5.62 ERA)...have a 3.18 ERA for the season, which ranks second in the majors...lead the majors in opponents on-base percentage (.295) and rank second in opponents batting average (.232) and slugging percentage (.350)...are third in the American League in fewest home runs (74).

OFFENSE: The A's won a game without an RBI yesterday for the 15th time in Oakland history, the first time since July 4, 2013 against Chicago (NL)...the A's **lead the majors** in runs scored (430) and walks (342), rank third in on-base percentage (.331), fourth in fewest strikeouts (609) and sixth in home runs (91)...are tied with Baltimore for the Major League lead with four grand slams and rank second with 46 home runs with runners on base (Toronto, 50).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in seven of the last 17 games and are 6-4 with a 4.93 ERA (52 er in 95.0 ip) over that span...are 35-20 with a 3.30 ERA (189 er in 515.0 ip) for the season...have the fewest losses in the majors and the lowest ERA in the American League.

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The A's have outscored the opposition by 129 runs, which is more than double the next closest team (Seattle, 64)...the best run differential at the All-Star Break in Athletics history is 95 in 1973 (first All-Star Game was in 1933)...the last team with a run differential greater than 127 at the break is Seattle in 2001 (149).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on this six-game homestand against Toronto (2-0) and San Francisco (two games)...went 7-3 on the last homestand against New York-AL (2-1), Texas (2-1) and Boston (3-1) and are 26-15 (.625) at home for the season, which is the second best home record in the majors (Los Angeles-AL, 28-14)...are 20-6 over the last 26 home games after starting the season 6-9...went 4-4 on the last road trip to New York-NL (1-1), Miami (3-0) and Detroit (0-3) and are 27-18 (.600) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League...are batting .260 (357 for 1374) with

Coco Crisp is hitting .366 (37 for 101) with 24 runs, seven doubles, four home runs and 15 RBI over his last 28 games...**Derek Norris** is batting .356 (16 for 45) with three home runs and 10 RBI over his last 15 games...leads American League catchers in on-base percentage (.402) and slugging percentage (.488), is second in batting average (.299) and tied for third in RBI (30)...**Stephen Vogt** is batting .361 (22 for 61) over his last 20 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1989** Mark McGwire connects off Charlie Leibrandt for his 100th career homer, a three-run shot in the third inning of the A's 12-9, 11-inning loss to Kansas City...in **1993** Rickey Henderson becomes just the second player in Major League history to lead off both games of a doubleheader with a homer...Boston's Harry Hopper was the first on May 30, 1913 vs. Washington...prior to the game, Rollie Fingers has his number 34 retired...in **1994** Rickey Henderson becomes Oakland's all-time leader in games played when he plays in his 1411th game as an Athletic...in **1996** the A's set an Oakland record and tie a franchise record by scoring 13 runs in the first inning of a 16-8 win over California...Matt Stairs tied a ML record by driving in six runs in the inning.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (9-3, 2.61 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.270), fifth in ERA (2.61) and opponents batting average (.216), tied for sixth in wins (9), seventh in slugging percentage (.339) and tied for seventh in winning percentage (.750)...also has the second highest run support (6.27), ranks fourth in fewest pitches per game (92.6), tied for seventh in complete games (1) and wild pitches (6) and seventh in fewest pitches per inning (15.2).

NINE-GAME WINNER: Has nine wins and has won 10 games before the All-Star Break just once in his career...that was in 2006 when he went 10-6 before the break...did not win a game after the break, going 0-2 in just five starts due to shoulder inflammation...has won 10 or more games in a season six times in his career...his nine wins are the most by an A's left-hander before the break since Mulder was 12-2 in 2004.

ONE RUN OR FEWER: Has allowed one run or fewer in nine of his 17 starts this year and 17 of his last 35 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 16-8 with a 2.84 ERA (65 er in 206.1 ip) and .227 (176 for 774) opponents batting average over that stretch...has walked 48 (2.09 per nine innings) and struck out 198 in 206.1 innings (8.64 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.13...has yielded just 17 home runs (0.74 per nine innings).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-0 with a 0.93 ERA (3 er in 29.0 ip) over his last four starts in Oakland...is 5-1 with a 1.61 ERA (9 er in 50.1 ip) in seven starts at home overall compared to 4-2 with a 3.57 ERA (21 er in 53.0 ip) in nine starts on the road...has the lowest home ERA in the American League and third lowest in the majors...has walked five batters in 50.1 innings at home and 19 in 53.0 innings on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .127 (9 for 71) batting average with runners in scoring position, including .063 (2 for 32) with RISP and two outs...among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title, the mark with RISP is the lowest in the majors and his average with RISP and two outs is second lowest (Sale, CWS .053)...has not walked a batter to lead off an inning and is the only pitcher in the majors with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title with no walks in that situation...his .255 on-base percentage against batters leading off an inning is eighth lowest in the American League...has yielded a .197 (58 for 295) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .282 (24 for 85) against left-handers...the mark against righties is fourth lowest in the AL...has surrendered nine of his 10 home runs this year and 25 of his 29 over the last two years to righties...has allowed five home runs over his last three starts (15.1 ip) after surrendering five over his first 14 starts (88.0 ip).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-0 with a 1.09 ERA (5 er in 41.1 ip) in six starts during the day compared to 5-3 with a 3.63 ERA (25 er in 62.0 ip) in 11 starts at night...ranks second in the majors in day ERA (Ross, SD 0.93)...is now 9-2 with a 2.34 ERA (25 er in 96.1 ip) in 16 starts during the day over the last two years and 10-10 with a 4.15 ERA (76 er in 165.0 ip) in 30 starts at night.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 6-1 with a 3.56 ERA (17 er in 43.0 ip) in seven starts on four days rest compared to 3-2 with a 1.94 ERA (13 er in 60.1 ip) in 10 starts on five days rest or more.

MONTH BY MONTH: His ERA and opponents batting average has gone up each month of the season...went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in April, 2-2 with a 2.67 ERA and .220 opponents average in five starts in May and 3-1 with a 3.12 ERA and .223 opponents average in five starts in June...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Gray, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...of those six, only Cahill was undefeated (Cahill started the season 6-0)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 13-4 (.765) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in 13 of his 17 starts and has tossed six or more innings 13 times...has not allowed a run four times.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits in a 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game **April 2**...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut...was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 win at Texas **April 29** to start a season 4-0 for the first time in his career...had his career-high tying six-game winning streak snapped in a 4-2 loss to Seattle **May 5**...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings...struck out 56 and walked just 10...tossed just 1.1 innings at Cleveland **May 17**, which was the shortest outing of his career...was ejected by home plate umpire Jerry Layne after walking Aguilar with one out in the second...tossed his second career complete game, a six-hitter in the A's 3-1 win over Detroit **May 28** in Oakland...did not walk a batter and struck out eight...his other complete game was a two-hit shutout against Boston on July 3, 2006...went 161 starts between complete games, which is the seventh longest streak of consecutive starts without a complete game in Major League history...struck out 10 batters in 6.1 innings **June 3** at New York (AL), his 22nd career 10-strikeout game...had his four-game winning streak snapped in the A's 10-1 loss at New York (NL) on **June 24**...allowed seven runs on eight hits in 3.0 innings, which were his most runs in a start since yielding a career-high 13 at Oakland July 10, 2010...allowed six runs on 23 hits in 35.1 innings during the winning streak, which spanned five starts from May 28 to June 19 (1.27 ERA, .184 opponents batting average).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Detroit on Monday...shut out the Tigers on three hits and two walks over the first five innings but Sanchez also blanked the A's before Oakland scored a run in the sixth...Kazmir allowed a leadoff home run to Cabrera in the bottom of the sixth and he was relieved two batters later with the score tied 1-1.

KAZMIR vs. TORONTO: Is 4-6 with a 3.80 ERA (97.0 ip, 96 h, 43 r, 41 er, 37 bb, 98 so, 8 hr) in 16 career starts...is 1-2 with a 3.31 ERA (18 er in 49.0 ip) in eight starts in his home ballparks and 3-4 with a 4.31 ERA (23 er in 48.0 ip) in eight starts at Rogers Centre...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 3-2 A's loss at Toronto May 23...allowed a two-run home run to Tolleson in the second inning and yielded another run in the third when Pillar scored on a Reyes ground out...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced...it was his first start against the Blue Jays in nearly four years.

RHP Jeff Samardzija (0-0, --- ERA): Was acquired from the Chicago Cubs today with Jason Hammell for Addison Russell, Billy McKinney, Dan Straily and a player to be named later or cash...was 2-7 with a 2.83 ERA in 17 starts for the Cubs...ranks 10th in the National League in ERA but has the third lowest winning percentage (.222) and the fourth lowest run support (3.08)...went 0-4 despite a 1.46 ERA over his first 10 starts...is 2-3 with a 5.18 ERA in seven starts since then...has allowed a .221 batting average with runners in scoring position...has surrendered just seven home runs in 108.0 innings...his average of 0.58 home runs per nine innings ranks ninth lowest in the NL...was 1-4 with a 2.24 ERA in nine starts at Wrigley Field, 1-3 with a 3.59 ERA in eight starts on the road...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-2 loss to Washington a week ago today (5.0 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 5 er, 0 bb, 6 so)...has never faced the Blue Jays in his career.

- Has issued the fewest walks (78) among AL bullpens...**has issued just eight walks over its last 17 games and 64.1 innings.**

LAST EIGHT, FIRST NINE: Is 2-4 with a 4.08 ERA (21 er in 46.1 ip) and .293 (53 for 181) opponents batting average over his last eight starts after going 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA and .216 opponents average over his first nine starts...is averaging 6.80 strikeouts per nine innings over his last eight starts (35 so in 46.1 ip) after average 9.05 over his first nine starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-2 with a 2.42 ERA (12 er in 44.2 ip) and .224 (37 for 165) opponents batting average in seven starts at home compared to 3-3 with a 3.86 ERA (25 er in 58.1 ip) and .271 (62 for 229) opponents average in 10 starts on the road...ranks **eighth** in the American League in home ERA.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has not allowed a home run in his last five starts, 32.0 innings and 140 batters faced...has allowed nine home runs for the season, eight of which have been solo shots...opponents are 14 for 38 (.368) with RISP over his last six games...yielded a .149 average with RISP over his first nine starts...has a .329 (24 for 73) opponents batting average in the first inning, .234 (75 for 321) after that...the opponents number three hitter is batting .372 (16 for 43) with three home runs...the six hitter is hitting .093 (4 for 43), which is the **lowest** mark in the majors.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-3 with a 3.75 ERA (15 er in 36.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest compared to 5-2 with a 2.96 ERA (22 er in 67.0 ip) in 10 starts on five days rest or more.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Had a no decision in his only interleague start June 27 at Miami, allowing four runs in 5.0 innings (7.20 ERA)...is now 0-2 with a 5.35 ERA (21 er in 35.1 ip) in 17 career interleague appearances...that includes 0-1 with a 9.22 ERA (14 er in 13.2 ip) in three starts.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (5 er in 5.0 ip) in one start in the month of July...went 2-1 with a 3.30 ERA in five starts in June after going 2-3 with a 3.90 ERA in five starts in May...was 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 12-5 (.706) in his starting assignments...has the **fifth** highest run support in the American League (5.85)...opponents have reached base on an error seven times, which is **tied for second** most in the AL (**Kuroda, NYY 8**)...has walked two batters or fewer in 12 of his 17 starts and allowed two runs or fewer nine times...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 at Minnesota and April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk...began the season with four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such season-opening streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

CAREER BESTS: Won his sixth game of the season June 15, which is a new career high (previous: 5 in 2010)...had just nine wins in 191 career appearances entering the season...also has career highs in strikeouts (92), innings pitched (103.0), games started (17), hits (99) and walks (32)...his 3.23 ERA is more than a half run lower than his previous best of 3.92 last year.

AS A STARTER: Has made 17 appearances this year, all starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 6-6 with a 3.79 ERA (47 er in 111.2 ip) in 19 career starts compared to 9-14 with a 5.30 ERA in 189 relief appearances...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

2014 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win over Seattle **April 3** in Oakland...left trailing 2-0 but the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game...had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota **April 9**...struck out a career-high nine in 7.0 innings...was relieved by Doolittle to start the

eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth...had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) **April 14**...matched his career high with nine strikeouts for the second consecutive start...picked up his first career win as a starter in the A's 4-1 win over Houston **April 20** in Oakland...retired seven of the final eight batters he faced...had a no decision in the A's 12-5 win at Houston **April 25**...allowed a career-high eight hits...extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 12-1 victory at Texas **April 30**...did not allow a run in 7.0 innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Seattle **May 6**...allowed three runs in the first inning and another in the sixth and left trailing 4-2...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win over Chicago **May 12** in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings matched his career high with two home runs...was the winning pitcher in the A's 13-3 win at Cleveland **May 18**...it was the 200th appearance of his career...tossed a career-high 109 pitches and allowed a career-high tying two home runs for the second consecutive start...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss at Toronto **May 24**...allowed a career-high tying eight hits...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 5-4 loss to Detroit **May 29** in Oakland...yielded a career-high tying eight hits for the second consecutive start...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-4 win at New York **June 4**...allowed four runs in 6.0 innings, all in the third inning, but the A's scored seven unanswered runs for the win...he was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) **June 9**...allowed a career-high tying eight hits for the third time in his last four starts...was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-5 win over New York (AL) **June 15** in Oakland...shutout the Yankees on three hits over the first five innings...had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10 inning win over Boston **June 21** in Oakland...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...however, matched his career high with four walks...left with a 1-0 lead but Gregerson allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save...had a no decision in the A's 9-5 win at Miami **June 27**...was relieved by Otero with a 4-2 lead but he allowed two inherited runners to score for the blown save.

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.
- Made two rehab appearances with Single-A Stockton April 3 and 5 against Visalia (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA) and was reinstated from the DL April 7.
- Was placed on the DL a second time May 9, retroactive to May 8, with a strained right forearm.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...added a walk-off RBI single June 21 against Boston...now has five regular season "walk-off" RBI with the A's and seven in his career.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.

- His second at bat May 18 at Cleveland was the 5000th of his career.

- Had a 0-for-20 streak from April 2 to 6, which was a career high at the time.

- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.
- Stole two bases June 22 against Boston for the seventh multi-steal game of his career

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.
- Made his 400th career appearance June 19 against Boston.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.

- Underwent successful reconstructive surgery to repair the ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow April 30...the surgery was performed by Dr. Thomas Mehlhoff at the Texas Orthopedic Hospital in Houston.
- Was transferred to the 60-day DL May 4

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL) and added a third June 22 against Boston.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.
- Had his fourth career walk-off RBI May 9 against Washington, his first as an Athletic.
- Hit his third career leadoff home run May 14 against Chicago (AL), his first since Sept. 4, 2010 at Baltimore.
- Had a RBI single in the first inning June 16 against Texas to snap a career-high 0 for 21 streak.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

ARNOLD LEON

- Was recalled from Sacramento May 7 for the doubleheader against Seattle but did not pitch in either game...was sent back to Sacramento following the game.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

JED LOWRIE

- Had a career-high tying 16-game reaching base streak from April 19 to May 6 (also July 26-Aug. 21, 2010)...went 18 for 67 (.269) with six walks and two hit by pitches (.347 on-base percentage) during the streak.
- Had a two-run double in the seventh inning against Chicago (AL) on March 12 for his 500th career hit.
- Snapped a career-high 0 for 21 streak June 11 at Los Angeles (AL).

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Tied a Major League record when he was hit by a pitch twice in the ninth inning April 25 at Houston...it marked the eighth time a batter has been hit by a pitch twice in an inning, the first time by an Athletic
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.
- Went 3 for 5 with two home runs and five RBI May 13 against Chicago (AL)...became the first player in Oakland history to hit a home run as both a first baseman and left fielder in one game.
- Matched his career-high with four runs scored, two doubles and three extra base hits May 18 at Cleveland.

- Was named AL Player of the Week for the week of May 12 to 18 after going 10 for 22 (.455) with eight runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs, 11 RBI and five walks in six games...had a .556 on-base percentage and 1.182 slugging percentage...it was his third career weekly honor.
- Had a streak from May 13 to 23 where each of his 12 hits were for extra bases (six doubles, one triple, five home runs)...that is the longest such single season streak in Oakland history, breaking the mark of 11 that he set to conclude the 2013 season.
- Hit his first career grand slam May 30 against Los Angeles (AL)...become the fourth cleanup hitter in Oakland history with a grand slam in the first inning...joins Dave Kingman (June 20, 1984 vs. Kansas City), Mark McGwire (June 26, 1997 vs. Texas) and Matt Stairs (June 6, 2000 vs. San Diego)...his second grand slam came nine days later on June 8 at Baltimore...had no grand slams over the first 531 games of his career.
- Had 19 extra base hits in May to set an Oakland record for extra base hits in the month of May (previous: 18, Giambi in 2001)...had the most extra base hits by an Athletic in any month since Mark McGwire had 19 in April, 1997...had nine home runs and 25 RBI in May, which were his most ever in a month.
- Had his second two-homer game of the season and the sixth of his career June 3 at New York (AL).

DEREK NORRIS

- Had a streak of five consecutive multiple hit games from April 24-30 (11 for 18, .611).
- Had his first career two-homer game May 11 against Washington and also had a career-high six RBI...both of the home runs were three-run shots...is the first Athletic with two three-run homers in one game since Eric Byrnes on July 4, 2004 against San Francisco...both of the home runs came on a 3-0 count...since pitch count data is first available in 1988, he is the only A's player with two 3-0 home runs in his career (source: Stats, Inc. & A's files)...is the first Major Leaguer with two 3-0 homers in one game since Chase Utley on June 28, 2007...the six RBI equal the most by an A's catcher since at least 1914 (Joe Astroth, Sept. 23, 1950 at Washington; Mickey Cochrane, July 30, 1931 vs. St. Louis).
- Hit his first career grand slam May 26 against Detroit.
- Hit his fourth career pinch hit home run June 17 against Texas...had five RBI in the game to become the fourth Athletic since 1914 to have five RBI off the bench (Seth Smith, July 27, 2012 vs. BAL; Erubiel Durazo, July 10, 2004 vs. CLE; Mickey Tettleton, Aug. 24, 1986 vs. NYY)...it was his second career game of five or more RBI (6, May 11, 2014 vs. Washington).

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).
- Played second base, third base and right field June 22 against Boston to become the second player in Oakland history to play each of those positions in one game (Jerry Browne, Aug. 1, 1992 at Kansas City)...it was his first appearance in the outfield since Aug. 5, 2008 at Seattle and his second career appearance in right field (May 5, 2005 vs. Cleveland)

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).
- Had his fourth career game-ending RBI April 19 against Houston, a single in the A's three-run ninth inning.
- Went 2 for 4 with two home runs and six RBI May 16 at Cleveland...the RBI were a career high (previous: 5, two times) and it was his fifth career multi-homer game...one of the home runs was a grand slam, the second of his career (Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston).
- Was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 3 retroactive to June 1 with a hyperextended right knee...went 7 for 16 (.471) with a run, three doubles, walk, strikeout, stolen base and caught stealing during a four-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Sacramento from June 18-22 (three in right field, one at designated hitter)...that included a four-hit game at New Orleans June 21...was reinstated from the DL June 24.
